Ferhaps it may seem a little peculiar to you that this company is manufacturing something other than foun tain pens, pencils, desk gets and ink, but such is the case.

We have recently taken up the manufacture of a Holy Water Sprinkler. Catholics everywhere know well the use of the Holy Water Sprinkler.

These lluly Water Sprinklers are made so that they guite closely resemble the PARKER VACUMATTC founthin pen. They lave, of course, no pen in them. They ar. semi-transparent so that the priest using one can see just how much Holy Water is in the barrel. They are very beautiful and can be carried in the pockel.

On the top of the cap is a gold cross, which makes it lowk somewhat ornamental and, at the same time, if the priest carries a fountain pen in his porket with the Sprinkler, the cross on the top of the Sprinkler identifies it from the pen.

Already a large number of these Sprinktera have been sold in all parts of the world. Our Tandon Office, for instance, just told us they had an inquiry from truland for five gross of these and spnt in an order for several dozen preliminary to the expectant order.

Nut long since one of our representatives on the road, Mr. Lee P. Benton, wrote us in regard to a young man in his turritory, in lumboldt, lows, who is dning some fine foustain pen selling.

Humboldt, Jown, is a small town of only a little over $2,(000)$ population. You would think under the circumstances that the opportunities for selling fountain pens and pencils in a town of this size would be somewhat limited, but the young man exploycd in the drug sture in that town, Mr. Royal Bennett, thid not think so.

Do you know what he did? He compited a list of people whom he thought ought to bay a PARKFR pen or pencil. Then he turned his thought batteries on these people and made them acquainted with PARKER pens.

When be got through, he knew the interesting story of the marrufacture of PARKER pens so that he could in turs pass it on to the customer.

If you visit the l'arker Pen plant, the writer would be very pleased in have you visit his summer home wherein is installed some ratleer interesting Oriental objects which the writer has gathered in his pilgrimages about the world.

Ore, for instance, is a Buddhist Shinto Shrine such as they usp in the Orient and the only one the writer las ever seon in the United States. Here it was that the Prince and Princess Svasti and Prince Arjuna of the Royal Siamese Party worshipped when they were guests of Mrs. Parker and the writer some three years ago.

These are only a few of a number of rather Interesting Oriental carvings which are placed on the writer's estate in very similar arrangements to those foumd in China, Ceylon and India.
