As the reality of this school year fades into memories, our experiences and acquaintances will grow dim.

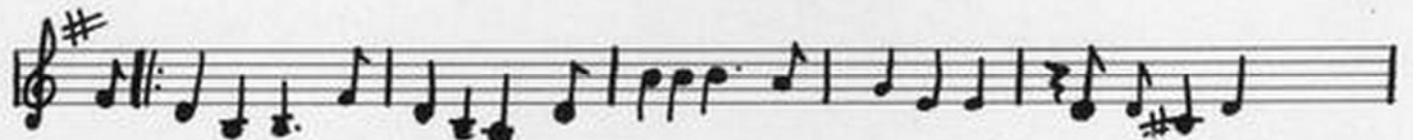
Thus the purpose of our theme is to keep ever anew in our minds the precious moments of our high school life.

We realize all too well that life is a serious business, but now we are going to abandon all care, and store between the course of this book these treasured memories of our early youth:

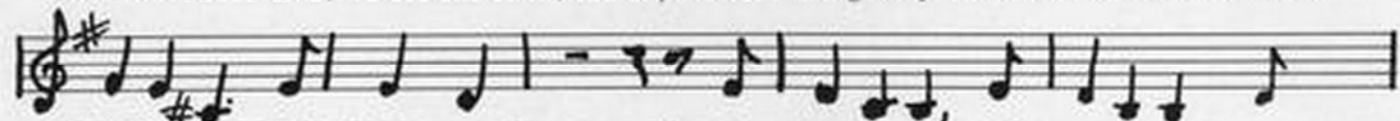
Memories from the prologue of the seventh grade to the grand finale of the seniors at graduation, these are our "Moments to Remember".
