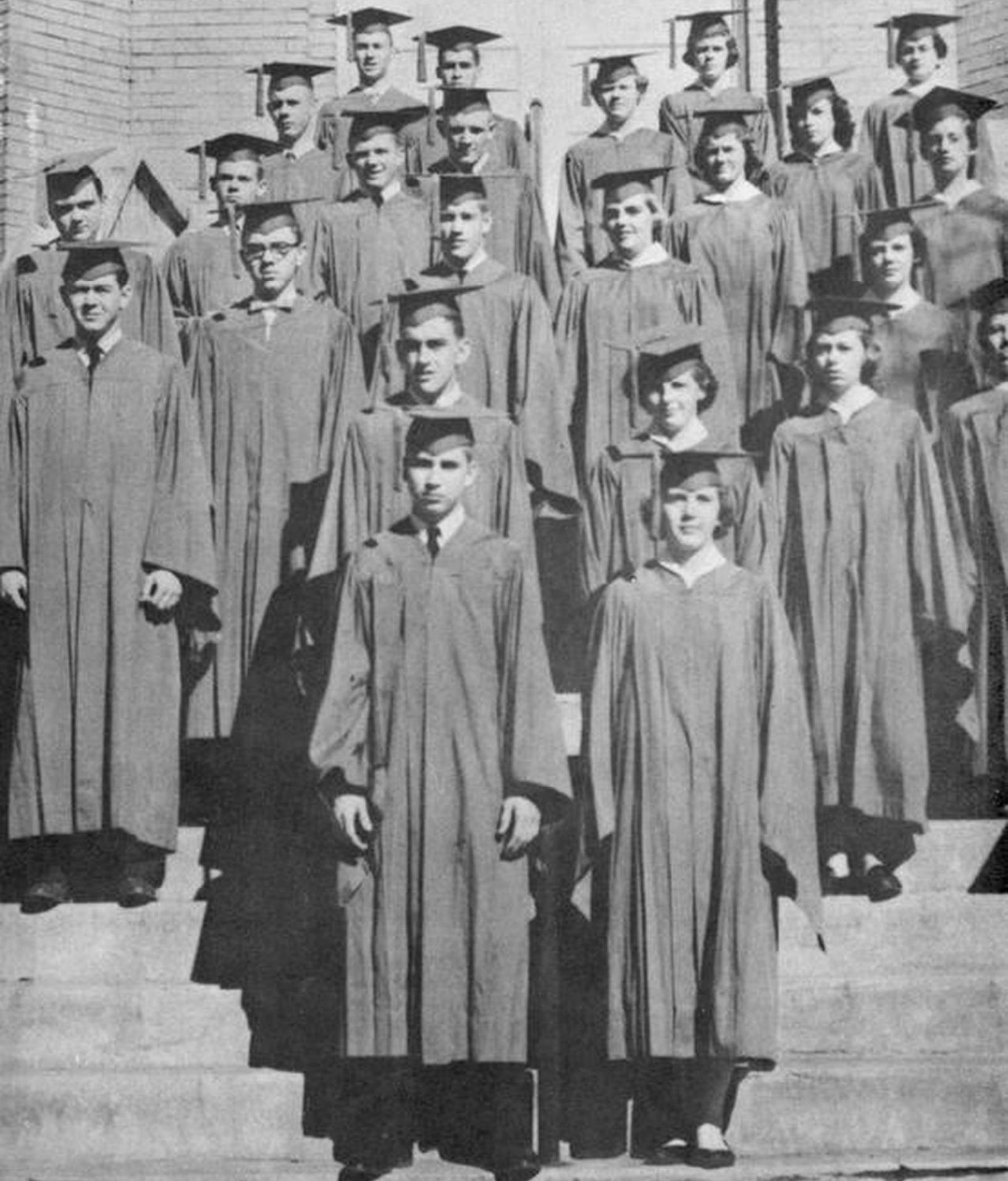

FOREWORD

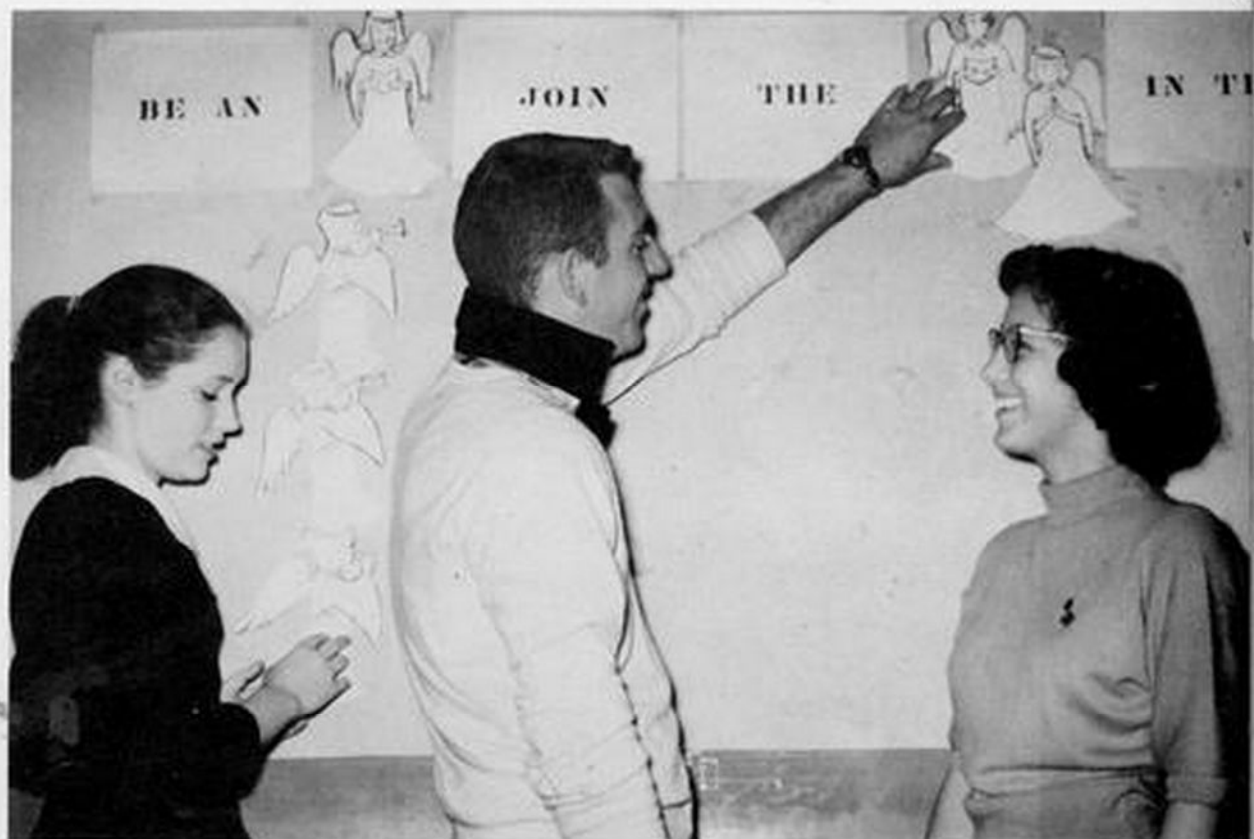

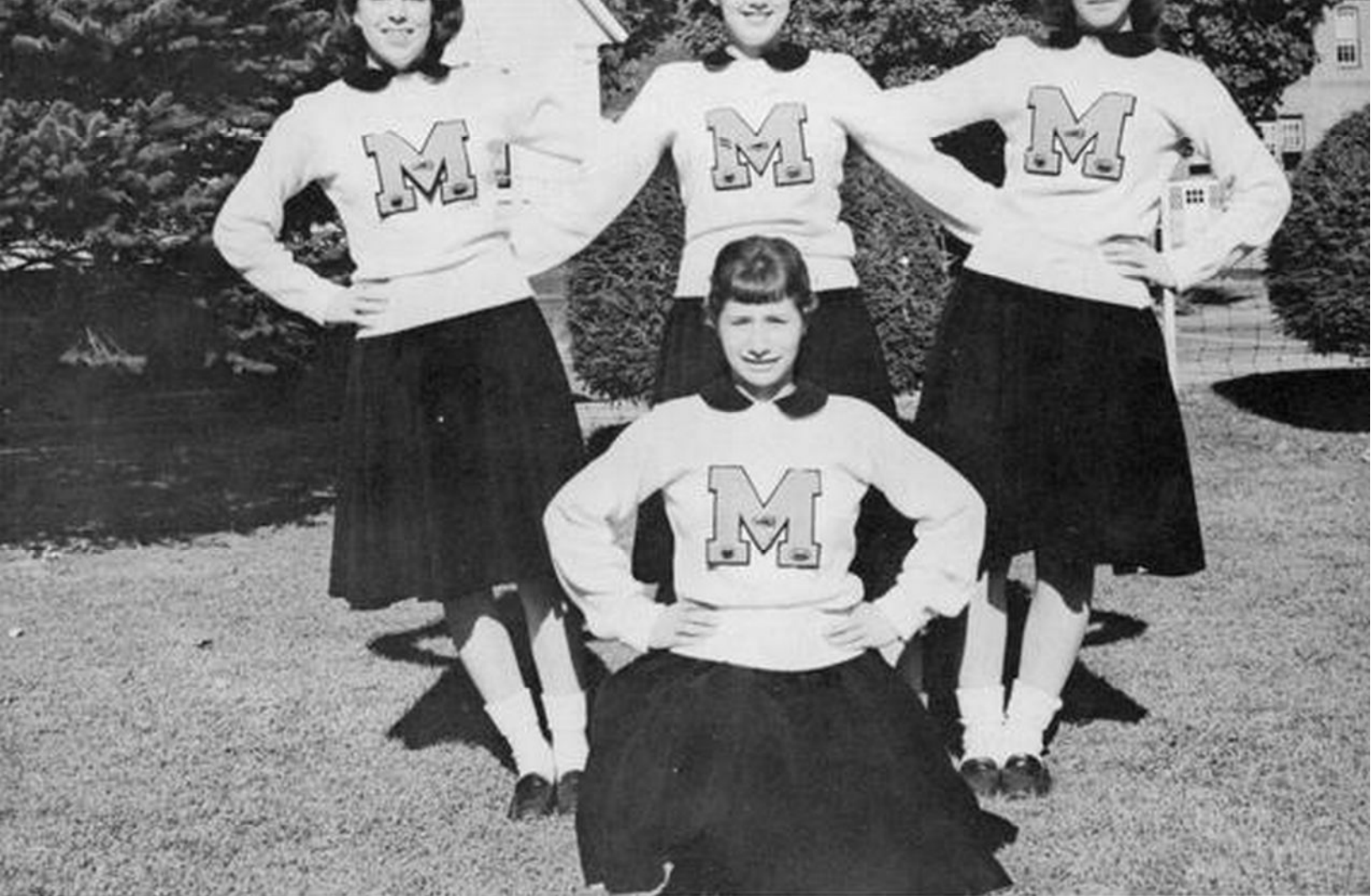
MARLINTON HIGH BASKETBALL TEAM
