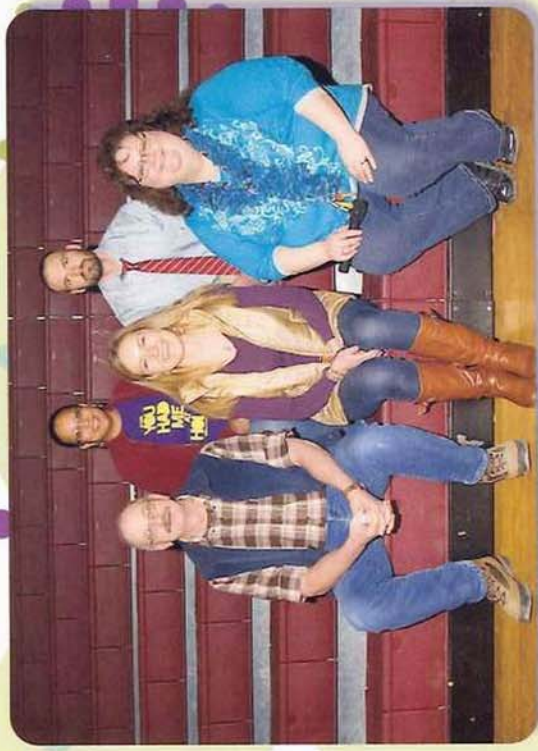
SOPHOMORE CLASS

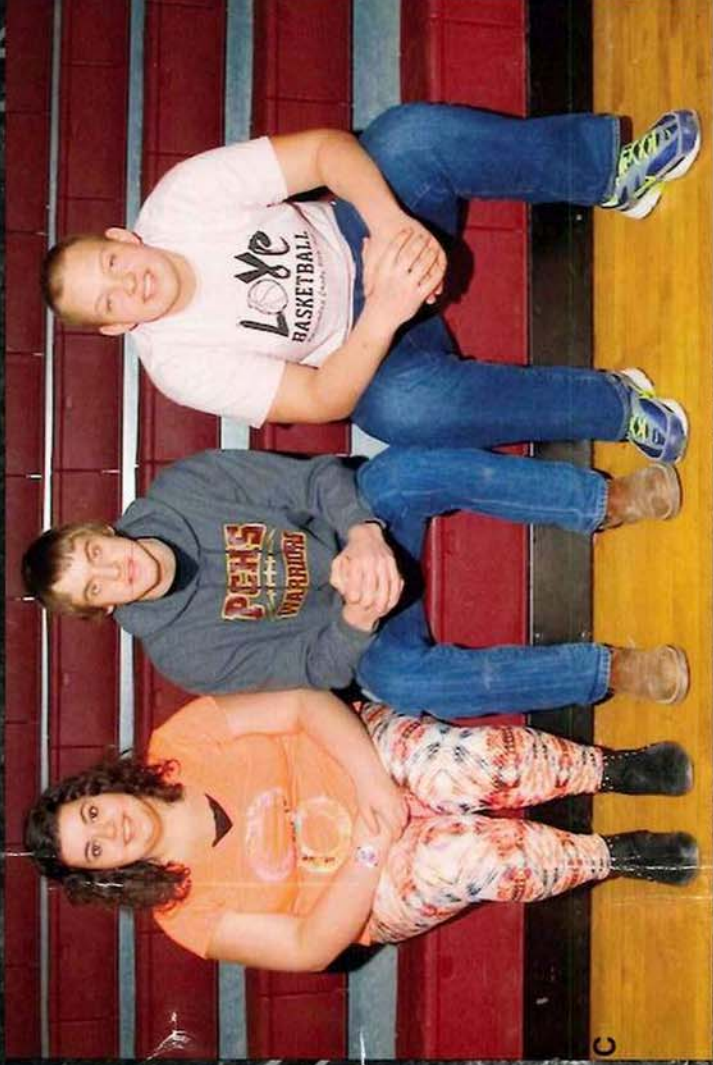
Freshmen Class

During forestry, students had the opportunity to walk in the woods and learn about trees and how to identify them. Mr. Garber taught the students how to identify trees by the bark and their leaves. 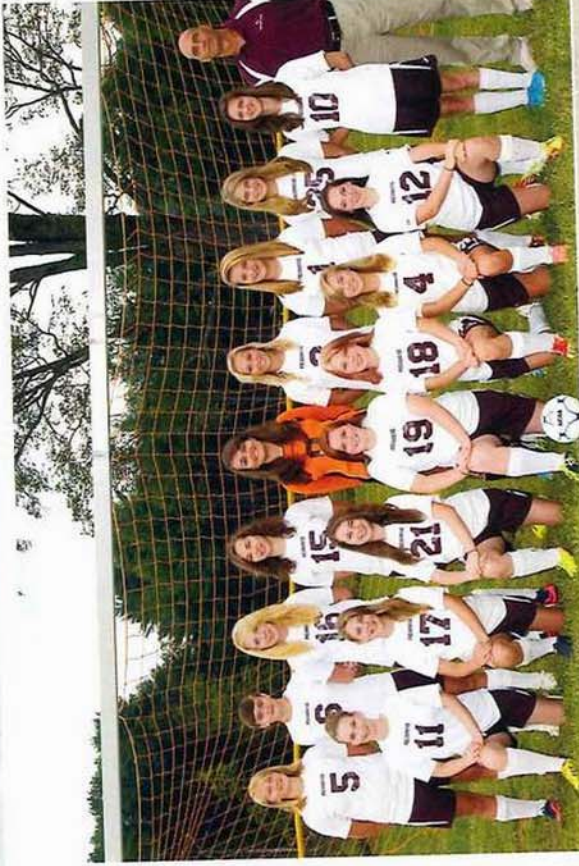

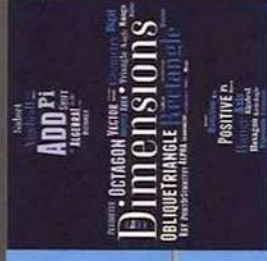

During forestry, students had the opportunity to walk in the woods and learn about trees and how to identify them. Mr. Garber taught the students how to identify trees by the bark and their leaves. Students also spent some time in the classroom learning about the woods from our workbooks and by playing vocal games. Mr. Garber taught students how to protect themselves from a forest fire; and what type of tools you use to cut down trees. The forestry class also learned how to use a compass and to pace off steps away from the tree to see how many logs are in a tree. We also made Biltmore sticks to measure the trees when we were far enough away from them. In wildlife management, students learned how to make habitats such as rabbit and bird houses. The students also learned about the edible plants and non-edible plants. The class went to the stream and looked for aquatic life. They found water pennies, leeches, and crawdads.
