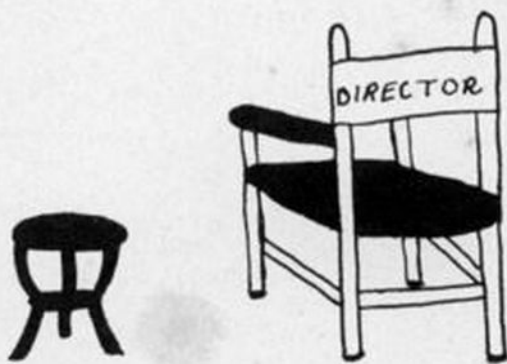

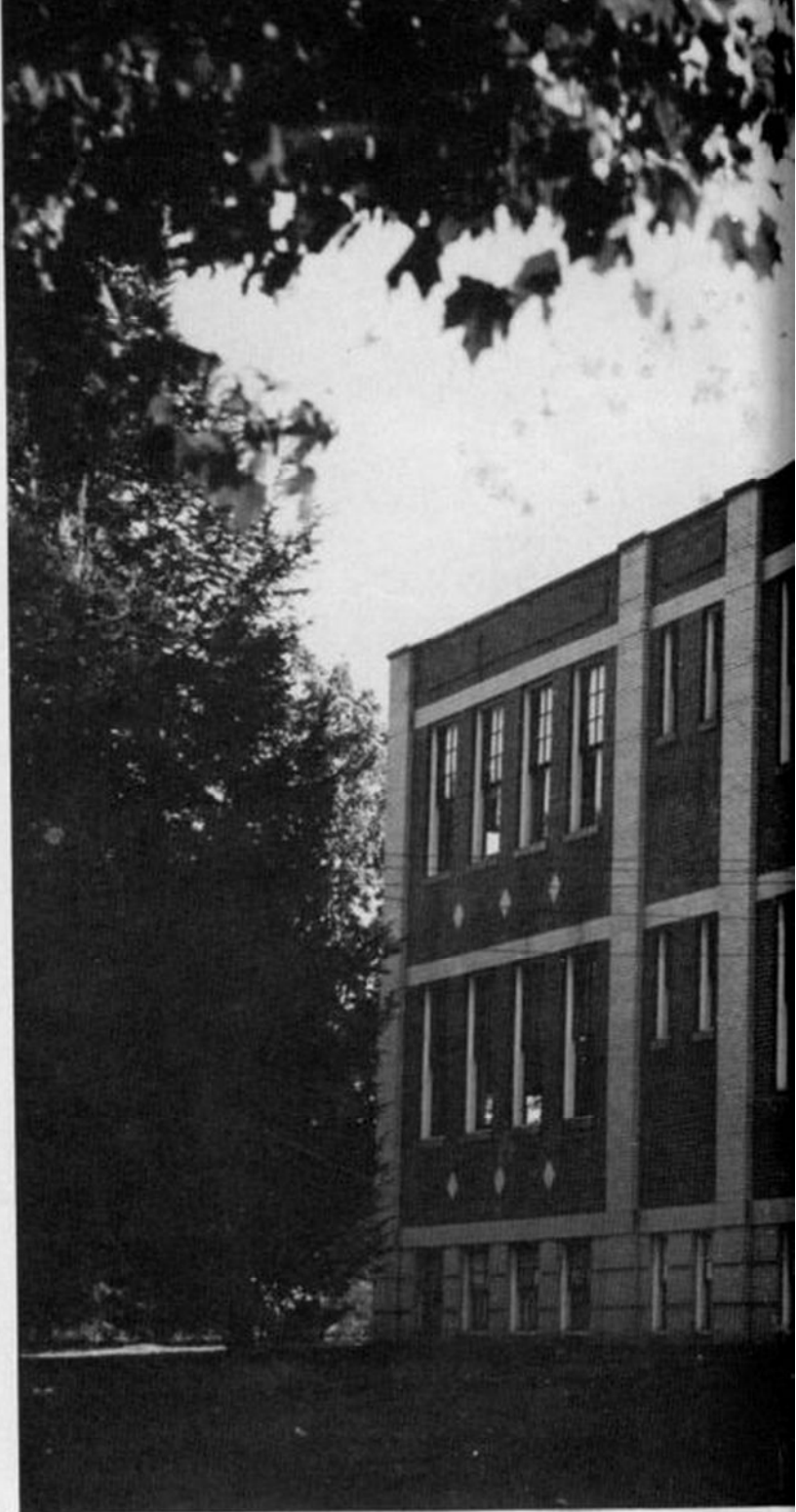

With the hope that everyone will enjoy this book as much as we have enjoyed the creation of it, we present the 1956 Mountain Breeze.

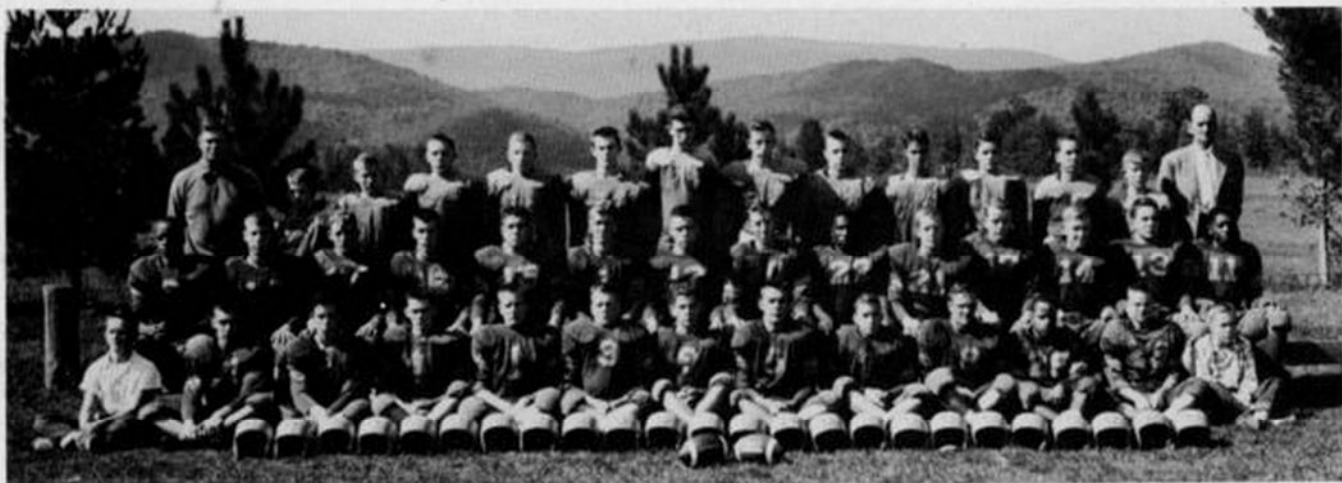
