\*\*\* Summary of PCA Board Meeting in May - Bill Hong \*\*\*

At the May teleconference meeting, the PCA Board of Directors elected Carla Mortensen as new PCA Vice President, succeeding the retiring Richard Binder, who remains on the Board. The Board also accepted summary minutes of its recent planning retreat, and discussed what actions it would undertake to support a memorial fund in the name of Sonya Mawhorter, who has been instrumental in helping the Board in its past planning work. Updates were also provided on Pens for Kids support activities, memberships status (now close to 1000 total) and upcoming membership renewal policy changes. Discussion of how PCA website upgrade proposals will be received and evaluated over the coming summer, as well as library digitization efforts and the upcoming Board elections were also matters for consideration.

\*\*\* PCA Election Update - Carla Mortensen \*\*\*

This cycle, three members of the current board are eligible for re-election: Joel Hamilton, Bill Hong, and Kim Sosin. In addition, the Nominations Committee solicited both self-nominations as well as nominations from others during the month of June, 2008. In total, six people initially evidenced interest in joining the board, but all have withdrawn from current consideration. Several hope to be considered in the following election cycle when they have concluded other obligations.

As a result, the ballots which will be sent out in September electronically (and by hard copy to members who do not have emails) will ONLY contain the names of the Board members running for re-election. Members will be free to write in the names of any candidates they feel appropriate, but should those people gain a majority of votes, they would have to agree to the terms of office, available in the Bylaws listed on the PCA website.

The ballot results (electronic and postal) must be returned by October 1 and will be immediately posted on the PCA website. The winners of the election (or reelection) will be presented to the membership at the Ohio Pen Show in November.

The Board just received the resignation from Russ Ewert, our Treasurer. We appreciate all that he has done for the PCA and we wich him the best. We will be starting a search for a new Treasurer. If you have any suggestions, please let us know.

The Finance Committee is gearing up to begin the budget process for 2009, which it is aiming to complete by early October. This will allow the PCA to better manage its funds and serve its membership. The budget process will include all the operating committees of the board, which will also be responsible for the ongoing expenditures.

The Pennant subscription and the membership year have always extended from January to December, no matter what time of year that a member joins. The description of the long-time policy is expressed like this on the PCA website: "Our membership dues are based on a January-December calendar year. All members joining after October 1st will have their membership extended through the following year. The PCA. mails renewal notices each November."

The PCA board has just elected to change that policy to one that is logical and more consistent with policies of other memberships and publications. Beginning with members who paid in March, 2008 and from now on, membership dues will purchase a membership from the month of payment to the same month the following year, or the same month three years away if the three year membership is purchased. We will mail renewal postcards in November, 2008, to all whose memberships were purchased between October, 2007 and February, 2008, with a reminder postcard in late January, 2009. Beginning in March, 2009, postcards will be mailed each month to those whose memberships expires that month.
