*** Message from the President - Joel Hamilton ***

Most of the PCA members were not able to join us at the November Annual Meeting but the minutes are on the Web Site http://www.pencollectorsofamerica.com/ and you can review them at your convenience. In addition to the election of new officers during the November Board Meeting, your Board is off and running with a lot to do and an agenda for the year which should result in expansion of membership, greater exposure to the public, new activity and a further refined Web Site. The previous Boards have brought us to this point and their vision and direction provides the foundation on which we will start this new construction. I am in hope that we will receive CONSIDERABLE feedback from the members as we tackle the tasks ahead of us. We are your representatives and want to hear from you. As most of you know, the PCA is in the process of receiving a donation from one of its generous members. The first 200 pens of that gift have been received and appraised and they will be on display the LA Pen Show. One of the members suggested that an endowment is the way to assure that we have the dollars to meet our annual operational expenses and thereby freeing up money from dues to use for other activity such as scholarships and acquisition of additional resources for the library. It's a great idea and if each member would make a \$100 donation that would provide a great endowment from which we could draw

operational expenses from the interest earned. As we are a 501 (c)(3) organization, any such donation would be tax deductible.

We recognize that, "the times they are a changing.." (pardon me Bob Dylan) and as such we need to be aware of and engaged in meeting the members wherever they are. While our primary focus is the promotion of the use of writing instruments, we really can't deny that the touchscreen and keyboard are, at least technically, writing instruments and a number of our members use them.
