Dear Friend --

We need more cops patrolling our neighborhoods – and working together, we can get them.

A constant refrain from residents of Los Angeles is that they rarely see a patrol car in their neighborhood, or



that it takes LAPD too long to respond to an emergency call, or that they can't get through to the department on the non-emergency number.

In neighborhoods throughout our city, the deployment of patrol officers is barebones — sometimes as few as two or three radio cars for an entire division — with officers overwhelmed, overworked, and significantly outnumbered. This is unacceptable and it is time to take bold steps to address this problem. That's why we've proposed a 10 point plan known as "Back to Basic Car", which seeks to rebuild and bolster the LAPD's primary patrol function and community policing delivery mechanism — the Basic Car Plan.

You can <u>read the full plan here</u>, as well as a "White Paper" that shows some startling statistics: during the past 50 years, the LAPD has grown by 30%, and the city's population has grown by 25%, but the number of officers patrolling our streets has actually decreased. It is shocking and unacceptable – and we need to fix it.
