## BY-LAWS OF THE FACULTY

SECTIONI.

ORGANIZATION OF THE FACULTY.

1. The organization of the Faculty of the Bellevue Hospital Medical College shall consist of seven Departments, to be designated as follows :

Principles and Practice of Medicine.
Surgery and Surgical Anatomy.
Obstetrics and Diseases of Women and Children.
Materia Medica and Therapeutics.
Physiology and Microscopy.
Descriptive and Comparative Anatomy.
Chemistry and Toxicology.
2. Vacancies.-In case of the death or resignation of any member or members of the Faculty, the vacancy or vacancies shall be filled by the remaining members, the election to be determined by ballot.
3. Election of Prefessors.-At all elections to fill vacancies in the Faculty of the Bellevue Hospital Medical College, a majority of the Faculty must be present, and at least four of the departments be represented. A negative vote of three members of the Faculty shall reject a candidate.
4. No candidate can be balloted for unless his name has been presented to the Faculty, and each member notified of the nomination, by the Secretary, at least four weeks before the election.
5. Removals.-Since a certain harmony of action on the part of the Faculty is not only highly important, but necessary to the well-being of the Institution, any Professor may be declared no longer a member of the Faculty by vote of the remaining members of the Faculty. For this purpose, it shall be necessary that the majority of the Faculty be present, and at least four departments be represented; when the Professor may be removed by a vote, taken by ballot, of all but two of those present at the meeting, notice having been served by the Secretary upon
the said Professor, of the time and purpose of such meeting, one month previously.
6. Members of the Faculty who may be prevented, by circumstances entirely beyond their control, from attending meetings for the election of Professors, or for the purpose of voting on the removal of a member of the Faculty, may send in their votes in writing; which votes shall be received by the Faculty, upon the solemn assurance of the members thus voting that they are unable to attend the meeting.
7. Officers.-The officers of the Faculty shall consist of a President, Secretary, and Treasurer, who shall be elected at each annual meeting, by ballot.
8. President.-The President shall preside at all the meetings of the Faculty, and, in matters not specified in the By-Laws, shall govern the Faculty according to ordinary parliamentary usage. It shall also be his duty to request the Secretary to call meetings of the Faculty, on the written application of two members of the Faculty, with the object of the meeting specified.
9. Secretary.-The Secretary shall keep accurate minutes of all Faculty meetings ; shall attend promptly to all the correspondence of the College ; shall preserve all documents and letters relating to the Institution; and
shall call meetings of the Faculty, at the request of the President.
10. Treasurer.-The Treasurer shall have the charge and management of all the funds of the Institution ; shall pay all accounts properly audited by the Executive Committee ; and shall keep an accurate record of all moneys received and disbursed. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to immediately notify the President of any deficiency in the Treasury, and, upon such notification, the President shall, as soon as practicable, direct a meeting of the Faculty to be called.
11. Meetings of the Faculty.-Seven members, or a majority of the Faculty, shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of ordinary business.
12. Order of Business.-The following shall be the Order of Business at meetings of the Faculty :

1. Reading of Minutes of the last meeting,
2. Reports of Officers of the Faculty.
3. Report of the Executive Committee.
4. Reports of other Committees.
5. Unfinished Business.
6. Miscellaneous Business.
\%. Reading of Minutes.
7. Adjournment.
8. Anmeal Meefiny.-An Anmual Meeting of the Faculty shall take place on the first Tuestaty in April, for the election of oftieers, eleetion and appointment. of committees, and hearing the ammal report of the Execoltive Committee.

## SECTION II.

## STANDING COMMITTEES.

1. Externtive C'ommiltee.-A Standing ('ommittee of there members of the Faculty shall he dected by hallot at the ammal meeting, which, with the Seepetary, shall constitute the Exccutive Committec.
2. The Exeentive ('ommittee shall organize by the chertion of at Chaiman and Semepary, shall meed ment larly every two weoks daring the winter session of lectures, and shall make a report at every meeting of the Faculty.
3. It shall be the duty of the Exerentive (ommittere In atteml to all the husiness of the Institution mot provided for hy sperial exmmittees, of (eomprehemed in the spereflien duties of the uffieers of the Fatenlty.
4. All expenditures eommeded with the rarions departments of instruftom, exeprting the ammal expenses of the departments of' 'hemistey and Physiology, and

dishursements diverely radered hy the Fiadelty, mast he :anctioned by the Exeentive ('ommitter. Which shall allas andit all accomits preselenter the Fiambly, before they can be paid by the Treasurer.

9. In case any member of the Faculty le mavoidahly provented from giving his Lecture at the preseribed hour, he is, if prate icable, to calme his hour to be filled hy some other member of the Fatoulty, or give timely notice to the Lecture Committee.
10. No one but members of the J'aculty shall deliver a Lecture or Lectures in the College buiding, mentess by special invitation from the Faculty.
11. Publishing C'ommittee-A Standing ('ommittee of three shall lee appeinted hy the l'resident, with the consent of the Facultr, at each ammal meeting, which sha! hato charge of the issue of the circulars, catalogues, and all wher publicatioms hy the Faculty, as well as all motiees and adrertisements in medical and secular journals.

## SECTION III.

## INTRODI'C'TORY AND VALEDIC'TORY ADDRESSES.

1. Four weeks of more before the opening or closing of the regular Winter sessiom, some member of the Falculty shall be celected, hy ballot, without momination, 10 give the Introductory or Vialedictory Adhess.
2. The Craduating ('lass shatl be permitted to elecet. one of their momber to give a Valedictory Adrless at

the close of each W Whter session; which atdress mast first be sulmitted to the Execoltive (ommittere amd most mat oxecopy more than twenty mimutes in its delivery.

SECTION IV.<br>DEMONSTRATOR, PRUSEETORS', ANI ASSTGTANTS.

 Anatomy is to he mominated hy the Protesisen of Anatomy, and appointed hy the Faculty.
