

GAVILAN STOPS TURNER, RETAINS TITLE.

Cuba's kid Gavilan, 146, successfully defended his crown last Monday night, July, 7, against young, sensational Gil Turner, $144\frac{1}{2}$, by stopping the challenger in 2:47 of the 11th round.

The Municipal (Philadelphia) Stadium bout marked the 3rd defense of the welterweight title by Gavilan. The 39.000 fans who saw the fight were thrilled from the opening gong until the sensational finish, when referee Tomasco halted the severe punishment administered by the champ to save Turner from possible injury.

The fight, up to the time of the t.k.o., was a very close one. Both fighters gave a fine action performance, but eventually savvy and a systematic wearing down of his opponent saved the champ's crown. Both judges had it 5-5 at the end of the 10th. Referee Tomasco had it 6-4 and the Associated Press card had it

5-4-1 for the Cuban. One round, the 5th, was taken away from Turner by the referee for low blows.

The young and courageous Turner made his best bid in the early rounds. A blow thrown by the champ in the 5th, slowed him down considerably and gradually the "Keed" took charge. In the 11th a left hook started Turner's down-fall and in the following minute and few se

In the second innning neither Raschie nor Simmons permitted hit.

In the 3rd inning only the American League had a hit, a double

In the top of the 4th inning the American League scored 2 runs on a double by Minoso, and 2 hits by Ed. Robinson and Roberto Avila respectively. In the Bottom of the 4th, the N.L. scored 2 more runs with 1 man on board out of Hank Sauer's homer to the roof in left-center.

The score remained unchanged in the 5th. In the top of the 6th inning, pitcher Bob Rush, the winning pitcher for the N. L., had only thrown two pitches to Minoso when the game was halted because of rain.

Actually pitcher Simmons pitched better and only permitted 1 hit in 3 innings.

Vic Raschi pitched the first 2 innings for the A. L. and Bob Lemon, the victim of Sauer's 2 run homer, who pitched the 3rd. and the 4th, was the losing pitcher.

Little Bobby Shantz pitched in the 5th, and struck out Whitey Lockman, Jackie Robinson and Stan Musial. Said Jackie Robinson: "He showed me the best curve I've seen in years."

In its 19 years game history this was the first time an All Star game was halted because of weather.

This was the National League's 7th win out of 19 games played.

World News

S.S. "UNITED STATES" WINS BLUE RIBBON.

On Monday, the new 53.000 tors liner, the United States, on her maiden trip, streaked past Bishop's Roik of the Scilies at 5.16 a.m. G. M. T., setting a new record for the trans-Atlantic crossing.

The United States took three days 10 hours and 40 minutes for the 2,942 mile crossing from Ambrose Light, of New York, to Bishop Rock, off the Scilies, the traditional start and finish posts for blue Ribbon bids, breaking the British Cunard liner "Queen Mary's 14 years old record by 10 hours and two minutes. The average speed was 35.59 knots per hour as against 31.69 knots per hour set by the Queen Mary.

The United States arrived at the port of Le Havre about 14 hours ahead of schedule and her passengers had to retmain on board because trains, customs and dockside

facilities were not ready for her.

The United States will sail from Southampton on July 30 on her west bound crossing, about four hours ahead of the Queen Elizabeth. It is expected that this will be an unofficial race between the two vessels.

U. S. A.

During the Independence day weekend at least 650 persons met accidental deaths in the U.S.A. Traffic reached a record for the three-day week-end with 370 deaths being reported, with drownings taking the lives of 202.

DENMARK.

This week, Denmark officially delivered a new tanker to Russia in spite of the U.S.A. threats to cut military aid.

The United States in a note to Denmark pointed out that the delivering of the tanker to the Russians violated an agreement which forbids countries receiving United States military aid sending strategic goods in Russia and her satellites

The note was rejected by the Dannish Government which feels that the ship was contracted for under the 1948 trade agreement with Russia three years before the aid pact with the U.S.A. was signed.

The government fully understood the boycott on strategic goods to Communist countries but should not violate international trade ethics by defaulting on contract with Russia.

BRAZIL.

The U.S.A. Secretary of State, Mr. Dean Acheson, left Brazil on Tuesday at the end of his seven day visit for the U.S.A.

Mr. Acheson stated that he had come to Brazil because he wanted to know the country at first hand.

He called to attention the fact that Brazil had come of age among the great nations of the world and that Brazil had much in common with the United States since both countries want peace with freedom, and justice.

KOREA.

This week, the peace negotiations took a new turn, apparently for the better. During the week, the longest session on the prisoner repatriation issue took place, and the United Nations spokesman told newsmen that the talks were proceeding in a business-like tashion.

The Secretary of the United Nations, Trygie Lie, was reported this week to have stated that he expected an armistice in Korea by the end of this month or early next month.

FINLAND.

The traditional Olympic torch arrived at Helsinki, on Wednesday, for the Olympic Games, scheduled to start on July 19, 1952.

On Tuesday, the Olympic torch was joined by the "Flame of Midnight Sun" at the town of Tonio.

The Flame of the Midnight Sun was lit by the rays of the midnight sun focussed through a mirror at midnight on Sunday, near the Lapland community of Pallastunturi.

Finland's skiing champion, Pekka Niemi then took it on the first lap toward Tornio where it was joined with the Olympic Torch.

The torch will burn night and day at the top of the stadium tower.

Seventy countries, with an estimated 6.500 athletes will compete.

For the first time in 40 years, Russia will be represented at the Olympics.

The last Olympics the Russians

took part in was during the year 1912 at Stockholm.

Moscow has been claiming wonderful performances for her athletes and this will provide the first real test under stiff internation conditions for her athletes.

It is said that a duel may develop between the U.S.A. and Russian athletes since these countries have entered all the competitions except fild hockey.

Glimpses from the New World

LATIN AMERICAN OIL.

New York (Vaz Dias) — Oil, one of Latin America's biggest assests, also is one of her biggest problems. This is the conclusion reached in the current issue of Latin-American Business Highlights, the Chase National Bank's quarterly review after an extensive survey of oil resources and production in the southern republics.

Confronted with a lack of low-cost coal, Latin America must rely on oil to generate electric power and meet industrial needs for heat and power. The Chase digest reveals that the problem is one of adequate oil resources but inadequate oil production. While almost all the 20 republics are potential sources of oil, only ten Latin American countries produce it. Of these ten only

five — Venezuela, Mexico, Colombia and Ecuador — are oil exporters, and continually increasing domestic demands are now squeezing the export earning potential of the last-named four. The remaining 15 Latin American republics are net importers of petroleum.

Venezuela, far and away the largest source of oil in Latin America, also ranks as the world's number one oil exporter. Only in Venezuela — where a favorable climate for foreign investments exists — has oil development matched the needs for eco-

nomic growth. In other Latin American countries the lack of domestic venture capital, and the failure to encourage the inflow of venture capital from overseas, is holding back oil development, according to the Chase analysis.

VIACO OIL-STORAGE SYSTEM.

Stockholm (Vaz Dias) - The world exploitation rights for the Swedish method of storing oil in rock cavities, the Viaco system, have been sold to the Swedish financier Henrik Mannerfrid, of New York, with the exception of Sweden, Mexico and Norway.

The method, which was reported last autumn to have undergone a long period. and which is boed on the principle of storing oil on water with the suboil pressure of ground water acting as a medium for prevention of leakage. It is expected that a saving of as much as two-thirds of the cost of storing by conventional methods will result from the adoption of the Viaco system.

AIRMINDED AMERICA.

Washington (Vaz Dias) - On an average, more than two Americans were killed every day of 1951 in small plane, non-airline accidents, the Civil Aeronautics Board disclosed here. Every day more than ten such private planes crashes all over the United States with pilot error singled out as the formost cause. Reckless flying, which is one particularly

The monthly figure can now be automatically transmittd to the central office of the power utility where it is read and recorded by the electronic brains of business machines which calculate the amount due and even make out the bills. The General Electric executive who pointed out these possibilities stressed. that industry could and should

tremendously increase its output by making full use of electronics, thus assuring a greater amount of goods and services and a higher standard of living for each worker.

MARGERINE TO BE MARKED

New York (Yaz Dias) - Restaurants serving margerine in New York State after July 1st will serve it in three-cornered pattied clearly marked "Margerine". Moreover, the New York State Legislature demands that restaurants not serving the butter substitute at the table but using it in their kitchens must disnlay conspicious signs reading "Oleo: margerine served here", and print it on their menus. Other states have preceded New York in serving margerine to restaurant customers. New York takes it up after a long butter-versusmargerine wrangle.

GLOBAL INCOME.

United Nations, New York (Vaz Dias) - Half of the world's population had incomes below \$150 in 1950. Regardless of individual per capita increases the descrepancy in global income levels remains high, according to the United Nations Monthly Bulletin of Statistics. Asia ranges lowest in the world's income brackets, Eastern Europe and Latin America are next while the United States, Western Europa and Oceania form the comparatively. prosperous part of the world.

Exact compilation of data is difficult in Eastern Europe as their figures relate to material output only. Such thinly populated parts of the world as Canada and the United States, together accounting for only 10% of the world's inhabitants, had 43% of the total income in 1950, while Asia. Latin America and Africa with 65% of the world's population bad 17%. The remaining 40% income went to Europe which has 25% of the population.

CURE FOR KIDNEYSTONES.

Chicago (Vaz Dias) — A new drug against kidneystones tested recently by medical research organizations including the Wyeth Institute of Applied Biochemistry in Philadelphia, has shown very satisfactory results. Hvaluronidase, injected under the skin. releases some of the "jelly" which holds together the human body, sends it into the kidneys, where it covers growing stones with a protective crystal preventing expansion of growth. What's more. 4 out of 5 patients taking the drug did not develop kidneystones anymore.



HOLLAND HAS THE LOWEST DEATH RATE.

Amsterdam (Vaz Dias) Of all Western European countries the Netherlands has the highest birth rate. The number of births per thousand inhabitants has it is true, regularly decreased in the last five years from 30.2 to 22.3 but in other countries the birth rate is considerably lower.

The death rate in the Netherlands is lower than in any country in the world. It is also lower than it has ever been before.

At present it amounts to 7.6 per thousand inhabitants.

As a result of this higher birth rate and lower death rate, the Netherlands ranks first among Western European countries as regards the average annual increase in population. From 1945 to 1951 the increment percentage for the Netherlands was 1.7.

NEW OIL REFINERY NEAR BOMBAY.

Bombay (Vaz Dias) The expanded scheme of the proposed oil refinery of the Standard Vacuum Oil Company on Trombay Island of Bombay has received the approval of the Government of India. The United Press of India reports that

the project will also be speeded up and production will begin earlier than was scheduled. According to the Standard Vacuum authorities in Bombay, this will be several months earlier that the 1956 date first anticipated.

Under the expanded project, the daily capacity of the refinery will be increased from 19.000 barrels to 25.000 or a third more than was originally contemplated.


