



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INTRODUCTION.

The importance of this work was first suggested by Mr. Walter W. Pratt (916) of Hartford, Conn., who at once took steps to have the work brought to completion. The foundation of it is "The Pratt Family," by Rev. F. W. Chapman, The Rev. Mr. Chapman followed out in full the descendants of Lieut. William Pratt, the brother of John Pratt of Hartford, and only included such records of John Pratt as occasionally arose in his researches. The book reached few of the descendants of this branch of the family. The ancestry of John Pratt further back than herein given is uncertain; however, it is well to state that the family name is found in the County of Hertford, England, as far back as 1315, and in the County of Bedford in 1296. The impossibility to connect the different generations can be fully appreciated, and therefore it is thought advisable to present the work complete as far as possible in its American families without further researches in England, and I trust that this volume will fulfill its mission, in being a help and pleasure to every family contained herein.

TO TRACE YOUR ANCESTRY.

Find your name and number in the index; then find your number in the book. The number of your father is beside his name, which is first in parenthesis, next to yours; his father's name and number is next to his, etc. Your children's records follow your own. If they have a plus sign (+) before them, it indicates that they have children and their records are to be found further on in the book under their numbers, thus:

Father of No. 97. Father of No. 30. Father of No. 6. Father of No. 2. 97. WILLIAM (William³⁰, John⁶, John², John¹) born, etc.



THE ANCESTRY OF JOHN PRATT

OF

HARTFORD, CONN.

1636.

The ancient registry of Wills, in the County of Hertford, England, having been carefully searched, established without doubt the parentage of the progenitor of this branch of the American Pratt families. It is only to be regretted that the direct line cannot be definitely established many generations previous to those herein given, for the families of Pratts have figured prominently in history from the twelfth century. However, the records herein given may be a stimulus to some of the families to devote some time while abroad to the discovery of more ancient records, which will be welcomed by all those who appreciate their lineal descent.

FIRST GENERATION.

THOMAS PRATT of Baldock, Hertfordshire, Eng., made his will February 5th, 153\frac{8}{9}, in which he names his wife, Joan Pratt, executrix, and heir conjointly with their children, Thomas Jr., James, Andrew, and Agnes. His will was sealed with the arms of the Pratts of Baldock, a fesse dancett in chief, two lions rampant.

Their son Thomas Jr., married Ellen Coke, and had William, John, James, Elizabeth, Alice, Ellen, and Grace.

Their son James married Dorothy ——, and had James, John (married Elizabeth Prime), Edward, and Jane who married John Rishton.

SECOND GENERATION.

Their son ANDREW PRATT, of Baldock, married, whom, it is not known, for his will cannot be found, but the parish records contain the following names and baptisms, of his children:

ELLEN, daughter of Andrew Pratt, bap. in 1561. WILLIAM, son of Andrew Pratt, bap. Oct., 1562. RICHARD, son of Andrew Pratt, bap. June 27, 1567.

THIRD GENERATION.

WILLIAM PRATT, of Baldock, Hertfordshire, Eng., baptized in October, 1562. Married Elizabeth —. His will is found in The Doctor of Commons, dated 1629 at Stevenange, Hertfordshire, where he was rector for thirty years. In his will he mentions his wife, Elizabeth, and their children, Richard, Mary, and Sarah. The following other children are mentioned on his monument in the church at Stevenange: Elizabeth, John, and William.

The history of the County of Hertford, Eng., by Robert Clutterbuck, Vol. II, p. 443, contains the following memorial of the Rev. Wm. Pratt, of Stevenange:

"William Pratt, Clk, S.T.B., 6th December, 1598. Patron Thomas Clark. Instituted by Bishop Chadderton. He was succeeded by Richard Meredith, Clk, S.T.D., 27th October, 1629. This church was dedicated to St. Nicholas."

A tablet on the north wall of the church bears the following inscription:

"Hic jacet Gulielmus Pratt Sacræ Theologiæ Baccalaureus et hujus Ecclesiæ per annos triginta prudentissimus Rector: Tres habuit filios Johannem et Ricardum totidemque, filios; Saram Mariam et Elizabetham ex clarissima conjuge Elizabetha; Tandem partriam emigravit anno salutis 1629, Ætatis 67. Monumentum hoc amoris simul et mæroris perpetuum testem posuit delectissima conjuix Elizabetha quæ juxta placide in Christo abdormint."

TRANSLATION.

"Here lies William Pratt, Bachelor of Sacred Theology, and most illustrious rector of this church during thirty years. He had three sons, John, William, and Richard, and the same number of daughters, Sarah, Mary, and Elizabeth, by his renowned wife, Elizabeth. At length, the course of his life being run, and his age becoming burdensome, he emigrated to the Celestial country in the year of salvation 1629, aged 67."

The rectory of Stevenange lies in the diocese of Lincoln, the archdeaconry of Huntington, and deanery of Hitchin, where the following baptisms are recorded:

SARAH PRATT, daughter of Rev. Wm. Pratt, bap. Feb. 6, 1605. (Named in father's will and on monument.)

ELIZABETH PRATT, daughter of Rev. Wm. Pratt, bap. April 2, 1613. (Named on father's monument.)

RICHARD PRATT, son of Rev. Wm. Pratt, bap. Feb. 16, 1618. (Named in father's will and on monument.)

John Pratt⁴, son of Rev. Wm. Pratt, bap. Nov. 9, 1620.

Mary's baptism is not found, but she is named in her father's will. William's baptism is not found, but he is named on his father's monument.

It will be seen from the above that three of the children, viz.: Elizabeth, John, and William, arenot recognized in their father's will, and for the probable reason that they had left for America, or signified their intention of leaving, and received their portion. John Pratt and his brother William both arrived in Hartford with Rev. Thos. Hooker in 1636. In 1645 William Pratt sold his lands and moved to Saybrook, Conn., and John remained in Hartford.

DESCENDANTS OF JOHN PRATT

1. JOHN PRATT, son of Rev. Wm. Pratt, baptized November 9, 1620, Stevenange, Hertfordshire, England.

In truth very little can be said of the subject of this sketch, about his leaving his native home with his brother William and perhaps his sister Elizabeth, but from the facts herein stated we know that the religious persecutions of that period must have been the cause of their departure for a land of freedom of thought and worship, as well as a land of safety. fact that John Pratt was one of Rev. Thomas Hooker's party which emigrated from Newtown, Mass., in 1636, leads us to believe that he came to America at the same time that Rev. Thos. Hooker did, in 1632. However, it must be stated that no record can be found to verify that fact; however, on the 7th of April, 1634, John Pratt was granted two acres of land by the old burying place "without any common pales." [Paige's Hist. Cambridge, Mass., p. 20.] "John Pratt was in Newtown (Cambridge), Mass., in 1633; he owned a house in 1635 on the northerly side of Mt. Auburn Street, between Brighton Street and Brattle Square, which he sold to Joseph Isaac." [Hinman, p. 628.] [Paige's Hist. Cambridge, p. 32.] "John Pratt was made freeman at the General Court holden in Mass., May 14, 1634." [Records Mass., p. 369.] "May 1st, 1635, John Pratt in the Towne, one house with a garden. Backside about on rood, Sam Greenhill southeast; Springe Streete, southwest; Will Spencer, northwest; Creeke Lane, northeast." [Proprietors' Records of the Lands and Homes of Newtown, pp. 6-52.]

On the 31st day of May, 1636, John Pratt set out from Newtown, Mass., with Rev. Thos. Hooker and his party for Connecticut, the magistrates of Newtown previously having agreed that there was not sufficient room in Newtown for all to have sufficient lands on which to live and pasture their cattle. The Newtown pilgrims went out into the pathless woods, finding themselves in a wilderness. They climbed hills, forded streams and crossed swamps. It is said that the first place they stopped, the first night of their journey, was at Split Rock, in Natick. Continuing their journey they arrived at Hartford, Conn., some time in June, 1636. The persons resident of Hartford were divided into two classes, i.e., "proprietors of land" and "such inhabitants as were granted lotts to have onely at the towne's courtesie."

John Pratt's name occurs on the list of the former on the town records. It is found as follows: "14 Jany, 1639, John Pratt, one who has rights in undivided lands, is elected Representative for the following year." [Town Records.]

"At a general meeting of the 'Freeman' for the election of Magistrates, according to the orders April 11, 1639, John Pratt was chosen one of the Committee." [Town Records.]

"Jany 14, 1639, John Pratt one of committe to adjust and appoint due proporcon for mens allotments."

"John Pratts land (28) was reckoned from the north side. The lotts were begun at Windsor bounds and the wast Land was to be in breadth as the rest, the Lines running east and west." [Town Records.]

"28th July, 1640, It is ordered yt John Pratt and Richard Goodman are to order his proportion of fencs in ye south medow layed Together, & also, To se yt a sufficient bound marke be sett; between man & man att each end of theare medow a greate ston sett in a houle." [Town Records.]

"18th Feby, 1640, John Pratt one of committee to appoint & lay out lands."

"28th July, 1640, John Pratt ordered to proportion fences."

"Jany 26, 1641, John Pratt chosen to order the affaires of the towne."

"Sept. 15th, 1643, John Pratt chosen one of the grand jury."

"June vith, 1644, John Pratt freed from watching according to the promise of the General Court."

"3rd Feby, 1644, John Pratt chosen constable."

At a general meeting of the Town of Hartford the 14th January, 1639: "Whereas their is some differents in mens allotments, some having moore then is according to their due proporcon, Its therefore ordered, That Mr. Hopkins, Mr. Wells, Mr. Webster, Mr. Steele, Mr. Taylcot, Andrew Warner, John Prat, Tymothy Standley, John Clark, Joseph Mygate, with the townsmen, shall exsamen the same and shall have power to appoint every man his proporcon according as in their Judgment shall be just and equall." [Htfd. Towne Votes, 1635, 1716.]

At-a general meeting Oct. 24, 1643, It was ordered "that there shold be a bell rung by the watch euery morman hower befoor day break; and that thay that ar apoynted by the constable for yt purpose shall begin at the breadg and so ring the beal al the way forth and back from Mastar Modies Willicesses hill to John prat's gat, and yt ther shal be in eury house on up and haue mad som lith within one querter of an hower after the end of the beal ringing; or if he can prou the beal is rung befor the tim apoynted then to be up with lith as befor mentioned, halfe an hower befor day break, & for defalt herein is to forfeit 1s. six peance to be to him yt finds him falty, and six peance to the towne." [Htfd. Towne Votes, 1635, 1716.]

"2nd March, 1651-2: The Court orders that the treasurer shall pay to Richard Goodman & John Pratt for the carrying on of the necessary work at out the prison howse, out of the next Rate, $30 \pm in$ such pay as the rate is to be paid in this Towne." [Colonial Records.]

Feby 23, 1654: "There is in good, some shott at goodman Pratts; the towne chayne at Richard Butlers; the Towne Clock at good Pratt's." [Htfd. Town Votes, 1635, 1716.]

"Savage" says that John Pratt was a carpenter by trade, as he made repairs on the "Prison howse" in 1651. We may believe that he followed that trade when not engaged by the affairs of the towne and his home. He afterwards purchased two adjoining house lots on Main Street of Gov. Haynes,

which extended north of Asylum Street to the Old 4th Church. Pratt Street derives its name from this John Pratt, as it was cut through near his home lot.

The record of his marriage can not be found. Christian name of his wife was Elizabeth. Her maiden name, and where they were married, is not known.

His will was dated Oct. 14, 1654, and the original of which can be found in the Halls of Record, Hartford, Conn. He died in Hartford, Conn., July 15, 1655.

- 2. JOHN (John¹) born about 1638 in Hartford, Conn., was made Freeman at a court called by the Governor and Magistrate at Hartford, 26th Feb., 1656. [Colonial Records, Conn.] He was chosen Constable for the years of 1660, 1669, 1678, 1682, and chosen "to order the affayrs of the town from 1653 to 1665. [Htfd. Town Votes.] Mr. Pratt's name appears on the list of "Freemen" on the north side of the river, taken Oct. 13, 1669. [Colonial Records, Conn., p. 518.]

Mr. Pratt married first Hannah Boosey, born in 1641, daughter of Lieut. James and Alice Boosey, of Wethersfield, Conn. (He was clerk of the train band.) [Savage, p. 473, Boardman Gen.]

Mr. Pratt married second, Hepsibah Wyatt, daughter of John Wyatt. [Farmington Town Records, Vol. 10, 11-12.]

His will was dated April 19, 1689, and can be found in the Halls of Record, Hartford, Conn. Mr. Pratt died November 23d of the same year. His widow, Hepsibah, married 2d, John Sadd, March 10, 1691 [Hartford Town Records]. John Sadd was a tanner from Earl's Colne Co., England, settled in Wethersfield, Conn., 1674. He died Dec. 20, 1694. Mrs. Hepsibah (Pratt) Sadd died Dec. 20, 1711. [Trumbull's Mem. Hist. Hartford Co., Vol. I, p. 275.]

The children of John and Hepsibah Pratt were:

11+Susannah, b. Oct. 2, 1680, Hartford; m. Daniel Merrill. 12+Jonathan, b. Oct. 6, 1683, Hartford; m. 2d, Mary Benton.

3. DANIEL (John'), b. in Hartford, Conn., about 1639. He was made freeman by the Court, Feb. 26, 1656 [Colonial Records, Conn.]. "At a session of the General Court in Hartford the 11th day of March 165% The listed persons for Troopers presented to, & allowed by this Court under the Command of Major John Mason are as follows, in Hartford, Mr. Willis, Mr. Lord, Mr. Thos. Wells, Jacob Mygatt, Jonathan Gilbert, Nicho Olmsted, John Stedman, James Steele, Dan Pratt, & etc." [P. 309 Colonial Records, Conn., 1636, 1665.]

"At a Towne meeting february ye 11th, 1657: ther Weer chosen For to order the affayres of the towne for ye year ensueing. Dan: Pratt."

"The account of the towne rate was taken this 16th of December, 1658, by us underwritten. Daniel Pratt," & etc.

"ye 20th of Nouember, 1660, There remaineth in Dan Prats hand, due the Towne, £2. 6. 2."

"Dan Pratt chosen for rate maker of the town 1661."

"daniel prat was chosen for to vew & Judge of fences, 1662."

Mr. Pratt was chosen Townsman for the years of 1663, '64, '72, '73, and "deputy to order the prudenshalls" for 1663, 1664. He was chosen constable for 1668. At a town meeting June 2, 1671, he was chosen one of a committee "to lay or stake out the highways" on the north side of the river. Mr. Daniel Pratt was also fence viewer for the years of 1676, '77, '78, '79, and '80. [Town Votes and Connecticut Colonial Records.]

"Daniel Pratt, Sr., was proposed for deacon" in the first church of Hartford, March 11, 1686, but was not chosen. [Walker's Hist. 1st Church of Hartford, p. 249.]

The only record of Daniel Pratt's wife that can be found

is that on the stone at the head of her grave in the burying ground of the First Church of Hartford, Conn. (Center Church), which reads as follows: "Hannah Pratt, wife of Daniel Prat, age about 50, died Sept. 3, 1682." Mr. Pratt's will is dated April 19, 1690; in it he bequeaths his property to his son Daniel and his seven daughters. The following is taken therefrom: "I have great reason and I do heartily desire to bless God for the good agreement and love that I have lived to see amongst my children, as well as their tenderness towards myself, so I now desire to commit them to that God that hath cared for me all my days. Commanding them to love, fear and serve him who will be their God as he hath been their fathers God." Daniel Pratt was buried on the 24th of April, 1691. [Trumbull's Hist. Hartford Co. Savage Gene. Dict.]

6. JOHN (John², John¹), born in Hartford, Conn., May 17, 1661, where he resided until his death; he served the town in the capacity of "Chimney Viewer" in 1686–89; "Fence Viewer" 1695, 1713; "Selectman" 1697, 1711; and "Constable" 1705–15. The Hartford town records give his cattle mark as "a slitt downe the outside of the neare eare" in 1706.

"Probate Court of Htfd., Feb. 15, 1693, on the motion of John Pratt, being of age to receive portion given him by his father John and his mother Hepsibah Sadd executor." [P. 51, Will Bk. 5, Htfd., Ct.]

In the Colonial Records of Conn. we find the following: "John Pratt is plantf Oct. 15, 1699, and John Sadd in right of his wife. John had the right to keep the land of his grandfather."

Mr. John Pratt married Hannah Sanford, daughter of Robert Sanford, Jr., who was the son of Robert Sanford and Anne Adams, daughter of Jeremy Adams of Hartford, Ct. He made his will March 15, 1741, which was probated March 15, 1744. [Will Book, Vol. XV, Htfd., Ct.] In his will he mentions his grandsons Ozias son of John, John son of John, Isaac son of John, his son William, his daughters, Hannah Porter, Esther Talcott; Hannah, widow of his son John, and his granddaughter to whom he bequeathed "my feather bolster and warming pan and chest marked W & S as a token of my love." His son William was executor.

He was Treasurer of the Colony from 1755 to 1769; deacon of the first church from 1748 to 1780; she died Aug., 1775; he died July 3, 1799. They had four children. [Talcott Gen., Talcott Papers, Htfd. Hist. Soc., 1892.]

8. SARAH PRATT (John², John¹), born in Hartford, Conn., June 20, 1668, married for his 2d wife in Hartford, Conn., Nov. 13, 1690, Timothy Phelps, born in Windsor, Ct., Oct. 26, 1656.

She died on the 18th of February, 1758 [Htfd. Prob. Records, Vol. 8, p. 75], and was buried in Center Church yard. The following epitaph is taken from her gravestone: "Here lies enterred ye body of Mrs. Sarah Phelps ye relict of Mr. Timothy, Decd. who died Feb. 18, 1758 in ye 96th yr of her age."

9. JOSEPH (John², John¹), born in Hartford, Conn., March 6, 1671, was bap. at the first church of Hartford, Dec. 13, 1696. He married July 22, 1697, Sarah Colyer. [Hurd's Hist. of New London Co.: Atwater Hist. Kent, Ct., Colchester, Conn., Records.]

At the General Assembly in 1700, Oct. 10, he was present as deputy for Milford "Lieut. Joseph Pratt (Colo-

nial Records). "He deeded away his lands in Hartford,

Mch. 12, 1700." (Chapman's Pratt family.)

"May 13, 1703, this Court Grants that Joseph Pratt" etc. and the rest of the proprietors or freeholders in the township of Colchester shall have "a pattent given them for the whole township to be signed according to the law." (Colonial Records, p. 415, 16). The title of Sergeant is given him in the records of the town, i.e. "April 29, 1723, Sargeant Pratt credit for perambulating labor as lien, £0. 0s. 3d. To the fetching Mr. Neucome to judge the work of the galleries, expense and attendance thereon in all, £0. 10. 0."

"Sept. 6, 1725, Sargt. In Feb., 1797, his family removed to Pompey, and also his father-in-law, Solomon Loveland, who was a miller. Mr. Pratt also engaged in agriculture, making large additions to his first purchase. Mr. Loveland, at the age of 85, would take a bag of two bushels of wheat from the back of a horse and carry it into the mill. He died at the age of 87. Mr. Pratt married Elizabeth, daughter of Solomon Loveland, of East Hartford, Conn.

"Mr. Pratt was active in the early improvements of the town of Pompey, and contributed freely to the establishment of churches and schools. He was one of the first to organize the Pompey academy. He closed his life in 1841 at the age of 87. Mrs. Elizabeth Pratt survived him one year only, and died in 1842, aged 88.

167. SAMUEL (Aaron⁵⁰, Jonathan¹², John², John¹), born in East Hartford, Conn., and bap. July 29, 1764; he removed with his father and mother about 1770; he returned to his father's old home in East Hartford, Conn., in the spring of 1775, and enlisted in the American Revolution July 10, 1775, in the 3d company, 8th Regiment, Huntington's Brigade, stationed on the Sound until Sept. 14. Ordered by Washington to Boston camps, took post at Roxbury, in Gen. Spencer's Brigade, and remained until the expiration of his term of service, and was discharged Dec. 14, 1775. (Conn. Men in the American Revolution, p. 86.)

Samuel Pratt again enlisted July 2, 1777, in Capt. John Harmon's Company, 4th Regiment, Conn. line, and was discharged January 1, 1778. This regiment went to camp at

Peekskill, and in September was ordered to join Washington's army in Pennsylvania. They marched in the Connecticut Brigade under Gen. McDougall, and were engaged in the battle of Germantown, Oct. 4, 1777; were assigned to Varnum's brigades and continued a brave defense at Ft. Mifflin on the Delaware; were closely engaged at the battle of Monmouth. (Conn. Men in the American Revolution, p. 188.)

About 1785 Capt. Samuel Pratt married Esther Wells, born April 20, 1766, in Hatfield, Mass. They returned to Westminster, Vt., where they resided on a farm.

In 1801 Capt. Sam'l Pratt, inspired partly with a spirit of adventure and partly with that daring enterprise common to the early pioneers of our country, determined upon making a long expedition into the almost savage wilderness of the far West. He left his home in Westminster and proceeded to Montreal, and there made preliminary arrangements for entering upon his project the following year. In 1802 he gathered about him a few fearless spirits like himself and set forth, leaving at home a large and interesting family in charge of a devoted Christian mother. Capt. Pratt was well qualified for such an undertaking, for he was cautious, courageous, and a man of firmness and decision, frank in his manners, a shrewd judge of human nature, with a strong sense of right, manifesting itself in his address, which tended to inspire confidence in his intercourse with strangers. He was in person broad shouldered, thick-set and stout, capable of enduring the fatigue and hardships attendant upon such a journey. In the fall of 1803, near Sandusky, he had the misfortune to be taken down with the small-pox. His companions, either overcome with fear or regarding his case as hopeless, left him in the wilderness among the Indians. squaw attended him and nursed him faithfully through this disease. After recovering he made his way to Erie, from thence, on his way home, he passed the site of Buffalo, then but a cluster of log cabins. Reaching home he was received as one risen from the dead. They had not heard from him during his long absence and had given up expectations of ever seeing him again.

Captain Pratt's mind at that early date comprehended the advantages of the little village of Buffalo, and at this

time determined to cast his lot here. In 1804 he sold out his village store and closed up his affairs in Westminster and set out with his family on their tedious journey for His goods and household effects were packed in two emigrant wagons with white arched tops. Mrs. Pratt, with the more delicate members of the household, occupied the family carriage, a stately vehicle, hung upon high leather springs, in which the children took turns in standing up, there not being seats for all. They reached Buffalo in September, 1804. In the old family carriage were Mrs. Pratt, aged 38 years; Miss Polly Smith, a niece of Capt. Pratt, afterwards Mrs. Hiram Hanchett; Mary Pratt, aged 2 years; Permelia, aged 12 years; Benjamin Wells, aged 8 years; Esther Pratt, aged 6 years; Hiram Pratt, aged 4 years. In other conveyances, Capt. Pratt, aged 40 years; his sons, Asa Pratt, aged 16 years; Pascal Paoli, aged 10 years.

Samuel (Capt. Pratt's eldest son) did not emigrate with his parents at this time; he was then 17 years old, and held position as clerk in Mr. Bigelow's store in Townshend, Vt.

Subsequently a log cabin was improvised upon the terrace and the family of 7 children huddled into it in great discomfort, the most important piece of furniture in the cabin being a huge chest. A small store building was soon completed, in which Capt. Pratt placed his goods temporarily, while a larger one was being constructed. His first store was on the north side of Exchange Street. Capt. Pratt located on lots No. 37 and No. 2; he set about building a house on lot No. 2 with his characteristic energy. completing his new store he filled it with a stock of goods suited to the primitive people about him, nearly all his business being in barter with the Indians for furs. After he finished his house, he endeavored to furnish it as comfortably as the difficulties of doing so in those times would admit. Among other comforts if not luxuries for that day, he spread upon its floors a carpet from Boston, which was the first one laid in the place. The family were always on good terms with the Indians. Incidents sometimes occurred, however, causing Mrs. Pratt to feel nervously insecure in her isolated life. One day, as they were eating dinner, an infuriated, half-intoxicated Indian who went by the unenviable title of Devil's Ramrod, ran into the dining-room chasing in advance of him Benjamin Wells Pratt, who was then a lad. The Indian was brandishing his knife, and clutching at the boy to kill him. Benjamin ran under the table among the feet of those sitting there and his pursuer was brought to a stand. It seems that Benjamin, with other boys, had been teasing the Indian, and it was difficult to pacify him ever so little. At length he said: "Will not kill Ho-da-ni-da-oh's boy." With these words he turned away, stuck his knife into the door with a terrible thrust, and, leaving it there, strode haughtily out of the room.

Mrs. Fox (Esther Pratt) says: I took my little sister, Lucy Ann, then a baby, into father's store one day, and placed her on the counter. My attention was directed from her for a moment, and when I turned towards the child I beheld to my horror a Tuscarora squaw come into the door, and, like a flash, catch up my little sister in her blanket and instantly disappear with her. I ran screaming with all my might after her; and brother Asa, who was near by, gave chase, caught her, and with great difficulty succeeded in getting Lucy from her grasp. When questioned as to her motive for stealing the child, she replied that she had just lost her own and wished to possess another.

In 1805, Capt. Pratt and his wife made a trip to New England. They returned with their aged father and mother from Westminster. Aaron Pratt, Capt. Pratt's father, did not long survive the journey west. He died in 1806, and his wife about 1809, and both are buried in the village burying ground, now Franklin Square. Both were members of the Congregational Church.

Capt. Pratt and his wife were exemplary earnest Christians, and were always doing for the advancement of society and the town in general.

Capt. Pratt, aided by his sons Asa and Pascal P., carried on an extensive trade in furs with the Indians.

August 30, 1812, Capt. Pratt died. He was buried in Franklin Square burying ground. He had proved himself a kind father and affectionate husband, as well as a prudent guide and counselor. A few weeks after the looting and burning of Buffalo Mrs. Pratt returned to Westminster with her children and lived in their old homestead and afterwards returned to Buffalo, where she died in 1830.

Capt. Pratt was among the first inhabitants of Buffalo; with them he cheerfully encountered all the privations and hardships incident to first settlers of a new country, and the public spirit displayed by him in whatever related to the improvement of the village and the convenience of the early settlers in this vicinity well rendered his memory dear to all who knew him. It may in truth be said of him that to the wants of the indigent his hand was ever open to their distress, his heart never closed. He was characterized by a great business enterprise and activity, and his descendants have exhibited the same traits of character. [Ketchum's Hist. of Buffalo; sketch of the life of Sam'l F. 214. JOHN (Zachariah⁹⁴, William³⁰, John⁶, John², John¹), Capt. John Pratt, patriot of the Revolution, second son of Zachariah Pratt and Abigail Cook his wife (and twin brother of James), was born in Hartford, Conn., October 12, 1753, and his early years were lived there. He served as lieutenant during the war of the Revolution, entering the Army through the Penn. Continental line, while absent from home on a visit, his name appearing in the 3d and 4th Penn. Regiments.

In 1779 he was Assistant Commissary General under General James Clinton, whose headquarters were then in Albany, N. Y. He was an early member of the "Society of the Cincinnati," and his popularity with his brother officers is evidenced by the pleasant and lengthy correspondence with many of them, which continued for a long term of years. Afterward, under Generals St. Clair and Wayne, he served through the Indian War, which raged in Ohio, and other western localities, sharing in their respective defeats and victories. In March, 1791, President George Washington "nominated, and with the Advice and Consent of the Senate appointed him a Captain in the First Regiment in the Service of the United States," and a few weeks later, the Secretary of War, General Knox, ordered him to immediately commence the recruiting service in the State of Connecticut. "The principal rendezvous will be at Middletown." One specification was, "No negro, mulatto, or indian to be enlisted."

In ecember, 1793, after seventeen years of service, he resigned from the Army and retired to private life, having purchased a farm a year before, not far from Middletown. In 1812, he removed with his family into the city, where he was identified with the general interest of the place. He was a Whig of '76. A supporter of the principles which governed the administrations of Washington, a popular representative of the town in which he lived, he was repeatedly elected to the Legislature, and was also a magistrate. He served in the sessions of 1799, 1806, 1807, 1808, and 1809, May and October of each year. During Lafayette's last visit to America in 1824, he was the guest of honor in several Connecticut towns, and the last to welcome him was Middletown. He went down from Hartford

on September 4th or 5th. "Capt. Pratt was chief of escort to meet him, a few miles up the road, and was alone in the first carriage. Lafayette and he recognized each other when they met, and both were much affected." There was of course all possible military display, and crowds lined the streets. "On reaching Middletown they drove to the Washington Hotel, in recent years the home of the late Bishop Williams, where a reception was held in his honor, after which the distinguished guest and his escort rode down Washington Street to Shaddock's dock, where the Oliver Ellsworth from Hartford was waiting their crival, and Lafayette left for New York to embark in a few days on his homeward voyage.

Three months later, on December 27, 1824, Capt. Pratt was suddenly called from his earthly to his Heavenly home, but he had set his house in order and was ready for the summons.

February 28, 1795, Capt. John Pratt married Elizabeth Cooper, daughter of Lamberton and Elizabeth Cooper of Middletown, Conn. Mrs. Pratt died July 8, 1862, aged 91 years and 4 months.

A few extracts from one of several obituary notices tell of the estimation in which Capt. John Pratt was held.

"The integrity of the deceased was universally known and acknowledged. Naturally possessed of unusual sensibility, Capt. Pratt was a friend and helper of the distressed in every condition of life. In the prosperity of his friends and acquaintances he rejoiced; and in their adversity, he had a sympathetic tear ever ready to show the interest he took in their welfare. In domestic life fulfilling all its duties with fidelity, and communicating delight by pleasant manners, and by conversation, exhibiting a warm and affectionate heart, he will long be remembered with regret. His departure was sudden, but Christian hope shed a serenity over the final scene."—Communicated.

Recruited mainly in Hartford County and Eastern part of the State. Went into camp at Peeks-Kill in the spring of '77 and served in Parsons' Brigade under Putnam during movements of following summer and fall. On the advance of the enemy and the loss of Forts Clinton and Montgomery, Oct., '77, it crossed to west side of Hudson and served under Gov. Clinton of New York for a time. On Dec. 10, The regiment engaged with other troops in an

expedition against Long Island which met with accidents, leaving Col. Webb and other officers prisoners in enemy's hands. Regiment wintered with Parsons' Brigade at West Point, and assisted in construction of permanent works there. In summer of '78, it was attached to Varnum's Brigade, and marched to Rhode Island, engaging in the battle there of Aug. 29, '78; commended for its conduct. Wintered in Rhode Island '78-'79 and remaining there till fall of '79 marched to winter quarters, Morristown, N. J., '79-'80; assigned to Stark's Brigade, Lt.-Col. Huntington commanding. Present at battle of Springfield, N. J., June 23, '80, and during following summer served with main army on the Hudson. Upon a memorial of Col. Huntington, The Assembly of Connecticut on the second Thursday of May, '80, adopted the regiment as one of the 'Connecticut Line,' and a Committee of Congress in Camp Preakness, N. J., June 23, '80, approved the measure. It was designated the oth Regt. and went into winter quarters, '80-'81, with the Division at Camp 'Connecticut Village' above the Robinson House."

"In 1797 a city watch was instituted, the city was divided by the council into four watch wards, and Capt. James Pratt, Ezekiel Williams, Ashbel Wells and Richard Butler were appointed watch wardens. He brought his family in one of the old-fashioned wide-tired boot-shaped wagons, with parallel sideboards and cloth-covered top, which formed one of a train containing mostly Indian stores, under charge of Asa Pratt, his brother. Pascal Paoli, then aged 13, had been allowed to accompany them for the pleasure of the ride."

"Samuel Pratt, Jr., and his family were all fond of music. He entered upon the same line of business as his father, Capt. Pratt, was engaged, nearly opposite his father's store on Exchange street, in company with Benjamin Caryl and others; however, he shortly retired that he might more satisfactorily discharge the duties of Sheriff of Niagara county, to which office he was appointed March 10, 1810. Later he associated himself with his brother-in-law, Elijah Leech, the firm being Pratt & Leech. At the time of the great Buffalo fire, Mr. S. Pratt, Jr., resided on what is now the northwest corner of Eagle and Main streets; and back of his house was a stretch of primitive forest through which Niagara street had been cut. He was the purchaser of lot No. 39, corner of Main and Swan streets."

"On the night of Dec. 30, 1813, a little past midnight, the weather being raw and disagreeable, Mrs. Leech (Capt. Pratt's daughter, Pamelia), who, with her husband, was sojourning at Wid. Pratt's farm homestead, upon the creek, heard the booming of a distant cannon. She was at once aroused to the fact that it was the signal for the British

and Indians to commence attack upon Buffalo, which had been anticipated as retaliatory measure for the burning of Newark, now Niagara, which had been done by General McClure, two weeks previous. She aroused her husband, and no time was lost in rescuing the family of her brother Samuel from impending danger. The family was aroused and all packed in a wagon and driven to the homestead. Samuel stayed behind to watch and protect property. He put out many fires kindled in the buildings by the enemy. The family was severely pressed after the war, and the strictest frugality was required to secure even the necessaries of life for a home formerly habituated to every seasonable luxury."

The following appeared in the *Buffalo Gazette*, Dec. 24, 1812: "Samuel Pratt, Esq., has been appointed Adjutant of the Volunteers."

In 1818 Mr. Pratt took charge of his former employer's store, Mr. Bigelow, in St. Thomas, Can. Mr. Pratt was a man of about 5 ft. 9 in. in height, of rather slender figure, delicate in general appearance, polished in his address, and remarkable for his politeness, ease, and grace of manner. He died August 7, 1822; Mrs. Pratt died March 19, 1862, age 74.

At the beginning of the troubles on the frontier, Asa Pratt was among the first to enlist in the government service in 1812, as private in Capt. King's Company, 22d Regiment of Infantry. He was endowed by nature with a strong constitution, and was of bold and fearless disposition. He distinguished himself at the battle of Chippewa, where he was severely wounded. Mr. Pratt belonged to the Buf-

falo Grays; he was struck with a spent grape-shot which lodged in the fleshy part of his thigh. He died in Collins, N. Y., August 23, 1868.

At the burning of Buffalo in 1814, though only a boy, young Pratt displayed remarkable bravery and aided sev-

eral persons to escape from the fire. It was the desire of his friends that he should study medicine, but the calling was so repugnant to the ambitious boy, born to be a merchant prince and banker, that he could not overcome his dislike to it.

In 1818 an opportunity was offered to Hiram Pratt and Orlando Allen to purchase a stock of goods. This they accepted, and together embarked in business which soon led to a large trade, and on the part of Hiram Pratt to extensive operations in commerce, real estate, and banking. He built several steamers, mills, and originated the Bank of Buffalo. He was elected Mayor in 1835, and again in 1839, and stood high in esteem and confidence of his fellow citizens.

The tremendous financial revulsions in 1836-7 broke his spirit and his health, and he died May 1, 1840.

He was married in Northampton, Mass., Nov. 3, 1825, to Maria Fowle, born in 1799, daughter of Nathaniel and Rhoda (Clap)-Fowle of Northampton, Mass., who survived him until Feb. 5, 1868.

He was a Representative in the 23d Congress, 1853-5, Democratic candidate for Governor in 1858 and 1859, being defeated by Gov. Buckingham. He was also a delegate in 1860 to the national convention at Charleston when the secession conspiracy began. In 1862 he was elected to the House of Representatives. In 1870 and 1871 represented Wethersfield in the Legislature. Nov. 29, 1840, General Pratt married, in Candor, N. J., Lutilia Juliette Hollister, born Oct. 7, 1824, in Glastonbury, Conn., daughter of Samuel and Laura (Horton) Hollister of Glastonbury, Mrs. Pratt died April 23, 1885, in Wethersfield, General James T. "Up to the time which immediately preceded the rebellion, his life was one of seclusion and retirement. oughly imbued with the life-long conviction that the permanence of our Federative system of government could only be maintained by a grim and fearless adherence to the letter and guarantees of the Constitution, he was chosen then for his acknowledged ability and polarity of principles, one of the delegates to represent the State of Louisiana in Convention of the Democracy of the U. S. at Charleston, and was subsequently present and prominent among the distinguished representation, in its closing deliberations at Baltimore. At the outbreak of the war he was commissioned one of the Major-Generals of the Militia of the State, and immediately, with his characteristic zeal and fidelity, organized, drilled and prepared for the field, as far as practicable the entire effective force of his district. The appointment of Genl Richard Taylor to the command of Western Louisiana, after the fall of New Orleans, immediately led to radical changes in the official rank, position and powers of the state officers. Genl. Pratt became necessarily subordinated, especially as regarded all field operations, but true to himself and the dictates of that unselfish and disinterested patriotism which had prompted him from the beginning he abated nothing of his zeal, but nobly and generously coöperated with his superiors in all measures devised for the defense of his adopted state. It was out of compliment to him that the command of the first expeditionary success, in turning and capturing the outposts of the enemy at Bayou des Allensands and driving them within his city lines of defence, was entrusted to him. After other and varied service, Gen. Pratt retired, unfit for service with greatly impaired health, and a broken constitution, which continued gradually to decline until his death, July 30, 1866, at Portland, Conn.

"But few, if any suffered more at the hands of the foe than the deceased. On the eve of the evacuation of the Parish by Banks' Army, in the spring of 1863, Col Perleys New York Regiment was sent down and encamped for days in his yard and dwelling, with a special view of annoyance to his family, and the destruction of his beautiful grounds. On the eve of their departure they carried away by force every negro, every living creature, and every moveable means of subsistence. He was absent at the time of this foray. But upon the occasion of the second raid by Franklin he was at home secure as he reasonably supposed, in his enfeebled health from any further molestation, after the wholesale plunder of the previous spring. But in this he trusted too far to their forbearance and humanity. He and his nephew, both non-combatants, were suddenly seized by a military guard, taken to New Orleans, and there confined for months before they were discharged—and this without the assignment of any cause for their arrest.

"Of large and varied information, he was clear, analytical and just in all the conceptions and conclusions of his enlightened intellect. As a writer he had but few equals. Firm and steadfast in his estimates of men and measures.

'He would not flatter Neptune for his trident, nor Jove for his power to thunder.'

Kind and affectionate in all domestic relations of life; socially he was a refined gentleman."

"These details of his public relations and trying incidents connected with them have been here recorded solely with the view of preserving his memory, a heritage to his children, by his daughter, Miss Fanny Wadsworth Pratt."

"The credit of establishing the Life Insurance business in Hartford belongs to a group of men who would hardly have been selected as the probable founders of a vast financial system — a lawyer in delicate health, a carriage manufacturer, and an apothecary, viz.: Edwin O. Goodwin, Elisha B. Pratt (No. 359), and Guy R. Phelps. But they were all men of superior capacity, energy, and integrity, who needed only some such field for their talents. The memory of Mr. Goodwin's fine abilities and lofty character is still cherished with pride by his descendants; he would have gained distinction at the bar had his strength sufficed. In 1846 Mr. Goodwin, casting about for some employment less confining than a lawyer's desk, conceived the idea of organizing a life company, and inoculated Mr. Pratt (No. 359), with it. Dr. Phelps willingly agreed to abandon the drug business and cast in his lot with them. Thus originated the Connecticut Mutual Life Ins. Co."

Y., in the year 1833, he studied at the Hamilton Academy in Madison Co., N. Y., after which he spent one year in Amherst Academy. Early in 1836 he entered upon his business career in the hardware store of his brother, Samuel F. Pratt (No. 642), in Buffalo, N. Y., five years later becoming a partner; the firm name then became Pratt & Co. The business prospering and increasing, became one of the best known wholesale and retail hardware houses in western New York. The firm soon added to their business a large plant for the manufacturing of iron; a blast furnace and rolling mill being built at Black Rock, N. Y., for this purpose, giving employment to eight hundred working men. Several large vessels were used to bring the iron ore from Lake Superior region. In the year 1846, Mr. Pratt, in connection with his brother, Samuel F. Pratt, and Mr. Wm. P. Letchworth, organized the firm of Pratt & Letchworth, for the manufacture of saddlery hardware, wood hames, malleable iron, and steel castings. The successors of this firm are in business to-day in a corporation styled The Pratt & Letchworth Co., which corporation bought out Pratt & Letchworth in 1896. This business has given employment to from five to eight hundred employes continually for over thirty-five years. Black Rock, N. Y., stands to-day as a result of these pioneer industries, and a monument to the power of the manufactory introduced by these benefactors, to the nerve, energy, and ability of their progenitor.

Mr. Pratt has always had a pride in his native city, and has been identified with all that has made it beautiful, and was among the first to take an active part in its advancement. He was one of the originators of the Buffalo Park system, and spent time while abroad in investigations on that subject, that the system inaugurated should be of the best.

He was the first president of the Park Commission and served in that office untiringly from 1869 to 1879, when he resigned. Mr. Pratt served on the commission to appraise the land at Niagara Falls, N. Y., to be used as an international park. The commission made awards to the amount of one and one-half millions of dollars, which gave satisfac-

tion to both landowners and state, being approved by the Supreme Court and accepted by the legislature. Mr. Pratt was Presidential elector in 1872, elected by the Republican party, and, with this exception, he has always refused political office. He served as vice-president of the Manufacturers and Traders' Bank from the time of its organization in 1856 until he became its president in 1885, which office he still holds. By his strict attention to business, his executive ability, farsightedness, and ability to reach a conclusion quickly, and prompt execution of plans once formed, together with the success which has followed all his undertakings, he has won the confidence and highest esteem of his fellow citizens. To all charitable institutions of Buffalo he is a generous contributor of time, earnest, faithful work, and money. Is president of the Bankers' Association, a director in the Commercial Bank, and the Buffalo, New York & Philadelphia Railroad; president of the Buffalo Iron and Nail Co., the Young Men's Christian Association, and the Buffalo Seminary; trustee of the Buffalo Gas Light Co., the Buffalo Orphan Asylum, and the North Presbyterian Church.

684. JOHN PRATT ROBERTS (Emily M. Pratt³⁷¹, John²¹⁴, Zachariah⁹⁴, William³⁰, John⁶, John², John¹), born in New York city, Aug. 11, 1829, his parents moving back to Middletown in the spring of 1835; most of his boyhood was spent there. He early developed a love for the sea, which it was impossible to overcome, and all efforts to turn his attention to other pursuits having failed, he was sent on a long voyage to China, hoping this would prove effectual. In October, 1844, he sailed, with four other boys of his own age, on the ship Panama (Capt. Wm. F. Griswold of Lyme, Conn.), in charge of, and with certain privileges from, the captain. Absent seventeen months. The five ports of China were opened about that time, and the *Panama* was the first ship to enter. Young Roberts started with the avowed intention of filling the captain's chair, which position he early attained, and had the proud satisfaction, before he was twenty-four years old, of having, as captain of the barque Storm, made the shortest voyage round the world of any on record then (1853), for which he received a very complimentary letter from Lieut. Maury, U.S. N. In October, 1855, the barque Storm was so badly wrecked in a typhoon in the China Sea that she was pronounced unseaworthy, and Capt. Roberts returned home. He afterward commanded the Liverpool packet ship *Underwriter* for several years, but having the opportunity offered him of taking out to China for the house of Russell & Co. the steamer Huquang, which was built after the plan of a North River boat, for use on the Yang-tse-Kiang, he sold out his interest in the Underwriter, and devoted himself to preparations for

the hazardous undertaking of crossing the ocean in a vessel at which older men shook their heads. He felt sure of success, and before leaving had made such a thorough study of all the machinery, that he felt competent for any emergency. The Huquang steamed out from Sandy Hook at noon on May 28, 1862, and arrived at Shanghai on the 19th of August, "in 82 days, 11 hours, 36 minutes from New York, allowing for the difference of longitude, and in 57 days, 22 hours, 48 minutes steaming time, making the shortest passage on record, not only from New York, but between the ports" where they stopped for coal. He wrote: "We were not expected for a fortnight, and the owners were proportionately pleased at our safe and unexpected arrival, and I was glad to get here where the water is smooth, for which the boat is better adapted than for a sea steamer." His success in taking out the Huquang created for him an enviable reputation, and his career in China, where he has remained ever since, has been an eventful one. The extracts published at the time will give some idea of what he has accomplished. A private letter, dated Nagasaki, Japan, Dec. 27, 1874, contains the following interesting information: "I have just received from Shanghai a telegram announcing that the Pacific mail steamer Alaska was floated at Hong Kong, by Capt. Roberts, on the morning of December 23d. It will be remembered that the Alaska was blown ashore in the great typhoon there of Sept. 28th last, remaining upright, but in shoal water. Captain John P. Roberts took the contract for getting her afloat, and succeeded in doing so, to the no small astonishment of the Hong Kong folks, who never expected to see her off again. The achievement is considered by all a great credit to his engineering ability, which is already well known in China. Hong Kong is a British colony, and Capt. Roberts' success was in the face of no little national prejudice, and reversed the opinion of the best English engineers. Ten floating pontoons, immense levers, and full-moon tides did the business."

During the summers of 1875 and 1876 he was engaged in a far more difficult enterprise—that of rescuing the treasure from the steamer *Japan*, which was burned and sunk in the China Sea some time before. In a letter dated

Shanghai, Jan. 31, 1876, he gives some account of the work:

"I was absent from Shanghai last summer, and succeeded in finding the wreck of the Japan after a long search and much tiresome and disagreeable work in sweeping over many miles of the bottom of the sea. On the 31st of July we found the wreck, nineteen and a half miles from the nearest land, and lying in twenty-three fathoms of water, or 138 feet. The southwest monsoon was then in full force, and opportunities for diving were very rare; yet the divers were able during the following six weeks to make fourteen descents, when the northeast monsoon set in strong, and obliged us to abandon further proceedings until spring, when there is generally fine calm weather for several weeks. The diver found the treasure tank and brought up from it, the last time he was down, twenty-four dollars, which he got by putting his arm through a hole in the tank. The tank was about twenty-eight feet long, five feet deep, wide at one end and pointed at the other, and very much the shape of a flatiron. Through the center of it were two of the lower deck stanchions, about fourteen inches square, and these having burned away, left holes, through one of which, probably, the diver got the dollars. The latter was in a roll, stuck together and black by heat or the action of salt water. The tank was probably red-hot when it was submerged, and collapsed by water pressure, as one would crush a paper bag in the hand. In calm weather the divers were able to see tolerably well when at the bottom, and they sent up several slabs of copper and a case of canned lobster, which latter was eaten by the crew. I expect to leave for Hong Kong about the 1st of March, and my absence from home will depend on the time required to recover the money from the wreck. If we do succeed the feat will be the greatest ever performed in the way of submarine diving. Not one professional diver out of a hundred can work at a depth of twenty fathoms, and our work must be done at a greater depth, where the pressure is sixty-nine pounds to the square inch and the very best men and apparatus are required. Another great disadvantage is the situation out in the open ocean, where very little wind creates too much sea for work to be carried on, and where the current is

most of the time too strong to allow the divers reaching the bottom, so that we need a combination of favorable circumstances—calm, fine weather, slack water, and the very best divers and appliances. Our divers came from England, one of them a very superior man. He is to be back in March with another, as good as can be got. Nothing is left of the Japan but the bottom and a mass of iron work. As the upper works burned away, the vessel lightened up, and when she sank all the wood work and combustible matter were destroyed down to the water's edge."

There were about \$400,000 in the treasure tank, most of which was recovered from the bottom of the sea.

At one time Capt. Roberts held the responsible position of Supt. of the "China Merchants Steamship Co.," having full control of twenty-six large steamers, besides numerous hulks, towboats, and other smaller craft. His latest work, and a great one, has been the building of a dock for the Shanghai Engineering, Shipbuilding, and Dock Company on the Tootung shore of the Woosung River, nearly opposite the Point. The plans were his own design, and the dock was opened with considerable ceremony by the company on the afternoon of June 1, 1899, when many invited guests were present; and as the customs regulations demand the naming of the dock, the directors named it the Oriental Dock.

The Obituary of Henry Zachariah Pratt, taken from the Hartford Courant, September, 1863:

In this city, at 5 A. M., August 31, 1863, Henry Z. Pratt, aged 50. Funeral from his late residence, 130 Washington Street, on Wednesday, the 2d inst., at 3 P. M.

The passing away of one after another of our prominent citizens is creating a void not only in desolated households, but in the places of honor and trust which they have occupied in the community. Our obituary record for the past week announces the decease of Mr. Henry Z. Pratt, who has long been known among us as a high-minded and honorable business man, and a valued member of society.

Mr. Pratt was born in this city in the year 1813, and at the age of fifteen became a clerk in the bookstore of Messrs. George Goodwin & Sons, then publishers of the Connecticut *Courant*. He commenced business in 1834 as a member of the publishing house of Robinson & Pratt; the firm was removed to New York in the following year, and after enjoying several years of great prosperity, subsequently became Pratt, Woodford & Co., and finally in 1858, Pratt, Oakley & Co. In these various connections, a large number of educational works were published, such as Olney's Geography, Comstock's Philosophy and Chemistry, Bullion's series of Grammars, and other valuable school books.

In his business career Mr. Pratt displayed great energy, industry, and sagacity, and the highest sense of mercantile honor. Having safely weathered the financial storms of '37 and '57, his prosperity received its first reverse in the unlooked-for and unavoidable crisis caused by the Southern rebellion. The large sums due to his house by repudiating Southern merchants crippled its resources materially, and it was finally obliged to succumb to the tide of adverse circumstances. The care and anxiety consequent upon this calamity seriously affected Mr. Pratt's health, and he never recovered from the blow. A year since he was elected Vice-President of the Ætna Insurance Co., with which he had long been connected as a director, and continued to hold the office until his decease. The large concourse of friends and neighbors assembled to pay the last sad offices to this esteemed citizen and valued friend, attest how highly Mr. Pratt was honored in life, and how deeply lamented in death; but who may estimate the loss to his bereaved family? Singularly happy in his domestic relations, the removal of this most tender and devoted husband and indulgent parent leaves his fireside utterly desolate. "The places that once knew him shall know him no more forever," but the memory of this noble, Christian gentleman will long be cherished by the community in which he lived, and in the heart of hearts of those who knew and loved him best.

THE WORK OF RESTORATION BY THE RUTH WYLLYS CHAPTER, D. A. R.

In 1636 there came to Hartford, Conn., a company of men under the leadership of Rev. Thomas Hooker, which has become distinguished as an unusual band of pioneers. They were not wanderers or "Pilgrims," in any sense; but, actuated entirely by religious principles, they left comfortable homes and conditions of more or less wealth and prominence to set up in the wilderness their standard of religion as interpreted by them to be "pure," hence their title of "Puritan." They became not alone the founders of Hartford, but the "Founders" of a new form of government.

In the year 1640 a piece of ground was set aside by the town for a burying place. From that time to 1803 there were laid away in this sacred spot the mortal remains of those who rested from their earthly labors in this town. While they were called to their reward their deeds have lived after them, and not their descendants alone, but also the great nation which they did so much to found hold their achievements in grateful remembrance. For many years this place was neglected, almost forgotten, hidden by surrounding buildings and darkened by the shadows of great trees and squalid tenements which faced on a narrow and forbidding alley. Nearly three years ago the Ruth Wyllys Chapter, Daughters of the American Revolution, undertook to redeem this historic spot, and at the same time to accomplish a great public improvement in converting this almost useless alley into a beautiful street, in obliterating a center of filth and crime, and in bringing into public view the memorials of the illustrious dead where they should be seen and honored by all. More than one attempt had been made to accomplish this object, but the great cost which would

necessarily be incurred in destroying \$80,000 worth of buildings had proved too great an obstacle to its accomplishment. The plan presented by the Regent of the Ruth Wyllys Chapter, which has succeeded, involved the raising of between \$25,000 and \$30,000 by individual contributions on the part of those who were willing to give from their own means for the public good, the balance being placed by the Street Board in assessments upon adjoining property holders. The First Church, whose origin antedates the settlement of Hartford, and whose place of worship has adjoined the cemetery since 1739, joined the Chapter in furnishing the necessary funds. No more spontaneous and generous aid has ever been given to a worthy object than has been freely extended to those who have persistently and successfully labored for the improvement of the city and the honor of its early benefactors.

Gold Street has been formally widened and opened, and the occasion of the giving of lands purchased by the Ruth Wyllys Chapter to the City of Hartford celebrated in a unique and delightful manner. The ceremonies took place in the rear of the ancient church, and thousands of persons gathered to do honor to the occasion and listen to eloquent addresses from some of Hartford's leading men. The cemetery has had its outlines extended by the acquisition of these lands, and the whole plot has been placed under the charge of the Park Board, a body of most capable and trustworthy gentlemen, and its perfect care thus assured. There now remains the urgent duty of restoring and preserving every memorial in the yard. From various stages of decay they must be rescued. One hundred and fifty are finished, and there are three hundred and fifty requiring speedy attention. The method used is the Caffall process, which is best known as that employed to preserve the obelisk in Central Park, and been quite extensively used in Greenwood Cemetery. It is desirable to finish this work the present season, and in the fall the grading of the yard and seeding may take place and a handsome iron fence built. Great efforts are being made to find descendants of persons buried in the yard, acquaint them with the present movement, and invite their co-operation. It is presumed that in most cases descendants will desire to do the work necessary to save the

gravestones of their ancestors, and preserve the family records which are frequently of great value.
