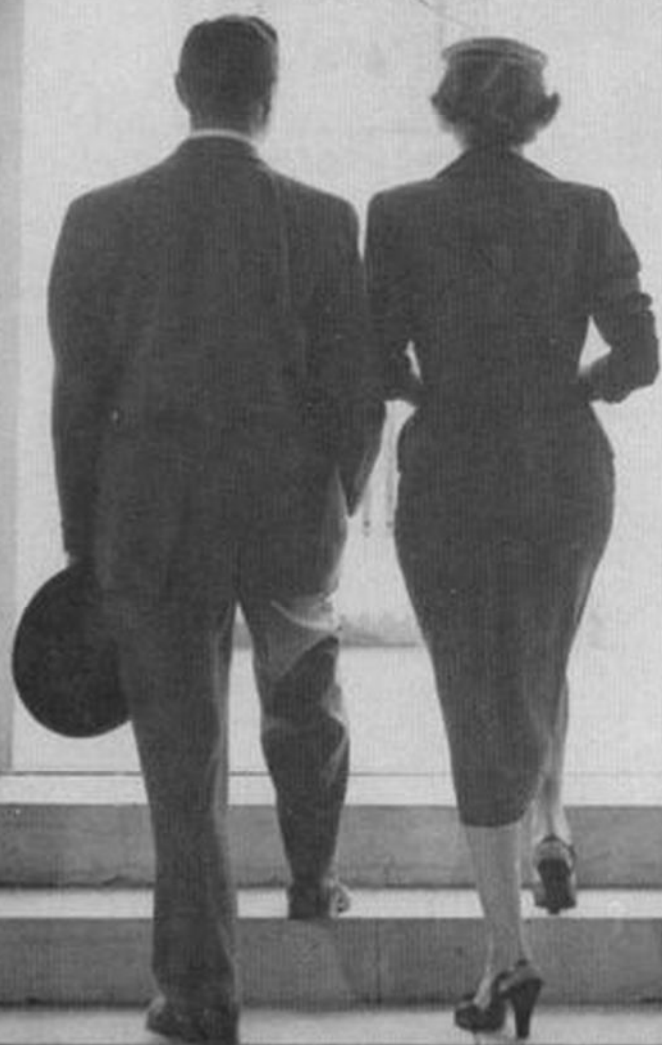

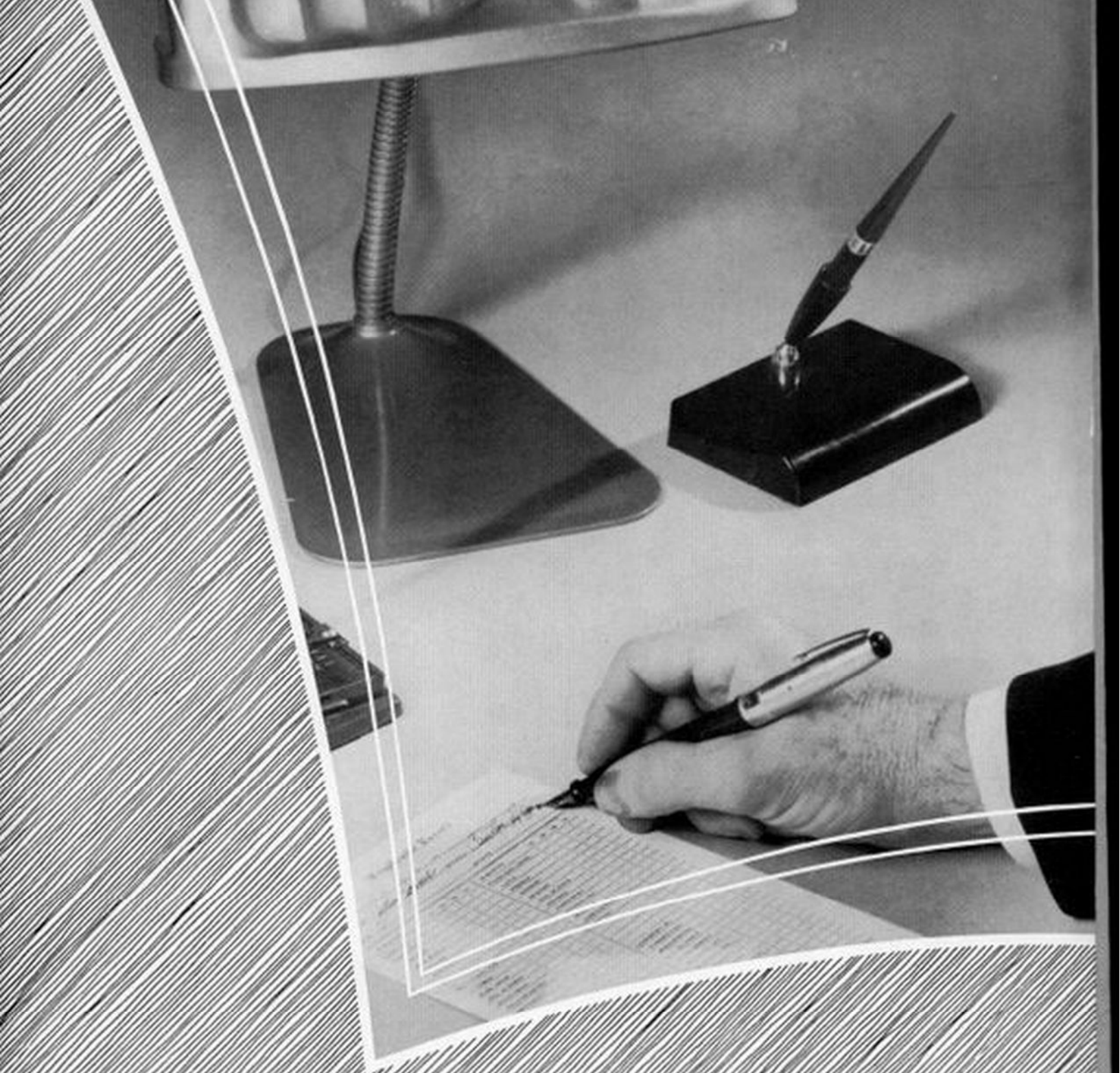

Class History

Garnett McCoy, Janice McCoy, Betty McMillion, and Jerry Rose were band majorettes; Martha McNeel and Linda Barcroft were high school cheerleaders. David May and Martha McNeel attended "Know Your State Government Day." Pete Rose represented our class at Boys' State. Mrs. Brill left us that year. In her place we received and welcomed Mr. Jack Tennant from Fairview, West Virginia. We got our long awaited class rings the first of January and gave our very successful play "The Big Blow-Up" February 29.

On September 5, 1956, we once more entered the doors of "Good Ole H.H.S.," but this was our last one as we were now what we had wanted to be for about eleven years -- "Dignified"?? Seniors!! We chose the following officers: President, David May; Vice-President, Roger Pritt; Secretary, Jane Ruckman; Treasurer, Delores Arbogast; Reporter, Ralph McKeever. Mr. Tennant had decided he'd rather go to college than be our sponsor, so we welcomed Mrs. Payne and Mrs. McLaughlin as our sponsors. Pete Rose and Ralph McKeever were football captains this year. Martha McNeel was high school cheerleader and F.F.A. Sweetheart. Delores Arbogast was chosen Homecoming Queen. Garnett McCoy, Janice McCoy, and Jerry Rose were again majorettes.

As this yearbook goes to press, we hope that these students who are now seniors will graduate in May. We are looking forward to our trip to Washington next spring and many other activities.

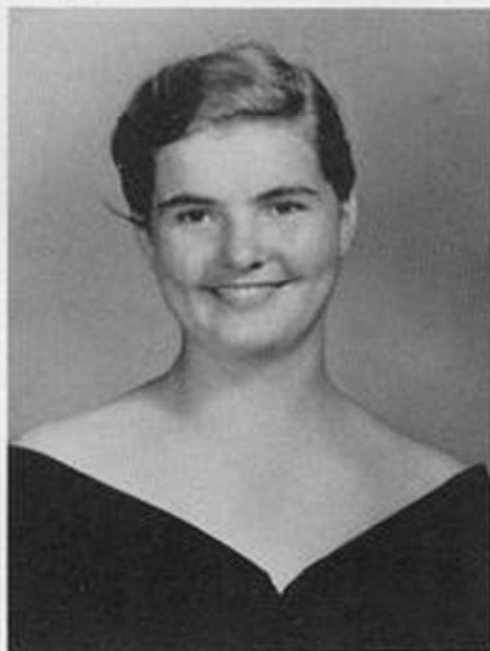

Jerry Rose wills to Earl Lawson a car, so that he won't have to walk to see his girl friend.

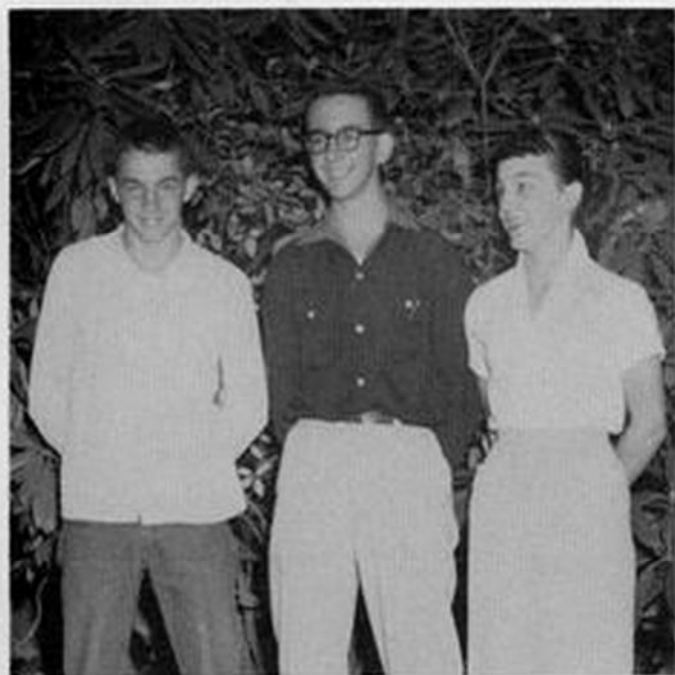
