





Norman Weinstein, Poet in Residence for Pocahontas and Randolph County Schools, worked with four English classes this year in the instruction of poetry. Weinstein, a native of New York and a wellknown poet, was sponsored by the Artists in Schools Program. His objectives were to get students to like and write poetry. Mathematics






