

हे, हमही छी हारू!


Hi, I'm Haru!

आ बुन्नीमे ओहार। On rainy days, shelter.




आ जाड़क रातिमे घूरक गरमी। On cold nights, warmth.

ओ हमर खूब सेवा केलन्हि। हमरा खूब फल-फूल, साग-तरकरी खुएलन्हि। She took care of me.


She fed me vegetables and fruit.
