## **CAW'S "DASHAWAY" FOUNTAIN PEN**

This pen is the result of experiments extending over a period of a quarter of a century, and was brought to its present state of perfection in 1891, since which time over 50,000 pens per annum have been sold, and it stands at the close of the nineteenth century the most popular and widely known fountain pen manufactured. It comprises a 14-kt. gold pen fitted to a fountain holder of highly polished, vulcanized rubber, and on each side of the pen is a feeding shaft of hard rubber, one of which conducts the ink from the fount to the ribs of the pen, while the other conducts air to the fount to supply the vacuum caused by the exhaustion of the ink, thus forming a

### **DOUBLE FEED**

one for the exit of ink, the other for the entrance of air. In this simple construction the inventor combines the well-known laws of atmospheric pressure and capillary attraction, which completely overcomes the common faults in fountain pens, namely, "skipping" at one time, and "flooding" at another.

The "Dashaway" differs from all other fountain pens, not only in the "double feed," but in its exceeding sim-

licity, which enables any novice to take it apart and clean it and re-adjust the parts with the greatest ease.

Any good writing or copying ink may be used, and one filling will write from forty to fifty pages of foolscap. It can be carried in the pocket ready for use in any emergency, and as soon as touched to paper the ink begins to flow by capillary attraction and the action of the pen in writing. Records, accounts and letters written with this pen have a uniform color of ink on every page and line, because the ink, not being exposed to the air, is always fresh and is laid on more evenly than with a dip pen.

It is the simplest, cleanest, readiest and most easily managed of all the fountain pens.

When the cap is removed it is

### **READY TO WRITE**

and when the writing is done the cap can be replaced and the pen is ready for the pocket.

The hard rubber is incorrodible, and the gold pen being tipped with diamond (iridium) it is practically indestructible, and unless unnecessarily injured it will last a lifetime.

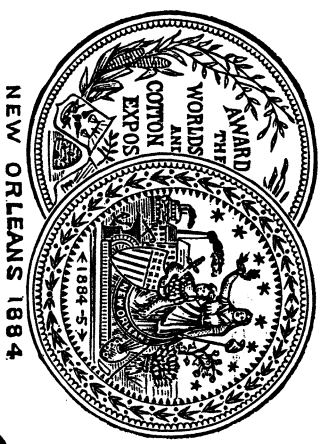

This pen is the latest product of inventive skill in fountain pens, and it is hailed as a public blessing by would-be users of fountain pens who had tried one kind after another and had given them up in despair.

3. The holder is made of one straight tube of highly polished vulcanized rubber.

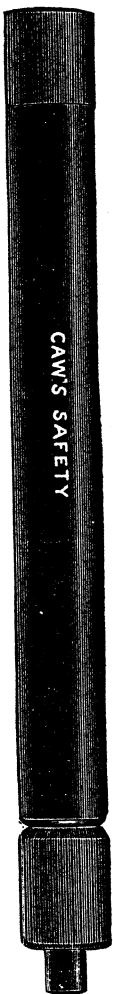
Actual Sizes of CAW'S "SAFETY" FOUNTAIN PENS when Closed for the Pocket.



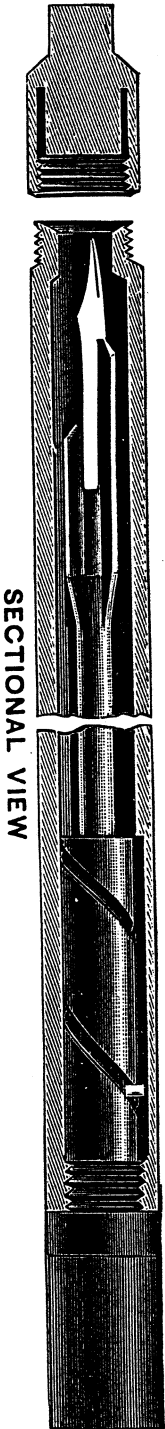

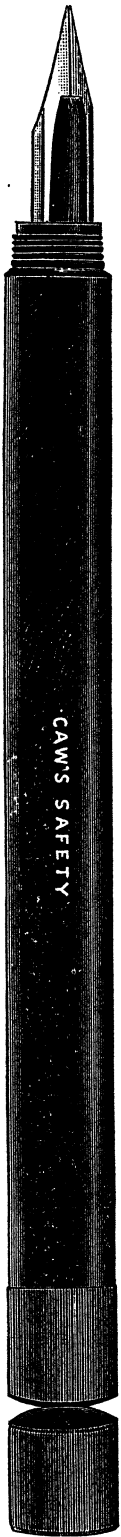

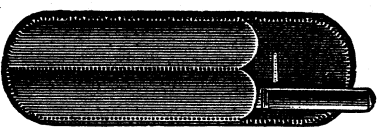

These "yokes" are made to fit any pen, and will be supplied to those using other makes of pen at small cost.

A supply of ink is carried in the handle to write from *fifty to sixty pages of foolcap paper*, and being hermetically sealed it will keep fresh and clean until used. The point is a circular tube of gold, tipped with an alloy of iridium and platinum, making it almost as
