

Video-pornography games cause protest

NEW YORK, NY—When Custer's Revenge, a video game depicting a sexual assault on an Indian woman tied to a stake, was introduced at a video show here recently, 300 American Indian activists and members of women's groups took to the streets to protest.

"It's racist and it's vulgar. It says that

it's OK to rape some women; it says it's OK to rape Indian women," said Virginia Cornue, executive director of the New York chapter of the National Organization of Women. She joined the picket line outside the hotel where the National Music, Sound and Video Conference was held.
