## LAGO'S NEW „EMPLOYEES MEDICAL CENTER" OPENED TO VISITORS

Lago's new "Employee Medical Center", replacing the old Plant Dispensary, opened its doors to its first visitors last Thursday when a group of doctors and press men were invited to tour and inspect the new facilities. On hand to welcome and guide the two groups - at different hours of the afternoon - were Dr. R. C. Carrell, Head of Lago's Medical Department, and Dr. R. F. Brace, long time Head of the Plant Dispensary and designated Chief of the new Center. Also present for the occasion was Dr. Thomas Kienzle of the staff of the parent company's Medical Department in New York.

Both Dr. Carrell and Dr. Brace in their introductory remarks stated that the completion of the Medical Center was the fulfilment of a dream that began many years ago. For long they had realized the inadequacy of the old Plant Dispensary, and the beautiful, new Center would be a unit more capable of taking maximum care of the employees for whom it was built. It was erected by the firm of Petrona & Croes at a cost of approximately Fls. 700,000.

Dr. Brace explained to the visitors that the Center would not only take care of actual physical illness and injuries, but would pay great attention to "constructive medicine," which dealt more with the preventive aspect of illness. Attention would also be paid to the "psychosomatic" or mental angle, and for this purpose Dr. Turfboer, assistant to Dr. Brace, was at present on study in New York.

Dr. Brace then conducted the visitors through the spacious T shaped building, explaining the lay-out and the purpose of the various sections. The Center carries four clinics for the daily treatment of employees, one of the clinics being specially for females. Waiting rooms, doctor's offices, clinics and lavatories all have the appearance of beauty and spotlessness, with their cream or green walls and green rubber floor tiles. The whole building is air-conditioned.

The Center is scheduled to start full-scale operations on Monday, November 22nd. Before then, it

will be open to visits by employees and their families from Nov. 14-18, and during the period of November 19-21 records, equipment and furniture needed from the old dispensary will be moved into place. "Business" begins on the 22nd.

The Management of the Lago deserve the deepest thanks of the employee body for making such an up-to-date and valuable Medical Unit available to their workers. And a special word of compliment must go to Dr. Carrell and Dr. Brace who have worked on the idea for years and have at last seen their dream fulfilled.

### LAST DAYS FOR POPPIES

During the week young ladies could be seen in various parts of San Nicolas offering the familiar red poppy for sale. Proceeds from the sale go to the Earl Haig Fund for assisting soldiers disabled in the last two World Wars.

It is to be hoped that everyone will give generously to this worthy cause. The appeal is made only once a year, and a good response can bring great help to the suffering ones who braved the

noise and smoke of battle to make the world safer for others.

Tomorrow will be the closing day for the selling of poppies.

Those who have not yet bought one are kindly asked to do so.

### "BOY" ECURY HONOURED

"THERE'S NO PLACE FOR A TRAITOR IN MY FATHER'S HOUSE"

These heroic words were spoken by "Boy" Ecury when arrested by the Germans in Holland in 1944 and asked to betray his friends. He refused to do so, even though the Germans offered to set him free and send him back to Aruba. He was shot by the Germans for being a member of the Dutch Resistance. He gave his young life so that others might live.

On Saturday morning last, the tenth anniversary of his execution, the highest official in the Netherlands Antilles, His Excellency Governor A. A. M. Struycken, and Lieutenant Governor Dr. L. C. Kwartzs, in the presence of "Boy's" father and mother, relatives and government officials, laid wreaths at the foot of the statue of Aruba's war hero.

It was a short ceremony which made a deep impression on all who attended it.

### Light Plane Crosses Atlantic in Non-Stop Flight

Max Conrad, age 50, father of 10 children, landed a light two-engined plane near Paris last Sunday after a nonstop flight of 22 hours and 19 minutes from New York.

"I'm not tired", said the San Francisco song writer and veteran solo flier as he climbed happily from the cabin of a Piper Apache, "I just need to relax a bit." He nonchalantly bounced a grapefruit in his hand, all that was left of the slim provisions of toast, fruit and soft drinks with which he started out from New York's Idlewild airport Saturday.

He landed at Toussus le Noble air field near Paris. It was his fifth solo flight across the Atlantic in a light plane, but his first nonstop.

The plane has a normal capacity of four passengers. Some of this space had to be used to store extra gasoline. Special tanks holding 300 gallons fitted in place of the

rear seats and 72-gallon wing tanks gave the craft a 25-hour range.

Hurrying indoors out of a light rain, Conrad, formerly of Winona, Minn., sipped champagne while describing his flight as uneventful. He said the weather was generally good, adding:

"I ran into a belt of bad weather over the north Atlantic and had to go through some snow and ice. Most of the time I was without radio contact."

The flight was planned to deliver the plane to France from the United States by the cheapest method and not solely to conquer the Atlantic. Conrad also wanted to step up interest among young people in flying. He is sponsor of the "Winona Experiment" to encourage American high school students to learn to fly.

He plans to return to the United States by ship.



### "REMEMBRANCE" SERVICE AT HOLY CROSS TOMORROW

At 11 A.M. tomorrow at the Holy Cross Anglican Church there will be a special service in remembrance of those who died in the last two World Wars.

Similar services were held in Britain and other parts of the Commonwealth last Sunday, while last Thursday was observed in the U.S. as Veterans' Day.

At tomorrow's service there will be representatives of the local Government, members of the Consular Body, and representatives of the Dutch Marines, the American Legion and British ex-servicemen. The service will be conducted by the Rev. C. E. Pipe, Rector of Holy Cross.


Please be kind enough to publish the following in your valuable paper for me.

**JAILAL ON SHORT VISIT**

Mr. Rupert Jailal, a former Lago employee in the Mechanical Department, was on a short visit to Aruba last week. He was on his way back from an official trip to the USA where he had been sent by the British Guiana Rice Marketing Board to observe rice cultivation methods and grain storage in that country.

Mr. Jailal resigned from the Lago in December of 1950 after thirteen years service with the Company. On his return to British Guiana he was first engaged in vegetable produce and was later appointed Assistant Secretary of the B. G. Rice Producers' Association. He has been Acting Secretary of the Association for the past year.

Mr. Jialal received signal honor last year when he was selected by the Governor of British Guiana to be a member of the Interim Government set up after the suspension of that colony's constitution and Government. He is the youngest member of the Legislative Council.

Speaking of conditions in British Guiana, Mr. Jailal said that the country was slowly returning to normalcy. What was needed most of all was employment for a large number of the population. This situation exists, he states,

because of a reluctance of the people in general to show any "pioneering" spirit. Land was available, but people were not prepared to put in the hard work necessary to make it fruitful.

He stated that any amount of land is available for rental from

the Government at the nominal figure of 20 cents an acre, and any one with a little money to invest in farming stood a good chance of making a comfortable livelihood.

Mr. Jailal is scheduled to return to British Guiana today.

2,500 SEE CURACAO'S CHAMPION, LUCKY STRIKE, WHIP L.S.P. "A" SELECTION, 12-5,

E. Huckleman, Baseball Commissioner of the Nat. Non-Prof. Assoc. of the N.A., pitches first ball

Lucky Strike crushed the inexperienced LSP "A" Selection with a 12-hit barrage behind the 4-hit pitching of a combination of three Curacao hurlers, in the first of two games played at the Lago Sport Park during last week-end.

Until the bottom of the fourth, the match was scoreless; and it was a race between Curacao's Gravenhorst and Aruba's Donald Panthophlet (chosen by manager Legrand as starter instead of the LSP "A" champion pitcher, S. Lejuez) to see who would register the most strike-outs and give the least hits. Up to the fifth, Curacao had only one hit, an infield that skidded off the glove of pitcher Panthophlet and was too late for second-baseman Blijden, to make a play at first. Even up to the seventh, Donald was not tagged hard. He had three hits against him so far.

Gravenhorst of Lucky Strike -- although a run was scored against him off two walks, an error and a squeeze play -- had a better advantage over his adversary, Panthophlet. Despite his giving up six bases on balls in those six innings for one run, Aruba got only one safely from him, and this came in the sixth off the bat of V. Benjamin who substituted on second for T. Blijden in the fifth.

A total of seven pitchers were used in the game, with Aruba taking the margin. Curacao used three and Aruba four. The four Aruba pitchers were blasted for a total of 12 hits, while the Curacao moundsmen were cracked for singles three times.

Aruba did not keep the fourth round 1-run lead for long, for, in the following inning, Curacao came across with three runs off three costly errors and a hit. Another run was produced in the seventh, when Panthophlet was connected hardest. He allowed two singles and his third baseman helped the cause with an overthrow error, (his second of the night), to first.

Curacao's biggest inning was the eighth; Lucky Strikers came to bat ten times and Canister got two licks that finished Panthophlet. Panthophlet took for the showers after two "Smokers" connected him consecutively. Help was sought from Samuel Blijden, who, actually was of no help because he did not retire a batter in that eighth inning. It was left to Geraldo Stamper to finish that stanza left smoking by his predecessors.

It would not have been fair to allow Stamper to extinguish the fire without getting a hit or run from him, so the Curacao boys filled his hands with a few to avoid discrimination. When the side was retired, no less than seven big runs were scored and seven of the ten Lucky Strikers at bat in this inning hit safely.

-- who followed Stamper on the mound in the ninth -- something to remember also, the Curacao, champs scored a single on a pass-ball by S. Richardson. The run followed a hit and another error.

Aruba did not score again until the eighth and ninth rounds. Two runs came across in each of these two innings. It was in the eighth that Lucky Strike's hurler, Gravenhorst -- who had done a fine job -- gave way to Chickitin Grigorios, due to tiredness. The LSP boys started to build a record of base-on-balls on Gravenhorst and later on the 6 ft., 3 inches Grigorios, but the big lead of eight runs in his favor encouraged Grigorios to close the inning without further damage.

Aruba again had four base-on-balls and a hit in the ninth frame, but all the walks did not come off Chikitin this time, because his Manager did not give him the chance to establish a record of free passes. His successor, Canister, however, picked up where Chickitin left off and if A. Chin did not strike out and Paul tagged by the catcher (for the second out) in trying to come home when the latter dropped the ball after Chin fanned with the bases loaded, Aruba would have scored more than two runs and probably start a confusion on the Curacao side.

During a brief ceremony before the game, Mr. Edny Huckleman, Commissioner of the National Non-Professional Baseball Association for the Netherlands Antilles, pitched the first ball. Officials and "Madrina" of the Curacao Lucky Strike team and members

of the LSP Board, accompanied Mr. Huckleman to the mound.

Donald Panthophlet could have pitched the whole game were it not for the countless, timely errors committed by his infield; and failure by the whole squad to hit in a clutch. Aruba had many opportunities to score, judging from the fact that they received sixteen base on balls -- many coming in consecutive order. Donald hurled his best game of the year.

Mgr. Harry Legrand of Aruba used all the men he had available. These 19, together with the 14 used by Mgr. Hoertado of Curacao, made a combined total of thirty-three players participating in this match. This is a record for the LSP.

Only seven of the 12 Curacao runs were batted in. Aruba batted in 3 of her five. Curacao stole a total of 12 bases while five Arubans broke the law of the seventh commandment.

Curacao's best batters, each with two hits were: Martin, Sussana, Canister and Anacherico. For Aruba, A. Panthophlet, E. Ponson, V. Benjamin and S. Paul, connected 1 of the Aruba hits.

## Altar Boy Reportedly Admits Slaying Girl

A lanky, 15-year-old altar boy and former Boy Scout was charged with murder last Saturday after he allegedly confessed to strangling Geraldine Annese, 15, an ex-schoolmate, whose nude body was found last week Friday in a garage beside her home in Norwood, Mass.

District Attorney Myron Lane said Peter Makarewicz, Jr., confessed strangling the girl with his bare hands.

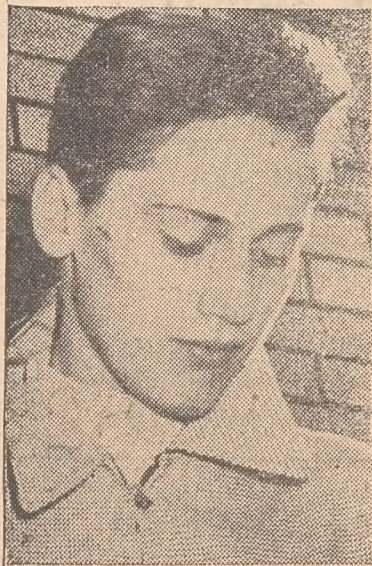
Peter allegedly confessed after eight hours' questioning. Handcuffed to police later, he walked through a horrified crowd of his neighbors as investigators sought a re-enactment of the crime.

Lane said: "There was sex connected with the attack. He planned to do it that (Thursday) evening. We have evidence that shows he had reason (to kill the girl) although he didn't say".

Geraldine, a vivacious sophomore in a vocation school, had been out with other teen-agers Thursday night and left them about 9:45 p.m. When she failed to return home by 11:30 p.m. her father reported her missing.

Next morning, her body, clad only in socks, was found on the garage floor. A necklace was drawn tightly around her neck, but authorities did not believe the ornament was the instrument of death.

Peter and Geraldine went to grammar school together. Until recently they had taken the same cooking course in school. They lived around the corner from each

other and "dated" until she broke off the association six months ago, neighbors said.

Peter's mother said Saturday: "He used to walk home from school with her. He's never been in trouble". Neighbors referred to him as a "nice" boy.

As Peter walked with police to the garage Saturday afternoon, Geraldine's step-brother, Philip De Rose leaped at him, shouting: "My sister's dead. My mother's dying". Geraldine's grief-stricken mother has been given sedatives.



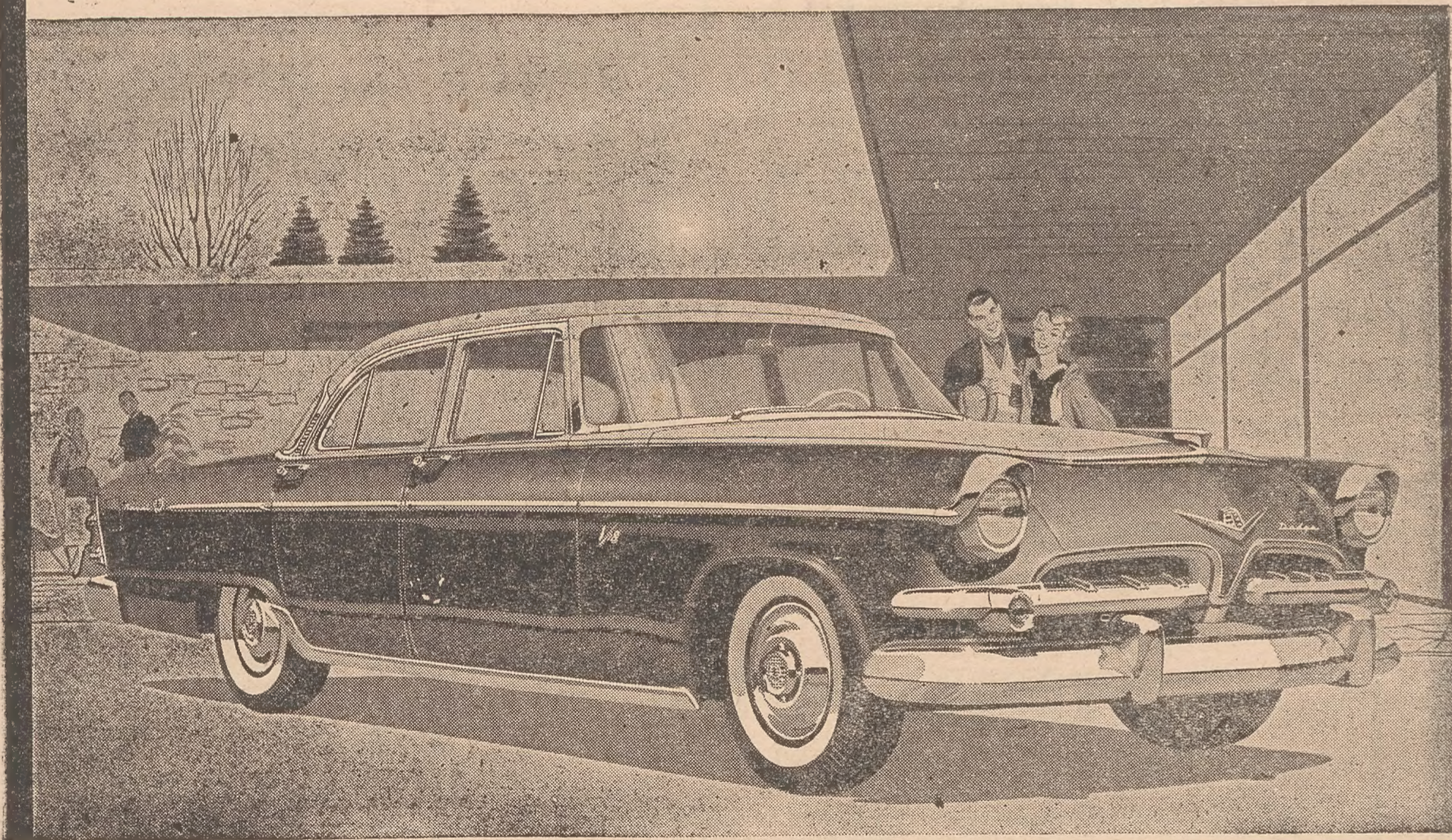
