

# Groups protest game

GARY, Ind. (AP) - Five northwest Indiana women's groups are urging a boycott of a video game, "Custer's Revenge."

Spokeswomen say they're upset with the game because it gives a visual image of American soldiers raping American Indian women.

The women are arguing that

the game isn't just depicting violence against women, but that it also promotes the idea that all men are rapists and encourages violence through the images.

Members of the Calumet Women United Against Rape, Northwest Indiana Women's Bureau, the Lake County Rape Taskforce, National

Organization for Women and the Gary Commission for Women say they find the game objectionable and are asking that stores stop distributing and people stop purchasing the game.

Custer's Revenge is produced by the Mystique Entertainment Division of American Multiple Industries, Inc. of Northridge, Calif.
