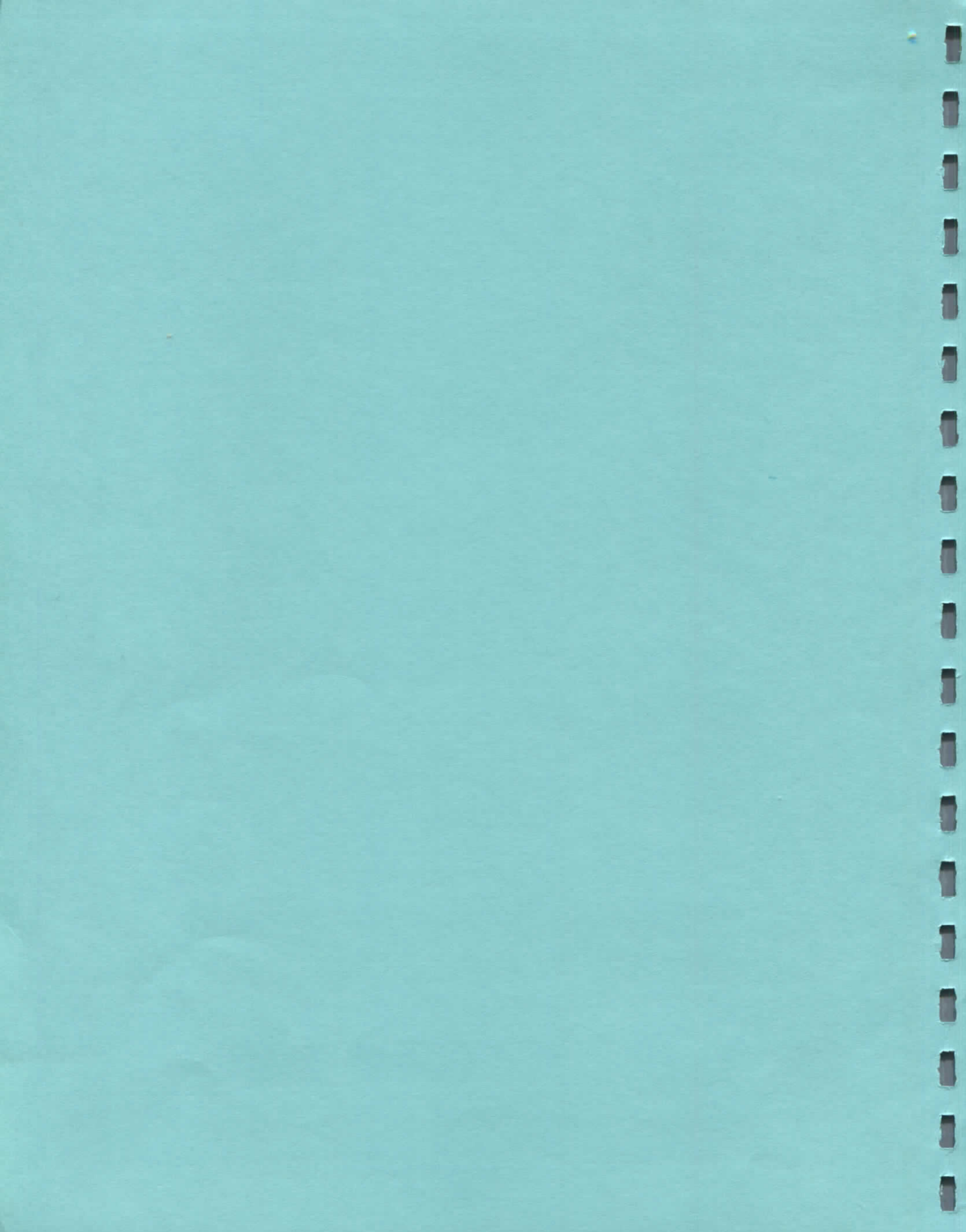

## Preface

---

The *1996 Interactive Healthcare Internet Directory* contains more than 700 listings of health-related resources found on the Internet. While compiling this directory, I found there were many more resources than I could possibly catalog, so I concentrated on the most useful ones.

As general references I included the following resources: 1) Tutorials that provide you with an overview of the Internet and what it offers; 2) Search Tools that allow you to locate resources on specific topics; 3) Indexes of health-related resources so you would have a few key sites from which to begin your browsing; and 4) Directories which provide online pointers to health-related agencies, associations, hospitals, institutes, libraries, medical centers, medical schools, nursing schools, societies, mailing lists, and more.

More specific resources cover topics in Allied Health, Dentistry, Diseases and Conditions, Education, Health Promotion, Medicine, Mental Health, Nursing, Public Health, and more. The *Internet Directory* is organized by subject to make it easier to locate particular topics. All online addresses (URLs) that are given in the body of the directory are for use on a World Wide Web browser such as Netscape. Also, most of the listings were current as of May 1996. Obviously, some may change, move, or disappear by the time you look for them.

**Helpful Hints.** Based on my time spent online, I have a few suggestions to offer. First, in order to lessen the time it takes to upload files, it pays to turn off the graphics in your Web browser so you won't have to wait for all of the decorative pictures to load. It can be turned on again if you encounter a site where graphics are either necessary or desirable. Secondly, I discovered through trial and error that these online addresses are UPPER- and lower-case sensitive. If there is an upper-case letter in the address, you must type it as a capital letter.

Finally, I found that if I could not connect to a particular address, sometimes I could "back up" the address a bit and try again. For example, if you can't connect at the Yahoo Index: AIDS/HIV site at "[http://www.yahoo.com/Health/Diseases\\_and\\_Conditions/AIDS\\_HIV/](http://www.yahoo.com/Health/Diseases_and_Conditions/AIDS_HIV/)", then you could knock off the "AIDS\_HIV/" and try

again, or just go all the way back to the home page at "<http://www.yahoo.com/>" and work your way through the menu system. This also is useful if you jumped into a site a specific page, but want to explore the entire site. In some cases, this method is preferable to typing the entire address. The address to access the 9th Revision Directory of Scholarly Electronic Conferences is "gopher://gopher.usask.ca:70/00/Computing/Internet%20Information/Directory%20of%20Scholarly%20Electronic%20Conferences/Medical%20Practice%2C%20Nursing%2C%20Personnel%2C%20Patients%20and%20Medical%20Sciences%2C%20Research." Another way to reach this site would be to connect to the main menu at "gopher://gopher.usask.ca/" and work through the menu system by choosing Computing; Internet Info; Dir of Scholarly Elec Conf; Medical Practice, etc.

**Other Directories.** Just a reminder that we also publish software directories that list health-related software delivered on CD-ROM, Videodisc, and Computer-Assisted Instruction (floppy disk). If you don't already have one of our flyers, please call, write, or e-mail and we will send one to you.

**Submissions.** As always, there inevitably will be errors and omissions in this volume. ## What is the Internet

The Internet is a world-wide network of computer networks. More than 30 million people use the Internet in more than 100 countries, with the number of users increasing by more than one million per month. The Internet was created in 1969 by the Department of Defense's Advanced Research Projects Agency as a way to exchange information between the Department and research scientists based around the country. At the time the system was known as ARPANET and consisted of four computers. By 1972 the system (now called ARPANET) had grown to include 37 computers and the researchers had begun to send e-mail to one another over the network. By 1987 the network had grown to such an extent that the military moved their component to another network, the National Science Foundation had taken over the infrastructure and established NSFnet, and the network had been overhauled and opened to any educational facility, academic researcher, government employee, or international research organization that wanted to use it.

Today the Internet actually encompasses several networks, such as NSFNET, BITNET, and Usenet, as well as the commercial networks such as CompuServe, Prodigy, and America Online. All of these networks, as well as thousands of other servers, are connected to the Internet, and therefore, to each other. In order to be able to communicate with each other, standard communications protocols have been established to ensure compatibility between computers. These are known as Transmission Control Protocol and Internet Protocol, or TCP and IP. These protocols ensure that the information sent by one computer reaches its destination computer intact.

Although the Internet isn't owned or controlled by any one group, there are some organizations that strongly influence its development. One such group is the National Science Foundation (NSF), which helped build the Internet and provides an "acceptable use policy" as guidelines for use of the NSFnet portion of Internet. Another set of guidelines comes from the Internet Society in the United States and the Resaux Associes pour la Recherche Europeene (RARE) in Europe. These two groups provide guidance to Internet use through voluntary cooperation of its members.

## Connecting to the Internet

Connecting to the Internet today is simple if you have a computer, modem, telephone line, and a service provider. A service provider is a company that provides you with the "gateway" to the Internet. If you are at a university, government agency, or large corporation, your site may already have a connection to the Internet and you need to ask around to find out who can help you obtain personal access. Individuals who want access from home or office can connect by telephone through a service provider who has access, and who will give you access for a monthly fee. All populated areas have many services providers, usually listed in the local paper, that will provide SLIP or PPP (two different connection protocols) access for \$15 to \$20 per month. There also are national service providers, such as Netcom, that provide access to people all over the country through hundreds of local telephone sites. Stop at the computer section of any bookstore, or book section of any computer store, and you will find a number of Startup Kits that will get you online quickly. Internet access also is possible at an hourly rate through national online services such as Prodigy, CompuServe, and America Online.

# Internet Services

There are many different services that can be used over the Internet. Each one operates in a different way and has its own set of communications protocol, but the purpose of all is to exchange information. The easiest way to use all of these services is with a software program called a "browser." This is the program that provides a user-friendly interface to all of the Internet services. Many are available free-of-charge, the best known being Mosaic and Netscape. Both of these browsers provide access to e-mail, mailing lists, file transfer, listservs, newsgroups, telnet, and Internet Relay Chat (IRC) services.

## Electronic Mail or E-mail

Electronic mail or e-mail allows individuals on computer networks to exchange messages. Many e-mail addresses on the Internet are not directly associated with individuals. Frequently e-mail addresses are to mail servers, a mail service that manages mailing lists, sends files on request, searches databases, or even connects to other network resources.

## Mailing Lists

A system that allows people to send e-mail to one address, whereupon their message is copied and sent to all of the other subscribers to the mailing list. In this way, people who have many different kinds of e-mail access can participate in discussions together.

## File Transfer Protocol (FTP)

FTP (File Transfer Protocol) is an application that transfers files from one computer to another, regardless of where the two computers are located, how they are connected, or whether they are using the same operating system. FTP allows the transfer of both binary and ASCII files.

## Listservs

Listservers are computers dedicated to a particular topic. Internet users subscribe by sending their electronic mail address to the Listserver. Messages from other subscribers are routinely distributed to all those who have subscribed. Listservers can be monitored or unmonitored.

## USENET Newsgroups

USENET is an informal group of systems that exchanges news and information. These news networks are fashioned after traditional BBSs. The newsgroups are organized hierarchically, with the broadest grouping first in the name, followed by an arbitrary number of subgroupings. News groups under USENET are generally considered to be of global interest, with no fee access.

## **Telnet**

Telnet is a utility used to log in to other computer systems on the Internet from the user's home system. Once logged in, the user becomes a terminal -- it is as if the keyboard is connected directly to that remote computer. Users may then access the vast services that the remote computer offers.

## **Internet Relay Chat (IRC)**

Internet Relay Chat (IRC) is multi-user, live-chat protocol. There are a number major IRC servers around the world which are linked to each other. Anyone can create a "channel" and anything that anyone types in a given channel is seen by all others in the channel. Private channels can be created for multi-person conference calls.

# **Integrating Internet Services with Gopher and WWW**

## **Gopher**

Finding your way through the Internet can be overwhelming, with hundreds of thousands of sites and topics to discover. That's why the University of Minnesota developed a tool called Gopher, which provides a menu-based interface to search and retrieve information. Gopher incorporates text and graphics, file transfer using FTP, and can link to remote sites using Telnet. Essentially, Gopher makes it easier to use other Internet services. Gopher even allows you to search all gopher sites for information on a particular topic. This search tool is called Veronica. A more recent tool that allows you to search only the Gopher server you are currently logged onto is called Jughead.

## **World Wide Web**

The most exciting development on the Internet, and the one most responsible for the incredible growth it has experienced, is the World Wide Web (WWW). Developed in 1990 at the European Laboratory for Particle Physics in Switzerland (known as CERN), the WWW provides a graphical, magazine-style interface to the Internet. In addition to incorporating graphics and images into its "pages," the WWW allow for the use of "hypertext" documents, which allows users to jump from one piece of information to another with the click of the mouse. This information can be text, sound, graphical, or digital motion video. These links are coded into the text of WWW pages using HTML protocol (hypertext markup language). To read these pages, you need to use an WWW browser, such as Mosaic or Netscape mentioned earlier in this document.

Since the WWW incorporates all of the available Internet services, World Wide Web can have two meanings. Used specifically, it refers to those network servers that support WWW protocol and allows the use of HTML documents to link text, graphics, sound files, and video together. Used more generally, it encompasses all of the services found on the Internet: Gopher , FTP , HTTP , telnet , Usenet , WAIS and other tools.

## Online Help Understanding the Internet

If you still are uncomfortable with the concepts and terminology associated with the Internet, you can stop in at any book or computer shop and buy one of any number of good guides to the Internet. In addition, once online, there are a number of resources available to you that provide an overview of the Internet and its components. One good place to start is the Yahoo Index, perhaps the most popular site on the Internet. The Yahoo Index provides an index of thousands of Internet sites, organized by topic area. Under Computer and Internet there are several sources for information about the Internet. Make this your first stop when you do get onboard. Happy surfing!

## Health Related Mailing Lists

There are a number of mailing lists on the Internet dealing with health-related subjects. All of the mailing lists here use the LISTSERV mailing list software. For most mailing lists, the generic address LISTSERV@LISTSERV.NET may be used. All requests will be forwarded to the correct place based on the mailing list's name. Where the generic address of LISTSERV@LISTSERV.NET can not be used, the actual server's address is listed. This may be the case for a list which is confidential and is known only to the server hosting the list. In this case, it may only be possible to subscribe to the list ("review" may be blocked).

### Locating a list

To find out if an electronic mail list exists for a particular subject, you can send the following message:

To: LISTSERV@SEARN.SUNSET.SE  
Subject: <Blank>  
Message: LIST GLOBAL <searchstring>

Leave the subject field blank. Substitute a word or string of words for related to your area of interest for the searchstring.

### Getting more information

To get more information on a particular mailing list, including how many current subscribers there are, send the following message:

To: LISTSERV@LISTSERV.NET  
Subject: <Blank>  
Body: rev listname <short>

The command rev stands for "review". The parameter "listname" is the name of a valid list below such as "ACCRI-L". The option in angle brackets, <short>, indicates that you would like a count of all subscribers. If you leave off <short>, you will get a potentially long list of subscriber's addresses.



## Subscribing to a List

To subscribe to a particular mailing list, send the following message:

To: [LISTSERV@LISTSERV.NET](mailto:LISTSERV@LISTSERV.NET)

Subject: <Blank>

Body: sub listname <full\_name>

The command sub stands for "subscribe". The parameter "listname" is the name of a valid list below such as "ACCRI-L". The option in angle brackets, <full\_name>, does not need to be given.

# USENET Newsgroups

## What is USENET?

USENET is a system of special interest discussion groups, called newsgroups, to which readers can send, or "post," messages which are then distributed to other computers in the network. A common network is the Internet, but other networks may carry USENET, too, and the Internet contains far more than just USENET. USENET started as a network linking university personnel who needed to discuss technical computer issues, but the talk rapidly expanded beyond work, and USENET has grown far beyond its collegiate beginnings. Today there are thousands of newsgroups, with conversations ranging from discussions of computer technology; to gardening; to rock and roll; plus education, of course. People all over the world—but most commonly in the U.S., Canada, Europe, Australia, and Japan—use the USENET, and the newsgroups on the net reflect a wide range of interests. Each newsgroup is a discussion group focused around a specific topic, and some are much more specific than others: "rec.gardens" users may discuss all aspects of gardening, but in "rec.gardens.roses" you'll want to limit your conversation to just roses.

## Accessing USENET

Your network site administrator will be able to tell you if you have access to USENET newsgroups. If you do, the administrator will be able to provide site-specific information on access. The site administrator will also control what newsgroups you have access to, and while your site may carry only a subset of available newsgroups, you may be able to request that groups be added to the list.

## Finding Newsgroups

With thousands of newsgroups to choose from, how can you find the ones of interest to you? *[You can use one of several online search engines, such as Find Newsgroups or Liszt of Newsgroups, listed in this directory under Search Tools.]* Most systems will allow you to search the names of the newsgroups by keyword: search for "education" if you're interested in general education issues, or "k12" if your primary interest is grades K through 12. Education-related newsgroups include: alt.education.research, alt.education.disabled, alt.education.distance, misc.education.multimedia, misc.education.science, k12.chat.teacher, k12.ed.science, k12.ed.math

## Joining the Conversation

Joining a newsgroup is a bit like joining a conversation at a party: it pays to listen carefully to what's being said and to gain a sense of the tone of the conversation before jumping in and voicing an opinion. Your best bet is to "lurk" in the newsgroup for a while; that is, read the postings, but don't post replies, until you've learned the "netiquette"—net etiquette—of the group.

Each newsgroup has its own set of rules, some written out in its own FAQ (Frequently Asked Questions); others unwritten and best learned by reading the postings and gaining a sense of the tone and the topics discussed. Some newsgroups are moderated, meaning someone reads, screens, and occasionally modifies notes before posting them. On other newsgroups, there's no screening of messages. This means the tone of the newsgroups varies greatly. However, there are certain rules that are common to most newsgroups, as noted below. You should read the general USENET FAQ for your system, and for the newsgroup, but if you're anxious to join in right away, you'll be on safer ground if you follow these few simple rules.

## Some Do's

- Write clearly and concisely, and avoid "cute" spellings. Your postings will be read by people all over the world, many of whom do not have English as a first language.
- Stick to the topic of the newsgroup and to the message to which you are replying.
- Respond politely, even when baited by other users. Unfortunately, the anonymity of the net brings out the worst in some users. Your best bet: ignore them, as responding may only encourage their inappropriate behavior.
- Provide references to back up your views. This will help other readers who are seeking information.
- Be very cautious about using humor or sarcasm. Many of your readers simply won't get the joke, with the result being misunderstandings and hurt feelings. If you must use humor, mark it with a smiley face—:-)—or a grin—g—so all will know that you're joking.
- Read, re-read, and think twice about your reply before you post it. What you say is going to be read by people all over the world, and maybe by your colleagues and friends. Be sure it reflects your best thoughts and ideas.

## Some Don'ts

- Do not advertise on the net unless you are posting to a group that specifically accepts advertising. If the word "forsale" doesn't appear in the newsgroup name, err on the side of safety and don't post that ad! Newsgroup users are quite sensitive on this point, particularly if the posting is from a commercial site. They will retaliate if you persist.
- DO NOT WRITE IN ALL CAPS! This is called shouting, and is considered just as impolite as if you walked into a party and began talking very, very loudly. You'll be told to shush or worse.



- Do not post irrelevant material on a newsgroup, and do not "spam," that is, send the same material to many different, unrelated newsgroups. Many users have to pay for their USENET access, and they will not appreciate receiving messages unrelated to the topic of the newsgroup.
- Do not post surveys on the net. Most long-time users are tired of such requests, and the few people who do respond will provide you with very nonrepresentative results.

### **And a Few Final Hints**

Netters have developed their own vocabulary, so to get you started, here are a few hints of what some of their abbreviations stand for: IMHO: In my humble opinion; BTW: By the way; ROTFL: Rolling on the floor laughing

You'll learn more as you read the postings. See you on the information superhighway!

## **Glossary of Terms**

**Archie.** A tool (software) for finding files stored on anonymous FTP sites. You need to know the exact file name or a sub-string of it.

**ASCII (American Standard Code for Information Interchange).** This is the de facto world-wide standard for the code numbers used by computers to represent all the upper and lower-case latin letters, numbers, punctuation, etc. There are 128 standard ASCII codes, each of which can be represented by a seven digit binary number: 0000000 through 1111111

**BBS (Bulletin Board System).** A computerized meeting and announcement system that allows people to carry on discussions, upload and download files, and make announcements without the people being connected to the computer at the same time. There are many thousands (millions?) of BBS's around the world, most are very small, running on a single IBM clone PC with 1 or 2 phone lines. Some are very large and the line between a BBS and a system like CompuServe gets crossed at some point, but it is not clearly drawn.

**BITNET (Because It's Time Network).** A network of educational sites separate from the Internet, but e-mail is freely exchanged between BITNET and the Internet. Listservs, the most popular form of e-mail discussion groups, originated on BITNET. BITNET machines are IBM VMS machines, and the network is probably the only international network that is shrinking.

**Browser.** A client program (software) that is used to look at various kinds of Internet resources.

**Domain Name.** The unique name that identifies an Internet site. Domain Names always have 2 or more parts, separated by dots. The part on the left is the most specific, and the part on the right is the most general. A given machine may have more than one Domain Name but a given Domain Name points to only one machine. Extensions can tell you whether the site is educational (.edu), commercial (.com), government (.gov), or even in another country (.can).

**E-mail (Electronic Mail).** Messages, usually text, sent from one person to another via computer. E-mail can also be sent automatically to a large number of addresses (Mailing List).

**FAQ (Frequently Asked Questions).** FAQs are documents that list and answer the most common questions on a particular subject. There are hundreds of FAQs on subjects as diverse as Pet Grooming and Cryptography. FAQs are usually written by people who have tired of answering the same question over and over.

**FTP (File Transfer Protocol).** A very common method of moving files between two Internet sites. FTP is a special way to login to another Internet site for the purposes of retrieving and/or sending files. There are many Internet sites that have established publicly accessible repositories of material that can be obtained using FTP, by logging in using the account name "anonymous", thus these sites are called "anonymous ftp servers".

**Gopher.** A widely successful method of making menus of material available over the Internet. Gopher is a Client and Server style program, which requires that the user have a Gopher Client program. Although Gopher spread rapidly across the globe in only a couple of years, it is being largely supplanted by Hypertext, also known as

WWW (World Wide Web). There are still thousands of Gopher Servers on the Internet and we can expect they will remain for a while.

**Host.** Any computer on a network that is a repository for services available to other computers on the network. It is quite common to have one host machine provide several services, such as WWW and USENET See also: Node, Network

**HTML (HyperText Markup Language).** The coding language used to create Hypertext documents for use on the World Wide Web. HTML looks a lot like old-fashioned typesetting code, where you surround a block of text with codes that indicate how it should appear. Additionally, in HTML you can specify that a block of text, or a word, is "linked" to another file on the Internet. HTML files are meant to be viewed using a World Wide Web Client program, such as Mosaic.

**HTTP (HyperText Transport Protocol).** The protocol for moving hypertext files across the Internet. Requires a HTTP client program on one end, and an HTTP server program on the other end. HTTP is the most important protocol used in the World Wide Web (WWW).

**Hypertext.** Generally, any text that contains "links" to other documents - words or phrases in the document that can be chosen by a reader and which cause another document to be retrieved and displayed.

**IMHO (In My Humble Opinion).** A shorthand appended to a comment written in an online forum, IMHO indicates that the writer is aware that they are expressing a debatable view, probably on a subject already under discussion. One of many such shorthands in common use online, especially in discussion forums.

**IRC (Internet Relay Chat).** Basically a huge multi-user live chat facility. There are a number major IRC servers around the world which are linked to each other. Anyone can create a "channel" and anything that anyone types in a given channel is seen by all others in the channel. Private channels can (and are) created for multi-person "conference calls".

**Internet.** The vast collection of inter-connected networks that all use the TCP/IP protocols and that evolved from the ARPANET of the late 60's and early '70s. The Internet now connects roughly 60,000 independent networks into a vast global internet.

**Listserv.** The most common kind of mailing list, Listservs originated on BITNET but they are now common on the Internet See also: BITNET, E-mail, Maillist

**Login.** Noun or a verb. Noun: The account name used to gain access to a computer system. Not a secret (contrast with Password) Verb: The act of entering into a computer system, e.g. "Login to the WELL and then go to the GBN conference." See also: Password



**MUD (Multi-User Dungeon or Dimension).** A (usually text-based) multi-user simulation environment. Some are purely for fun and flirting, others are used for serious software development, or education purposes and all that lies in between. A significant feature of most MUDs is that users can create things that stay after they leave and which other users can interact with in their absence, thus allowing a "world" to be built gradually and collectively.

**Mailing List.** A system that allows people to send e-mail to one address, whereupon their message is copied and sent to all of the other subscribers to the maillist. In this way, people who have many different kinds of e-mail access can participate in discussions together.

**Mosaic.** The first WWW browser that was available for the Macintosh, Windows and UNIX all with the same interface. "Mosaic" really started the popularity of the Web. The source-code to Mosaic has been licensed by several companies and there are several other pieces of software as good or better than Mosaic, most notably "Netscape."

**Newsgroups.** See Usenet.

**Node.** Any single computer connected to a network .

**Password.** A code used to gain access to a locked system.

**Server.** A computer, or a software package, that provides a specific kind of service to client software running on other computers. The term can refer to a particular piece of software, such as a WWW server, or to the machine on which the software is running. A single server machine could have several different server software packages running on it, thus providing many different services to clients on the network .

**Telnet.** The command and program used to login from one Internet site to another. The telnet command/program gets you to the "login:" prompt of another host.

**URL (Uniform Resource Locator).** The standard way to give the address of any resource on the Internet that is part of the World Wide Web (WWW). A URL looks like this: *http://www.matisse.net/seminars.html* or *telnet://well.sf.ca.us* or *news:new.newusers.questions*, etc. The most common way to use a URL is to enter into a WWW browser program, such as Netscape, or Lynx.

**Usenet.** A world-wide system of discussion groups, with comments passed among hundreds of thousands of machines. Not all Usenet machines are on the Internet , maybe half. Usenet is completely decentralized, with over 10,000 discussion areas, called newsgroups .

**Veronica (Very Easy Rodent Oriented Net-wide Index to Computerized Archives).** Developed at the University of Nevada, Veronica is a constantly updated database of

the names of almost every menu item on thousands of gopher servers. The Veronica database can be searched from most major gopher menus.

**WAIS (Wide Area Information Servers).** A commercial software package that allows the indexing of huge quantities of information, making those indices searchable across networks such as the Internet . A prominent feature of WAIS is that the search results are ranked ("scored") according to how relevant the "hits" are, and that subsequent searches can find "more stuff like that last batch" and thus refine the search process.

**WWW (World Wide Web).** Generally, the whole constellation of resources that can be accessed using Gopher , FTP , HTTP , telnet , Usenet , WAIS and some other tools. More specifically, the universe of hypertext servers (HTTP servers ) which are the servers that allow text, graphics, sound files etc to be mixed together.

This search engine allows users to search on document titles and content. Its May 1 database contains 3.75 million link descriptors and the keywords from 767,000 documents.
