Dear Children of the Most High,

The Heavenly Father never places more on us than we can bear, and we are not alone in this calling. Because of the heart connection between the Son and the Father, Christ was able to succeed. Jesus never did, said, or acted upon anything else outside of the Will of the Father. This my friends is why we can enjoy freedom! But this freedom must be cultivated and understood daily. In other words, that is why you must work on your relationships; your relationship with God, with yourself, and with your neighbors. If you do this you will discover and enjoy peace, regardless of the atmosphere of the times.
