A BILL

Supplementary to the act entitled "An act to establish branches of the Mint of the United States," approved March third, eighteen hundred and thirty-five.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives*
2 *of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That*
3 the director of the Mint be, and he is hereby, authorized to em-
4 ploy, from time to time, at the several branches of the Mint,
5 such number of workmen and attendants, as, from the represen-
6 tations made to him by the respective superintendents, and from
7 his knowledge of the business of the several branches, he shall
8 deem necessary for the successful and economical prosecution of
9 the work, and the safety of the buildings and other public property,
10 at each branch Mint; which said workmen and assistants shall be
11 employed and paid in all respects according to the provisions of
12 the act entitled "An act supplementary to the act entitled 'An
13 establishing a Mint, and regulating the coins of the United

14 States,'” approved on the eighteenth day of January, eighteen
15 hundred and thirty-seven.

1 SEC. 2. *And be it further enacted,* That it shall be lawful
2 for the director of the Mint, by and with the advice and consent
3 of the President of the United States, to direct the coinage of
4 silver as well as gold at the branches of the Mint at Charlotte
5 and Dahlonega, in case he shall believe that the same machinery
6 employed for coining gold can, without injury to it, and without
7 any material expense for alterations, be beneficially employed in
8 said coinage: *Provided,* That the silver coined at said branches
9 shall be of the denomination of quarter dollars and under.

A BILL

Supplementary to the act entitled “An act to establish branches of the Mint of the United States”, approved March third, eighteen hundred and thirty five.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the director of the Mint be, and he is hereby, authorized to employ, from time to time, at the several branches of the Mint, such number of workmen and attendants, as, from the representations made to him by the respective superintendents, and from his knowledge of the business of the several branches, he shall deem necessary for the successful and economical prosecution of the work, and the safety of the buildings and other property, at each Mint; which said workmen and assistants shall be employed and paid in all respects according to the provisions of the act entitled “An act supplementary to the act entitled ‘An act establishing a Mint, and regulating the coins of the United States,’” approved on the eighteenth day of January, eighteen hundred and thirty seven.

Sec. 2. And be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for the director of the Mint, by and with the advice and consent of the President of the United States, to direct the coinage of silver as well as gold at the branches of the Mint at Charlotte, and Dahlonega, in case he shall believe that the same machinery employed for coining gold can, without injury to it, and without any material expense for alterations, be beneficially employed in said coinage: Provided, That the silver coined at the said branches shall be of the denomination of quarter dollars and under.
