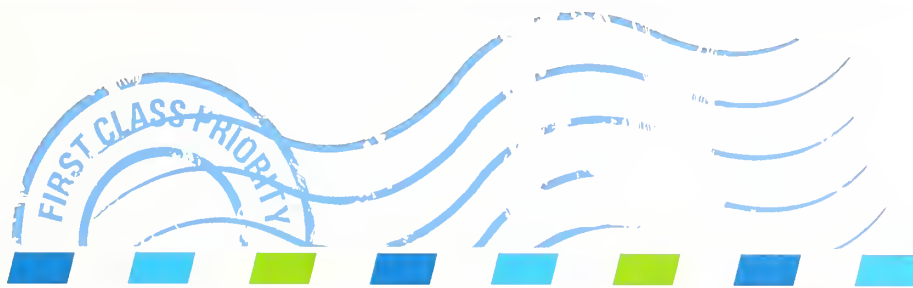

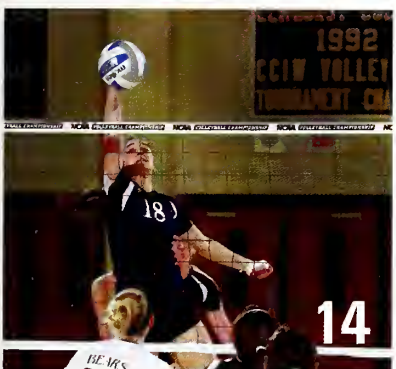

PAWS Adoption Event



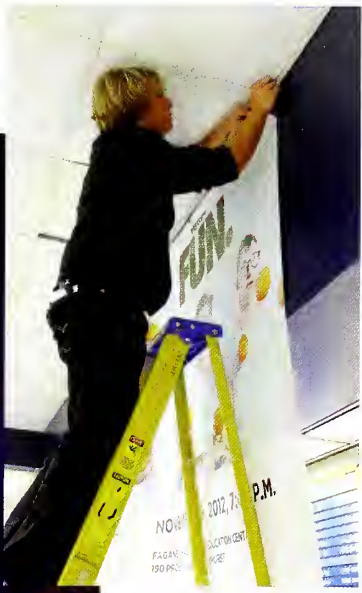

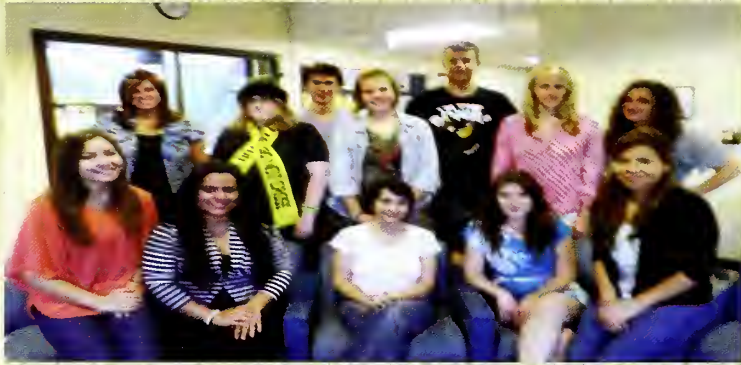

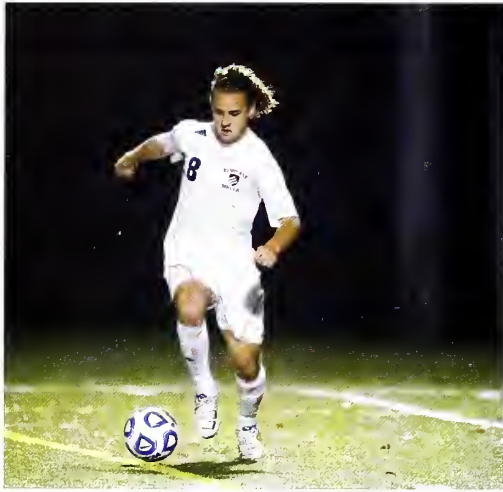

From shutting out Loras College with a score of 36-0, the Bluejays went on a tear only losing one game in the regular season play. They finished the entire season with a record of 10-2 with a undefeated record at home and a record of 6-1 in the CCIW conference. For the first time since 1980, the Bluejays were named the CCIW conference Champions. Also, they secured a berth in the NCAA Division III Championships for the first time ever in school history. Senior Running Back Scottie Williams was named the 2012 Gagliardi Trophy Winner. This is the first time that a player from Elmhurst has ever won this prestigious award. The Gagliardi Trophy recognizes the Most Outstanding Player in Division III football. Scottie was voted on by fellow players and coaches, as well as members of the general public. The Elmhurst Volleyball team also had a season to remember. After clinching the CCIW conference title, the team got the chance to host their section of the NCAA Regionals. The team took that chance and ran with it beating their opponents 9 games to 2 to win the NCAA Regional title. They proceeded to the sectionals where they won their first match but fell against St. Thomas. Megan Reynolds and Kaitlyn Wilks were both named AVCA All-Americans and All-Region first team. Veasy Smith was also named All-Region. Coach Hall was named Midwest Region Coach of the Year.
