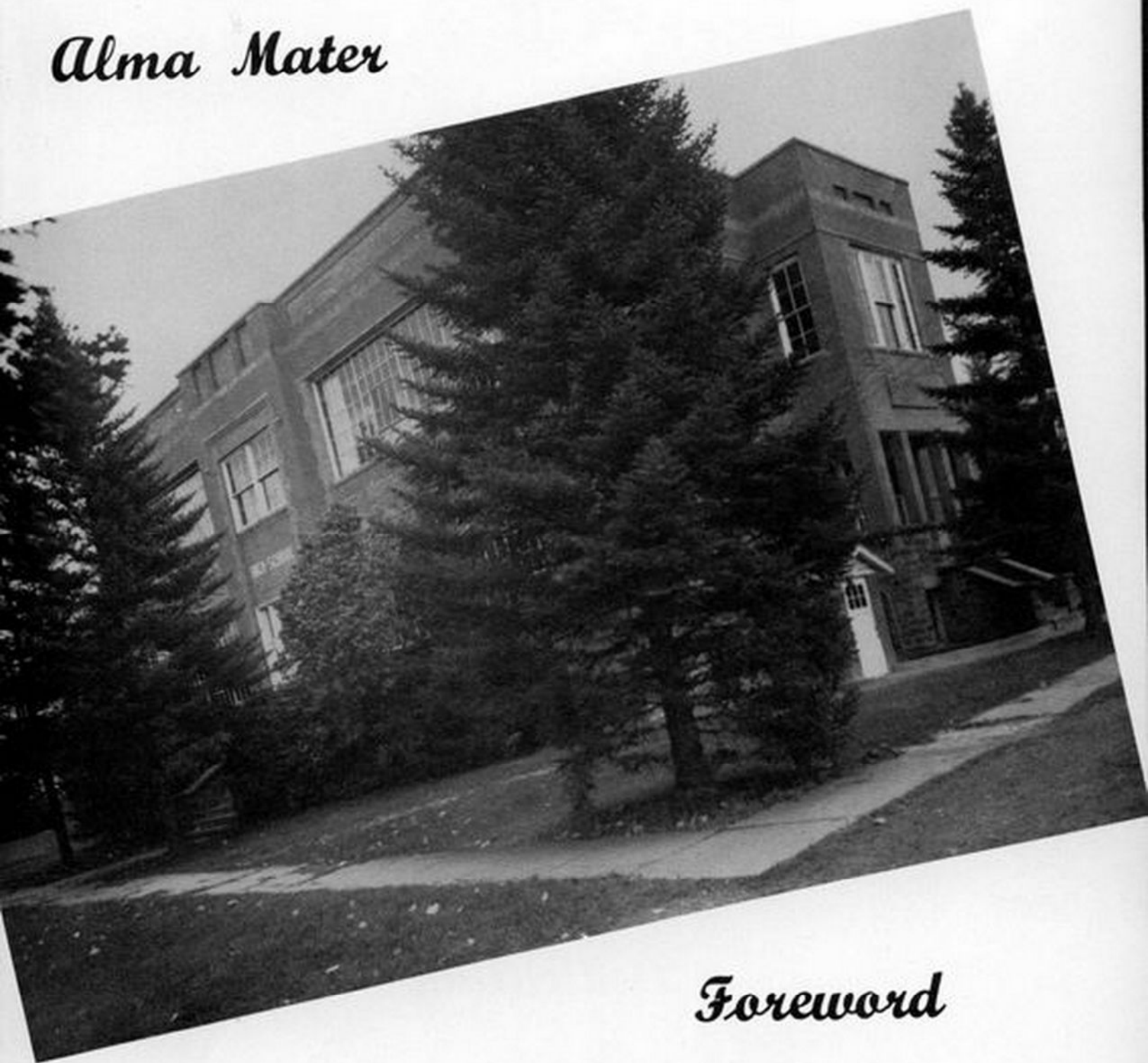

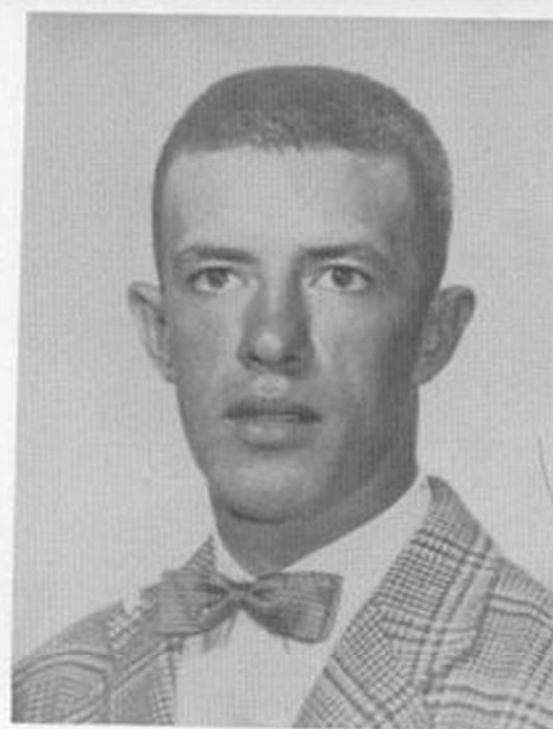

Those who dropped out during the term were Walter Bagrich, Curtis Coleman, John Gabbert, Charlotte Jarvis, Lorena Morrison, and Pauline Roberts.

During that year the following honors were bestowed upon us: Carolyn Hill, F. F. A.
