



LAGOVILLERS DISCUSS DUST PROBLEM.

In an effort to find ways and means to combat the dust menace and nuisance in Lagoville, residents of that district met recently to exchange ideas. It was unanimously agreed that some sort of action is urgently necessary and the group felt that oiling the open field adjacent to Lagoville would be the best solution.

In this connection contact was taken up with the owners of said land. While the owners are very sympathetic, it was pointed out that they too are "tied down to indecision" at present.

Not until it is known whether the local government intends to take over the land would the owners agree to any action being taken on same.

If the government will eventually purchase the land (for road construction) the proprietors have no objection to having same oiled at present. However, if the government does not intend to purchase, then the land would not be oiled because in that event, the owners will cultivate same.

Attempts by the Lagoville residents to get an answer from the government's Public Works Department in this connection have been unsuccessful at the time this is being written.

There is every indication that the government's plans call for purchase of the land, judging from the Lagoville roads end in this open field in a manner which suggests extension at later dates.

It is hoped that a speedy decision will be taken in the matter by the authorities concerned in the interest and welfare of Lagoville residents.

The retirement Plan of the Lago has recently been brought to the fore through the press with the object of bringing to the attention of the Management what the employees think of the plan.

The Plan is non-contributory, provides for a reasonable retirement income at age 60, with a minimum service of 15 years. Objections raised centre around the age limit. It is argued that 60 years is too high. This is five years less than the U.S.A., and the same as the foreign staff. Today living calls for a normal salary up to this age, in fact, men on reaching this age often request permission to continue working.

The Pension Plan is primary to provide a living for employee when he is no longer able to work; however a discounted income can be obtained as early as age 50. The sum so obtained is so small that few take it, and to reduce the age to 45 would make the income almost neglible. Maybe to counteract this, the majority of employees



would be willing to contribute up to 1% of their income, but this would pose other problems.

To date, no objection has been raised on what could be considered snags in the plan. The plan is non-contributory, but an employee must be a participant in the Thrift Plan in order to enjoy the benefits. I see no reason why participation in the Thrift Plan should be neces-This qualification should be deleted.

Secondly, the right to cancel the plan at any time is reserved by the Management. Thus while an employee is covered by the plan today, he may find two years from now, that he is no longer covered. I am not saying this would occur, but it is possible. Lago Management has expressed great faith in the future, and thus, a definite period should have been stated, say for five years, at which time renewal would take place, or so.

Pension plans today are subjected to bargaining. There are no provisions for this in the present plan. It is managed and directed solely by the Management. L.E.C. has no say in this plan.

CAPACITY CROWD ATTENDS CONCERT.

In this drama all five characters played their parts excedingly well, with Miss Adina Ramsey in the stellar role of RAQUEL, the wife of General Macias. Playing opposite her was Roy Straughn, as AN-DRES, a captain in the Revolutionary army. And in supporting roles were Miss Laurel Fouchong as MARIA, Raquel's sister-in-law; Albertus Brown as CLETO, a devoted follower of Andres; and Raymond Nicholson as FLORES, a captain in the Federal army.

Briefly, the play opens with a poignant scene in which Maria is grieving over the loss of her husband - she is only 20 - while Raquel tries to console her. Andres and Cleto enter, seeking refuge from the Federals, and compel Raquel to shield them, for they show her evidence that General Macias is their prisoner and his safety depends on theirs.

Raquel hides them, but on learning from Cleto that they had gained valuable information from their visit to the city and would win the next battle, in a moment of great sacrifice she gives them poisoned wine, though their deaths mean the death of her own husband.

ESTADO FALCON DISAPPOINTS ARUBA.

The efforts of the Amateur Baseball Bond Aruba as well as the expectations of ball players and fans in Aruba fell to pieces last Friday night, July 11, as a cable from Coro (Estado Falcon) announced the League's final decision of not making the trip to Aruba.

The reason given was that the team had a "play-off" in Venezue-la on Sunday, July 13.

This attitude of Estado Falcon (Venezuela) is the more disgusting because it must have been known at least a week ago that the play-off was scheduled.

The story goes like this. Some time ago,, when the ABBA formulated plans for an international series between Aruba, Curacao, Venezuela and Sto. Domingo, an invitation was sent to Caracas (Ven.). Caracas was unable to delegate a team and so Maracaibo was invited, accepted and won the series.

Shortly thereafter, in a broadcast from Coro (Estado Falcon), this state expressed its regret that Aruba had not invited them.

The same night, the active ABBA dispatched a cable to Coro which held an invitation for a 3-game_

week-end series to be played on July 5 and 6 in Aruba.

The reply was that the dates were not convenient because of a play-off for the team. However, Coro would be glad to come a week later, i.e. on the 12th and 13th of this month.

Aruba was agreeable and arrangements were made. A K.L.M. charter was booked and following

The ABBA started the advance sale of tickets.

In Estado Falcon the radio broadcast announced the big event and even mentioned the name of Madrina Dolores Leañez who would accompany the boys to Aruba.

Then, out of a blue sky, came a cable on Thursday, just two days before the trip. It brought the masage that the guests could not keep their appointment... again because of the "play-off" which was to take place on Sunday the 13th.

During the course of the day, the ABBA cabled back explaining that plans and arrangements this end had advanced too far to permit a postponement and asked that the play-off be postponed instead.

Mention was also made of the cash already expended by the ABBA and a reply was requested as soon as possible.

When no reply was received around midday Friday, the ABBA again cabled stating that if no further news was received the K.L.M. charter would be ready to leave Coro for Aruba at 8 a.m., the following day.

That evening at 6.35 while the ABBA had a meeting with baseball representatives from Curacao, the reply came.

Estado Falcon was definitely not coming to Aruba at this time. The play-off could not be postponed.

It is regretable that the guests adopted this attitude. From all appearances the ABBA has no intention to extend another invitation to Coro in a hurry.

ABBA RECEIVES INVITATION FOR WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP AMATEUR SERIES.

The Amateur Baseball Bond Aruba, member of the FIBA (Federal International Baseball Association) has received an invitation to partake in the Amateur Baseball world championship series to be held in Havana, Cuba, in September of this year.

The ABBA seriously plans to accept the invitation and has request-

ed support from the Government of the Netherlands Antilles to help finance the trip which, it is estimated, will cost approximately f 15.000.—

Meanwhile suggestions have been advanced to affiliate the Curacao Baseball Bond with the ABBA so that a team comprising players from both islands may be selected. In this connection a delegation

In this connection a delegation from Curacao traveled to Aruba last Friday night for discussions with the ABBA.

At this meeting the conditions under which such an amalgamation would take place were outlined and the delegates returned to Curacao for further study, discussion and final decision in the matter.

In the meantime, the ABBA has secured the services of a professional baseball trainer for our boys. Mr. Horacio Martinez, the trainer, who was here recently in his capacity of trainer of the Sto. Domingo players, is expected to arrive in Aruba some time next week.

Since printing the above, news was received that the Curacao Baseball League has rejected the proposals of the ABBA officials for amalgamation of the Curacao League with the ABBA.

World News

BERLIN.

Major-General Lemuel Mathewson, United States Commandant in Berlin, rejected the Soviet protest against alleged borders violations by American soldiers in Berlin.

He told the Soviet Control commission Chief for Berlin, General Sergei Dengin, that the United States forces in Berlin were not attracted by conditions in the Soviet Zone.

General Mathewson in a note to General Dengin, said: "I can assure you that American forces in Berlin do not intend deliberately to transgress those barriers which have been arbitrarily imposed by the Soviet authorities."

He called the incidents "minor and very understandable miscalculations of geography" He denied they were "inadmessible violations of the line established for the outer boundary of Berlin" or "illegal penetrations into the Soviet Zone.

GREAT BRITAIN.

This week, the Chancellor of the Exchequer, Mr. R. A. Butler warned that should the Government be forced to grant the union demands for pay increases, the country will lose some of its export markets.

A note was delivered last Saturday to the Soviet Embassy in London, demanding the recall within one week of Pavel Kuznetsov, Second Secretary of the Soviet Embas-

SY.

Kuznetsov was charged with having received secret information from a British Foreign Office radio operator, William Marshall, who was sentenced to five years imprisonment for passing secret information to the Russian.

PERSIA.

On Monday, The Persian Prime Minister, Dr. Mossadeq, asked Parliament for unlimited powers to rule as he sees fit for six months in order to solve the country's economic crisis. At the end of the 6 months, he would ask the Parliament to make measures introduced by him

in Pittsburgh to resume negotiations to end the six week's steel strike. The number of people now unemployed because of the strike is about one and a half million.

Three steel companies which have already reached agreement with the Union and are producing steel again, demanded an increase in the price of steel, however, the Federal Office of Price Stabilization rejected the demands for increase.

Another round in the Cold War between the West and East took place this week, when the U.S.A. Government informed the Soviet Government that it would cease publication of the Magazine America in Moscow, since the restrictions imposed upon the distribution did not make it worth while,

At the same time, the Soviet Government was requested to stop publication of all its propaganda material in the United States, and to cease sending any liferature of any kind into the U.S.A.

On Monday, the Democratic Convention opens in Chicago.

CZECHOSLOVAKIA.

A purge of top leaders of Czechoslovakia's Youth Organization and reorganisation of Communist Trac'e Union Federation is about to take place very soon, because of the arrival of a delegation of Russia youth leaders. It is said that Sdenek Hejzlar, chairman of the Czecn Youth Federation and Ladislav Lis, the secretary general, may be removed from office.

The new secretary general will be Ludvic Cibulda, and Hejzlar's name has been absent from the official ceremonies in connection with the arrival of the Russians.

The Communist Youth Federation supervises the Political and Premilitary education of the nations youths.

It is also complained that too many Czech youths still regard Thomas Masaryk and Edward Benes as heroes.

Official publication of the communist Trade Union Federation meanwhile indicated that a possible shake-up is near in the nations trade union leadership.

U. S. A.

The United States protested today to the Argentine Government over the bombing of the office of the United States Information Service Bureau on July 9.

The nota was issued by the U.S. Charge d'Affairs, Mr. Leslie Mallory. An Embassy spokesman said it "was not feeble".

The bomb which exploded shortly after midnight caused much damage estimated at several thousands of dollars to the Lincoln Library which is on the first floor of the building. Two Pedestrains were injured.

Other building in the nearby section of swank Florida Street were also damaged.

Another incident which was protested occured on June 25 when a passerby in a car tossed an inkwell tied to anti-American propaganda through a glass window of the library.

The police arrested seven persons after the incident on July 9, but later released them. The

U. S. A.

Last Friday, General Eisenhower was nominated on the first ballot as the Republican nominee for the Presidential Campaign in November.

On the first roll call, the General has secured 595 votes of the 604 required for nomination when the Minesota delegation changed its stand for the General, thus starting off a race of delegates to join the Eisenhower bandwagon.

On Saturday the General tendered his resignation from the Army, thus severing 40 years of service with the U.S. Army. After a brief meeting with top members of his campaign party, he has taken time off for a quiet vacation.

Meanwhile Senator Taft has gone to Murray Bay, Quebec Canada, for a much needed rest and to do some fishing. Mr. Taft declared that he would not run for the nomination for Presidential Candidate again, and promised to support Eisenhower all he can.

On Monday, the Democratic Convention opens in Chicago, in the same Hall as the Republicans. They have a entire field of 20 men to pick the man to run against the General.

The prospective candidates are Mr. W. Averell Harriman, Senator Estes Kefauver, Senator Richard Russel, Vice President Barkley, and Senator Robert Kerr. Mr. Adlai Stevenson, who is strongly favored, has said repeatedly that he is not running for any national office, however, it is believed that he is available for the Democratic nomi-The President has been much in favor of Mr. Stevenson, since he himself has, so it would appear, definitely made up his mind not to run for a third term.

KOREA.

Moderate fighting took place all along the front this week. Air attacks were made on the North Korean Capital, Pyongyang, with the civilians receiving warning notices dropped by plane.

Meanwhile the peace negotiators continue to hold secret sessions in an attempt to find a solution to the prisoner of war issue which is holding up the signing of an armistice.

U. S. A.

The new 53.000 liner, the United States, set up a new east-west transatlantic speed record on Monday, thus winning the blue ribbon on the Westward and Eastward trips on her maiden voyage.

The United States westward trip from Bishop Rock off the Scilies to Ambrose Light took 3 days 12 hours, 12 minutes, thus beating the record set up by the Queen Mary of 3 days 21 hours 48 minutes, by 9 hours and 36 minutes.

The average speed was approximately 34.51 knots per hour against the old record of 30.99 knots set up by the Queen Mary 14 years ago.

On Tuesday, the United States was given a triumphant welcome as she steamed into New York harbor. The welcome being described as the loudest, and longest ever accorded a vessel.

FINLAND.

The Olympic games open today in Helsinki with over 70 countries participating. All the participants are living in the special flats prepared by the Government, except the Russians who asked for a special camp set off by itself.

This move was thought to be an attempt to keep aloof, however, the

Russians invited newsmen to their camp and other athletes.

The American contingent went over to their camp, and it seems that the Russians are living up to the game spirit and are keeping politics out of the games.

It remains to be seen how they will keep up throughout the games.

A BUCKLE CONDEMNED THEM.

About eight years ago four men—three brothers and a hired thug—went to the gallows after being convicted on a charge of murdering a fellow villager at Tableland.

Fate, it seemed, had ordained their end for, apart from a simple little slip, they had destroyed the most damaging evidence against any accused in a case of murder—the body.

Shot dead while walking along a lonely path in the district, the victim fell to the ground and was immediately "attended to" by the assassins.

Convinced that no case of murder could be conclusively proved without the body, or some proper form of identification of same, as evidence, they proceeded to saturate it with a highly inflamable substance and burnt it to ashes.

Next they burried the guns beneath a nearby river band and, as far as they were concerned, that was the end of the matter. And so it might have been, had they not slipped up in just one little point in disposing of the body.

For several days the victim was reported missing, and the police combed miles of forest in search of the man or his body.

Sub-Inspector Farrell, who was then a Corporal, and for whom the solution of the case turned out to be a personal triumph, first came upon the freshly chipped stump of a tree and became apprehensive, as by now the police suspected that the body might have been burnt, having pieced together little hints which had come their way.

Using the stump as a hub, he deployed men for a radius of about a mile in various angles, until they came into contact with a heap of ashes, which they suspected of the victim.

But the ashes alone proved nothing as there appeared to be nothing remaining to indicate that a human had been burnt — until they searched the ashes.

In doing so, they discovered the buckle of a belt which carried the victim's initials. In the end this proved to be the only item which served to clinch the case against the accused men.

After being charged and convicted, they were later hanged at the Royal Gaol.


