Piano.

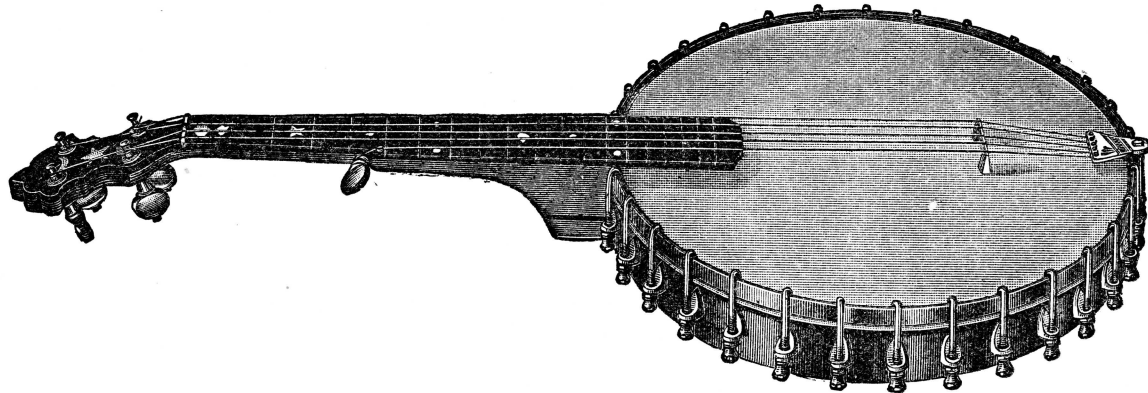
