*** Elections Update - Carla Mortensen***

Here is an update on the 2008 PCA election for the Board of Directors. On or about September 1st, we mailed out approximately 860 electronic ballots and approximately 240 paper ballots. As of September 22, we have received 225 electronic ballots and 42 paper ballot in return, a rate of roughly 27% for the electronics and 18% on the paper. I am happy to report this is the highest rate of return we have ever had for a PCA election, signalling to me that members appreciate the chance to vote online in a timely fashion.

On September 30, I will tally the ballots and ask my CPA, Carol Elizabeth of Elizabeth Financial Services to certify the results. Those results will be posted on the PCA website on or about October 1st, and will also be broadcast through the electronic media via the Fountain Pen Network, Pentrace, and zoss.com. In addition, the new/newly elected board members will be presented to the membership at the annual meeting in November at the Ohio Pen Show.
