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

Introduction

AUTHORITY AND SCOPE—The economic censuses are required by law under Title 13 U.S. Code, sections 131, 191, and 224. The 1967 Census of Business portion of the economic censuses consists of firms engaged in retail trade, wholesale trade, and selected services (hotels and motels; personal, business, and repair services; amusement and recreation services including the motion picture industry; law firms; and architectural and engineering firms) which operated in the United States. In addition, the Census of Business covers public warehouses, dental laboratories, travel agencies, and truck and bus carriers not subject to economic regulation by the Interstate Commerce Commission.

CENSUS DISCLOSURE RULES—In accordance with Federal law governing census reports, any data which would disclose the operations of an individual establishment or business organization are not published. However, the number of establishments or firms in a kind of business is not considered a disclosure, so that this item may appear in instances where other items of information for the same kind of business or geographic area are withheld.

COVERAGE—This report covers firms engaged in offering legal advice or legal services on a contract or fee basis, the head or heads of which are members of the bar. (For further definition of a law firm as used in this report, see "Firm" under "Explanation of Terms" in appendix A.) The firms included in this report comprise Major Group 81 as defined in the Standard Industrial Classification Manual, 1967.¹

METHOD OF COVERAGE—In the 1967 economic censuses, law firms were divided into two categories—the "mail" universe and the "nonmail" universe. The coverage of each component and the method of obtaining census information for these two groups are described below.

1. The "Nonmail" Universe—This group consists of firms which were not required to file a regular census return and includes the following categories:

a. All "nonemployers"—Consists of all firms with no paid employment during 1967.

Receipts information for these firms was obtained from 1967 Federal income tax records. The census included only those nonemployer firms which reported a receipts volume of \$1,000 or more during 1967 or, having been in operation for less than the full year, reported receipts which would have reached a total of \$1,000 or more on an annual basis. Although representing more than half of all firms, the nonemployer segment in 1967 accounted for only about 17 percent of receipts of all law firms.

b. "Small employers" — "Employers" consist of all firms in the active records of the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) which were subject to payment of Federal Insurance Contribution Act (FICA) taxes. "Small firms" consist of all those firms with one to three employees. Although representing more than 82 percent of the employer firms, the "small employer" segment accounted for only 40 percent of receipts of all employer law firms.

Data on receipts, payroll, and employment for "small employer" firms were obtained from the administrative records of the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) and the Social Security Administration (SSA).

2. The "Mail" Universe—Information for firms in this group was obtained by means of a mail canvass. In terms of receipts, this is the largest component, accounting for 50 percent of receipts of all law firms and 60 percent of receipts of all employer firms. However, they represent less than 9 percent of all firms and less than 17 percent of all employer firms. It is from firms in this group that data, in addition to receipts, annual payroll, and employment, were collected. Appendix B presents a facsimile of the report form used in the mail canvass.


CLASSIFICATION—Nonemployer firms were classified on the basis of information supplied on the Federal income tax returns. The classification of firms in the mail universe (section 1 b above) was based on the primary source of each firm's receipts.

CORRECTIONS TO DATA—Corrections to the tables presented in this report, made immediately prior to publication, have not been carried beyond the lowest detail level unless they significantly affect the data. As a result the detail in some tables may not add to totals.

CENSUS REGIONS AND GEOGRAPHIC DIVISIONS OF THE UNITED STATES



Appendix A

GENERAL EXPLANATION

EXPLANATION OF TERMS

Associate lawyer—An associate lawyer is a lawyer employed by a law firm. It includes all lawyer "members" of professional corporations since they are employed by the firm. It excludes sole practitioners and partners.

Average annual net income per firm—Average annual net income per firm is derived by dividing "receipts," less the sum of "payroll entire year" and "nonpayroll expenses," by the "number of firms."

Average annual net income per sole practitioner and partner—Average annual net income per sole practitioner and partner is derived by dividing "receipts," less the sum of "payroll entire year" and "nonpayroll expenses," by the "number of sole practitioners and partners."

Employment size—Firms are classified by size according to the number of paid employees for the pay period including March 12, 1967. Sole practitioners and partners, even though they may have been actively engaged in the practice of law, are not counted as paid employees in determining employment size, nor is their compensation included in payroll.

Firm—A firm is the law practice of an individual practitioner, a partnership, or a professional corporation. It includes, as "nonemployer firms," individual practitioners without employees. However, individual lawyers who work as paid employees are not counted as law firms. It does not include law offices or associations operated as a service to individual lawyers engaged in a "group practice," organized for the purpose of sharing expenses. Members of such associations, or "groups," are included as separate firms. Associations taxed as partnerships are treated as partnership firms.

Lawyer—Statistics for "lawyers" in this report include sole practitioners, partners, and associate lawyers.

Number of lawyers—Firms are classified by size according to the number of lawyers for the pay period including March 12, 1967. The number of lawyers includes sole practitioners and partners as well as associate lawyers.

Paid employees for the pay period including March 12, 1967—Paid employees consist of the number of employees, including salaried officers and executives of corporations, who were on the payroll in the pay period including March 12, 1967. Included are employees on paid sick leave, paid holidays, and paid vacations. Sole practitioners and partners of unincorporated firms are not included. The definition of paid employees is the same as used by the Internal Revenue Service for purposes of reporting on Form 941.

Payroll entire year—Payroll includes all forms of compensation such as salaries, wages, commissions, bonuses, vacation allowances, sick leave pay, and the value of payments in kind (such as free meals and lodgings) paid during the year to all employees. For professional corporations, it includes amounts paid to officers and executives; for unincorporated firms, it does not include compensation of proprietors or of partners. Payroll is reported before deductions for social security, income tax, insurance, dues, etc. This definition of payroll is the same as that used by the Internal Revenue Service for purposes of reporting on Form 941.

Receipts—Receipts include the total of all receipts from the practice of law. It also includes receipts from clients, such as commissions from the management or sales of real estate, insurance, etc. Receipts may be on a "cash" or "accrual" basis in conformity with the firms accounting practice. Total receipts exclude income from investments, rental of real estate, sales of fixed assets, etc.

Although the count of firms in this report represents the number in business at the end of the year, the receipts figures include receipts of all firms in business at any time during the year. Nonemployer firms are included in the tables if they operated at an annual receipts volume rate of \$1,000 or more; however, their reported receipts have not been projected to a full year's operation.

Receipts size—Firms are classified by receipts size, based on volume of receipts, in 1967. For the tables in this report, receipts figures were rounded to thousands of dollars before establishing the size classifications.

Specialized practice vs. general practice—Specialized practice, for purposes of this report, is any field of specialization accounting for 25 percent or more of the firm's receipts during 1967. Firms engaged in specialized practice are those engaged in one or more specialized fields of practice. All firms not engaged in a specialized field of practice, in accordance with this definition, are classified as engaged in general practice.

Standard metropolitan statistical area—The standard metropolitan statistical areas (SMSA's) for which data are shown are those defined by the Bureau of the Budget.¹ A standard metropolitan statistical area is a county or group of contiguous counties (except in New England) which contains at least one central city of 50,000 inhabitants or more, or "twin cities" with a combined population of at least 50,000. In addition to the county or counties containing such a city or cities, contiguous counties are included in an SMSA if, according to certain criteria, they are essentially metropolitan in character and are socially and economically integrated with the central city. In New England, towns and cities rather than counties are the units used in defining an SMSA.

SMSA population-size categories presented in this report are based on the 1960 Population Census.

Legal form of organization:

Individual practitioner—A firm owned by one individual. It was assumed, for all such firms, that the owner was a lawyer, active in the firm.

Partnership—A firm owned by two or more persons each of whom has a financial interest in the firm.

Professional corporation—Firms organized and incorporated under laws in certain States

permitting incorporation by law firms. In 1967 there were only a very small number of professional corporations engaged in the practice of law. Since the presentation of separate data for these firms would, in most tables, result in disclosures as defined by census rules (see Introduction), data for the "professional corporation" classification are combined with "partnerships" in the "all firms" category. Special inquiries for professional corporations were not tabulated.

Other legal forms—Estates, receiverships, joint ventures, cooperatives, etc. These are firms whose legal form of ownership is not one of those defined above. In 1967 there were only a very small number of firms engaged in the practice of law not classified as sole practitioners, partnerships, or professional corporations. Since the presentation of separate data for these firms would, in most tables, result in disclosure as defined by census rules (see Introduction), data for these firms are combined with "partnerships" in the "all firms" category. Special inquiries for these firms are not tabulated.

Associations—Associations are not treated as separate legal forms or organization. (See "Firms" above.)

SPECIAL TABULATIONS

Special tabulations of data collected in the 1967 Census of Business may be obtained on computer tape, on punch cards, or in tabular form. The data provided in such special tabulations will be in summary form and will be subject to the same rules prohibiting disclosure of confidential information (including name, address, kind of business, or other data for individual business establishments or companies) as are the regular publications.
