ACURIL 2019 Aruba honours three distinguished Library Directors of the Dutch Caribbean

What do these three phenomenal librarians have in common?

Rosemary de Paula, Alice van Romondt and Blanca Hodge, all three retired, have completed their library studies in the Netherlands and hecame outstanding librarians on their island in the Dutch Carihhean.

Blanca Hodge is the former director of the Philipsburg Juhilee Library in Dutch Saint Martin (1968-2007); Rosemary de Paula, former director of the Public Library in Curaçao (1968-2002) and Alice van Romondt, former director of the Bihlioteca Nacional Aruha (1978-2002)

All three were Knighted by the Queen of the Kingdom of the Netherlands for their work in the community and especially in the library of their country. Rosemary in 1990, Blanca in 1992 and Alice in 1999. Alice received also in 2018 the prestigious "Zilveren Anjer" award from the Prince Bernhard Culture Fund for her remarkahle, lifetime, contribution to the cultural field in Aruha.

All three librarians had new library huildings huilt which opened the opportunity to 'refresh' the image of the library and reach out to all corners of their communities with striking programs. Alice was very lucky, as she says, to have huilt two libraries, one in Oraniestad and one in San Nicolas.

Both Blanca and Alice are Past Presidents of ACURIL. Alice, Presidency 1986-1987, with



the conference entitled "Caribbean Collections: Crisis Management, Strategies for Libraries", held in Miami, Florida, USA.

Blanca, Presidency 1991-1992, with the conference entitled "Resources Management in Libraries and Research Centers of the Caribbean", held in Port of Spain, Trinidad & Tobago.

Both Rosemary and Alice had an exceptional position in the public service.

Rosemary was acting Governor of the former Netherlands Antilles from 1990 up to 2002, the first female to be appointed for this position.

Alice was Permanent Secretary to the Council of Ministers from 1994 to 2002, the first female to be appointed for this position in the Dutch Kingdom. Furthermore, these three professionals helped proped the library sector to new heights, where these institutions were able to transform themselves into cross disciplinary platforms, adding much needed dynamism to this sector and paving the way towards the digital media revolution we are encountering at this moment.

ACURIL is so very honored and pleased to recognize these outstanding librarians and therefor dedicate the 49th ACURIL conference in Aruba to these three librarians. Their dedication and professionalism are an exemplary to the new generation of librarians.


