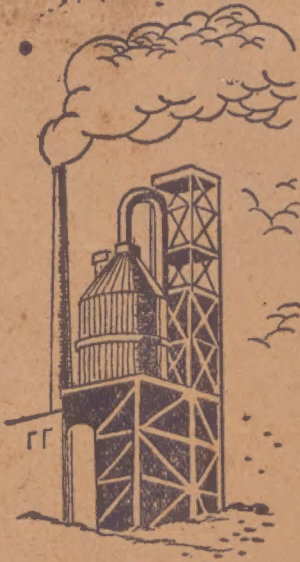

Polio in Aruba

According to authentic information received from the Director of Public health in Aruba, four (4) patients have been admitted to the hospital in Aruba suffering with the dreaded Infantile Paralysis (Polio) during the past 3 weeks.

While the Medical authorities feel that there is no indication of an epidemic and that there is no reason for undue alarm, it is recommended that some extra care and precaution be taken to safeguard the health of children and oneself.

The best defense against the disease, according to Medical authorities, is rest. Fatigue is dangerous. See to it that the entire family gets plenty of rest. Don't drain your resistance. The hot weather will do enough of that.

Contact at public places, such as beaches, etc can be dangerous, and so can be little open wounds such as small cuts, sores, etc. Take

care that all fruits are properly washed before eaten. In fact all fruits that can be peeled, such as apples, pears, peaches, mangoes, etc., should be peeled. Keep rubbish cans closed and see to it that children do not play with or in contents of such containers. Keep flies out of the house and away from food.

At the first signs of tiredness, pain in the neck region vomiting or fever, consult your doctor. By so doing you may help to keep polio away from your home and our community.

HUMAN RELATIONS

One of the most important phases of industry is "Human Relations". However, in Lago "Human Relations" is simply a topic of conversation — it is preached but not practiced.

Years ago, employees and all their family members were offered medical facilities at less expense than of today. At that time the Medical Department was less equipped with staff and other fa-

cilities. Some time ago attention was called to the fact that a certain lady (since deceased) who had several relatives and children working for the Company and who was denied the facilities of the hospital. Recently an employee with over 15 years of service whose mother was ailing requested the assistance of the Medical Department, but the request was refused because of the existing Company policy.

This policy does not permit employees' parents the use of the company hospital facilities.

Think of the feelings of an employee with a seriously ailing mother — he is desperate in his anxiety to secure her the best and cheapest medical facilities available; the Company for which he labors does own a hospital with the best facilities on the island, but

she is refused admittance there because of a POLICY.

Not long a visitor to Aruba fell sick and was allowed the use of Lago's hospital facilities — very good, very humanitarian — but what of the employee who slaves for the Company from day to day? How soon will Lago's management unfold itself from these "policy" wrappings which only contribute to the already too many sufferings of the "local" employee.

Manager Bryson made considerable changes in his team for the sole purpose of defeating the Cuba-bound boys and fielded Bonadie, F. Ruiz, Da Silva, Hodge, Ponce, P. Ruiz, Halley, Matthews and Eagan throughout. Bonadie on the mound did a good job, but showed signs of weakness towards the 8th when two singles and a free ride resulted in the ABBA's lone run.

The game remained even until the last of the fourth when Ponce got his second walk, sacrificed to second and scored when Bill Eagan made a terrific blast to center passing Harms who threw himself full length but could not stop it and Eagan remained on third. However, minutes later Eagan failed to score on the Catcher's error. Not satisfied with this lead, the sixth inning was more successful for Jose. Ponce took his third walk, Mathews took a dead ball and were sacrificed by Eagan. Roy Harms was penalized with a balk and scored Ponce, advancing Mathews to third, and Da Silva bunted along

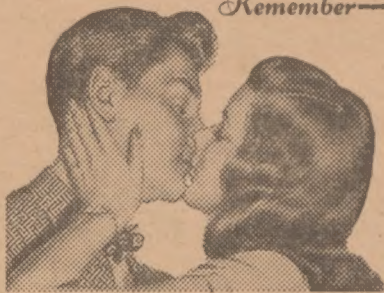

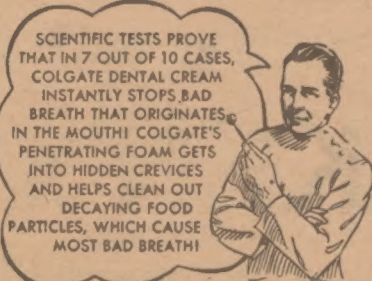

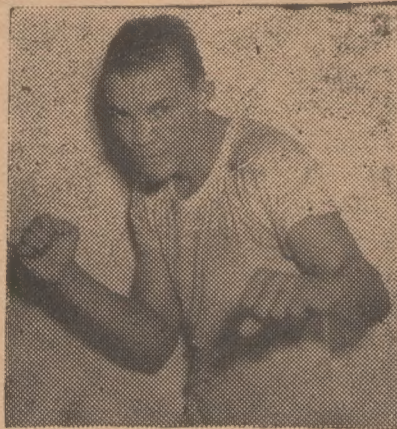

The 10 round bout will be the main event of a well balanced card with contestants from both Aruba and Curacao.

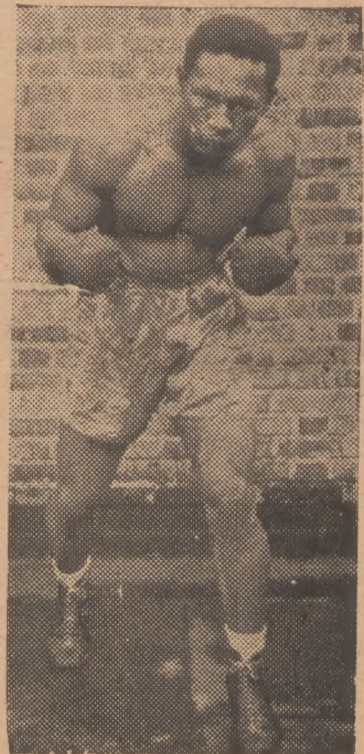
The program gets under way at 8.30 p.m. sharp!

World News

PERSIA

Last week Britain and the United States made an attempt to end the oil deadlock and observers felt there was a chance of Britain and Persia making a satisfactory agreement. The Persian Prime Minister, Dr. Mos-sadeq, in a broadcast last Saturday, declared that he could not accept the proposals put forward by Britain and that he would call Parliament and ask it to frame a reply.

Visiting the Abadan refinery last week, was Mr. W. Alton

Jones of the Cities' Service Com-pany of America. A Persian newspaper hailed Mr. Jones as a saviour because he would provide tankers and market Persian oil throughout the world, despite the British. Mr. Jones made no comments but his spokesman in New York said that Mr. Jones visit to Persia was only in a mediating capacity.

The U.S. Department an-nounced that Mr. Jones visit was unofficial, and the British charged that it has made the Premier more difficult to deal with.

BERLIN

The West German Minister, Mr. Jacob Kaiser, speaking over the United States radio station

in West Berlin, appealed to East Germans not to emigrate into West Germany unless "Ut-ter necessity" forced them.

He said it was the aim of So-viet Zone Government to bare the zone of honest, freedom lo-ving Germans by confiscating their property, firing them from

their jobs pressing them into the service of State Security Police or forcing them to work in uranium mines. By so doing, they create panic and induce Germans to flee westward. Refugees arriving in masses would weaken the social structure of West Germany and will result in success for Communism, and in order to avoid this, strict control measures were necessary.

SOUTH AFRICA

In his first public speech since the Supreme Court decision ruling the Government's high Court of Parliament Act to be invalid, Prime Minister Daniel Malan declared that the road we want to follow is being obstructed by courts. What is demanded is that as a white nation - the leaders of Africa we should abdicate.

This is not the road which the great majority of English speaking South Africans wish to follow. Continuing, he pointed out that the powers drawn up against the Government are very considerable and are trying to make them do away with all color bars. They want to pervert the whole past history of South Africa and to make new beginning on the basis of complete equality. This is not the road the Afrikaner people wish to follow.

Dr. Malan concluded by saying that Communist in South Africa were active today and were telling Africans to demand full equality and that such action called for strict measures by the Government.

U.S.A.

Mr. John L. Lewis, President of the United Mine Workers' Federation, in a Labor Day message, called on other labor organizations to unite.

In his message, he said, "We have no choice but to capitulate or fight back. We cannot fight back effectively without unity or singleness of purpose."

Several times in the past, the leaders of the Congress of Industrial Organizations, the American Federation of Labor and the United Mine Workers' Federation have tried to merge forces, but all efforts to have a single labor federation have been in vain. These three groups control about twentyfive million workers. Touching on this point, John Lewis said that though American Labor faces an era of danger and of threats to its very existence, the unions were jealous of one another and would not agree to unity.

During the recent steel strike, John Lewis placed a check for ten million dollars at the hospital of the CIO as a token of his support for that organization.

of Vernam Field, abandoned United
States base, to the first motor
rally in Jamaica to see autoraces,

to beat the train over the crossing.

Smashed bodies littered the
scene in the worst road-rail acci-
dent in Jamaica since the Balacla-
va derailment in 1939.

Eighteen persons died on the spot
and two died in hospital the next

NEW TRADE AGREEMENT BETWEEN VENEZUELA AND THE U. S.

Venezuela and the United States have signed a new trade agreement. The U.S. has agreed to effect a considerable reduction in the import duties on petroleum and other products from Venezuela, while Venezuela will also decrease the import duties on goods originating from the U.S.

A declaration of President Tru-

man was published in Washington in which it is stated with respect to this new treaty that it represents another expression of the desire of the U. S. and Venezuela to contribute towards the expansion of the world trade. This new trade agreement partially substitutes and supplements the trade agreement signed between both countries in 1939.
