Dear Friends,

Wondering what you should do with your Christmas tree after the holiday? Don't just throw it out, recycle it. LA Sanitation has CURBSIDE collection for Christmas trees.

Dried-out trees are a dangerous fire hazard and should not be left in the home or placed outside. For curbside collection, if you live in a single-family home, remove all decorations, tinsel, and stands. Cut the tree in half and place it in your LA City Sanitation green clippings container. If you live in a multifamily building, please place your tree curbside on regular collection days.

Trees will be recycled and turned into compost and mulch.

To drop off your tree at a fire station through mid-January, visit:

Also, you can go to one of two mulching facilities, weekdays, from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.:
