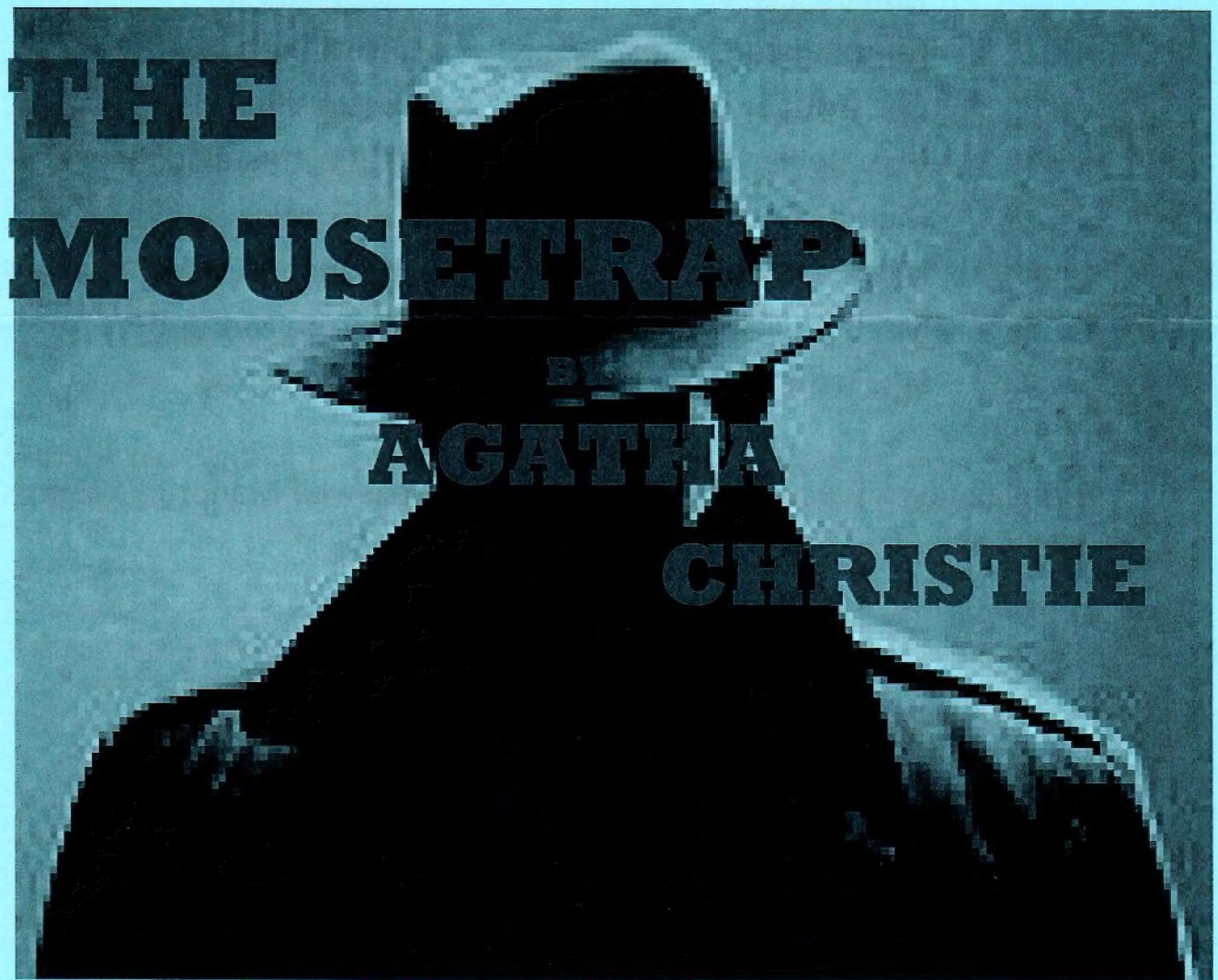

Director's Note

According to her autobiography, when Agatha Christie attended the original rehearsals of *The Mousetrap* she had conversation with the producer, Peter Saunders, who told her that he thought that the play would run for fourteen months. Christie answered that she gave it eight months. In fact, after she wrote the play, she gave the rights to it to her grandson as a birthday present, thinking it would make a nice little gift. The play opened in November of 1952 and has been playing in London ever since, amassing a record 26,000 performances in its 65 year run, quite the birthday present.

The Mousetrap is considered to be one of the most popular "who dun its" of the 20th century and remains popular even in 2017. This young cast has done a great job of embracing the script and creating a tense thriller for your enjoyment.

In keeping with the tradition of the show, we ask that when you leave the theatre that you not reveal who the murderer is until after closing night on Saturday. Enjoy the show.
