



This house was built about 1898 by Rev. W. D. Reynolds on a hill south of Chungju, Korea. The hill was called "Wonsu" and was originally the site of the home of the Lee (21) family who later occupied the throne of Korea until 1910 when the Japanese annexed the country.

The hill being sacred to the "Lee-dynasty", it was necessary to give it up, and in 1900 it was pulled down and money was paid to the Mission to compensate for the loss, and another site was given for the Mission to use, which was occupied from 1900 to the present (1954)
