## CONSTITUTION

## Article I-Name.

This club shall be known as the Pemigewasset Woman's Club.
Article II-Object.

The object of this club shall be to broaden and strengthen the moral, social, and intellectual life of its members, and through them to make itself a power for good in the community
Article III-Officers.

Section 1. The officers of this club shall be a President, two Vice-Presidents, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, Treasurer, and an Executive Committee to consist of six members.

Sec. 2. The officers of the club with the exception of the executive committee shall be elected at each annual meeting by ballot and a major vote. Three new members of the executive committee shall be elected for a term of two years at each annual meeting by ballot and a major vote.

SEC. 3. Officers shall not be eligible to re-election to the same office for more than two consecutive years.

Sec. 4. At the first meeting in March, a committee of three shall be appointed by the chair, who shall report at the first meeting in April a list of nominations for the election at the annual meeting.
Article IV-Membershap.

Any woman shall be eligible for membership who is interested in the work of the club. The name of each candidate must be presented at a regular meeting by a member of the club and may be balloted upon

at any regular meeting subsequent to that at which the name was presented. Three negatives reject.

After election, a person becomes a member only upon signing the constitution and paying the annual due within one month from the time of election.
Article V-Dues

The annual due for one year, or any part of a year, shall be one dollar. The financial year shall begin at the close of the club year, when the annual fee shall become due.

## Article VI-Amendments.

The constitution may be amended by a two-thirds vote of the members present, and voting, at any regular meeting of the club, provided that a written notice of the intended change has been given at a previous regular meeting.

## BY-LAWS.

## Article $I-D u t i e s ~ o f ~ O f f i c e r s . ~$

Section 1. The President shall preside at all meetings of the club and shall perform the other duties usually belonging to this office. She shall also cast the deciding vote in case of a tie in the executive committee. In her absence, it shall be the duty of the Vice-Presidents in their order to preside at any meeting.

SEc. 2. The Recording Secretary shall keep a correct record of the attendance, and of the proceedings of all meetings of the club. At the annual meeting, she shall present a written report of the year's work.

Sec. 3. The Corresponding Secretary shall conduct the correspondence of the club; notify all persons elected to office, making a statement of the duties connected therewith; give notice to those appointed on committees and elected to membership, and notify all members of special meetings.

Sec. 4. The Treasurer shall receive all moneys and pay them out on the written order of a majority vote of the executive committee, all bills payable for a sum exceeding five dollars having been submitted to the club. At the annual meeting she shall present a written report of all moneys received and paid out by her.

Sec. 5. The Executive Committee shall be intrusted with all business and interests of the club, in the interim of its meetings and with the appointment of sub-committees. They shall have the right to order the payment of any bill not exceeding five dollars without submitting it to the club. They shall have power to fill all vacancies which may occur during the year.

## Article II-Meetings.

SEC. 1. The regular meetings of the club shall be held the first

and third Mondays of each month from October to May inclusive, at such hours and places as shall be agreed upon.

SEC. 2. The last regular meeting in the month of April shall be the meeting for the annual election of officers, who shall assume their regular duties at the close of the club year.

The incoming president shall be the president to attend the annual meeting of the State Federation of Women's Clubs.

The report for the year shall be read at the last meeting in May.
Sec. 3. Special meetings may be called by the President or Acting President or on request of three members of the club, at least twentyfour hours notice thereof being given.
Article III-Quorum.

Five members shall constitute a quorum.
Article IV-Withdrawal.

SEC. 1. A member wishing to withdraw from the club shall send a written resignetion to the secretary that her name may be taken from the list of members.

SEC. 2. Any member who fails to pay the annual fee before the first of November shall be dropped from the rolls as having voluntarily withdrawn from the club.
Article V-Visitors.

Members may bring guests, who shall be admitted by ticket, to any regular meeting, except the annual meeting. Tickets may be obtained of the Recording Secretary by members only, on the payment of ten cents for each ticket. These tickets are to be procured within two weeks of the date for which they are to be used. The same woman, residing in town, shall not be invited, as a guest, more than once in a year.

## BY-LAWS.

## Article VI-Conduct of Meetings.

All meetings shall be conducted by the rules of parliamentary law, the "Woman's Manual of Parliamentary Law" being the authority.

## Article VII-Amendments.

These by-laws may be amended by a two-thirds vote of the members present at any meetings, notice of such intention having been given at a previous regular meeting.

## Article VIII-Suspension of By-laws

Any article of the by-laws may be suspended by a two-thirds vote of the members present, for not more than one meeting, excepting this article which shall not be suspended.
