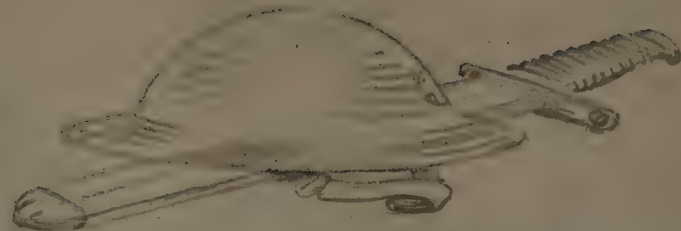


1. Looking out of the famous Bismark Tunnel, which was driven thru the Hill by the Germans. It is about seven ft. in height and wide enough for four men abreast. It contained a perfect Ventilating and Drainage System. At intervals there were large Chambers built off from the sides.

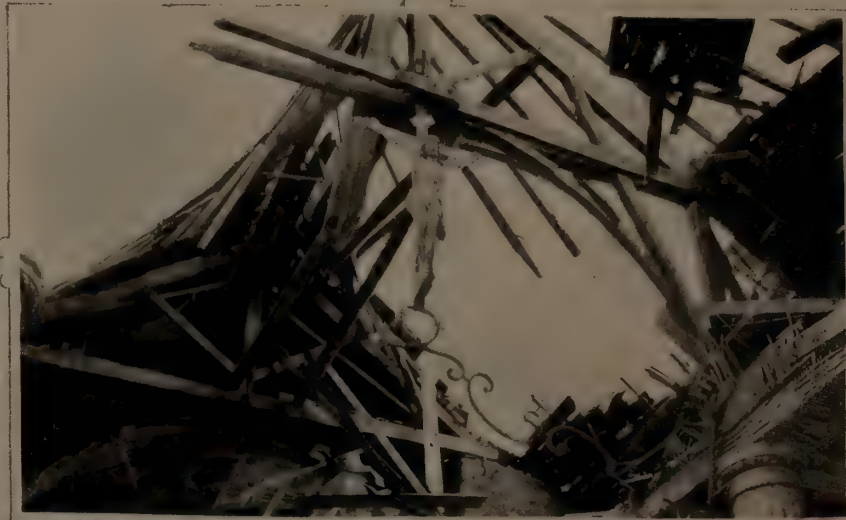

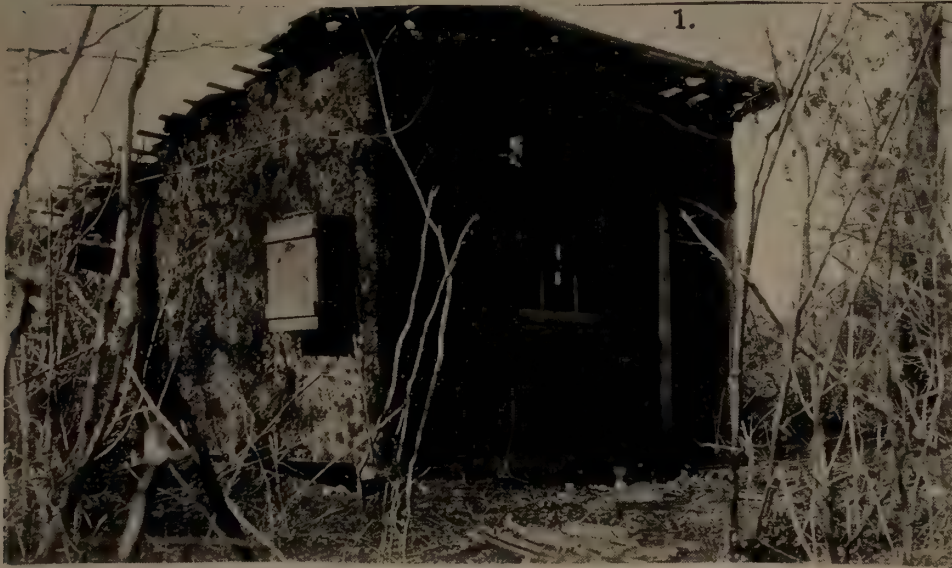

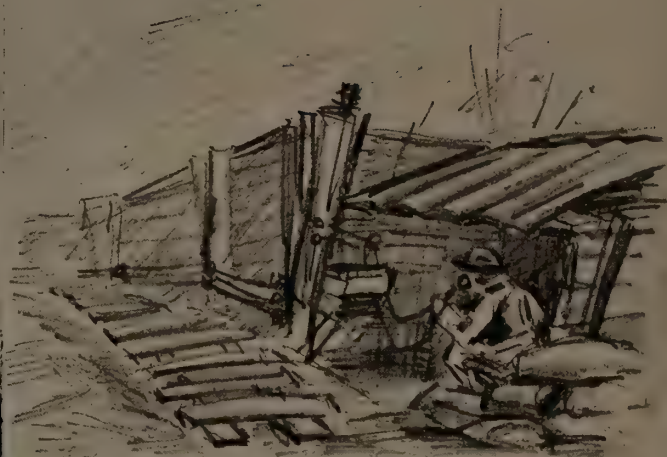
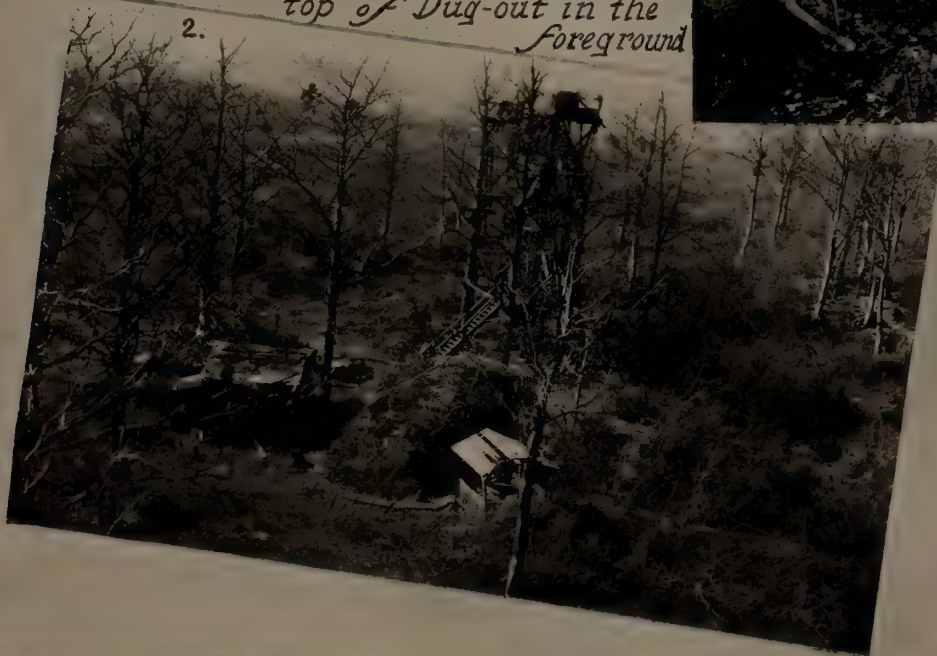

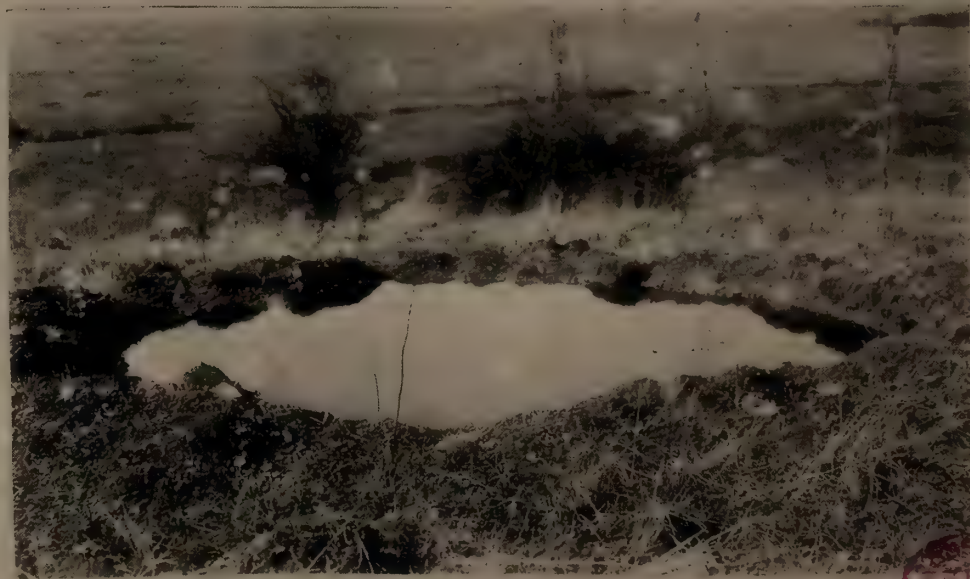

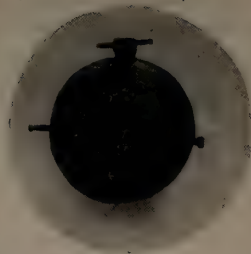

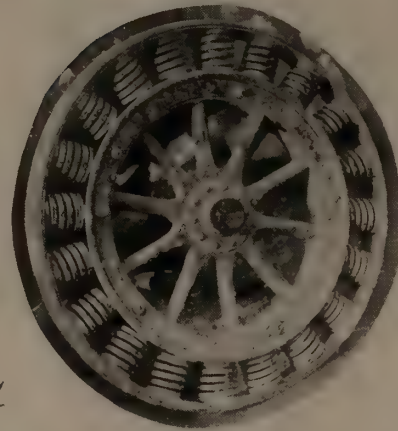

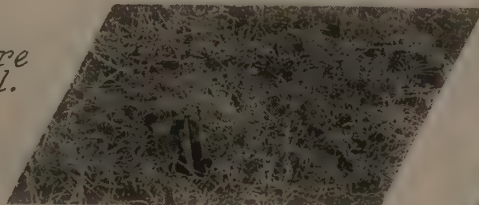

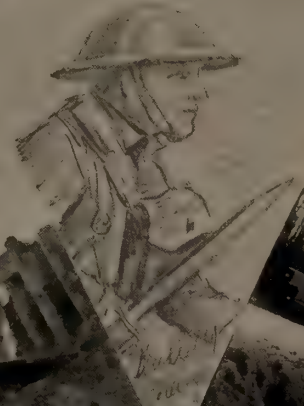

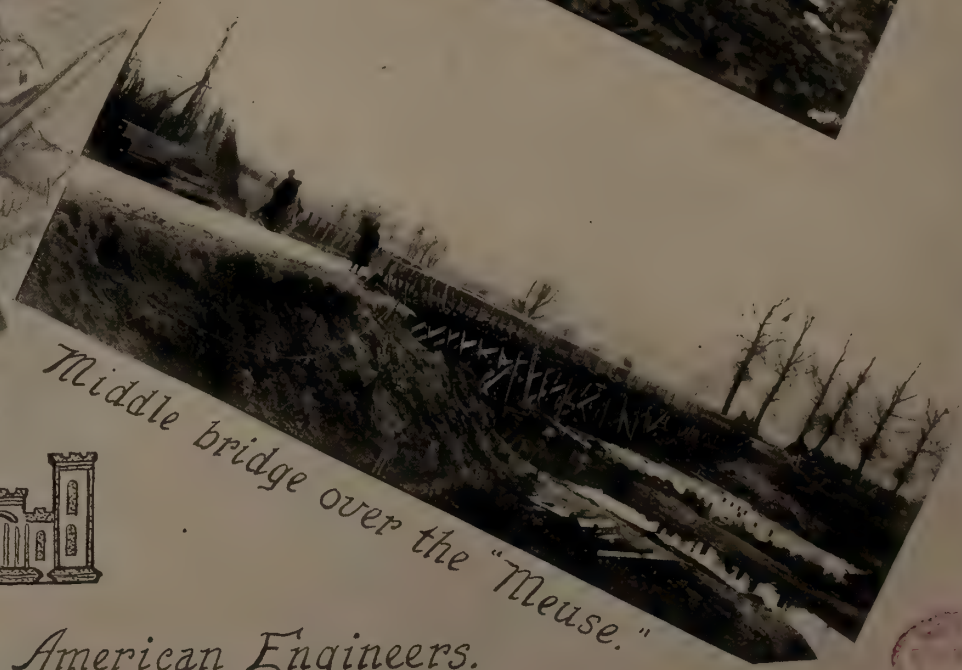

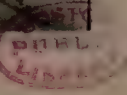

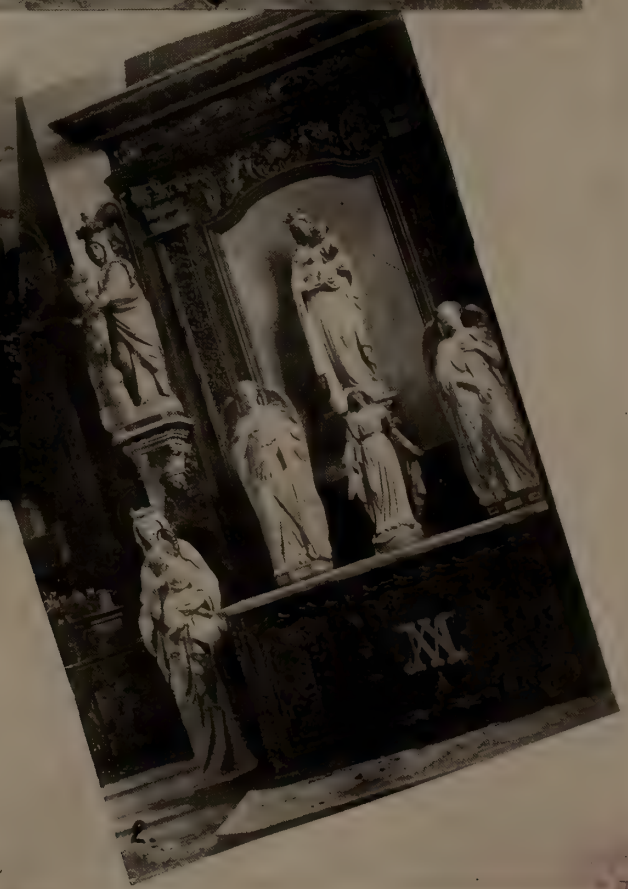

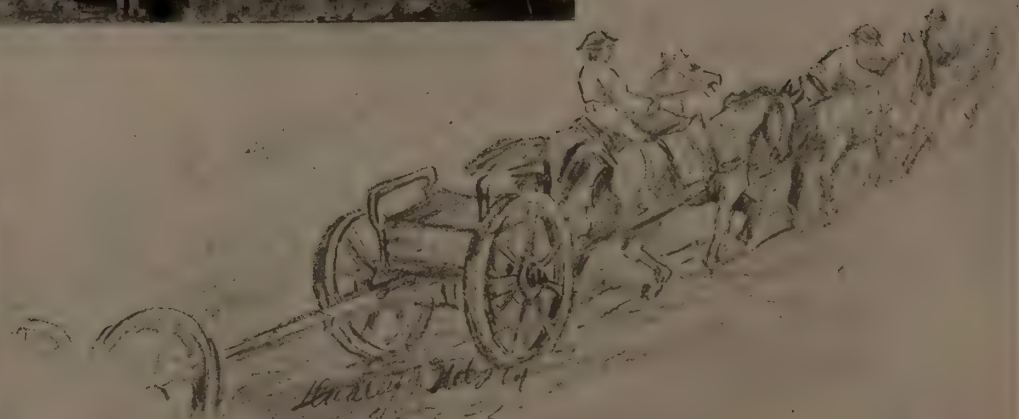

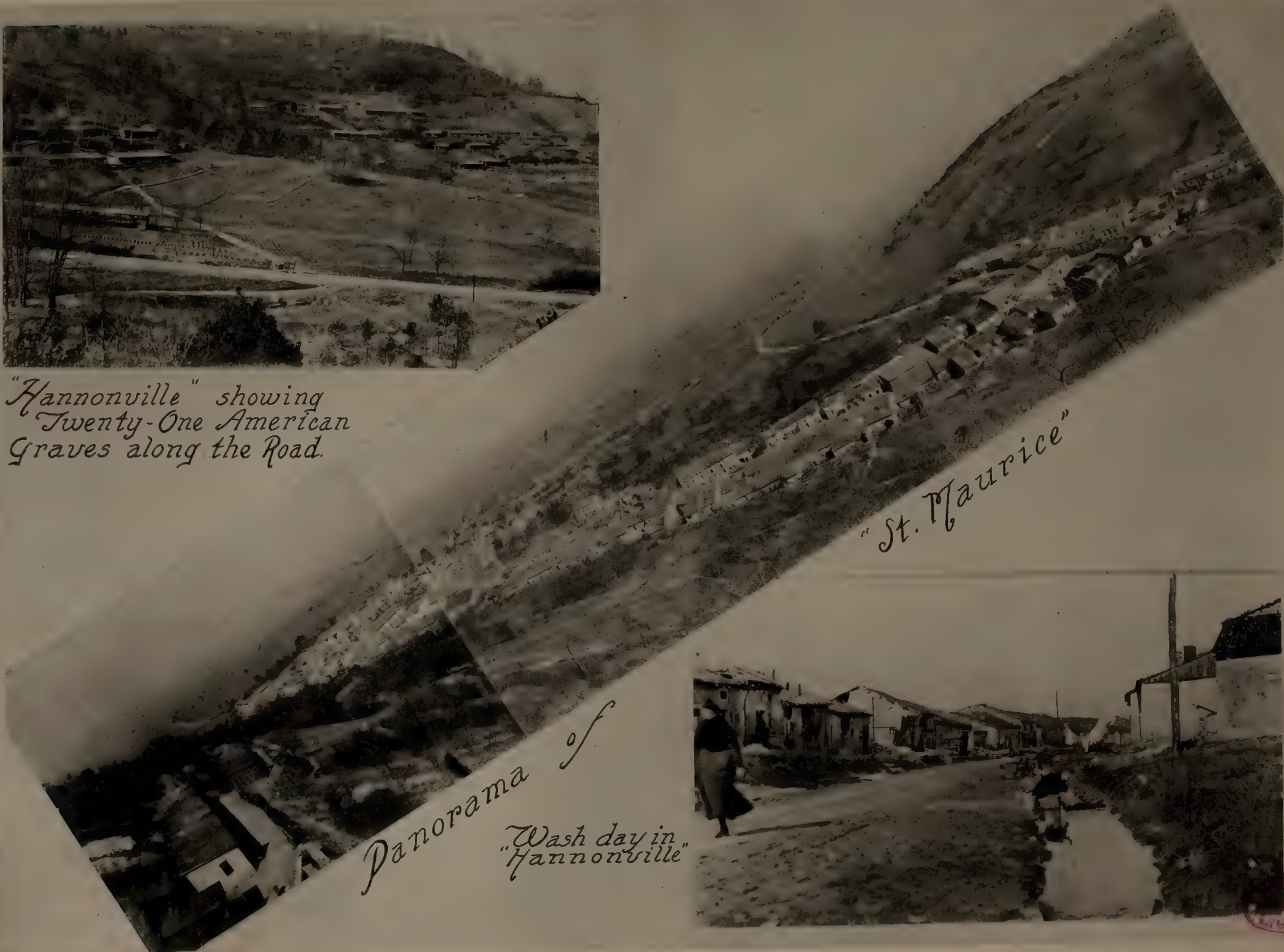

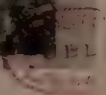

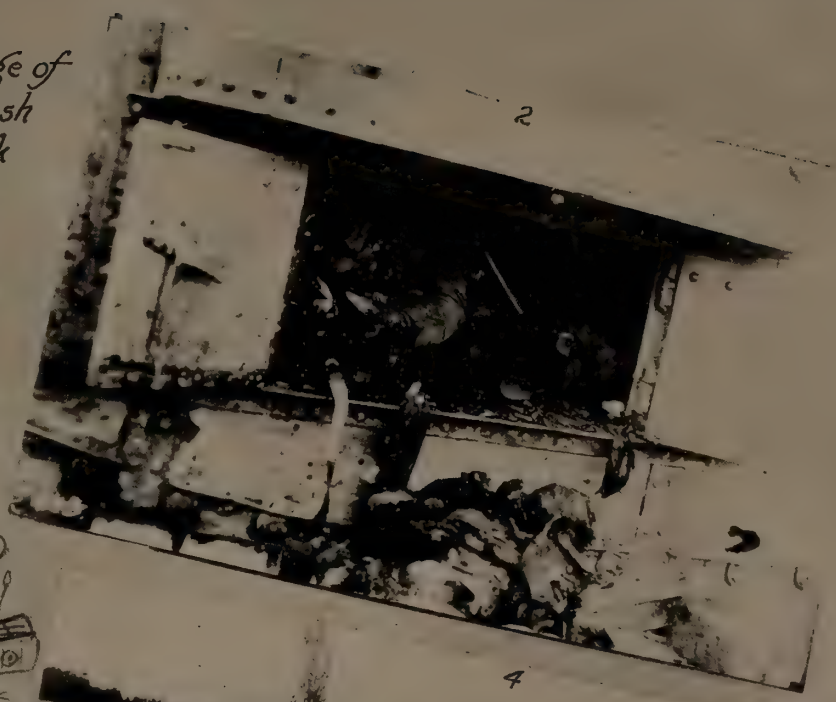

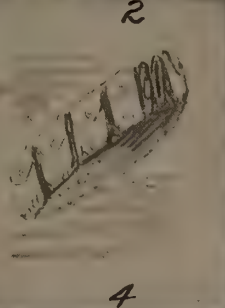
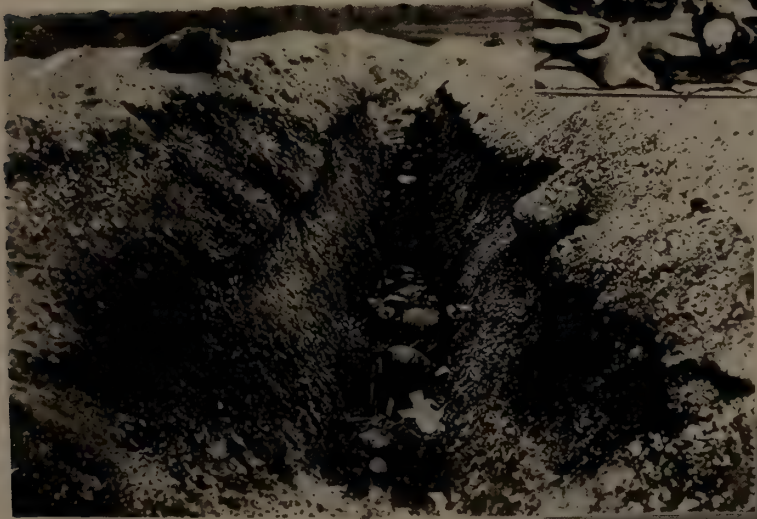

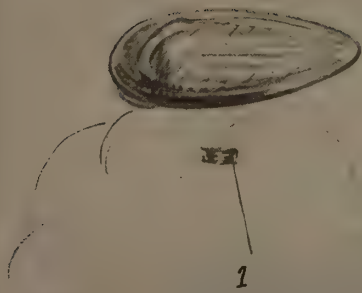

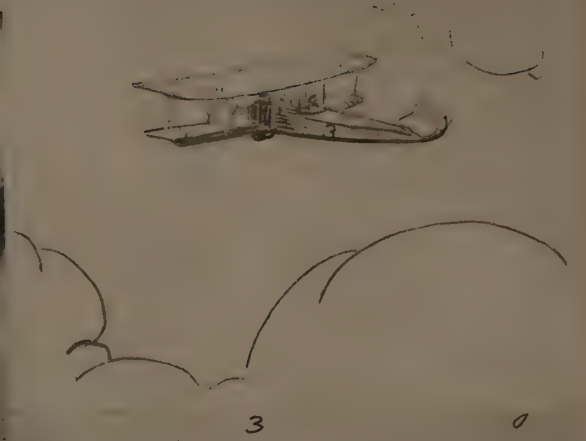

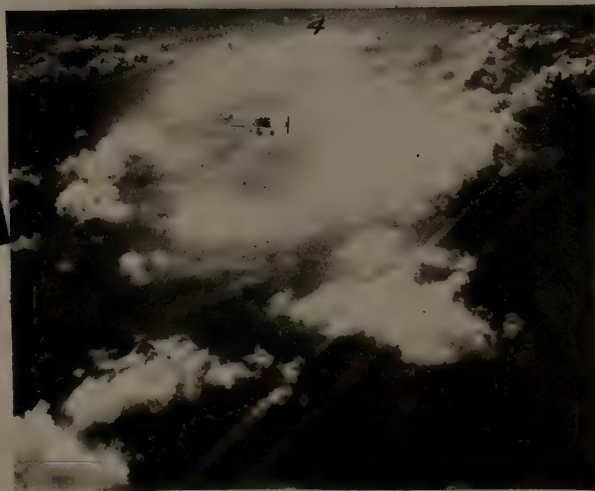

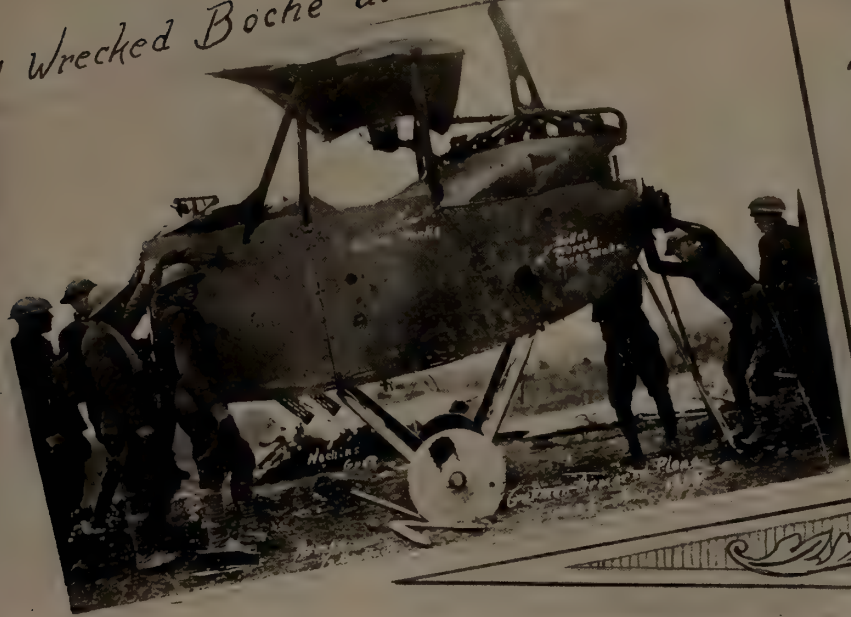

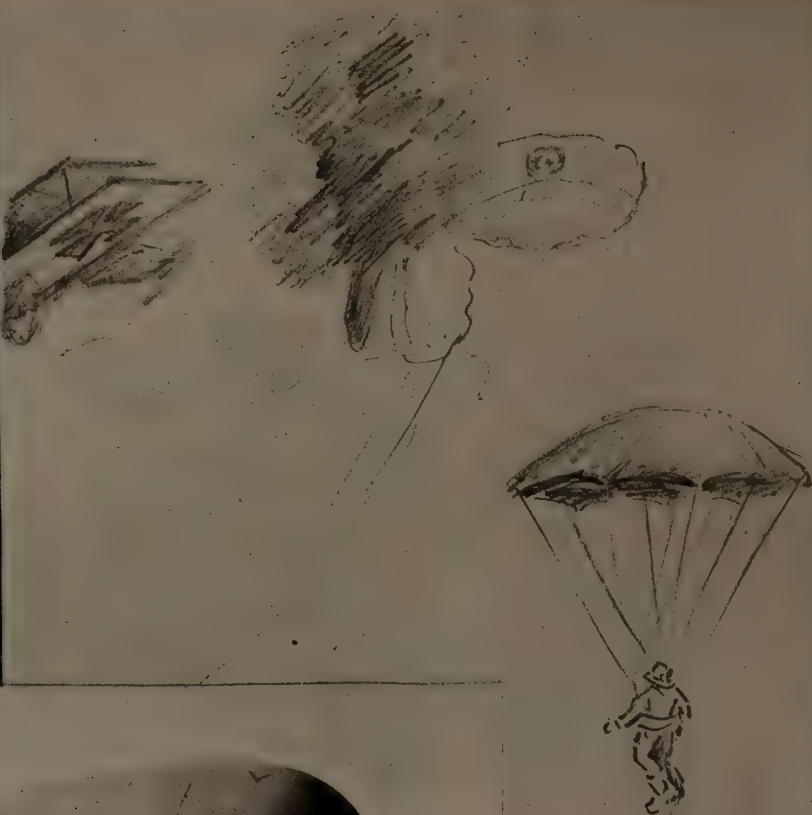

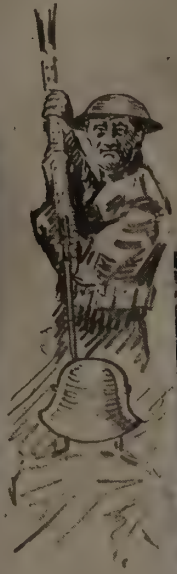

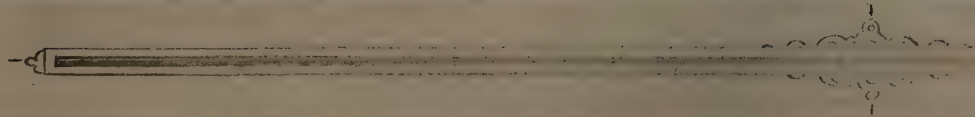
