Mobiche brethren if thou bryinge forwardes of they tourney (after a godly forte) thou thair do well, because that for hys names sake they went forth: and toke northinge of the Benepls . We ther love ought to recease futh, that we myght be beipers to the trueth. I waote buto the congregacion : but Diorrephes, whiche loueth to baue the preemynetice among them, recepueth be not. ADherfore if I come, I will beclare by a depes whiche he boeth, reflyinge on be with inalycious wordes, neither is therwith content. Rot oneto be hunfelte receiveth nor the beethien, but also be sophibberh them that woulde, and things erh them oute of the congregation. Beloued, followe not that which is earli, but that which is good. De rhat boeth tvell, is of god but he that doth supil, feeth not god. Demetrius barb good reporte of all men, and of the truether feife, yea, and we oute felues also beare recorde, and ye know, that oure recorders true . I had many thyinges to wapte : but I will not with yake and penne wayee buto the. I cruft & Chall Chostly ferhe, and we Chall fpeake mouthe comouth. Weace be buto the. The louers falute the Biete the louers by name.



De cider buto the bery louynge manne Gaius, whome I love (oncerely. Dearly beloved, this doo I wishe for in my prayers of Jetu Christ, that like as thy foule doeth prosperouslye well in continuonae fedfastly in the Cofpelles doctrine, even to it may also doe profperous ly in al other matters, Chaift being thy good spede, for Thane conceaued no finall pleature of the faying of the brethren, whiche are come buto be, and have made res

porte of the Conceritie, they beinge as true withele bearours, as thou true ly folowest the trueth of the Golpell, not onely in profession, but also in thy fludies, a in all the whole life. for there is no matter that maketh my barte more glad, than if I chaunce to heare, that my childre, which I begat by the Gofpell buto Chrift, Doc folow the trueth that we Delyuered thein. Dearly beloued, in that thou art biligentlye good buto the Chillians, whiche are there, and come thider as ftraungers, thou dovel a dede worthy hom that truly putteth his trust in the Gospel, and loueth Chaist. for they have made reporte of thy lynceritie before all the whole companye of the Christians. And thou houldest doe well to, if thou wouldest bring those, whoms thou receivedest gently at their coming, forth with like gentilnes, thither as they would goe:like as they, which goe about Gods bulines a not they owne. deferue to be entreated of the that love God hartily. for thei went not forth to a market to encrease they owne household pelfe, but to preach the name of the lord Jefu Chrift, whose doctrine they diffribute so bnto & heathens. that they take nothinge of them for all that: to thintense they maye bringe the more frute buto Chrifte, for whome they labour: and if they to boe, god defende them from all Aupicion of hallinge hande making. In Dede it is be-Cemynge for bs to receive fuche in to oure house, and to prouple, that they

want nothinge to the necessifie of they lyfe, that we may on some behalfe be partakers of those thinges, which are done by them buto the glozye of God. for fo Christ hathe promised that he which receiteth a prophete as a prophet, foulde have the rewarde of a prophet, I have written hertofore already buto the congregacion, that is there, to doe the fame, that I warne the of: howbeit Diotrephes withflandeth and doeth not receive our monte cions, having rather to be a ring leader among his own, than of low degre, and a pure disciple of Chaift: and having rather to be autour of a new beris fye, than to be a true folower of the olde enangelical doctrine. 300 herfoze if I come bnto you, I will warne hom of hys boinges, wherof he thinketh peraduenture that I am not ware, while he being a naughtie manne chat: treth with malicious wordes againste bs, to thintent he myght take away our credence and autoritie from us among you, whiche do erhouse you to continue ftill in the doctrine of the Golpell. Dether beinge herewith con: tente, le doeth not onely not receyue the brethren, but also forbiddeth them that woulde receive them, and diffurbeth them in the congregacion. The mans frowardnes is fuche. Aby good louinge brother, tolowe not that whiche is full, but that which is good. It is our parte to luftre them that naught are but not to folow they example. All are not the children of god, which have received baptime. De that beclareth his faithe by godlye des des, is bome of God, for he recembleth the disposition and doctrine of hys father. He that doveth wickedize, although he professe God in his wordes, per he doeth not for all that fee god truly : for he is fene with molte purely fee wied eies of faith, which are blurred with the Darkenes of bices. There fore anoyde the example of Diotrephes, a fet Demetrius before thy eyes to bo after. for his godlynes is reported of all men, whiche although they would fave nothing, yet the thinge it felfe maketh reporte of the mannes bertue. Yea and we our felues havinge experience of hys fonceritie, beare witnesse of hym. And you know, that we beare true witnesse of hym. I had also bery many other thinges, whiche I was desyrous that thou

houlded knowe, but I shought it not expedient, so put them in writing. I stuff I half some but the hourly: than we half presently commune of all thinges more surely and more fully. Peace be but the. Thy frendes that are here commende them but the. And salute thou those frendes agayne, that are there, in they, behalfe dilygently, and by name.
