#### Friend --

We have been blessed with several rain events over the past month, and it appears that more wet weather is on the way!

I want to remind you about the City services available to help residents cope with the inclement weather, as well as provide some tips on what to do around your home to protect your family and four legged companions.

Here are some tips to prepare yourself for the wet weather ahead:

- Check your catch basins to make sure they are clear of debris. Call LASAN at 311 or 1-800-773-2489 for assistance with debris removal.
- Ensure your building drainage is clear of debris, including rain gutters.
- Secure any loose palm fronds, tarps, loose items that may be carried away by rain or be blown away.
- Cover steep slopes on your property that are not vegetated, which may become unstable when saturated by rain.
- Use sandbags to protect properties in low lying areas. Contact your neighborhood fire station for sandbags.
- Have alternate evacuation routes out of your neighborhood.
- If you have sprinklers, turn them off before, during and after rain.
- Install rain barrels to capture rain. LADWP provides rebates for up to 4 rain barrels per property.
- Please reduce water consumption during rain to reduce flows in our sewers.

Also, consider creating an emergency kit that includes the following items: Food and water to last three days to a week (extra for pets); First aid kit & medications (over-the-counter and prescription); Radio (with extra batteries); Cash and important documents; Blankets; Clothing and sturdy shoes; Tools (wrench, duct tape, fire extinguisher, sturdy gloves, whistle); Sanitation and hygiene supplies.

LA RIVER - The The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE), Los Angeles District, is reminding Angelenos that the LA River Shared Path is only available for public use Monday through Friday after 4:00 p.m., and on weekends, while work takes place to remove non-native vegetation, trash and debris in the area adjacent to Elysian Valley.

The Los Angeles Department of Transportation (LA DOT) installed a shared path detour and signage around the construction zone. LADOT closed the LA River Shared Path from Gilroy Street (west of SR-2)

to Riverside Drive (at I-110), Monday through Friday from 7:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. from October 17, 2016 through March 15, 2017.
