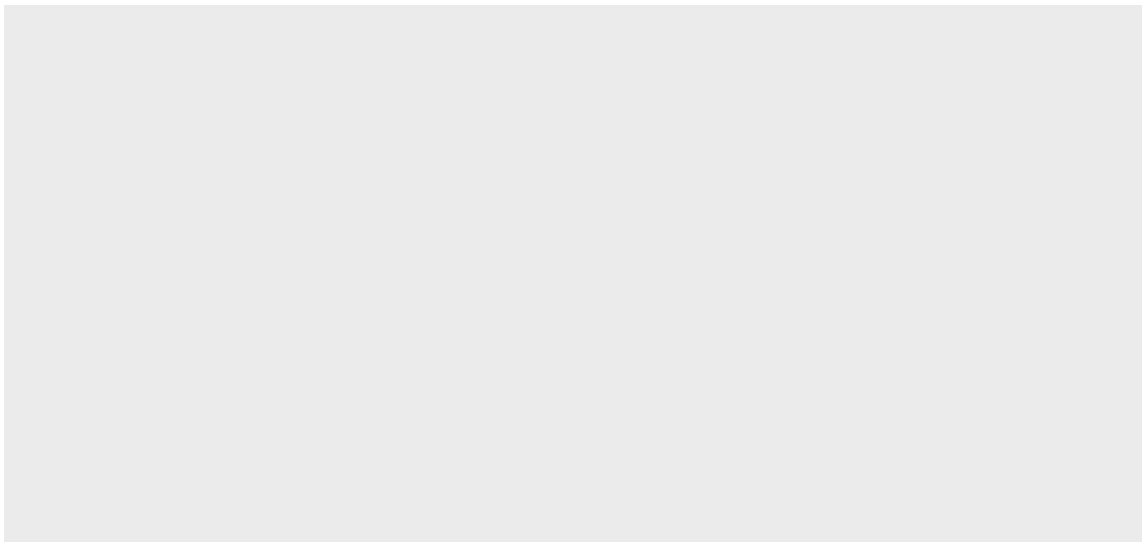
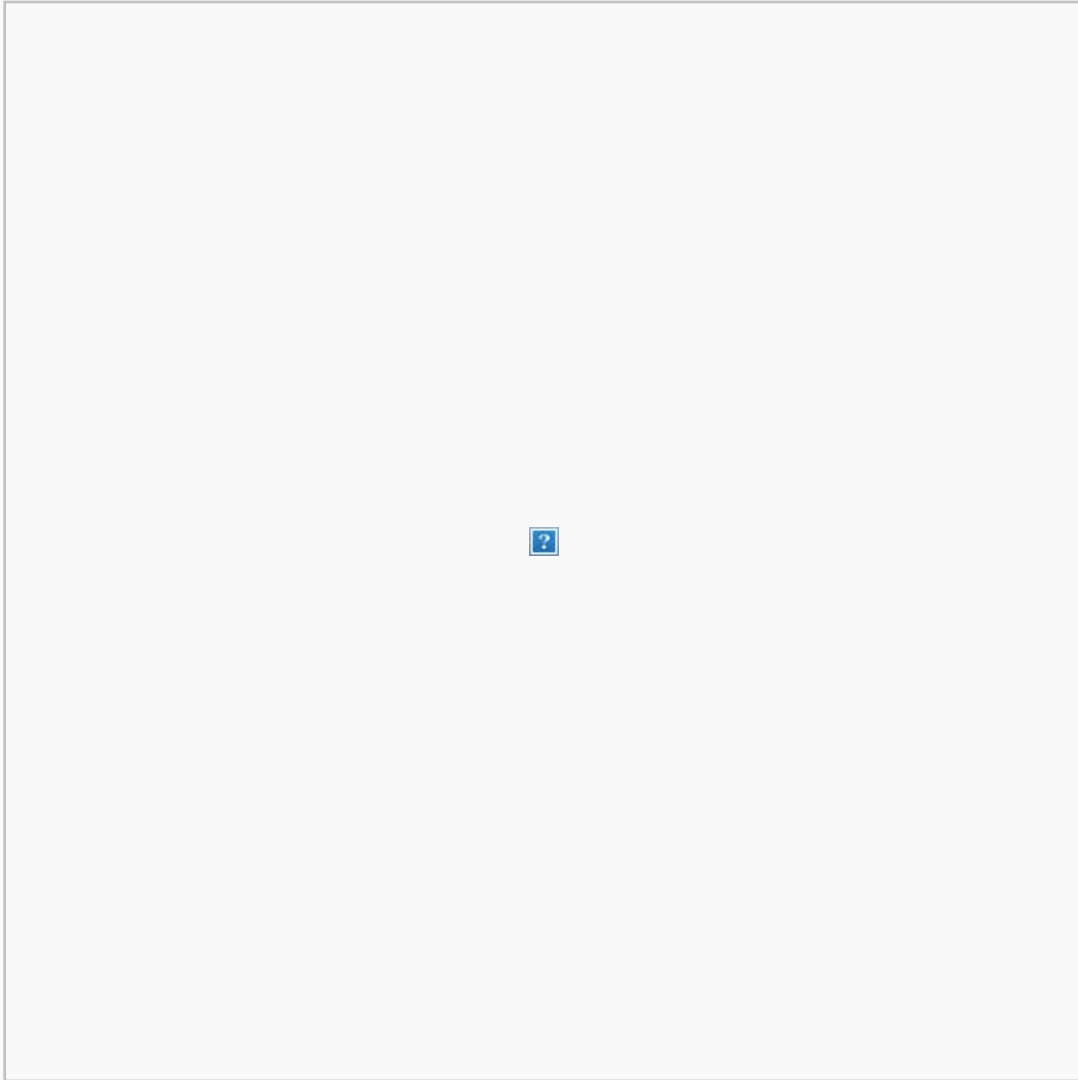

### **LADOT's first ATC Cabinet**

On June 20, 2017, LADOT installed its first Advanced Transportation Controller Cabinet (ATC) at the intersection of Cesar Chavez Avenue and Lyon Street. The ATC Cabinet is next generation in traffic control technology and has been under development for a number of years. The ATC Cabinet is an open-architecture platform that supports a wide range Intelligent Transportation Systems applications requiring field-installed equipment. It offers motorist and technician safety, enhanced operations, compact size, modular and high-density design, and improved power efficiency. This ATC cabinet along with LADOT traffic controller software will easily handle complex traffic operations like adaptive control, leading pedestrian interval operation, bicycle detection, light rail transit, and multi-modal great streets. Significant contributions to the development of the ATC Cabinet were made by George Chen, Senior Transportation Engineer.

### **Vision Zero Spotlight: Temple St. Slow Jams**

LADOT partnered on three community-based traffic safety activations this weekend as part of our Vision Zero education efforts. Among the many highlights of the weekend, LA walks, Public Matters and Pilipino Workers Center installed several murals and art pieces along the corridor. To take community members around to see all of the art installations and activities, the Temple St. Slow Jams team hired a colorful, animated Jeepney shuttle. The jeepney also played a slow jams playlist, curated by community members in Historic Filipinotown.

### **Rumble No More: LADOT Installs "Rumble Bars" to reduce street racing**

LADOT's safety-first approach was cemented today through a brand new "rumble bars" installation— a Vision Zero tool that can be used to address speeding on roadways where the critical speeds, traffic volumes, or roadway grade are too high for speed humps to be used. CD 12 Councilmember Mitch Englander, along with LAPD and LADOT, conducted a press conference to show off our new "Rumble Bar" demonstration on Plummer Street between Canoga Avenue and Topanga Canyon Boulevard. The Rumble Bars are thick layers of thermoplastic that are melted onto the roadway in thin strips, perpendicular to traffic flow, to produce a vibrotactile effect similar to rumble strips, that will alert the driver to slow down, or that a signal or stop is ahead. These Rumble Bars were installed by the Valley Yard crew led by Earl Brown, and including Randu Pineda, Charles Parra, and Anthony Duke.

Please expect delays and congestion in and around the event areas.

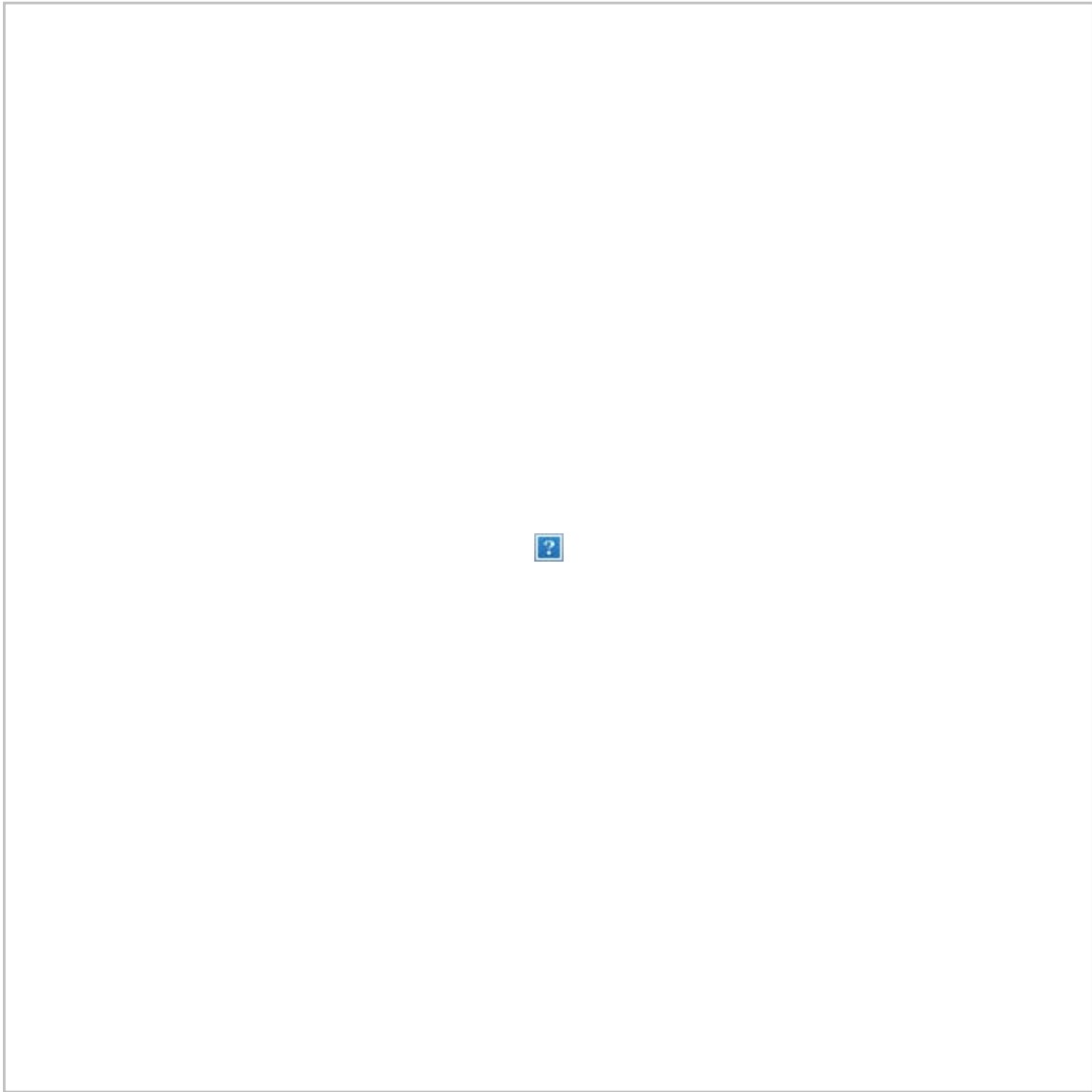
