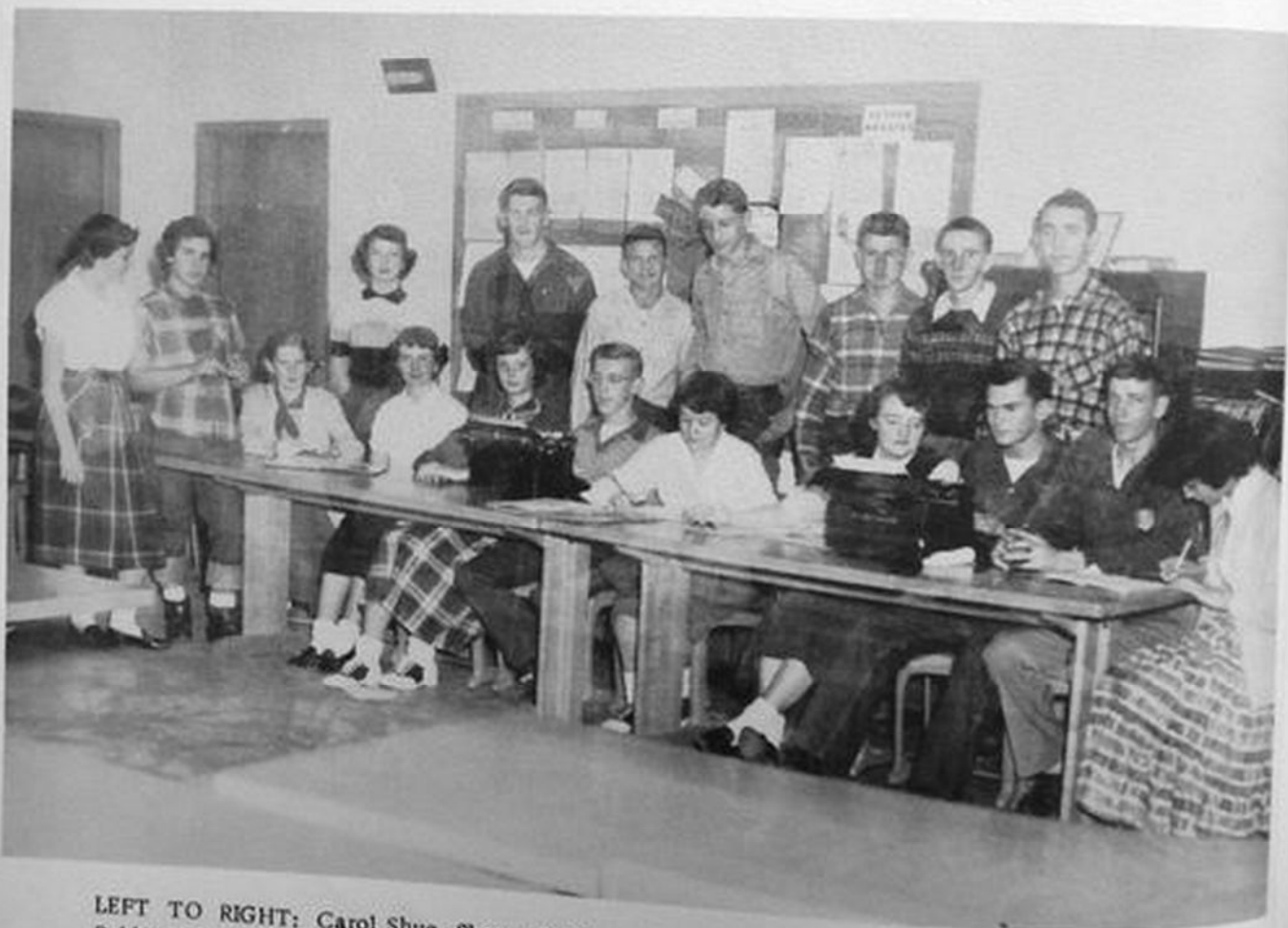
We hope you will find as much pleasure in our annual as we have had in preparing it for you. May many happy memories come to those who turn the pages of this book.

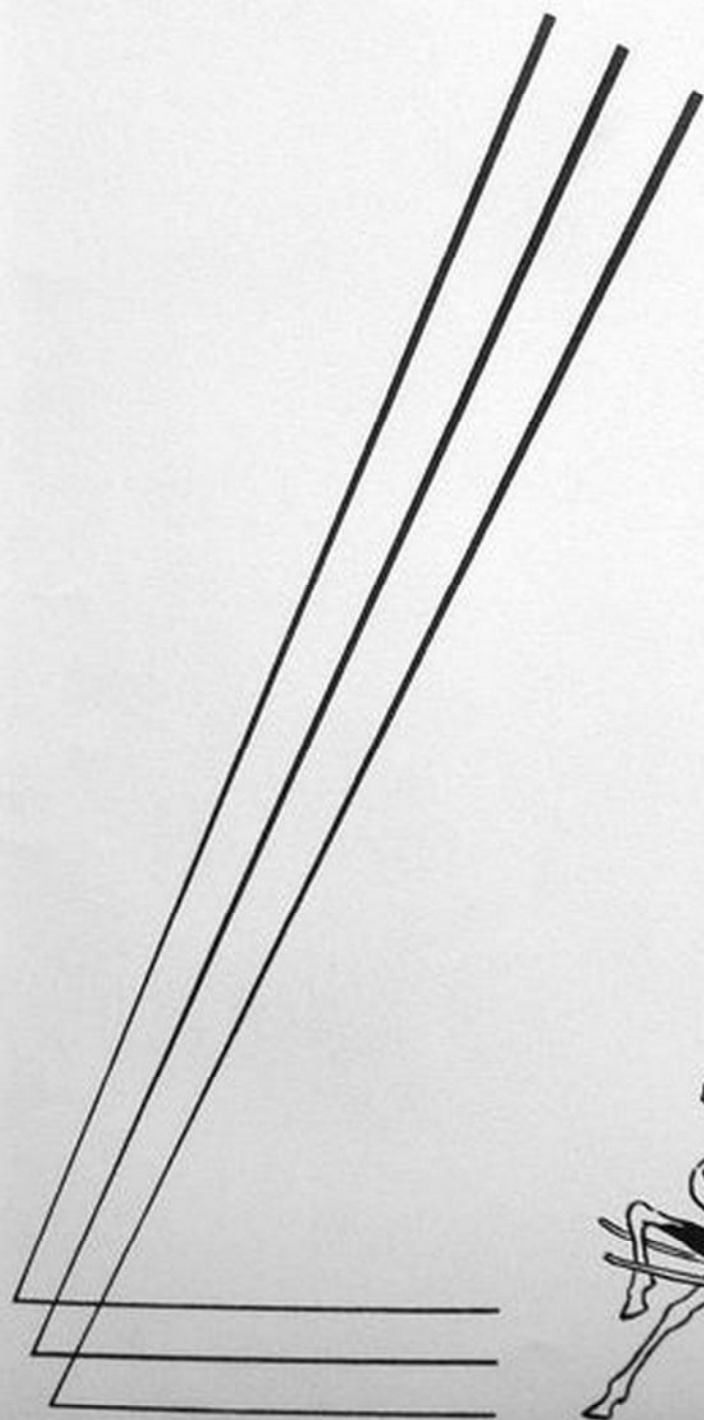

But our teachers fine work went unrewarded.

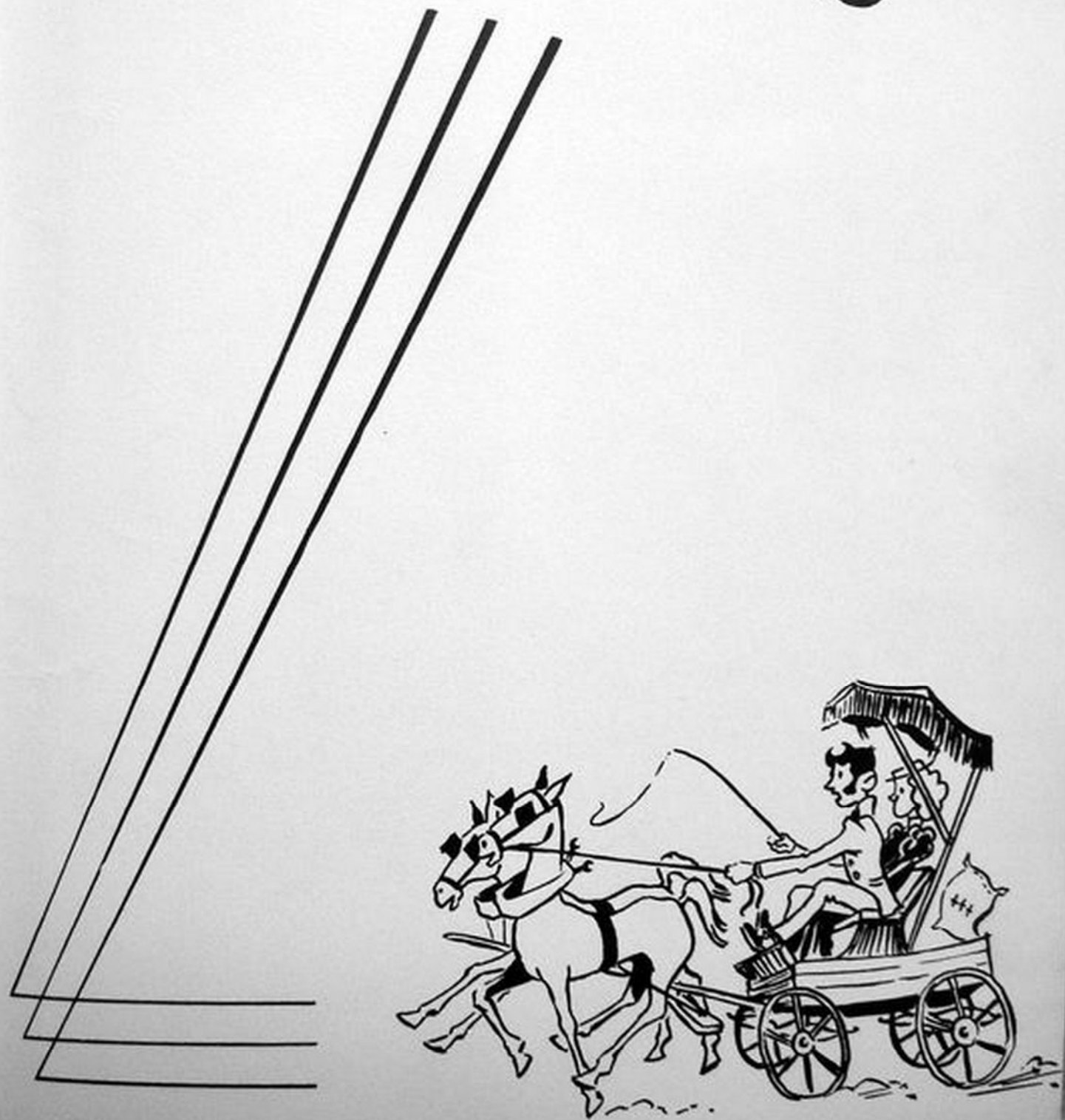
We must say good-by to our principal and faculty too,

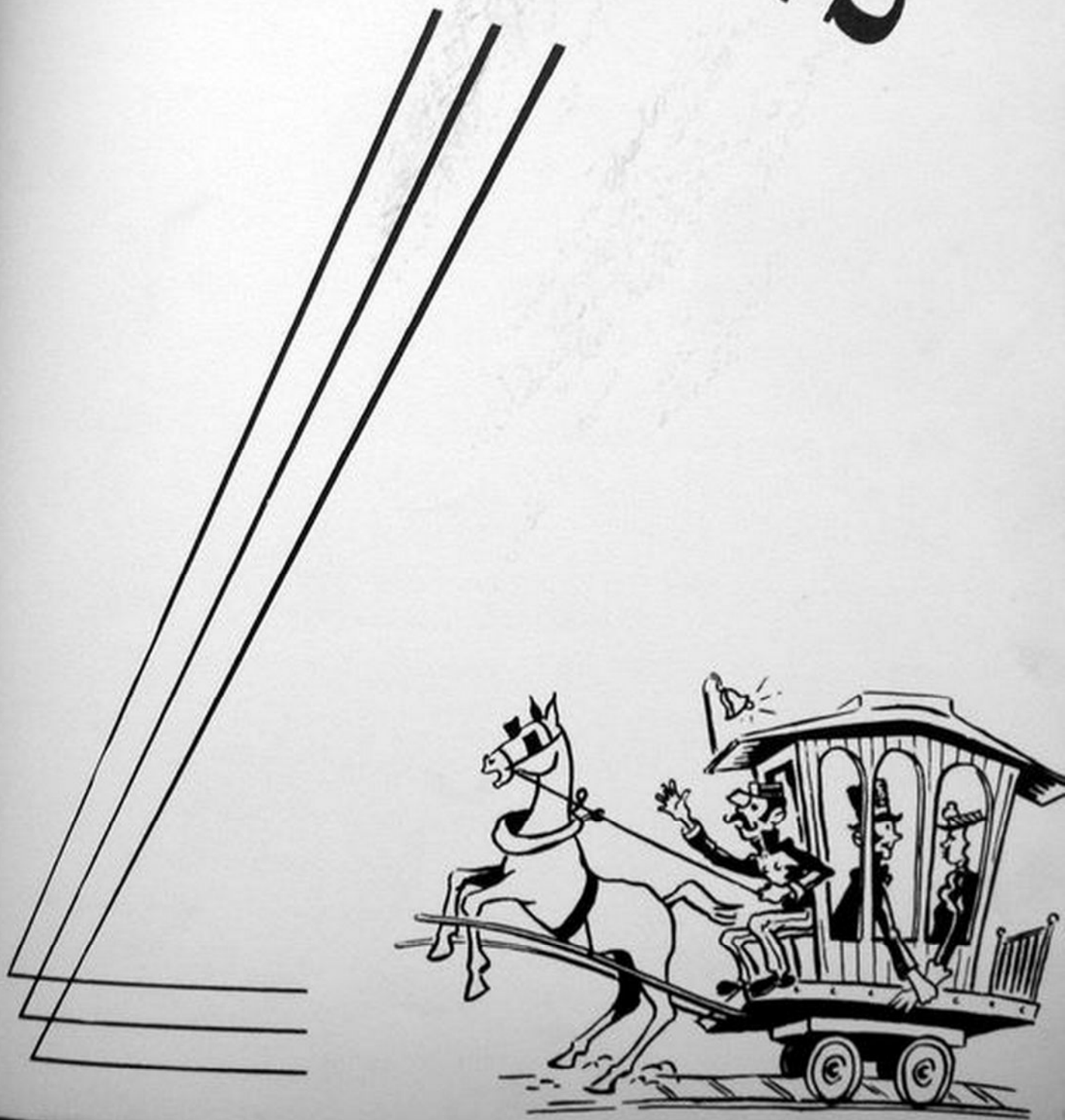
Bobby Barrett was a stock-car driver and was holding the record.

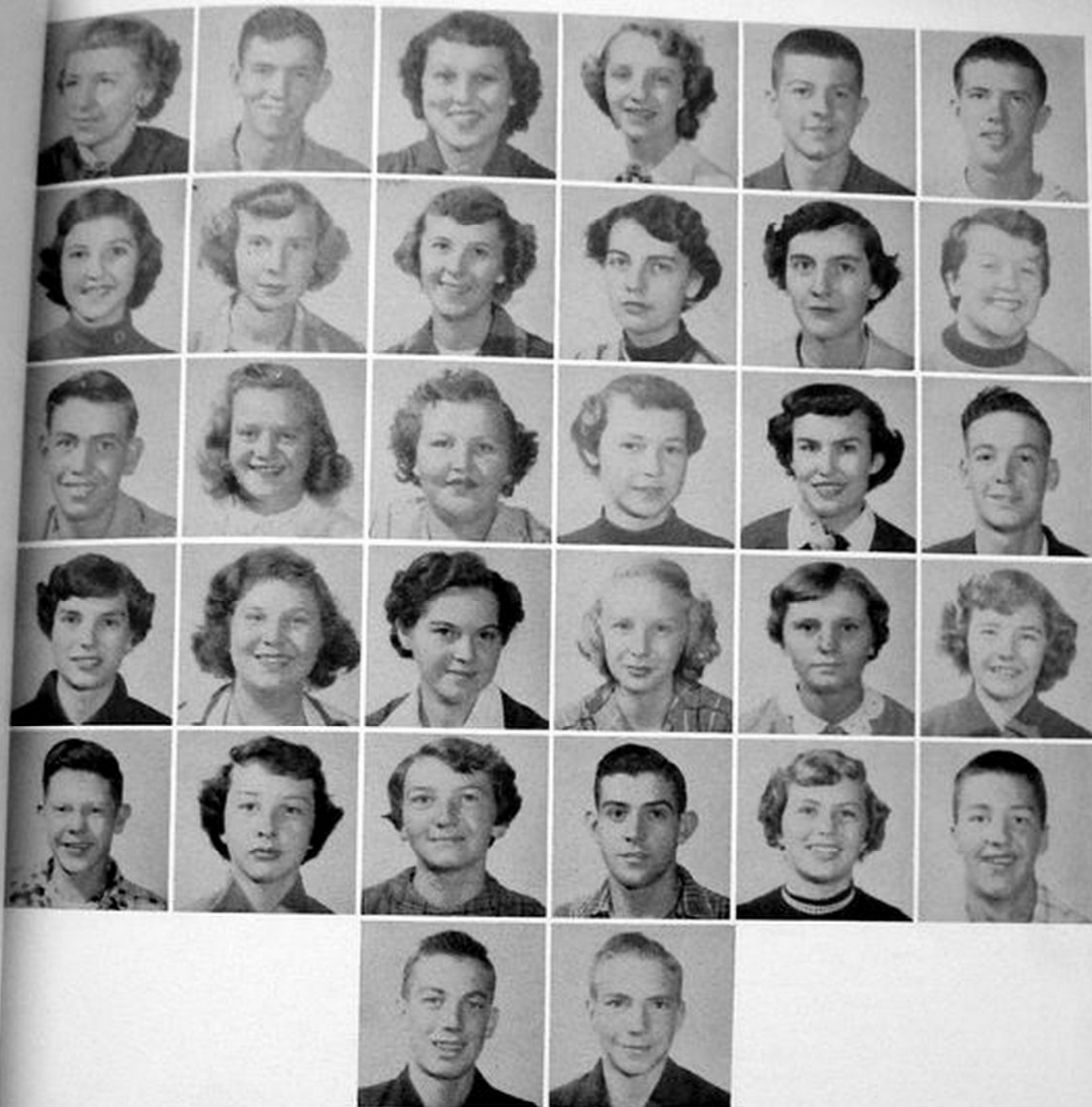

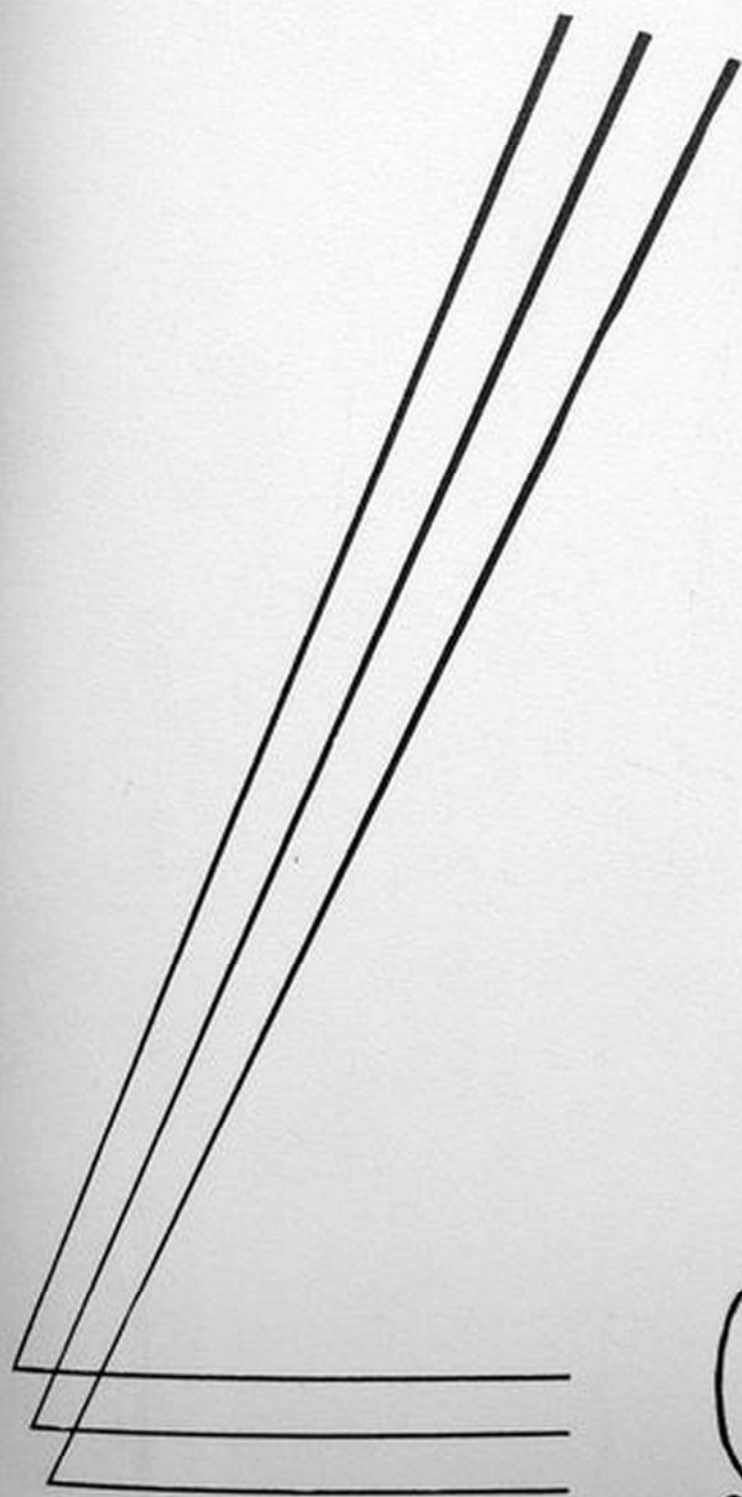
