SERIES

Biggest Surprise Since Bull Run: Ken Burns' *The Civil War* (PBS) disarmed critics, captured viewers and routed the competition by skillfully weaving the photographs, letters, speeches and songs of a bygone and bloody era. The result: history brought to life with the intimacy of a campfire chronicle and the immediacy of the evening news.

Ed Learned to Talk: *Cop Rock's* singing policemen, rapping street gangs and harmonizing juries left viewers of this ABC series gasping in bewilderment.

Best New Series, Case Closed: *Law & Order* (NBC). No singing, no dancing—just tough, methodical detective

work, followed by shrewd courthouse politicking and some of the most provocative plot twists you'll ever see.

The Twin Peaks Award for Quirkiest New Series: *To Northern Exposure* (CBS). With its likable collection of oddballs and misfits and its bawdy, laid-back humor, this is a show that grows on you—like antlers on a moose.

The Overexposure Award for Cult Series That Ran a Season Too Long: *To Twin Peaks* (ABC). With its dwarfs, demons, extraterrestrials and extra-

marital liaisons, *Peaks* got too confusing for even its most devoted fans.

The Fred Flintstone Award for Funniest Fossil Foolery: *Dinosaurs* (ABC) endowed those creatures with amazingly human expressions and a hip, '90s, blue-collar sensibility.

The We Kept Hoping We'd Wake Up and Discover It Was All a Bad Dream Award: To the far-fetched finale of *Dallas* (CBS), in which J.R. meets his guardian devil—a helluva way to end a once-great show.

The Now You See Him, Now You Don't Award: To CBS's *The Flash*, for an all-too-brief season of classy effects, campy villains and a catchy theme (by Danny "Batman" Elfman).

Most Indigestible Sitcom: *Sunday Dinner* (CBS). Norman Lear may have been a master chef 20 years ago, but his

latest concoction—a mulligan stew flavored with ruminations on religion—was a chore to stomach.

Best Career Moves: Katie Couric being promoted to co-anchor on *Today* (NBC); Tommy Mullaney (John Spencer), Zoey Clemmons (Ceclia Hoffmann) and C.J. Lamb (Amanda Donohoe) joining *L.A. Law* (NBC).

Worst Career Move: Henry Kissinger as guest weatherman on *CBS This Morning*.

Cruelest Exit: Rosalind Shays (Diana Muldaur) falling down the elevator shaft on *L.A. Law*.

The Middle-Age Blues Award: To *thirtysomething*, which got deep-sixed by ABC.

The Lighten Up, It's Only a Sitcom Award: To CBS's *Designing Women* for its distracting backstage feuding.

Father of the Year: Homer Simpson. Hey—you try raising Bart.

Mother-to-Be of the Year: Murphy Brown. Who's the father? And didn't Molly Dodd already go through this?

Most Improved Series: *Star Trek: The Next Generation* (syndicated). State-of-the-art sci-fi.

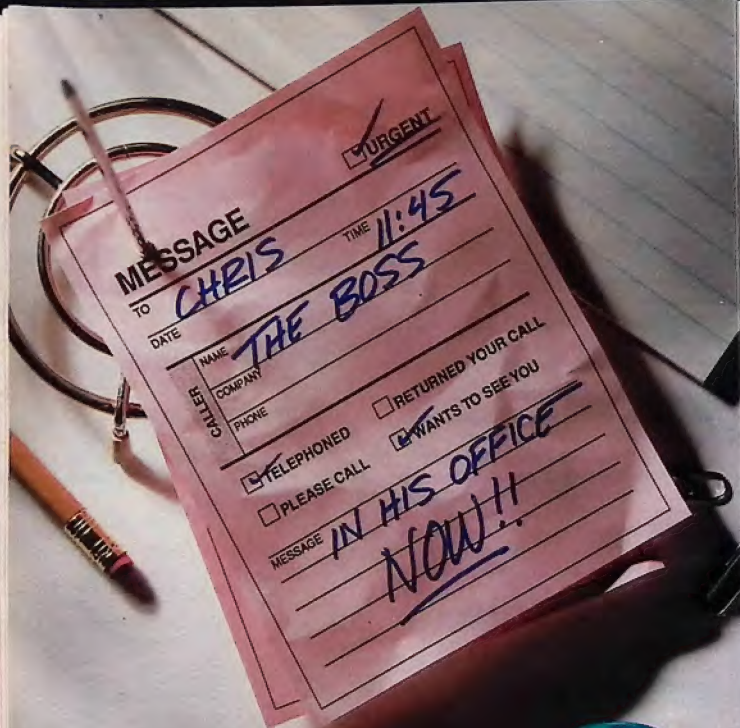

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This week on TV: The 62nd All-Star Game

Out of left field

Sometimes it's the unlikeliest heroes who hit those game-winning homers

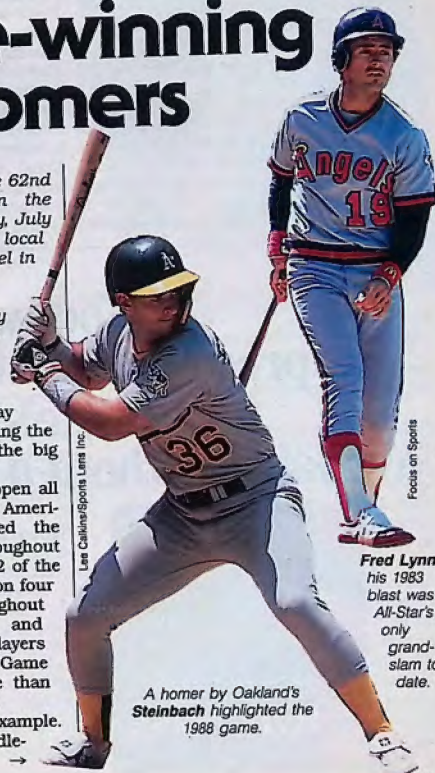

CBS is scheduled to present the 62nd Baseball All-Star Game from the SkyDome in Toronto on Tuesday, July 9, at 8 P.M. (ET). Check the local listings for the time and channel in your area.

There are two things everybody knows about Major League Baseball's annual All-Star Game: the National League usually wins, and it's the game's biggest stars who always have a way of rising to the occasion—slapping the key hit or reaching back for the big strikeout.

But the expected doesn't happen all the time. The much beleaguered American League, which dominated the game's midsummer classic throughout the 1930s and '40s (winning 12 of the first 16 All-Star Games), has won four of the last five. Similarly, throughout All-Star history, the second- and third-magnitude stars—the players who aren't perennial All-Star Game participants—have made more than their fair share of clutch plays.

Take last year's game, for example. The hero of that one was middle-inning pinch hitter and

defensive replacement Julio Franco of the Texas Rangers. The third-best hitter on a club that finished 20 games out of first place last season, Franco came to the plate in the All-Star Game with two on in the top of the seventh, and accounted for the game's only scoring by ripping a two-run double off Reds relief ace Rob Dibble. In 1988, a solo homer (in his first-ever All-Star Game at bat) and a sacrifice fly from an equally unheralded player, Oakland A's catcher Terry Steinbach, gave the American League a 2-1 victory.

Over the years, in fact, All-Star catchers have had a way of coming to the fore. Dick Dietz played in only one All-Star Game (1970), but in it he hit a ninth-inning homer that began a key National League rally. The senior-circuit stars went on to win that game in the 12th. Ozzie Virgil, another catcher who isn't going to be enshrined at Cooperstown anytime soon, had his day in the sun at the 1985 game. Actually,

Ozzie had his day in the sun under a dome, breaking up what had been a close contest with a two-run fifth-inning single; the NL held on to win 6-1 at the Metrodome in Minneapolis.

Cardinals catcher Tim McCarver, now a broadcaster, came up big in the 1966 game at the then-new Busch Stadium in St. Louis, scoring the winning run in the 10th inning—and saving countless people in the stands from heat stroke: the thermometer had reached 105 degrees. McCarver, who will be calling this year's game for CBS, stands a much better chance of getting to the Hall of Fame as a color man than as a catcher, but in the two All-Star Games he played, American League pitchers never got him out: three ABs, three singles.

By the same token, less-than-perennial All-Stars have also accounted for some of the Game's most dramatic moments. As Casey Stengel used to say, "You could look it up."

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□ 1964, Shea Stadium: With two on and two out in the bottom of the ninth, game tied 4-4, fireballing Boston Red Sox relief pitcher Dick Radatz looked in against the Phillies' Johnny Callison. Radatz had already struck out five batters in 2½ innings, and the free-swinging Callison was a guy who struck out about every six at-bats. But not this time: Callison pulled Radatz's first pitch down the right-field line and into the upper deck for a dramatic game-winning home run.

□ 1983 at old Comiskey Park in Chicago: Fred Lynn (then a member of the California Angels) capped a seven-run third-inning explosion with a moon shot into the rightfield bleachers. It not only ended an 11-game NL winning streak but it remains to this day the only grand-slam home run ever hit in an All-Star Game.

□ The only steal of home in All-Star history came in the second game ever played (1934) and occurred on the front end of a double steal. The Giants' Mel Ott was safe at second as Pittsburgh's Pie Traynor—at the ripe old age of 34—slid across the plate.

□ And for further proof that the race isn't always to the swift, return with us to 1990 and soggy Wrigley Field in Chicago: Toronto's Kelly Gruber tied an All-Star record by stealing two bases—the first time in Gruber's career he had ever stolen two bases in the same game.

OK, so guys you perhaps wouldn't expect to do make All-Star headlines. Why? "I don't know why it happens," shrugs McCarver, but one reason could be peer pressure. "The most impressive thing for a player," says McCarver, recalling his own experience, "is going into the clubhouse of an All-Star Game. You just look around and here are guys against whom you compete on a day-to-day basis in tough, grind-it-out competition, and for one day they're your teammates. The irony," he continues, "is that here are pitchers that hitters despise—pitchers that have knocked hitters down the week before—and now

they're teammates, too." No one in that kind of company wants to go out on the field and look bad.

Will an unlikely hero emerge at this year's game? If past performances are any indication, look for a catcher playing in his second or third All-Star Game to deliver a key hit (Toronto's SkyDome, says McCarver, is a "very good hitter's park"), pay special attention to the American Leaguers (they're on a roll of late)—and don't be surprised if Detroit first baseman Cecil Fielder has a big game. He hit four home runs in the SkyDome last year, led the AL in round-trippers with 51 and is among the league leaders again this year. The battle is not always to the strong, nor the race to the swift—but it never hurts to bet that way. **END**

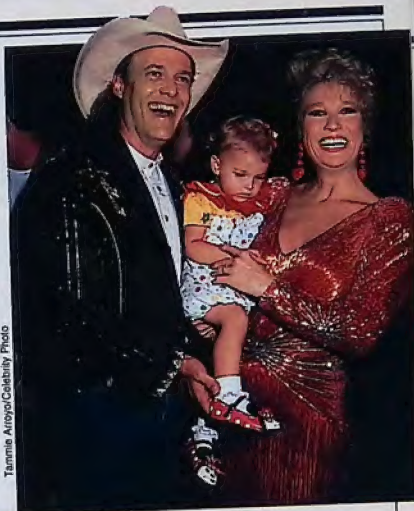

Taping by the numbers

When even President Bush admits he can't figure out how to program his VCR, you know you have a problem. And it's just that problem that prompted Henry Yuen and Daniel Kwoh, two CalTech-trained scientists, to try their hand at a solution. The result: VCR Plus+.

Yuen and Kwoh have created a handy device that lets you record whatever program you want by punching in a multi-digit code. The codes trigger the VCR to tape the program from beginning to end—whether it's 30 minutes long or several hours.

The device itself, about the size of a videocassette, is kept near the VCR and "talks" to it via infrared signals. All you have to do to activate the device is press some buttons. The first thing you tell it is your channel lineup (those

stations you can receive on your TV). And because the system has a memory, you need do it only once. Thereafter you simply punch in the code numbers of the shows you want to tape. (TV Guide prints them in a number of its 114 editions now and will include them in all editions by September. Some local newspapers also carry the codes.)

Yuen admits his invention was something of a fluke. "I wanted to tape a Red Sox game in 1988, on a day that I was going to be away. But after two or three tries, I couldn't program the VCR. I must have done something wrong."

What Yuen and Kwoh did right was to use a system called the Huffman coding scheme to assign each TV show and its time period a set of numbers (similar to telephone numbers). Then, with a sophisticated version of Morse code, they translated the numbers into a formula that enables the VCR to record programs in an easy way.

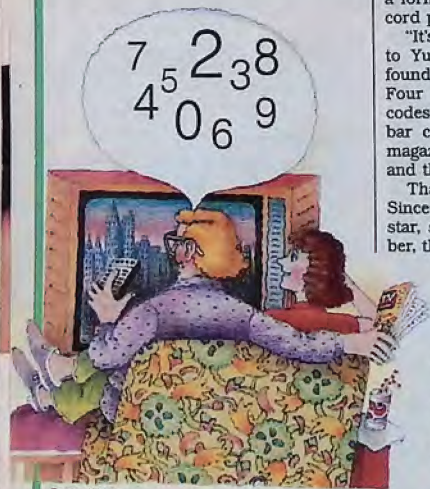
"It's very simple," says Yuen. Maybe to Yuen and Kwoh it is, but others found the problem a bit more difficult. Four years ago, Panasonic used bar codes to create a similar device. But the bar codes proved too large for most magazines and newspapers to print, and the idea didn't catch on.

That's not the case with VCR Plus+. Since Yuen and Kwoh's company, Gemstar, started manufacturing in November, they've already sold a million units (at a cost of \$60 to \$70 apiece).

And if sales of the devices continue to be brisk, you can count on more and more VCR users to turn into number crunchers.

So, on 6-23 at 1900 hours, I for one am taping 54264/7531. That's *60 Minutes* to the uninitiated. Sunday at 7 P.M.—at least where I live. 10-4.

Producers abdicate to the Fresh Prince

There's been a palace coup at NBC's *The Fresh Prince of Bel-Air*: executive producers Susan and Andy Borowitz have been replaced under not-very-amicable circumstances. When the sitcom premiered last fall, the Borowitzs, a white, self-proclaimed "yuppie" couple, were grilled by the media about how they could write for a show about a black family. Apparently they didn't write well enough for co-producer

Benny Medina, who manages *Fresh* star **Will Smith** and whose life inspired the show about a kid from the ghetto taken in by wealthy relatives. Medina says he and Smith "felt the Borowitzs were more interested in the jokes than they were in the characters." Another key point of contention: the manner in which the show was handling—or not handling—interaction between blacks of different social strata. Medina and Smith demanded "that

Will would have input into the storylines before they became scripts. . . . The Borowitzs decided they'd rather not come back, which none of us were upset about," says Medina. In mid-June writer-producer **Winifred Hervey-Stallworth**, who is black,

was brought aboard as executive producer. And supervising producer-writer **Cheryl Gard** is now being promoted to co-executive producer status. Gard is

white "but has soul," Medina says. NBC says the Borowitzs have been moved to the peripheral position of "executive consultants." The Borowitzs haven't been available for comment. Among the changes planned for the *Prince*: he'll get a job and mature.

Angela Lansbury of her character, "but she'll rent an apartment in Manhattan and spend weekdays in the city, where she'll teach a course in writing at a university or perhaps a high school." The actress is excited about the new direction of the CBS show. "The move," Lansbury says, "will put Jessica in touch with young people and into the mainstream of ballet and opera." Universal and CBS were considering shooting some segments in Manhattan, but because of the cost, Lansbury says, "We'll be shooting scenes of Jessica coming out of the New York subway in L.A.—at the Metro station at 7th and Figueroa."

Stamos plays his first bad guy

John Stamos, who plays affectionate Uncle Jesse on ABC's *Full House*, has

been spending his hiatus playing a rapist in the ABC TV-movie "Season of Fear." "Fear" is based on the 1988 Yachats, Ore., case of the ex-cons who kidnapped **Kathy** and **Paul Plunk** and their 2-year-old daughter and terrorized them, raping the wife, playing Russian roulette with her husband and threatening to kill the child. "It's the best thing I've done. It's the first time in a long time," says Stamos. "I feel like I can say, 'I'm an actor.'" For the role, Stamos grew his hair to his shoulders ("I didn't wash it for weeks"), wore dark contact lenses and had temporary tattoos applied to his arms and chest. Sinister as he may have looked, he says the twin 2-year-olds who portrayed the Plunks' daughter "loved me. If they'd come on the set crying, I'd be the one in charge of cheering them up. I'd

be playing with the kids, and later I do a scene pointing a gun at the actress who plays their mother."

Standing in the Shade for now

Elizabeth Ashley, who made her prime-time series debut on CBS's *Evening Shade*, tells how she landed the role of Frieda: "I didn't have to audition. I'm a bad reader and never got anything I auditioned for. **Burt [Reynolds]**—who I've known forever—offered me the series flat out. I kissed off my movie career 30 years ago, and this is my first steady job except for some long runs on Broadway." Ashley won a Tony in her early 20s for her performance on Broadway in "Take

Her, She's Mine." One year later—a victim of too much stardom too soon—she checked into a psychiatric clinic.

The actress, who dropped out of the rat race when she was 23 and took up residence on a sailboat anchored off a remote Caribbean island, says she'd like *Shade* "to last another five years, and then I'd buy another boat and retire for good. I returned to make money to put my son through college."

Portrait of the artist

Give **Jane Alexander** points for patience in her upcoming role as artist **Georgia O'Keeffe**, whose tumultuous relationship with noted photographer **Alfred Stieglitz** is the subject of an *American Playhouse* presentation. "A Marriage: Georgia O'Keeffe and Alfred Stieglitz," on PBS July 19, was five years in the planning. Alexander, who costars with **Christopher Plummer** in the drama, expected to make the project for the big-screen with **Maximilian Schell** costarring and directing. After rewrites and financing problems, Schell called it quits. In early '91, *American Playhouse* came to the rescue and by February

production was in progress. The actress, who stayed devoted to the project because she's a great fan of O'Keeffe, learned a lot about the late artist's life. Says Al-

General Hospital star goes country

Brad Maule, who plays Dr. Tony Jones on ABC's *General Hospital*, has just released "Living It Up," an album of self-penned country tunes. But he didn't warble them in Hollywood or Nashville. "I would have been treated like a cheesy soap actor trying to prove something," says Maule, a former backup singer for **Bobbie Gentry**. Instead, he went where he got some respect: **Norman Petty**'s recording studio in Clovis, N.M. Petty (who managed and produced **Buddy Holly** and co-wrote his classics "That'll Be the Day" and "True Love Ways") had plans to record Maule but died in 1984, the same year the Texas-born actor joined

GL's *Nia Long* and "Boyz" costar **Cuba Gooding Jr.**

GH. "His estate and his wife, Vi, still believed in me, though, so they approached me once again." Released on the independent CMG label and sold via an 800 line, the album boasts a good-luck charm: Maule recorded it on Holly's original microphone.

A long haul for Nia Long

"Boyz N the Hood" opens in theaters this week hot on the heels of "New Jack City," "Jungle Fever" and an explosion of other black-themed movies. Starring **Nia Long** (Kat) of CBS's *Guiding Light*, the film focuses on several kids in drug-infested, gang-torn South-Central L.A. and was shot on location just two blocks from where Long grew up. "Thanks to strong support from home, I turned out OK, but I had girlfriends who didn't. Some got pregnant, some lived with drug dealers. They just got caught up in the game," says the 20-year-old Long, who, like her film character, Brandt (a moralistic teen who's not yet ready for sex), was raised by a single mom.

A remembrance of baseball past

Fifty years ago this summer, **Joe DiMaggio** of the New York Yankees and **Ted Williams** of the Boston Red Sox did things on the baseball diamond that will probably never be surpassed. Williams hit .406—the last time any player has topped the magical .400 mark. DiMaggio hit safely in 56 consecutive games; no one since has come within two weeks of him.

They're just two of the stars of "When It Was a Game," debuting July 8 on HBO. No fan who remembers Major League Baseball as it was played between 1934 and 1957 should miss this one.

A year ago HBO Sports executive producer **Ross Greenburg** asked ex-players to scour their attics for vintage film. The response: some 50 hours of first-rate stuff, much of it shot with 16mm color cameras that Kodak gave out free as a 1936 promotion.

Reminiscences from the era's heroes and readings from baseball literature and poetry, supplied by narrators **James Earl Jones**, **Jason Robards**, **Roy Scheider** and **Peter Kessler**, complement the footage.

Among the show's more irresistible highlights: footage of Hall of Famers **Babe Ruth**, **Ty Cobb** and **Tristram Speaker** gathered for what today would be called a photo opportunity; the oldest color footage of the World Series yet unearthed (the 1938 battle between the Cubs and Yankees); and a segment about the game's great ballparks, including Fenway's "Green Monster" with advertising on it, and Chicago's Wrigley Field before the ivy.

Elsewhere in the hour: long-gone ballparks such as Ebbets Field, Griffith Stadium, Crosley Field, Shibe Park and the Polo Grounds rise again; **Duke Snider** remembers carrying an extra 7 pounds into the late innings—because the era's baggy wool uniforms be-

came wet with sweat; and such legends as **Carl Hubbell**, **Stan Musial**, **Whitey Ford**, **Joe Cronin**, **Pee Wee Reese**, **Rogers Hornsby**, **Honus Wagner** and **Cy Young**

are recalled in remarkable close-ups. Finally, there's the recognition that before 1947, all the players were white. **Don Newcombe** recalls **Jackie Robinson** saying, "I'm going to make (integration) happen"—and he did, for **Willie Mays** and **Henry Aaron** and other black stars. That was before free agency and multimillion-dollar contracts. Back when baseball was still a game.

'Scissorhands' is a cutting parable

Edward Scissorhands: You'll barely recognize 21 Jump Street's Johnny Depp in this imaginative, bittersweet Christmas fable directed by Tim Burton ("Batman"). 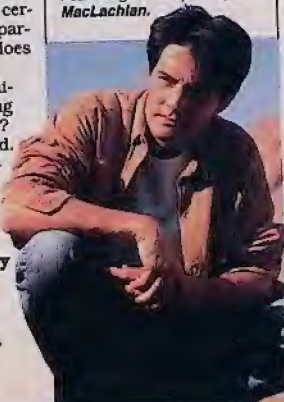
JEERS

(**Dan Castellaneta**, **Julie Kavner**, **Nancy Cartwright** and **Harry Shearer**) can be nominated as Outstanding Performer in a Comedy Series,

To the last episode of ABC's *Twin Peaks*. Knowing that after two seasons the show was not coming back, creators **Mark Frost** and **David Lynch** chose not to tie up *Peaks'* legion of loose plot ends but instead introduced a half-dozen others: who died when Thomas Eckhardt's bomb went off in the bank? What will happen to Norma and Ed now that Nadine has come to her senses? Will Ben Horne's collision with the Haywards' fireplace end his checkered career? Nobody can steal their thunder

Once upon a time all I expected from a morning-show weatherman was to tell me whether it was going to rain or not. And 50 percent of the time he would be right.

Or maybe, to put on airs, he would be a meteorologist, which, as everybody knows, is a person who knows all about meteors. It woke me up in the morning to hear a bracing lecture on isobars (a kind of Fudgistic) and the latest in bimbo-cumulus clouds.

But now my weatherman must be funnier than Rick Dees, capable of having an intelligent conversation with Joan Lunden, and he has to know about the latest azalea festival.

Who do you trust in the morning for tornado reports and Celsius readings (quick: is it too hot or too cold outside when the Celsius hits 17)?

Willard Scott is the biggest star on NBC's *Today* show. He weighs more than Bryant Gumbel and Gene Shalit's mustache combined. He has the gift of gab. Actually, he babbles, sometimes like a brook, endlessly. You get a lot of

variety with Willard. He is an institution already.

Everybody loves Willard in the morning. But I do wait nervously every day for him to introduce the local weather segments, "even as we speak." For 11 years, four times a day, he's been intoning those words. Is this an obsession or superstition? Did a fortuneteller once tell him as a boy, "You must say 'even as we speak' or someday the IRS will ask you to pay a tax on every T-shirt you get in the mail"?

Mark McEwen, on *CBS This Morning*, looms as large as Willard. He was a very funny

guy when he was a deejay on local New York radio, a little on the raunchy side, unorthodox.

He has the same weather as Willard. I checked.

Spencer Christian of *ABC's Good Morning America* also has roughly the same weather. I started following the weather with Christian back in the days when he was transplanting hair plugs.

His weather is the cleanest, brightest, easiest-to-swallow prediction that it might rain tomorrow (talk about going out on limbs). He is an intelligent, entertaining, likable fellow, not a somber one in his body. If only he would leave the jokes to Henny Youngman.

I was happy with Spencer until I saw the new weather tornado that blew in on May 21: Henry Kissinger on *CBS This Morning*. Was the ex-Secretary of State having a mid-life crisis? No, just fulfilling a fantasy. Add a blond wig and Marx Brothers nose and glasses, and he could be a fixture in the morning.

But I still miss the old days when weather used to be forecast by buxom girls and guys wearing funny bow ties, writing numbers on the wall with their magic markers, even as we speak. (E)

Son's death may muffle Carson's last hurrah

Johnny Carson is expected to return to *The Tonight Show* Wednesday (July 10) as scheduled, despite the impact the June 21 death of his son has had on the notoriously private talk-show host.

He is extremely "shaken," reports his agent **Ed Hookstraten** who says Carson retreated to England immediately after **Richard Carson's** funeral June 23. Hookstraten predicts his client will not mention his son's death his first day back on air—or ever for that matter. That shouldn't surprise even the most avid viewers of *The Tonight Show*, who have heard Carson refer to his three sons very rarely. Though the four-times married host makes light of his divorces frequently on air, he virtually never discusses his boys.

How profoundly the death will affect Carson's mood on-air is the subject of enormous speculation at NBC's *Tonight Show*. But the freak accident—Richard (39, known as **Rick**) drove his car over a 100-foot embankment—sidewiped the reigning late-night king just weeks

after he melancholically announced he would step away from the interview desk for good May 22, 1992. **Jay Leno**, his current replacement, was named new host.

The death most certainly further complicates the already troubled relationship between Carson and his first wife, **Jody**, the mother of his three sons. Her lawyer reports she was not even told of Rick's death until the day after his funeral. "Carson's people and I were trying frantically to reach her," says **Raoul Felder**, who represents Jody in her prolonged alimony suit against Carson. The couple divorced in 1963; Carson shared custody of the children.

"Maybe he and Jody weren't close," says Felder. "But they were close to the children."

In fact, Carson supported the sons in large part, buying them homes and securing them jobs. Rick, for example, worked for some time as a production staffer on *Armen*, the NBC sitcom Carson produced. Rick, a freelance photographer at the time of his death, last grabbed national attention after a

1973 car accident involving drugs. In 1971, while in the Navy, Rick was arrested on a marijuana possession charge.

Police at the Pacific Coast site where Carson had his fatal accident say no initial signs of drug or alcohol use were present. "Camera equipment was found in the car. We think he was taking photos," says **Sgt. Russ Johnson** of the California Highway Patrol at San Luis Obispo. "He was driving without a seatbelt." Rick had just celebrated his birthday three days before.

Slimmed down role for Rosie

Ratings colossus **Roseanne** will have a pared-down look this fall, when both of its imposing stars return more trim.

Look for **Roseanne Barr** and **John Goodman** to greet the new season each as much as 50 pounds lighter than their 1990-91 season selves. Barr showed off her new figure at her recent remarriage ceremony to **Tom Arnold** (who has lost 80 pounds over the last few months); Goodman lost his weight for the **Babe Ruth** movie he made →

over the summer hiatus.

"Ideally, I would like to lose another 50 pounds and get pregnant," says Barr. She dropped the weight through participation in an Overeaters Anonymous program and by eliminating from her diet all "fat, sugar, oil, butter, cheese and dairy products," she says.

Although the Conners have been positive role models for love among the hefty, Arnold, a *Roseanne* producer, says the Conners' sex life will become even more upbeat now that the double bed isn't so crowded. In one episode the couple runs away to Las Vegas to renew their wedding vows and meets up with **Wayne Newton**.

On another romantic front, the series will continue to explore the relationship between Roseanne's boss (**Martin Mull**) and his lover. In a twist that Barr hopes will be controversial, she is casting **Harvey Fierstein** ("Torch Song Trilogy" playwright and himself gay) to play a homophobe. —M.M.

Walker driven from daytime

Not only has prime-time producer **Stephen J. Cannell** stolen his next leading lady from the daytime soaps—he's going to be seen committing the crime.

The exec has picked Emmy winner **Marcy Walker** (Eden on NBC's *Santa Barbara*) to star in his new

CBS fall series *Palace Guard* (she plays a public relations rep on the staff of a swank hotel). On her final episode of the soap (July 26), Walker's character (who has taken on the alternate personality of her dead brother Channing) will fire a pistol at one of the soap's major characters," she says.

What Coz's quiz show could cost

This time around, stations aren't likely to bet the farm on **Bill Cosby**. While interest in the comedian's proposed *You Bet Your Life* remake is expected to be high, insiders say general managers just aren't going to ante up the same record-breaking fees for the show as they did for rerun

rights to *The Cosby Show*.

"Times being what they've been, this isn't going to set any records," says **Janeen Bjork** of Seltel, a firm that identifies hot prospects for local stations. First off, new game shows haven't been performing well in the ratings so there may be doubts about even a *Cosby*-backed hit in the offing. Secondly, buyers may feel burned by their *Cosby* deal. "People know they overpaid for that program," says Bjork.

When *The Cosby Show* first went into negotiations, local stations across America coughed up a collective \$500 million in one of the most lucrative deals in syndication history. That sort of spending is over, and in fact conditions now favor a buyers' market. For example, stations will likely sign on only if they are guaranteed of *Cosby's* staying with the show for the run of the deal.

Scheduled for the fall of 1992, the series will be produced by the same Carsey-Werner Company that produces *The Cosby Show* (along with *A Different World* and *Roseanne*). The project, an update of the game show **Groucho Marx** hosted between 1950 and 1961, would not necessarily interfere with *Cosby's* completing another season of his NBC sitcom—this fall entering its eighth year—though a ninth season is unlikely.

Will a baby Cheer up Ted Danson?

Cheers could be called *One Barkeep and a Baby* next season when Sam Malone becomes—gulp—a dad.

"I guess we're going to flirt with the idea of Sam being a daddy," says **Ted Danson**, the actor who has played the formerly foot-loose and fancy-free Malone for almost 10 years in the NBC comedy (Thursdays at 9 P.M. [ET]).

When last seen at the end of this spring's cliffhanger, Malone and feisty soulmate Rebecca (**Kirstie Alley**) had decided the childless life was a drag, concluding that they would make ideal parents. Since then, however, NBC has been coy about actually committing to the idea of a kid on the show. But Danson, one of the stars in the movie "Three Men and a Baby," seems to cozy up to the notion.

"It's fun to put Sam and a small child in a room together because they're natural enemies," says Danson. "They compete for the same space. I'm sure they [the show's writers and producers] will play with that idea."

While there will probably be a baby issue on the show, *Cheers* will continue to steer away from the

really serious stuff—like the survival of the planet. To get that message across, Danson, a vigorous environmental crusader who co-founded the American Oceans

Campaign, must moonlight. So on July 9 he hosts "Danger at the Beach" (PBS 9 P.M. [ET]), the first in a series of National Audubon Society specials that will air throughout the summer.

Danson takes an active role in the special, traveling along the country's seacoasts to interview people whose lives and livelihoods are tied to the survival of the oceans.

And then he goes back to *Cheers* for a run at paternity.

Making book on television

Many of us watch television without thinking much about what it all means. Now an exhaustive new book, *Watching America: What Television Tells Us About Our Lives* (Prentice Hall Press, \$24.95), explains the significance of TV to us.

Studying programming from 1955 to 1986, the book examines what television messages have been transmitted to us about society—about our families, our work, our perceptions of government, minorities, authority figures. The theories aren't all hot air, either. Drawing on anecdotal evidence from specific episodes of series long gone and still around, the authors track a compelling social history through the tube.

Written by Linda and S. Robert Lichter of the Center for Media and Public Affairs in Washington, D.C., and Stanley Rothman of Smith College, *Watching America* is well worth watching for—if only to reconcile the cumulative effect of all those hours, all those years, spent staring into the looking glass of TV.

Wimbledon's finalists and baseball's finest

This isn't a bad week, considering that it's July. It's a particularly good one, in fact, if you like tennis or baseball. First—bright and early Saturday and Sunday mornings—there are the Wimbledon Tennis finals (weather permitting, of course). NBC will be at Centre Court as usual. And on Tuesday, CBS has the Baseball All-Star Game. This year's venue, the SkyDome in Toronto, was given its name for a very good reason, so there's no need to append a "weather permitting" warning here.

Last year, as you may recall, the All-Star Game was played in Chicago's venerable Wrigley Field and, sure enough, there was a rain delay. But this week on cable, Wrigley and many other old ball-

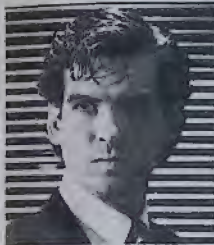
parks have an hour in the sun, and so will the baggy-suited ballplayers who made baseball truly "America's pastime" in the 1930s, '40s and '50s. When *It Was a Game* (Mon., HBO) is another flowery tribute in which voices (James Earl Jones and Jason Robards among them) quote poets. But what makes this hour different is its clips: color films dating back to the mid-1930s that HBO claims have never been shown in public before. Many of them are home movies—films of players more than of games—and they're vivid; they connect us to their era much the way that Ken Burns' close-ups of old portraits connected us to the Civil War. "Baseball," author Donald Honig rhapsodizes, "freezes moments and holds them." HBO has done a fine job of defrosting moments and letting them go.

Martin Tupper (Brian Benben), a 37-year-old editor of trashy novels, hasn't been doing so well letting go of his ex-wife, Judith (Wendie Malick). In fact, their adult-oriented HBO sitcom *Dream On* is based on this premise. But

last season, Judith married a saintly physician who was always off feeding lamine victims or saving rainforests, and in Sunday's second-season opener a nasty British director (David Bowie) is making a movie about this "Gandhi for our time." Mimi Rogers and Tom Berenger play Judith and her new husband in director John Landis's uproarious hourlong movie-within-a-sitcom; Martin is portrayed by ex-*St. Elsewhere* nebbish Stephen Furst.

Elsewhere, it's the beginning of the fall season on Fox. Sort of. A few weeks ago, the fourth network announced that it wanted to distance itself from the September logjam, and so *Beverly Hills, 90210* returns for its second season this Thursday with a poignant treatise on how confusing sex can be for teens. The confused teen is Brenda (Shannen Doherty), who has a pregnancy scare.

There's also new television on PBS this week, beginning with *Alive from Off Center*, back for a seventh summer of avant-garde exploration with "Words in Your Face," a survey of poetry that you

didn't have to memorize in high school. Next: *New Television*, a new weekly anthology of the offbeat, follows *Off Center* Thursday on many PBS stations as filmmaker Juan Downey's "J.S. Bach" meets MTV in eastern Germany.

If you prefer old television (and music performed in concert halls), PBS also has *Evening at Pops*, back for a 22nd season in Bos-

ton's Symphony Hall Sunday with an almost-operatic tribute to Leonard Bernstein's Broadway shows. And on Wednesday, many PBS stations will carry the opening concert of New York's 25th annual Mostly Mozart Festival Live from Lincoln Center. James Galway and Andre Watts are the scheduled soloists.

Finally, more old television—the sort that you'd expect this time of year. And as it happens, there are a pair of notable reruns: James (*Shogun*) Clavell's four-part 1988 miniseries *Noble House* (Sun.-Wed., NBC), about boardroom and bedroom shenanigans in Hong Kong; and "Andre's Mother" (*American Playhouse*; Friday on most PBS stations), Terrence McNally's Emmy-winning 1990

dramatic sketch about the coming to terms of an AIDS victim's mother (Sada Thompson) and his lover (Richard Thomas).

Tom Cruise, Bill Murray and 'Kane'

A week full of "infantile egomaniacs."

On Broadcast Channels

That description, by Nicole Kidman of Tom Cruise in "Days of Thunder" (which we'll get to later when we look at movies on cable), also can be applied to most of the central male characters in this week's movies.

Of the three-and-a-half broadcast movies this week (the half is Saturday's conclusion on CBS of the two-part 1986 hard-times-Down-Under TV-drama *The Last Frontier* ★★), *Pink Lightning* (Mon., Fox) is the only first-run offering. It's a ★★ 1991 TV-movie about five stereotypical women—the Nice One, the Pretty One, the Brainsy One, the Loose

One and the Married One—coming of age in a 1962 California universe of lunkheaded men who put them down or treat them like personal amusement parks. Though skimpy and

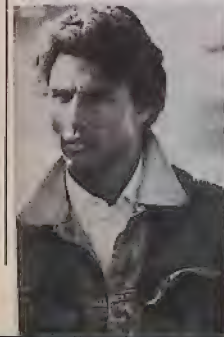

predictable, "Pink Lightning" occasionally makes a sharp point about women's roles and expectations in those pre-lib (and these post-lib) days, with an ending that will satisfy feminist longings.

Same time, on ABC, "infantile egomaniac" is just about the nicest thing you can say about the guy Randy Quaid plays in a repeat of the absorbing, fact-based ★★ 1988 TV-movie *Evil in Clear River*. He's the congenial, charismatic mayor and history teacher in a sleepy little Canadian farm town—and a hatemongering racist, as well as a Holocaust-debunking anti-Semite. Only Lindsay Wagner stands up to him, despite townfolk pressure, and fights him from the classroom to the courts.

On Sunday, ABC presents us with yet another small-town jerk—this one gets out of prison, and the populace turns vigilante to fight his return, in the ★★ 1988 TV-movie, *The Town Bully*.

On Cable Channels

What makes Ms. Kidman call Mr. Cruise an "infantile egomaniac" has to do with her disgust at his persistent dumb risk-taking and nose-thumbing at death while zipping around wreck-strewn racetracks in a loud stock car in 1990's ultra-clichéd *Days of Thunder* ★★ (HBO, MAX).

Were she a regular moviegoer, Kidman might also note that Cruise's Cole Trickle—a cocky know-it-all who bonds with, then forsakes, then rejoins his older mentor (Robert Duvall, believable as always)—is exactly the same character he's played in "The Color of Money," "Cocktail" and "Top Gun." Especially "Top Gun," and no wonder: "Days of Thunder" reunites "Gun's" Cruise, director Tony Scott, and producers Don Simpson and Jerry Bruckheimer in an "if it worked once it can make money for us twice" carbon copy, only duller and more ponderous.

As for copies of "Top Gun," 1990's *Fire Birds* (SHO) is a lackluster ★ cookie-cutter facsimile of that earlier film. Instead of fighter jets, it's high-tech helicopters, but otherwise it seems almost a frame-for-frame remake. Nicolas Cage tries to be cocky and know-it-all but is just weird and Neanderthal. Tommy Lee Jones is the father fig-

ure and Sean Young is the love interest who thinks (rightly) that Cage is an infantile egomaniac.

Bill Murray nearly always plays infantile egomaniacs, and he is always a little mean-spirited, but his humor makes it palatable and even endearing. In 1990's *Quick Change* (HBO, MAX), Murray's humor is tempered and matured, and it gives this ★★ bank-robbery caper film combined with an I-Hate-New-York theme just the right edge. The joke here: he's a criminal, teamed with Geena Davis and Randy Quaid, who makes short work of the heist but, because of the frustrations of New York City, can't find his way out of town. The movie loses its way, too, but Murray is totally in control, showing a richer, darker side of his stock character.

Finally, though it is making a triumphant return to movie theaters this summer on this, its 50th anniversary, Orson Welles' *Citizen Kane* ★★★★★ (insert string of your favorite superlatives here) is being shown on AMC this week. Need we remind you that it is perhaps the quintessential infantile egomaniac film?

THE ALL ENGLAND TENNIS CHAMPIONSHIPS

The women's and men's finals at the All England Lawn Tennis and Croquet Club's annual tournament, telecast live from Centre Court in suburban London.

The All England Club was established on Worple Road in 1869 as strictly a club for croquet, but in 1875, a rectangle of grass was set aside for the growing sport of lawn tennis. Two years later, before some 200 spectators, Spencer Gore became the first Wimbledon tennis champion. (Maud Watson became the first women's titleholder in 1884.) The following championships were decided by a system in which the defending champ met the winner of all the preliminary matches. The current format was adopted in 1921, the same year the club moved to its present location on Church Road.

This year, 400,000 fans are expected to gather at Wimbledon during the fortnight, observing its traditions . . . strawberries and cream; royal box-watching; tabloid headlines; and "predominantly white attire." And, of course, the unique grass-court competition.
