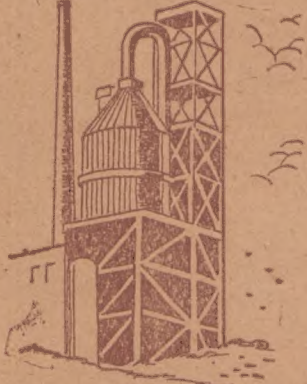
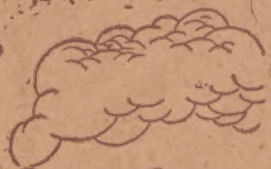

CAR KILLS WOMAN.

On Saturday night last at about 8.30 death came to 72-year-old Mrs. Placida Kelly after she was struck down by an automobile. The car, driven by Nel Harms — sub manager of the Guy Walter Shipping Firm in Oranjestad, was travelling along the road from Noord to Oranjestad at the time of the accident. The old woman was taken to the San Pedro Hospital for treatment but succumbed shortly afterwards. Funeral took place the following afternoon after services at the Roman Catholic Church at Paradera.

Prior to the accident Mrs. Kelly resided at Pontoon with her children. She is predeceased by her husband.

She leaves to mourn their irreparable loss three sons: Juan Fabian and Higinio Kelly all employed by Lago.

The Police is investigating the matter.

On Sunday of last week, Reinita's parents, friends, and representatives of the Rotary Club were stunned as the KLM bird landed and Reinita smiled to greet her relatives and benefactors. The girl with a new life ahead of her had undergone such drastic changes in her facial features that people could not believe what they saw. While leaving Aruba only a month and some days before, the girl was ashamed of her features. Now she was back as a charming young lady who could face the world and a new future.

Indeed, a great deal of credit is due Dr. Jenkins who accomplished a near impossible feat. Even the scars of the two complicated operations are hardly visible. The deformity completely belongs to the past and Reinita is ready for a new and beautiful life.

The Rotary Club may well look back on a splendid job of humanitarianism — giving back new confidence, courage and happiness to a blossoming young lady.

To Reinita go our best wishes and congratulations with the closing of an ugly chapter in her life story and the start of a beautiful new page, in which she is ready and able to compete with all of Aruba's many charming girls.

EVA PERON.

This week, the Argentine people mourned the death of Señora

Maria Eva Peron, wife of President Juan Peron.

She was born in 1919, the last of five children. Her father died early, but her mother managed to raise them by keeping an inn. At the age of 16, Eva left home to go to the big city of Buenos Aires where, for ten years, she lived the hard life of a destitute but ambitious young woman. She learned the hard way, worked as a extra in movie films, and got an occasional engagement on the radio.

In 1944, an earthquake struck the city of San Juan and when a nation-wide appeal was launched for funds, Eva demonstrated her dynamic power and leadership by organizing a group of actors and actress which toured the country with great success. This work brought her into contact with Colonel Juan Peron, who was then Minister of Labor and Social Security, and a close friendship sprung up between the two.

As Peron was constantly meeting Trade Union leaders, Eva soon knew many by them, and since she was able to discuss

ARGENTINE

Señora Eva Peron, wife of President Juan Peron and his former aid, died at the presidential palace in the Palermo section of Buenos Aires, on July 26.

Señora Peron fell ill in September last year, shortly after declining an invitation to run for Vice-Presidency. She underwent a major operation in November after which it was reported that she was suffering from an incurable disease, which although it was not revealed was believed to be cancer.

Her death ended the career of

one of the most powerful women in Argentine.

CANDID NOTES

This week the world saw another example of democracy in action, when the strike of the Steel Industry came to an end. This strike was not a minor strike in a secondary industry, but a major strike in the most vital industry of the U.S.A. and the gravity of the situation was well expressed by defense secretary, Mr. Robert Lovett., who said, "There is no enemy which could have inflicted upon us the damage we have suffered and will continue to suffer for many months to come."

This strike held up production of vitally needed material for defense in Korea, yet there were no cries of "communist inspired", the army was not called out, and although the President could have sent the workers back to work by invoking the Taft Hartley law, he refused to take this measure, but urged the employers and Union leaders to continue negotiation. Speaking of the Taft Hartley Law the Democratic party has pledged to repeal this law, because it is felt that any law which provides for a cooling off period, can only be of benefit of the employer.

VENEZUELA

A hall filled to overflowing was the welcome which Aruba gave the Cultural Mission of Venezuela when they made their first appearance in Aruba at the Sociedad Bolivariana last Monday night. In a program of songs, dances and poetry they held the large audience enraptured throughout and won vociferous applause for their performance.

This organization, which corresponds to the "People's Theater" movement in other lands, travels all over Venezuela with its performances and are now making their first trip overseas. They performed in Curacao before coming on here.

The Mission is an endeavor to show the hand of friendship of Venezuela to other parts of the Latin American region. In the words of a representation in his opening remarks on Monday night; the Mission is a gesture of "peace, friendship and goodwill" among neighbors in the South America area.

EVA PERON

their problems, she soon became popular with them.

This served Peron in a remarkable way, because in October, 1945, when he was arrested and jailed, Eva hastily contacted Union leaders and Colonel Domingo Mercante, and persuaded them to call out the workers to protest. 50,000 answered the call, marched to the Government house, and demanded Peron's release. A few days after Peron became Minister of War and Vice President.

Shortly after this incident, Peron married her in a secret ceremony, and so when he was sworn in as President in 1946, Eva became the First Lady of Argentine. Traditionally, the woman of Argentine kept out of politics, but Eva made a radical departure, entering politics as a powerful figure in her own rights. In the years 1946 to

1951, Eva did much. She brought first of all, a sense of political responsibility to the women of Argentine, and gave workers an awareness of their worth. She fought strenuously for the workers whom she affectionately called, "The Shirtless". She organized the Foundation which built hospitals and schools, provided homes for workers, arranged free distribution of toys, etc. for children, and sent medical aid to other countries struck by disaster.

She spoke the language of the poor, and they in turn were able to identify themselves with her. For the first time the average Argentine worker felt that those in power were interested in his welfare and he supported Eva's program. Each year, every worker gave two day's pay to the funds for the Foundation.

Her grip upon the populace and their love for her can be gauged by the crowds which she

was able to draw. On her first official tour to the province of Tucuman, the enthusiasm was such that seven people were crushed to death. Upon her return from Europe in 1947, her only visit aboard, she was met by a crowd of over a quarter million.

In 1951, she declined an invitation to run for the Vice Presidency, and soon after, in November she underwent a major operation. From that time until her death she suffered much but bore it with that fortitude and courage she had always shown. This week her body laid in state in the Ministry of Labor building, and over half a million weeping persons filed past her bier to pay their last respects. Some mourners had waited for more

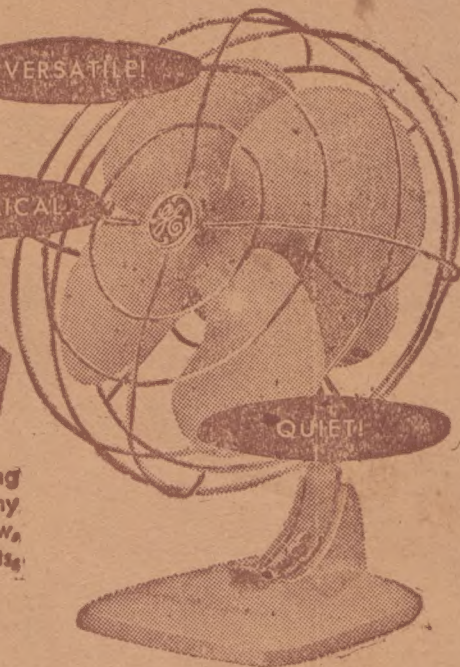
