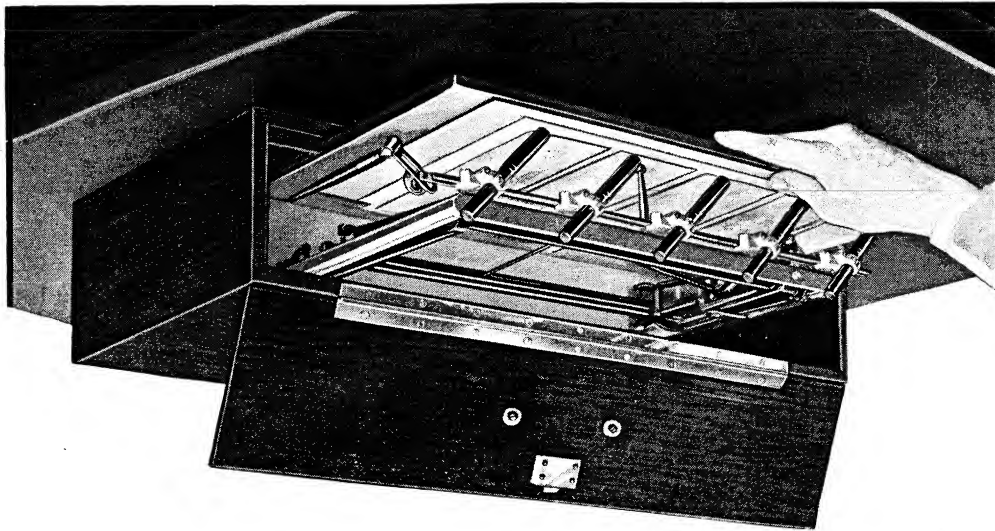

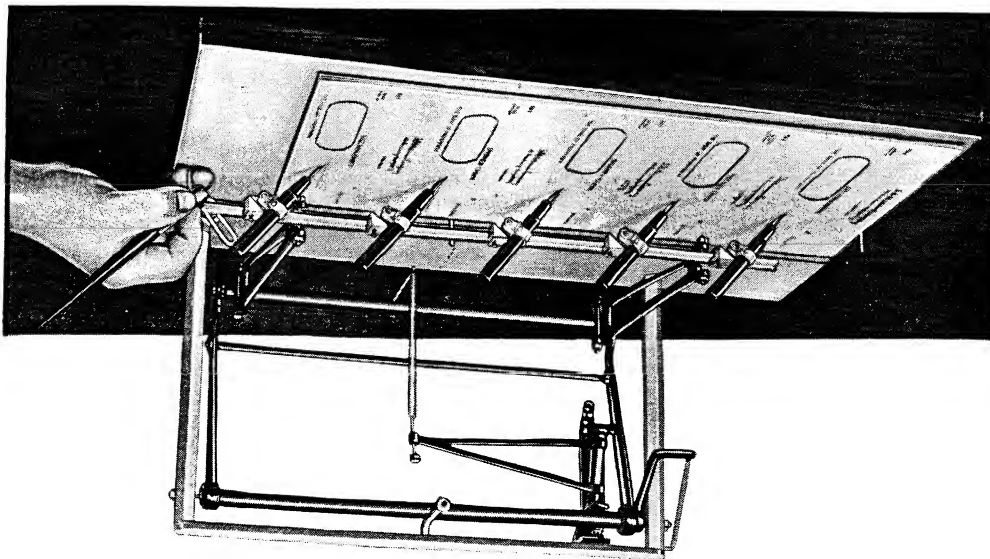

With Signagraph, Jr., you can sign five times eight—or forty signatures a minute and 2,400 signatures each hour—assuming that you can sign 480 signatures an hour singly. And these 2,400 signatures will be perfectly written and properly placed on your checks in identically the same time, and with no greater effort than is required in signing 480 checks singly.

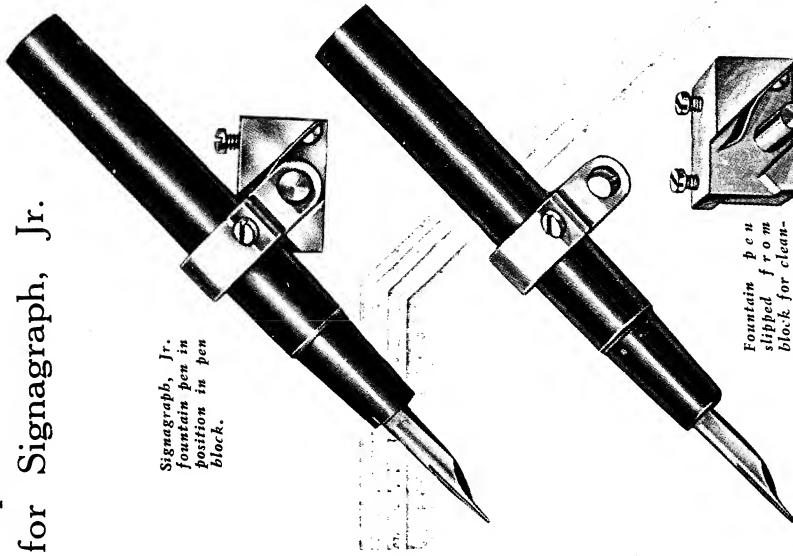
When you are through using Signagraph, Jr., it folds compactly and fits into a handsome wooden case, 24 inches wide, 5 inches deep and 12 inches high, that can be easily moved about as it is needed; or it can be shipped without the slightest damage. The metal block which holds the fountain pen in position on the pen bar is made in two parts—as is illustrated to the left. This block allows the pen to be slipped from its position on the pen bar when you want to clean or refill the pen. The pen, with its collar, is then replaced in its exact original alignment, ready for instant use.
