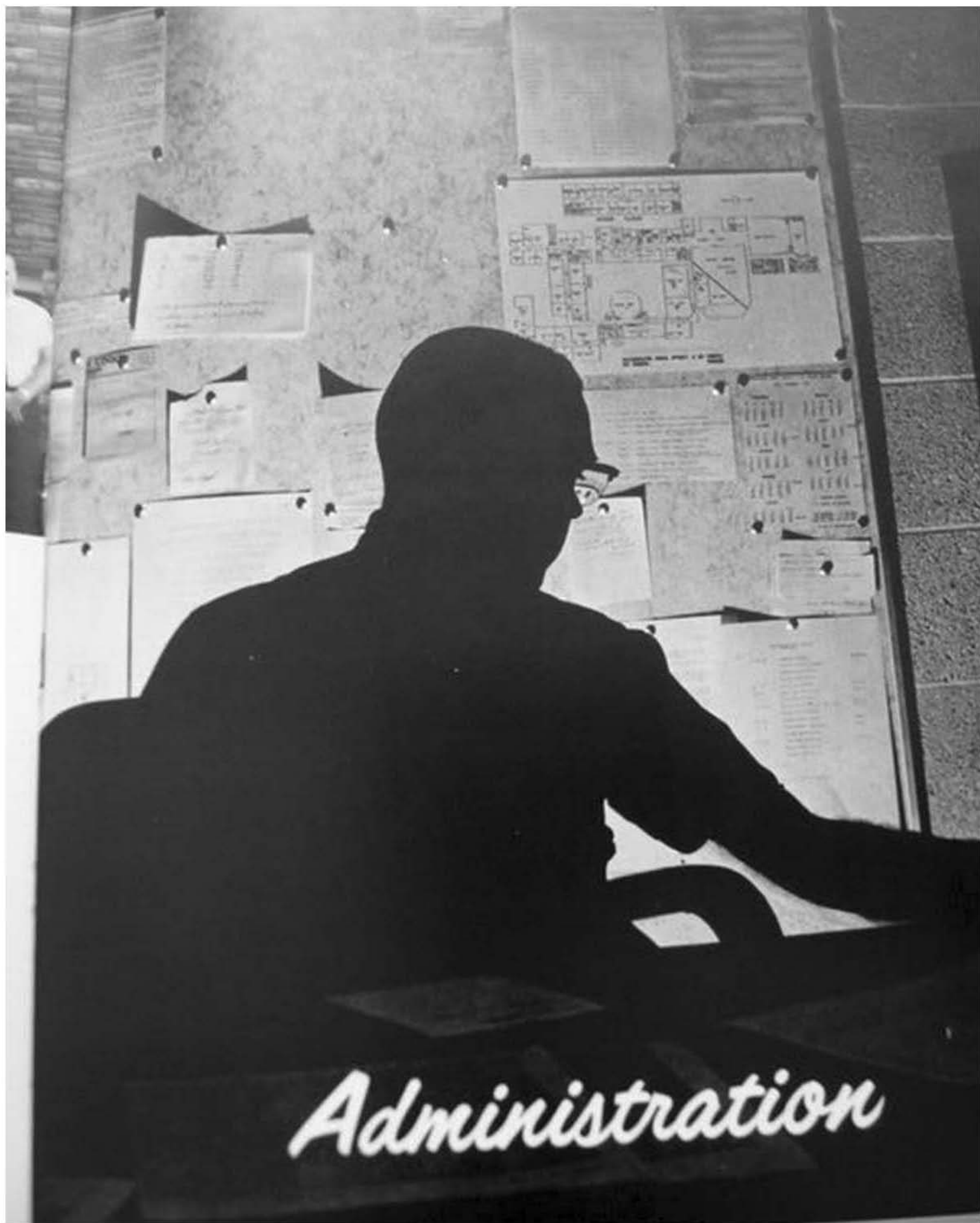


FAREWELL TO MARLINTON HIGH SCHOOL

CONFLAGRATION



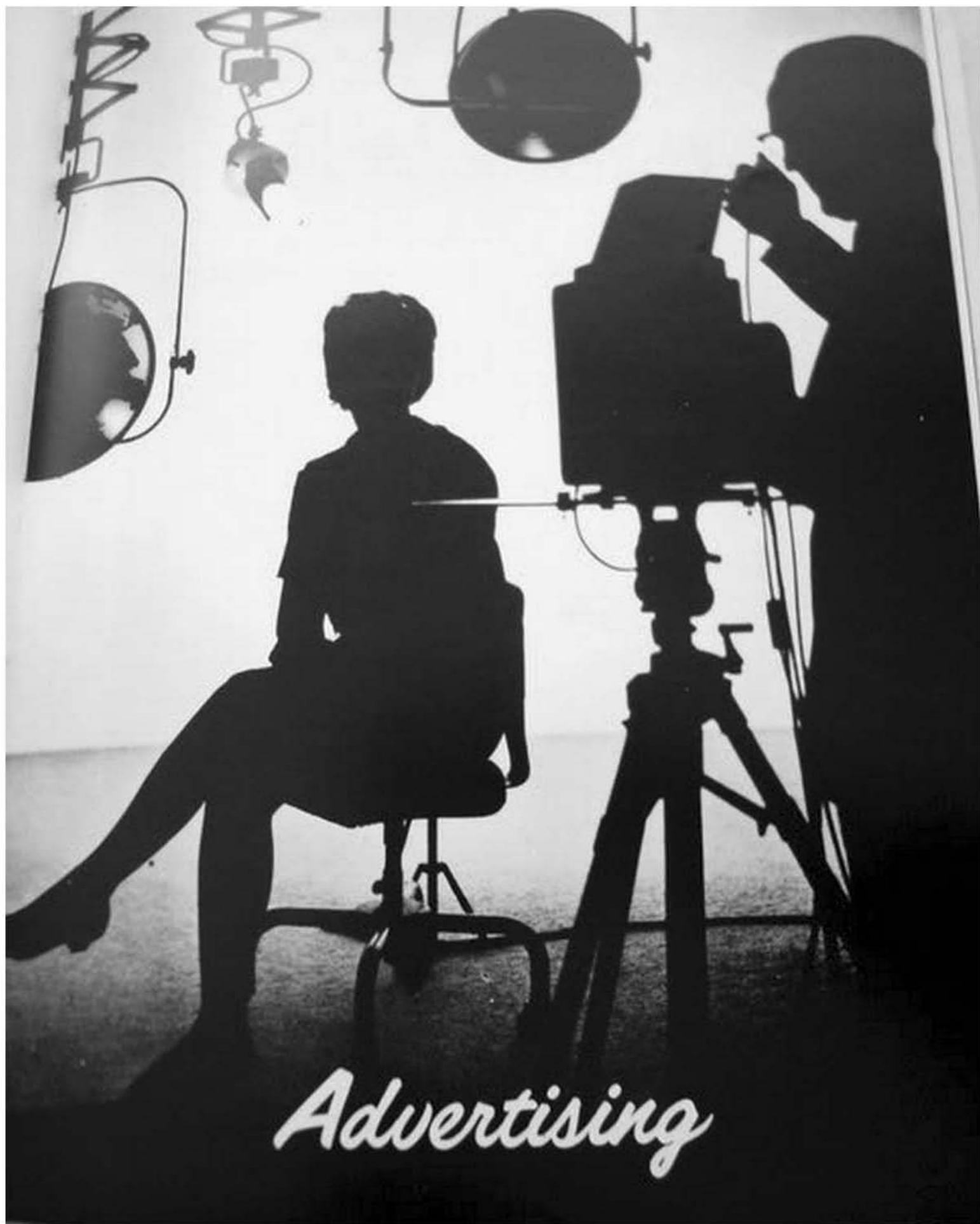
The year of 1967 will be long remembered by the students of Marlinton High. As you can see in the picture at the left of the page our Junior High was burned in June and one month later caught fire again. This building was the newest school building in Pocahontas County. This building was occupied by the 7th and 8th graders, Vo.-Ag. Students, The Board of Education, and also served as a garage for the school buses.

As a result of this fire the Board of Education had to purchase three Mobile School Units to be used as classrooms for the Junior High students.

The Frankford teams missed trying the Copperheads by three extra points which proved to be the downfall of the Pirates.

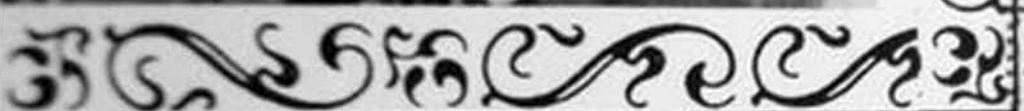
Frankford scored first on a three yard plunge by McClintic,

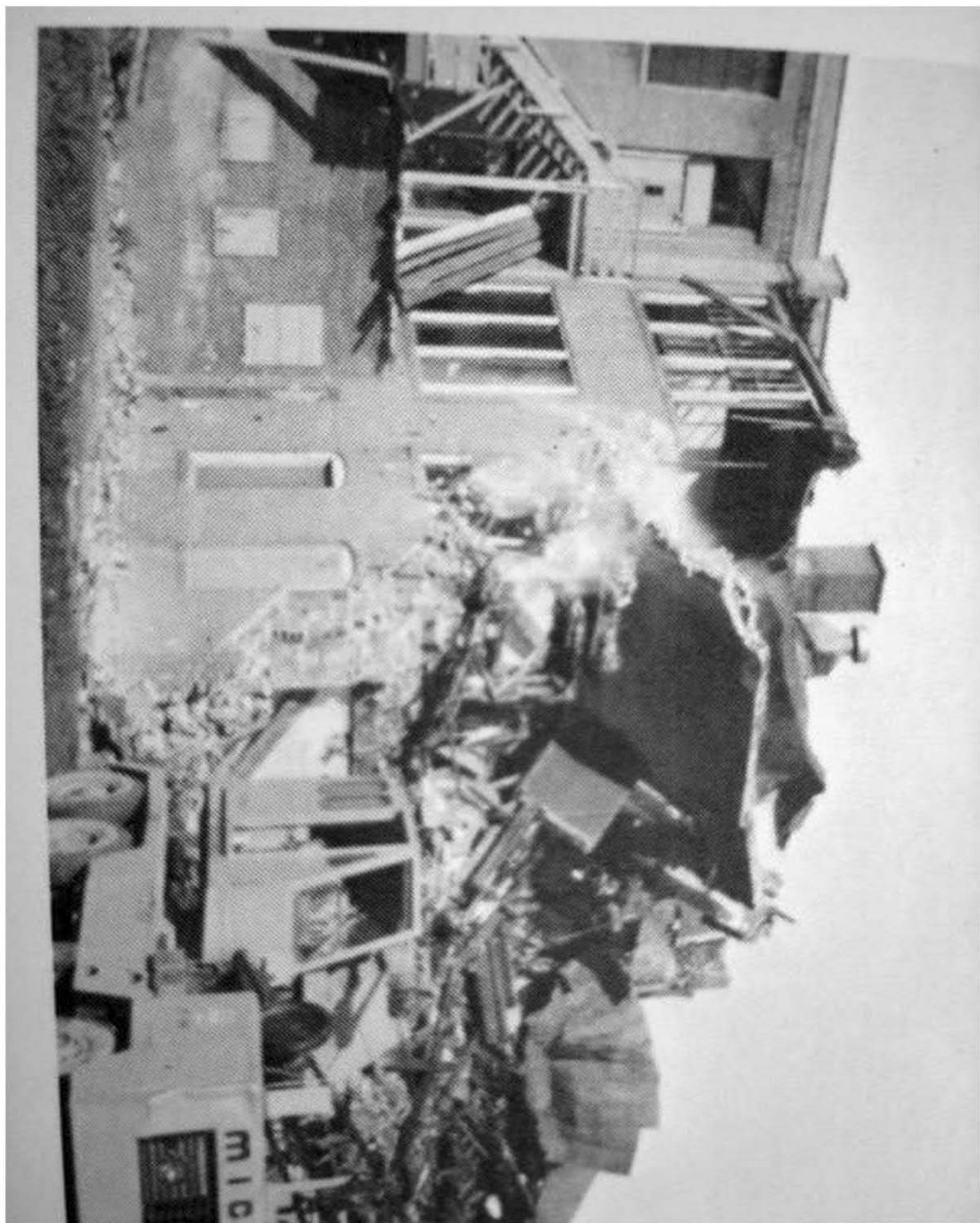


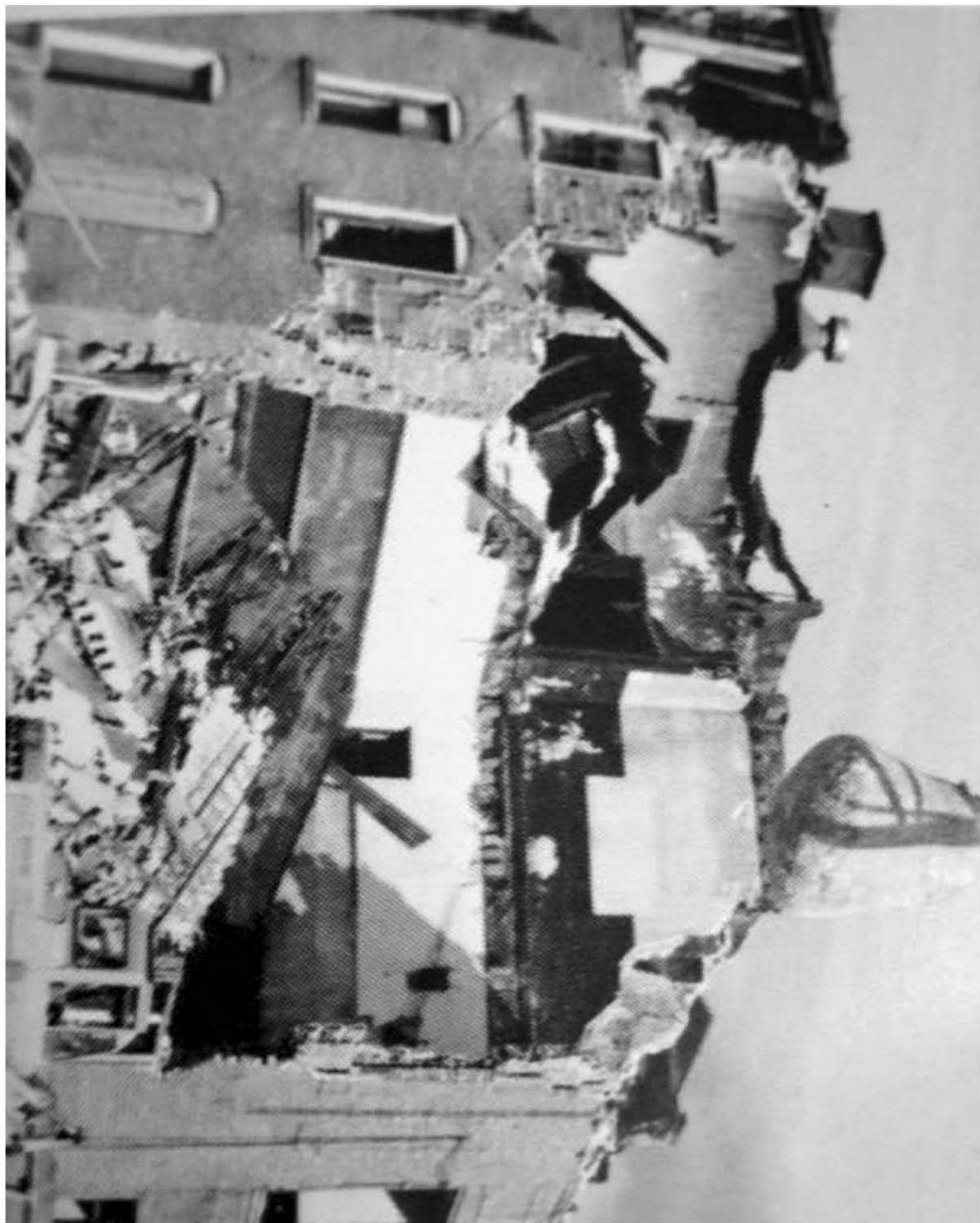












FAREWELL TO HARLINGTON HIGH SCHOOL
