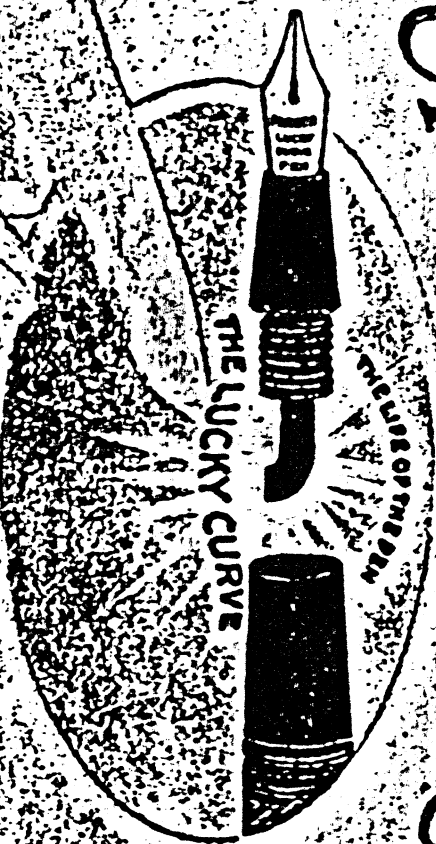

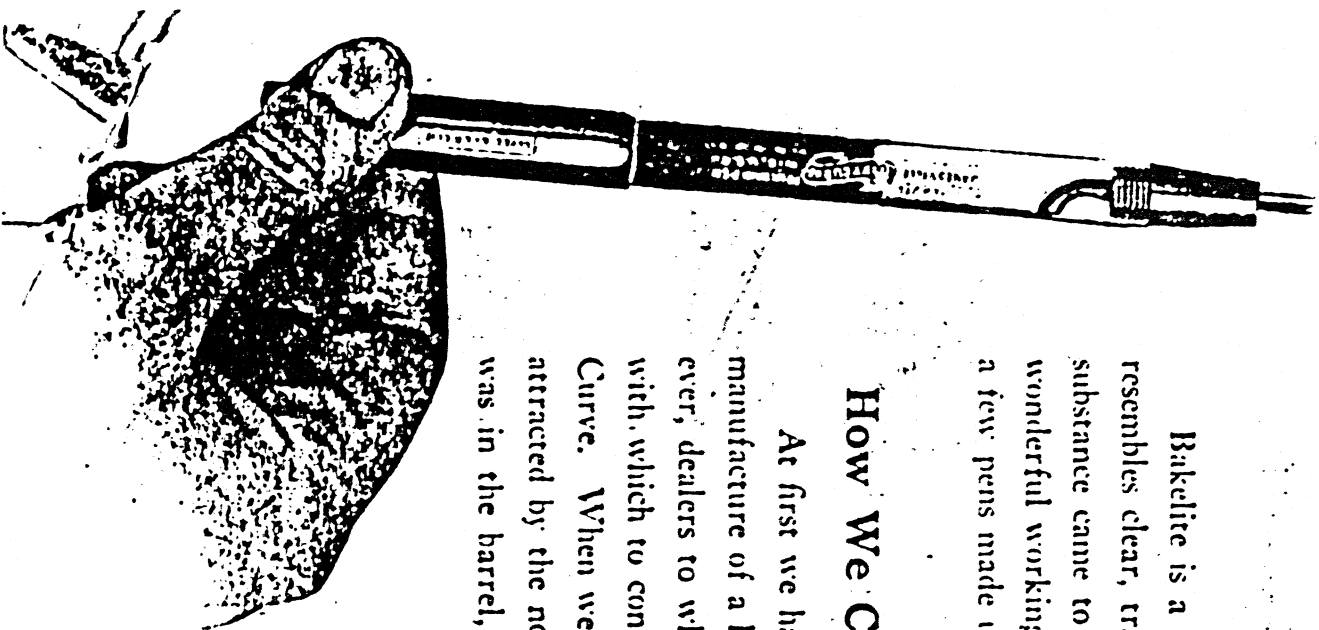
What Bakelite Is

Bakelite is a new substance, recently produced as a result of scientific experiment and research, which resembles clear, transparent amber so closely that only an expert can detect the difference. As soon as this substance came to our notice we saw that it was just what we needed to show clearly and conclusively the wonderful workings of capillary attraction as utilized by the Parker Lucky Curve, and we arranged to have a few pens made up with Bakelite barrels for demonstrating.

How We Came to Make Parker Fountain Pens with Bakelite Barrels.

At first we had no thought of making any use of Bakelite for commercial purposes further than the manufacture of a limited supply of transparent barreled pens for our own salesmen to carry. Presently, however, dealers to whom our salesmen showed their demonstrating pens began to ask for the same kind of a pen with which to convince their own trade of the perfect cleanliness produced in Parker Pens by the Lucky Curve. When we supplied these and the dealers showed them to their customers, many of *these* were attracted by the novelty, and by the convenience of being able at all times to see just how much ink there was in the barrel, and wished to purchase them for their own personal use. The demand from this source became so great and so insistent that a few months ago we decided to manufacture a few of our regular styles of Parker Pens with Bakelite barrels, and offer them for general sale along with the balance of the Parker Pen line. The call for these pens has been so great wherever they have been shown that we feel that, although we stumbled upon it almost by accident, the Bakelite barrel is going to be one of the most popular innovations ever made in the fountain pen business.

We are now making the Transparent Bakelite Fountain Pen in both standard and self-filling types, in four styles (numbers 20, 23, 24 and 25) as shown on next page.



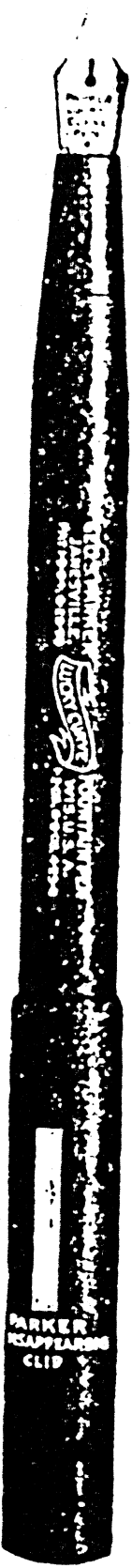
There is no difference whatever between the transparent Bakelite Fountain Pen and the same type and style, except in the barrel. In the Bakelite Pen this new amberlike substance is used in place of the hard rubber regularly employed for making the barrel. The Bakelite Pen is just as efficient, just as convenient, just as cleanly, and in addition has the features of novelty and convenience imparted by the clear amber transparency of this new material. The cost of the Bakelite Pens is slightly greater than that of the same pens with hard rubber barrel, since Bakelite is more expensive and more difficult to manufacture.

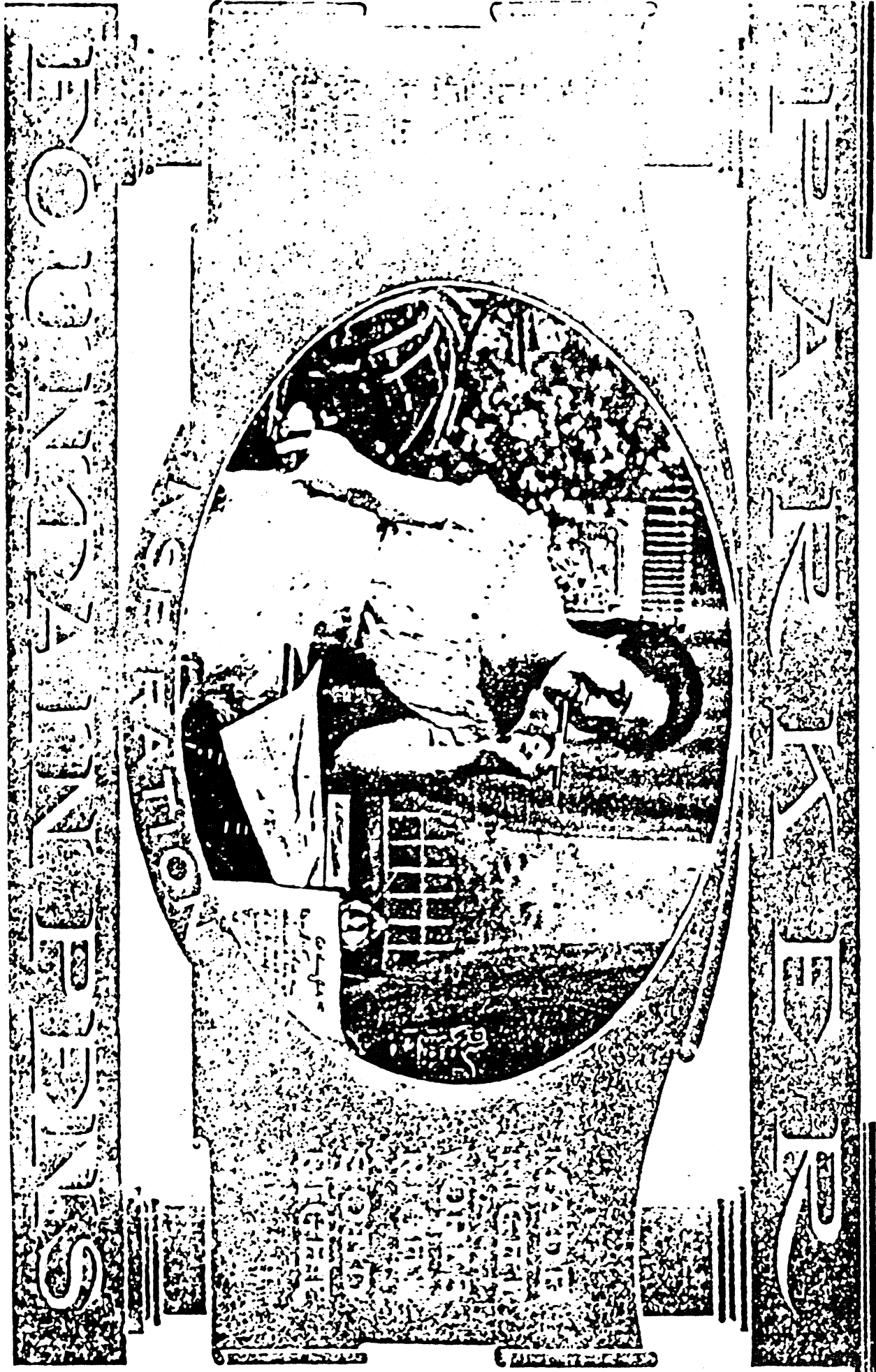


Cut No. 2. Ready to Fill.

The Parker Pressure-Button Bakelite Self-Filling Pen. This cut shows the button after having been depressed by which act the deflector presses the bar down and empties the rubber sac of air, so the fountain may drink itself full of ink.

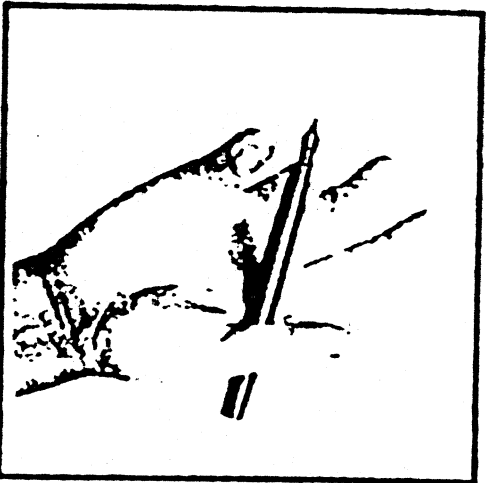

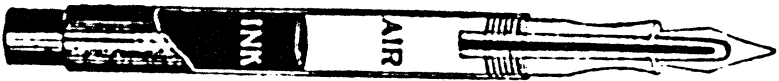

In order that you may understand why the Parker doesn't leak, you must know why fountain pens generally do leak, so we will tell you first why a fountain pen leaks. When you set a fountain pen in your vest pocket, point up, most of the ink runs down into the reservoir, but not all of it. Some always hangs up in the feed channel.

Between these two inks is always a space full of air. See X-ray photograph of a Parker Lucky Curve Fountain Pen, also X-ray photograph of a common type fountain pen, shown herewith.

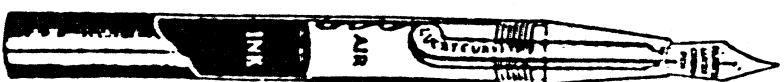
Now the body is 98 degrees hot. This is considerable heat. It's as hot as the hottest summer day in July.

Those 98 degrees heat of the body heat up the contents of the vest pocket pretty hot, and that heating up of the vest pocket heats up the air in the air space in your fountain pen.

When the air thus gets heated, it expands, and when it thus expands it's got to get somewhere. It can't stay in. It can't stay in any more than steam can stay in a cylinder, which contains two holes for it to get out.

Now when that expanding takes place, it expands against the line of least resistance, which is up through the feed channel and out through the pen point.

As it expands it makes a plunge for the only method of escape, viz., the feed channel. Instead of entering the channel in little minute bubbles, by some peculiar law of physics it enters the feed channel in *elongated* bubbles, completely filling the ink channel. As the pressure behind increases this elongated air bubble gradually creeps upward in the feed channel pushing all the ink on top of it upward until it fills the space around the nozzle, full of ink, and where it is apt to be jarred or spilled over the end of the nozzle where the writer finds it when he takes the cap off his fountain pen, and wonders what made his pen leak so badly.

Of course, you see now, why you get smeared when you take off your cap to write.

Now, let us tell you why the Parker doesn't leak.

The Parker feed channel isn't straight like the other. It's crooked—curved at the lower end, as per the X-ray photograph herewith. It curves over and touches the wall of the barrel.

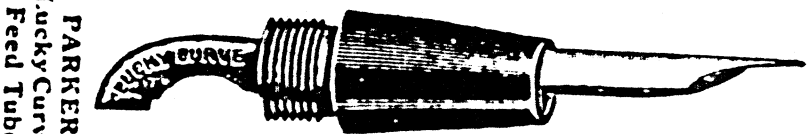
That magic touch is the secret—the open secret of Parker Pen success. The moist wall of the barrel has so great an attraction for the ink in the feed tube that *instantly* a tiny flood rushes downward—when the pen is upright—and joins the store in the reservoir beneath.

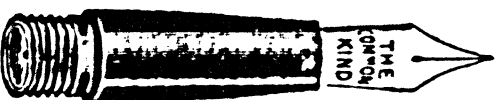

What makes the Lucky Curve and the Lucky Touch suck the ink down? Capillary Attraction, that wizardly force that makes a lump of sugar suck coffee or a sponge suck water, or a blotter suck ink, or a lamp wick suck oil.



The Parker Lucky Curve is the only invention that has ever been contrived and patented that really stops leaking and smearing your fingers. All sorts of contrivances such as plugs, and things of that sort, have been used, but so powerful is the air when it gets warm and begins to expand, that it will drive the ink out around plugs and pistons and around everything. There's only one way to make a pen stop leaking and that one way is to *remove the cause*. It's just like curing a man of sickness. You can't PARKER cure him; you've got to remove the cause. All fountain pens seek to *cure leaking rather than to remove the cause*, and that is why they fail to stop leaking and smearing of fingers. Please remember it distinctly, that the Parker is the only pen that removes the cause of leaking and smearing, and, therefore, is the

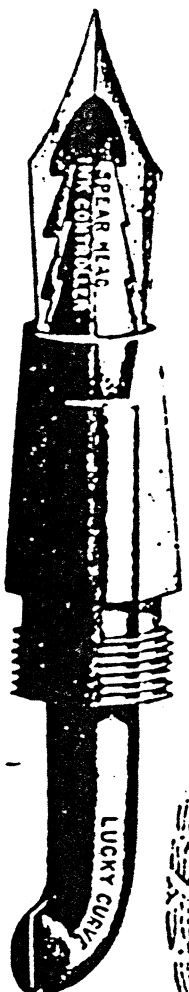
only pen that doesn't leak and smear. Now, about that *Spearhead Ink Controller* which holds up blots.

That is one of the most ingenious things that has ever been contrived by physics.

The *Spearhead Ink Controller* is a little device to prevent ink from feeding too fast or dropping off the pen point should more ink be forced out of the reservoir by accident or otherwise, as for instance a sudden jar.

The Controller consists of little notches or recesses cut in the side of the feeder. By one of the most peculiar and strangest laws of physics it is found that when ink which had been forced out of the fountain as above indicated and which would ordinarily drop off on the paper, it will be taken up by this little Controller and deposited in the first set of notches and held there as tenaciously and securely as though it was grasped by two tiny little hands.

Should still more ink be forced out, this strange law of physics will repeat the performance and fill the next two recesses or notches above and so on until the complete under side of the pen is loaded with ink held there by this weird and wizardlike force.

Parker Jack Knife Pen—Carry in Any Pocket, Any Position, Wont Leak



This phantom cut shows the simple principle of construction that is used for the Parker Jack Knife Safety Pen.

The tapering inner cap fits perfectly and forms an ink tight compartment for the gold pen. No valves or other complicated mechanism to get out of order.

The Parker Lucky Curve Jack Knife Pen is the only fountain pen designed that can be carried with absolute safety in any pocket or in any position, and it won't leak.

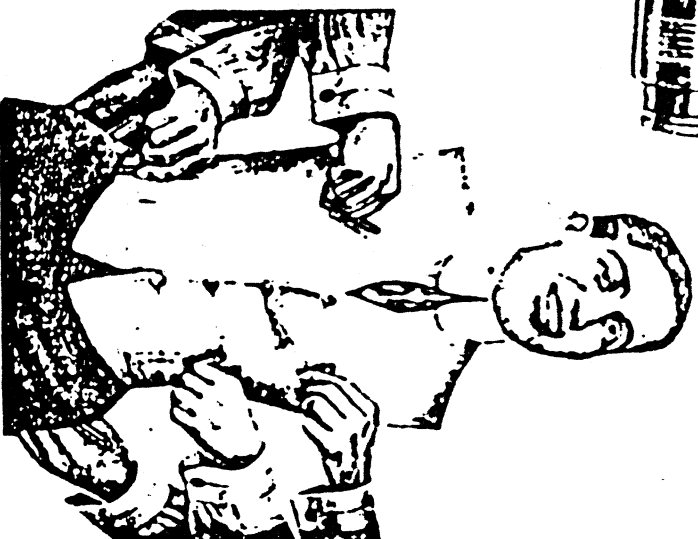
The Parker Jack Knife Pen has two caps, the regular or outer cap which screws on over the nozzle and the inner or safety cap which fits inside the regular cap (see sectional cut above). The gold pen is always encased in an air tight and ink tight compartment.

Wherever you take the Parker Jack Knife Pen out of your pocket, no matter if you have been carrying it upside down, simply *hold it with the cap upright and unscrew it* and if there is any ink in the cap, it will be quickly pulled back into the barrel of the pen by the magic force of capillary attraction. The Lucky Curve does that.

The Parker Jack Knife Pen wouldn't be such a wonderful invention unless it had the additional feature of the Lucky Curve so the ink will always be drained back where it belongs down in the barrel of the pen.

The accompanying cut shows just how convenient the Jack Knife Pen is. You do not have to think to put in into one particular pocket right side up with care, but you simply without thought or danger of leaking, shove it into any pocket you want and always find it ready for instant use and ink where needed but never where it will soil your fingers.

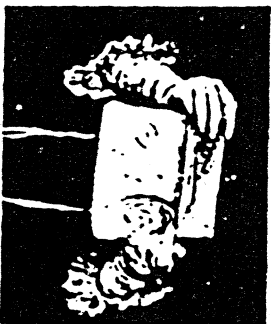
This phantom cut shows the Safety Cap on the Jack Knife Pen which not only prevents the pen from leaking but also being absolutely air tight keeps the point of the pen perfectly moist at all times and consequently it is always ready for instant writing.

The cuts to the right show how the Jack Knife Pen can be handled with white kid gloves or carried in a lady's purse or bag and never leak.

When fitted with the screw ring, it can be attached on the end of the watch chain and either allowed to hang as an ornament or carried in the opposite vest pocket (see page 33 describing line of Jack Knife Pens fitted with screw ring for this purpose).

We are also now manufacturing the Jack Knife Pen in full length patterns as so many people want a long pen that can be thrown into their grip or traveling case in any position with perfect safety.

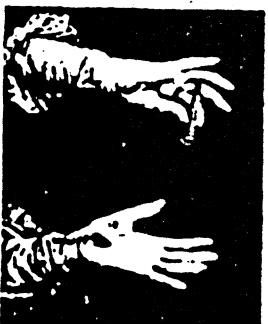

Parker Level Lock Clip "The Clip That Disappears"

New *Parker Level Lock Disappearing Clip*. There is nothing like it in the entire world. It is an entirely new departure in fountain pen clips.

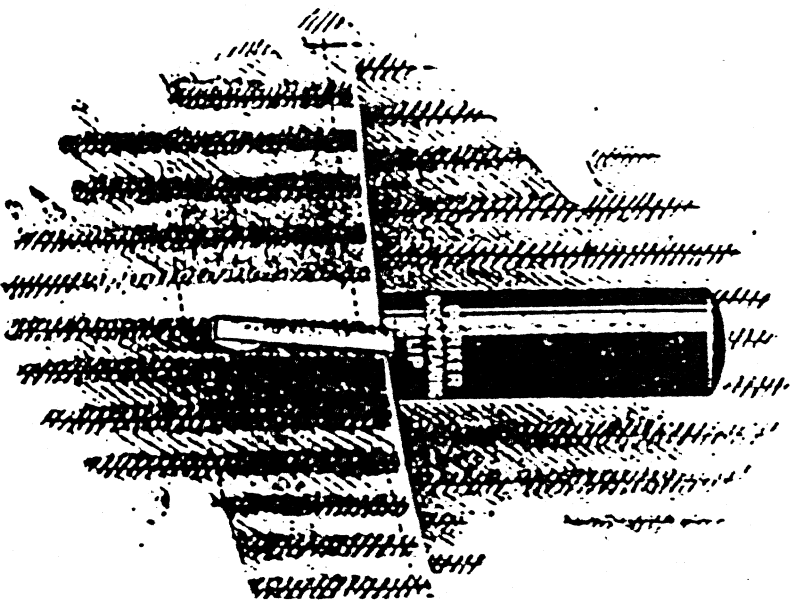
Instead of being riveted or clasping on the outside of the cap, making this end of the fountain look like an eye-sore, it is built on entirely different and distinct lines. Like a good little servant, it is in evidence only when wanted. *When not wanted it disappears to the level of the cap.*

The clip is visible above the surface of the cap only when the pen is ready to go into the pocket. Then it appears above the surface and grips the lapel of the pocket as shown in the cut. As soon as the cap is taken from the pen point end, the clip immediately disappears to the level of the surface of the cap, in which position it looks like a neat little nickel name plate—in fact the open space is usually left for the engraving of the owner's name.

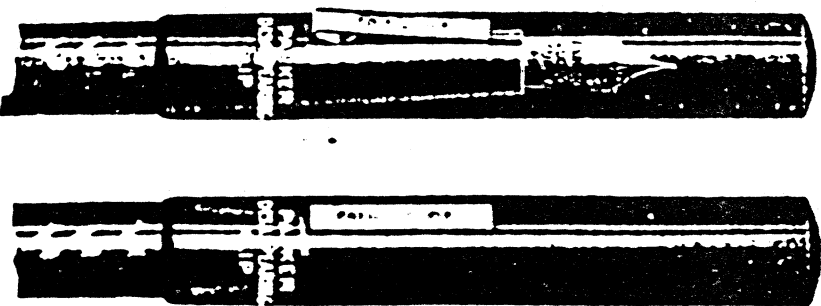
It grips the pocket and holds but does not tear it. Two little holes are cut into the cap and the clip is held in place by the bridge formed between the holes and also a small brass collar in the upper end of the cap.

Altogether it is the one clip that fills the idea of what a clip should be. Cannot be sold separate from the cap owing to the fact each Level-Lock must be fitted to the cap. The price is only 25c in addition to the price of the pen.

The Level-Lock Clip can also be furnished in gold filled for 50c each in addition to price of pen.

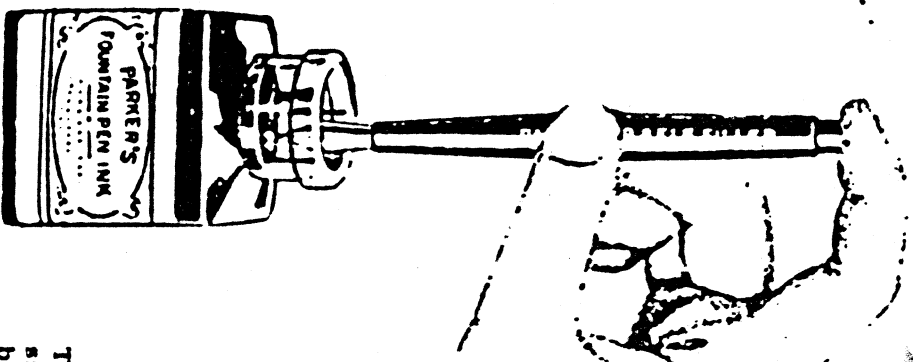
The New Parker Self-Filling Pen Complete

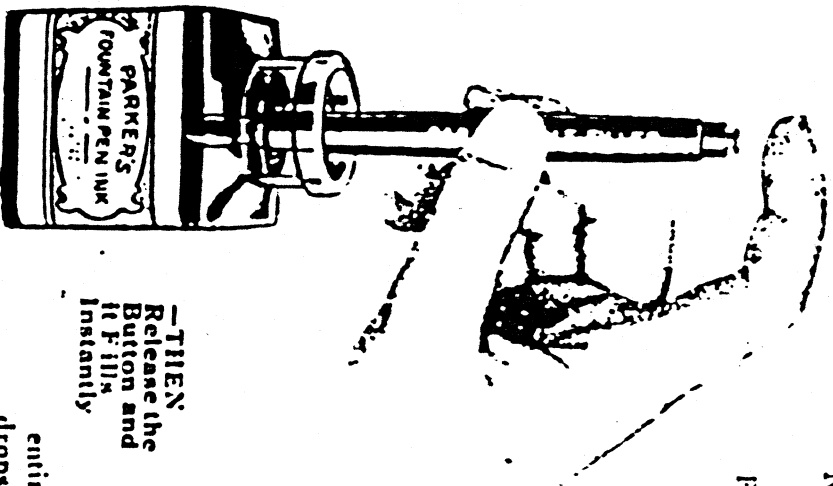

The accompanying illustrations show the simplicity of filling this style of pen which is as follows: A slight turn removes the "blind" cap—press the button—insert the nozzle in the ink—release the button and it instantly fills itself. The entire operation requires three to six seconds. We confidently feel that the new Parker Self-Filler is the "last word" in Self-Filling Pens. It is sold with the absolute guarantee of giving entire satisfaction and every dealer is authorized to offer you this guarantee.

REQUENT copying of figures by writing increases in proportion the chance of mistakes. If instead of rewriting written articles, a duplicate copy were made while the original was being written, the liability of error would be decreased very much and much time saved by doing two jobs in the time formerly required for one.

Comparatively few people know the many uses to which a Fountain Pen can be put. Take, for instance, the Manifold Pen. Any firm doing either a wholesale or retail business would save one-half the expense of a bill-clerk by keeping up with the times and using a Parker Manifold Pen. With it, the original bill is made and at the same time, by having a sheet of especially prepared paper, known as pen carbon, placed beneath and over another blank bill, an exact duplicate of the original is made. These duplicates can then be placed in a binder, used as a journal or order book, from which postings to the ledger can be made.

PHYSICIANS use them for making original copy of prescriptions for patients, and retaining duplicates for files for future reference. **BUSINESS MEN** use them in making copies of correspondence. Does away with letter press. No business man should ever write a business letter or order without preserving a duplicate copy for future reference, which is easily and quickly done when the original is being made.

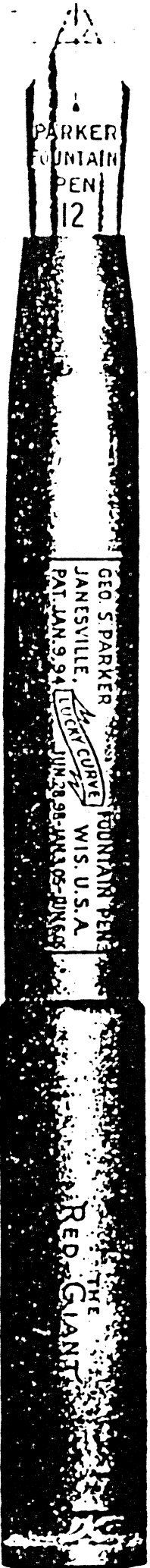
