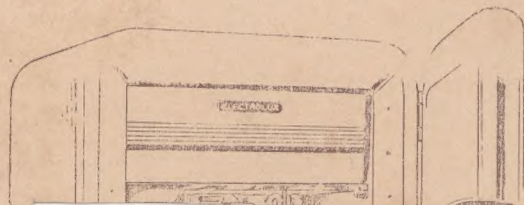

**BARBADOS FAILED TO SCORE OUTRIGHT VICTORY OVER GRENADA.**

*Shockness & DeCoteau run through Batsmen.*

A large crowd witnessed Grenada frustrate Barbados' hopes for an outright victory after being bowled for a meagre 92 runs before the luncheon interval.

Sharpe at number one scored 31, Kent 15 Grant 21 and DeCoteau 16 not out.

Doc Shockness, who was responsible for this collapse, took 8 wickets for 23 runs in 10 overs while Sealy & Martindale took one each for 8 & 11 runs respectively.

Barbados in their first innings were off to a good start with 43 for 1, when DeCoteau took charge of the southern end to bowl the fourteenth over and in a steady and unbroken 10-over spell, returned 6 batsmen for 18 runs.

Sharpe and Perrotte claimed one each for 19 & 27 runs respectively.

Barbados declared with 102 runs for 8 wickets, Bryan 35, Sealy & Reid 17 each, Straughn 13, Shockness & Linton not out, 13 & 3 respectively.

Grenada in their second innings with only eight men to bat, made a better show and were all out for 75, A. Perrotte scoring 35 in grand style, before he was caught off

Bryan, and E. Campbell 13, Shockness took 3 wickets for 27 runs, Bryan 2 for 32, Martindale 1 for 10.

With 69 runs to make in 35 minutes for victory, Barbados could only score 40 runs for 4 wickets at close of play.

**AN EXPLANATION.**

It appears that some people closely connected with boxing in Aruba have taken exception to the announcement that "Long Gun" has been granted a Matchmaker's license by the Boxing Commission.

These parties seem to entertain the feeling that they have met a new competitor.

The Local approached the new

matchmaker to find out what the score was, and came to the conclusion that the whole affair is a gross misunderstanding.

Long Gun does not and never had the intentions to "compete" with any promotor. He simply holds a matchmaker's license and is prepared to work for and with any honest promotor. He is also prepared to cooperate with all recognized matchmakers. He is after a united Boxing League to build up the sport in Aruba and holds nothing against any person whether boxer, promotor or matchmaker.

He believes, that with the assistance of local promotors he may succeed where others have failed.

The newly appointed matchmaker called a meeting with local boxers last Monday. The meeting was attended by Young Gavilan, Colorado Kid, Sugar Boy Nando, Fighting Shaddrack, Kid Tony, Young Quick Silver, Battling Siki, "Battling" Nelson Alvarez and Rosendo Perez,

At this meeting Long Gun informed the boxers of his official appointment and requested their cooperation.

He also acquainted the boys with some of his plans, which are mainly:

- (1) Well-matched contest
- (2) An elimination tournament between Aruba & Curacao for N. A. Championships.
- (3) The formation of a local boxing Club whereby serious consideration is given to a gym.

Nando's suspension ends this month.

We feel that the Commission's action was proper.

### World News

#### SWEDEN.

The Swedish Protest Note charging that officials of the Russian Embassy in Stockholm had worked with Swedish citizens spying against their own country was rejected by the Russians.

Russia in her reply stated that the Soviet Embassy had no connection with any spying and that the charges were an invention aimed at deteriorating the good neighbor policy between the Soviet Union and Sweden, therefore the demands that Russia take action against the Soviet Embassy Officials accused of participating in espionage were not justified.

Sweden has also presented another note to Russia pointing out that the Swedish planes shot down over the Baltic last month were not over Russian territory but international territory and that this matter should be referred to an international Court.

#### SOUTH AFRICA.

This week the Government took steps to curb the growing campaign of civil disobedience.

Leaders of the non-european stated that their passive resistance campaign against racial laws will become a struggle on a huge scale embracing the whole country.

The campaign is divided into three stages. The first stage consists of the selection and training of people to go into action in big centres to break racial laws and be jailed. The stage has already been started and more than 200 have been arrested. The second stage will be more volunteers and smaller centres and then the final stage mass action.

Among those arrested were two top leaders, Yussif Cachalia, and Nelson Mandela.

Mandela is the son of the Tembu chief and is an executive of the African National Congress. He interrupted his law studies to become chief volunteer in the Campaign.

in England, and a spokesman for the group in appealing to the police said that they are being spied on by a ring of communists and that none of them intend to return to their former homes. Soviet Russia wants to get them all back again because it is feared they can help England in the event war came.

#### BERLIN.

Further measures were taken by East German authorities to sever the link with West Germany.

All West Berliners who have property or business in the Soviet Zone will not be permitted to visit East Germany unless they cease to reside in West Berlin. This action has barred thousands of Germans living in West Berlin from their property and about 15,000 are in danger of losing their jobs in the East German works near Berlin.

The Three West Berlin Commandants protested against these measures in letters to the Soviet representative.

#### LONDON.

Many East European refugees, especially those from the Ukraine and Latvia, have during the past received letters from the Soviet Embassy offering them free passages, food and medical assistance if they would return home.

Recently the Soviets have stepped up this campaign and now are not only sending letters but also paying visits to their refugees.

There are presently about 20,000 refugees from Ukraine and Latvia

GERMANY.

Under the law a woman in Germany has very little say when she is married. She cannot open an account at the Bank without the husband's consent, she cannot have her own money and if she works the husband may collect the pay.

This week a new law came into force under which married women have been granted equal rights with their husbands.

Under the new law she may open an account without her husband's permission, she will have a bigger say in the home affairs, she may work and keep her own money, and in the event of a divorce, she is entitled to half of the joint property.

AUSTRIA.

Over the weekend the American Secretary of State, Mr. Dean Ache-

son, paid an official visit to Austria.

He was honored at a reception attended by President Theodore Koerner, the Austrian Chancellor, Leopold Figl, and the Austrian Cabinet.

Also attending the reception were the 3 Allied High Commissioners and the Soviet High Commissioner.

During the reception, the Soviet Commissioner inquired of Mr. Acheson, if he came bringing peace to which Mr. Acheson pointed out that it takes two to make peace.

During his visit, Mr. Acheson promised that American troops would stay in Austria as long as the Russian remain. This assurance was given in a Press conference broadcast to the Austrian people. The communist party had planned to stage a demonstration, but the welcome which the Austrian people gave the Secretary of State, plus of course, security measures, forced them to abandon their idea.

PERSIA.

This week, the Prime Minister, Mohamed Mossadeq received Mr. J. Prager, director of the Italian company which bought the crude oil carried by the Rose Mary, which the British seized in Aden.

Mr. Prager conferred with Persian Oil authorities and assured them that the seizure of the Rose Mary at Aden by the British would not stop him from continuing to take oil from Persia and that several Italian tankers would soon arrive to take on more oil supplies.

The Persian treasury is in such a depleted state that the government is anxious to secure sales at all cost.

U. S. A.

On Monday, the Republican convention opens in Chicago to select the republican candidate for the presidential elections in November. During this weeks, the two leading candidates for the nomination, Senator Taft and General Eisenhower were making last appeals for support, with their respective ma-

nagers exchanging accusations.

The General's campaign manager, Senator Henry Lodge, accused Taft and his adviser of resorting to desperate, last minute political tricks to thwart the will of the rank and file of the Republican party.

Many republicans feel it is not going to be easy to defeat the democrats in November and that the General has a better chance of winning the general election than the Senator.

A gallop poll indicated that this feeling was strongly supported; however, the Senator claimed that the poll was a propaganda stunt.

BRAZIL.

This week the police recaptured more of the escaped convicts from the Anchieta prison. However a group armed with tommy guns and rifles and headed by Joao Pereira

## LOCAL NEWS

### ARUBA TOURIST COMMITTEE PLANS EXHIBITION OF LOCAL HOME INDUSTRY PRODUCTS.

For some time now the Aruba Tourist Committee has been studying the interest of tourists for local home-industry products and to what extent this work is done in Aruba.

The results have been very gratifying. It was found that there is actually a great deal of tourist interest in such products and that the matter of local production is not as pessimistic as it has often been pictured.

The tourist committee therefore believes that by stimulating interest, reasonable production of locally made articles can be achieved. Based on the above findings, the Committee has drawn up a plan to get down to "brass tacks". For this purpose plans are being formulat-

ed to stage an exhibition of home industry products.

From this exhibition it will be determined if Aruba may look forward to a new source of income.

In this connection it is interesting to note that the annual revenues from home-industry articles in Trinidad and St. Thomas average \$250,000.— and \$150,000.— respectively.

#### The Exhibition

The exhibition will take place under the auspices of the Aruba Tourist Committee in November of this year and at a site to be determined later. Articles will be on display for 7 days. It is intended to seek the support of the Chamber of Commerce, the Merchants Association, the Rotary Club, the Lions Club and the schools.

#### Entries

The entire population of Aruba may submit articles. The time for entries will be announced later. All entries will be judged by a jury which will award a first and second prize for each of the 7 groups in which the articles will be classified.

#### Evaluation

An evaluation Committee will select the items which are considered to have permanent commercial value.

### NEW UNDERGROUND TRANSPORTATION SYSTEM.

New York (Vaz Dias) A high speed conveyor subway to help solve the traffic and transit problems of metropolitan centers is being recommended by the Chairman of the Board of Transportation of New York City, Col. Bingham. Conveyor transportation would provide continuous movement in both directions and can be installed and operate at lower cost than present underground transportation. The Goodyear Tire & Rubber Company and the Stephens Adamson Manufacturing Company designed a high-speed conveyor subway system to replace the overcrowded shuttle between Times Square and Grand Central Station, two famous New York landmarks. If the plans are adopted, small passenger cars will be moving on rubber conveyor belts in a continuous two-way stream between these two busy points, while, loading and unloading platforms will operate on the same principle. Bingham mentioned Oslo, Santiago and Sao Paulo among cities outside the United States which could use underground passenger conveyors to advantage.

### FINLAND'S ARMI KUUSELA KOPS TITLE "MISS UNIVERSE" REFUSES MOVIE CONTRACT.

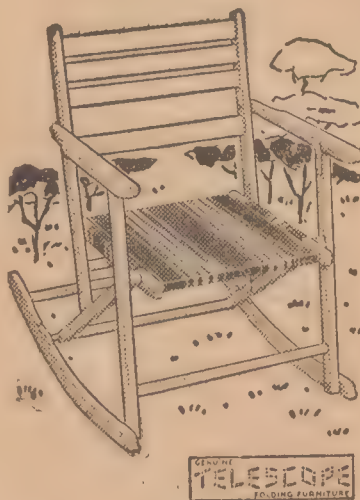

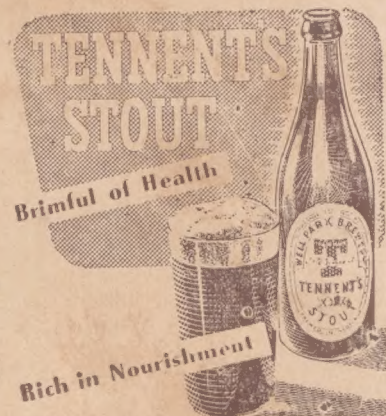

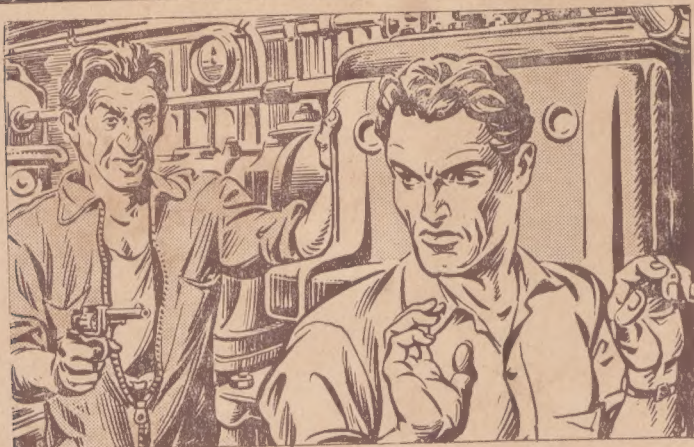
