We chose as our class colors, red and white, which we still carry. Our class sponsor, Miss Jane Sheets, has been with us through our four years in High School. Those who dropped out during the term were Walter Bagrich, Curtis Coleman, John Gabbert, Charlotte Jarvis, Lorena Morrison, and Pauline Roberts. During that year the following honors were bestowed upon us: Carolyn Hill, F. F. A. Sweetheart; Linda Clutter, queen of polio drive; Carolyn Hill, cheerleading trophy in the Sectional Basketball Tournament; Kenneth Rose, all tournament team in the Sectional Tournament; girls, the class basketball tournament; and James Coe, a medal for "Best Citizen".
