

CYCLING FACILITIES:

A few years ago the Employees Advisory Committee (now defunct) requested that cyclists be permitted to use their cycles throughout the refinery. Management at that time stated that due to heavy refinery traffic, a safety hazard would have been created if cyclists were allowed to use all roads in the refinery. The E.A.C. agreed with the management's view; however, subsequently cyclists were allowed to use the back road where traffic was not to heavy:

With the recent completion of the Industrial Relations Annex at the main Gate another gate was built and it is felt that employees who ride cycles to work may very well be allowed to ride through this gate without creating a safety hazard. At present they must leave their cycles in the sun at the Main Gate.

It is hoped that management would explore the possibilities of opening this gate to the many cyclists who would appreciate being allowed to ride to work through the new gate.

LOCAL NEWS

A STATISTICAL VIEW OF LAGO DURING 1951.

Total annual imports of crude oil in 1951 (expressed in barrels) were 157,312,048 (in 1950 — 150, 025,478), total imports per day in 1951 were 430,992 barrels, against 411,029 in 1950. A total of 431,174 barrels of crude oil per day were

processed in 1951, against 405,-911 in 1950, representing an increase of 25,263 barrels. The total preliminary production figure for the year 1951 was 158,006,000 barrels, the greatest portion thereof being heavy fuel oil, representing 96,710.000 barrels, followed by motor gasoline totaling 24,920,000 barrels. The production of sulphuric acid totaled 29.000 barrels, while asphalt produced totaled 79,000 barrels.

The processing of this increased quantity of crude oil was made possible only by considerable capital investments during recent years. Production was maintained at 2/3 of the normal figure for the duration of the strike. The total number of employees as of December 31, 1951 was 7,167 as compared with 7,189 in 1950. Of these 7,167

FOUL PLAY SUSPECTED IN DEATH OF MRS. MEZAS.

Somewhat recovered from the first shock that the death of Mrs. Mezas of Lagoville recently brought her family, and as a result of several occurances, her children are now wondering whether Mrs. Mezas died as a result of a murderous

Some time ago, the family claims, a letter was written to Mr. Mezas, who is employed in Curacao, in which the writer among other things claimed that she would be glad if something happened to the deceas-The letter was signed. ed.

Mr. Mezas, the recipient, forwarded the letter to his wife in Aruba for her perusal and the document was in the possession of the lady at the time of her death, but a search for same later on proved futile. It had disappeared. It is not known whether she distroyed it, whether is was stolen, or just misplaced.

On the night of the accident (or attack) which led to the lady's death, it seems she was in the bathroom taking a shower.

Apparently she was alarmed by something or someone since an examination of the house later revealed wet imprints of feet on the floor leading from the bathroom to the door leading to the yard. When her body was later discovered, it was found that she had just slipped on part of her garments and gone out to the yard. This, and the helter-skelter appearance of things as well as fact that she was barefeet, gave the impression of a hurried

With her in the house at the time were only her three grand-children which were all sound asleep. Her daughter was visiting her back yard neighbors and apparently she went to the fence to call this daugh-

Mrs. Mezas' body was found in the vicinity of the back yard fence.

First examination by the doctor revealed that she was unconscious and had a cut on her forehead, and it was believed that she had struck her forehead as a result of the fall.

Later at the hospital an X-ray picture of the skull revealed that she also had suffered a blow on the head in the neck region, and it is this second injury which led her family to believe that something was not altogether "natural" about her "accident".

This belief gained more ground when, shortly after regaining consciousness the deceased asked the doctor if someone had hit her. The doctor could not answer that question and advised her to go to rest. She never was strong enough thereafter to tell her story if she ever

Funny incident was that shortly after the funeral, the writer of the missing letter was seen leaving the yard of the Mezas family late at night.

The alarmed family has reported the matter to the police.

It is sincerely hoped that a thorough investigation will be made in the matter for, while the family hopes that their suspicious are without ground and that the mother of the family actually died of an accident, they hate to live in that belief that this was not so.



The Indians will draw \$35 weekly from the start of their training program.

try. A red safety closure would indicate that the medicine is for external use only while a white top would indicate that the bottle contents are meant for internal use. Closures should be designed in such a way as to increase the necessity of reading the label on the bottle in the medicine chest before swallowing its contents.

NATURAL RUBBER SOURCE IN U. S.

Albany, California (Vaz Dias) Ruber, extracted from the California grown guayule brush and tested in heavy truck tires is matching imported Hevea rubber in quality, if not in quantity. The United States began experimenting with domestic natural rubber production during World War II when most imports were cut off. According to the U.S. Department of Agriculture, the guayule project which after a postwar lull was renewed in 1947, has now reached a state of perfection which makes it suitable for use in heavy tires. Researchers who blamed the formerly inferior quality of Califora nian rubber on the practice of

storing the brush before processing, now apply a method of treating the freshly harvested guayule, removing fiber and resin and preventing exidation before storage. Test tires have been successfully tried out and more are under scrutiny in a fleet of trucks rolling on tires of home grown rubber.

STILL MORE SELF-SERVICE STORES

New York (Vaz Dias) - Selfservice stores are obviously here to stay, not only in grocery but in other lines as well. The overwhelming success of this new method of merchandising through the United States has induced two large 5 & 10 chain stores to try it out too. The F. W. Woolworth Company has opened a self-service store in New York where all but a few departments will be operated on a "self-selection" and "self-service" basis with checkout counters placed near the exit for payment and wrapping. S.S. Kresge Company, which operates 690 stores, is building a giant self, service center in Princetown.

SAO PAULO 1554-1954

Sao Paulo (Vaz Dias) - The 400th anniversary of the foundation of the city Sao Paulo in Brazil on January 25th 1954 will be celebrated throughout the whole year 1954 on an international scale.

The commemoration committee has started the extensive work, so that it may be taken for granted that on the opening day the visitors, who are expected in great numbers from all parts of the world, will be welcomed in an harmonious entirety in the traditional and hospitable fashion of the Brazilian people.

Sao Paulo is the biggest industrial centre of Latin America. which entertains close connections with trade and shipping circles all over the continents.

The jubilee exhibition in the Ibarapuera Park, spread over an area of over $1\frac{1}{2}$ million square meters, will form the central attraction. There Brazilian and foreign participants, for whom special paviljons will be erected, will be able to show the products of their respective coun-

Architect Oscar Niemeyer has created a monumental and ingenious balustrade and gallery in ultra modern style, which will form the entrance to the exhibi-

tion, and wherefrom the visitors will have a general survey over the vast exhibition grounds with their many ponds, lanes, woods and beautiful buildings.

SWEDISH CANCER REMEDY

Stockholm (Vaz Dias) - The Swedish surgeon Elis Stenberg, who has developed a new remedy against cancer, the thymus extract THX, has been invited to continue his researches at U.S. laboratories, and is leaving Sweden for that country in the middle of September. THX is claimed to be the first biological cancer cure and to be specially potent against leukemia, a generally fatal form of the disease. 85 per cent of the patients treat- RAINBO BAKERY ed have benefitted by the remedy.

SWISS MICE FLOWN TO INDIA

Geneva (Vaz Dias) - 15 Swiss Albino mice travelled by air on a 5000-mile route from Switzerland to India under the label of "VIP". World News

SCOTLAND.

Last week, Dr. Elizabeth Forbes-Sempill, in an advertisement in the "Aberdeen Press and Journal", informed the general public that all legal formalities have been completed for a change in her sex, and that in the future she will carry the name of Dr. Ewan Forbes-Sempill.

The doctor, who is very masculine in appearances, explained that for the past forty years her life has been unendurable since biologically and socially she has been living the life of a man. After examining the evidence submitted, the District Sheriff granted approval for a change in sex and the doctor is now registered as a male.

In an interview, Dr. Ewan Forbes-Sempill stated that as far back as he could remember, he lived like a boy and wanted to be with the boys. While in his early days he was brought up as a girl, and was schooled as a girl, a change became apparent as years went by. He developed a beard and had to resort to shaving. Since he is a doctor, he recognized what was wrong and underwent medical treatment for several years to establish his masculinity.

The change has been so complete that the Doctor plans to marry in the very near future.

YUGOSLAVIA.

It was announced this week that the United States has asked the Yugoslavian Government for greater co-operation in the joint defense of southeastern Europe, including the use by American planes of air bases in Yugoslavia.

Marshall Tito, head of the Government, was entertained aboard the U.S. aircraft carrier "Coral Sea"

This occasion was seized to impress the Premier with the need for his cooperation and he was shown charts outlining how and where carrier based planes, operating from the Adriatic could strike at any Soviet satellite country attacking Yugoslavia.

EGYPT

General Naguib's Government this week set up five committees to handle the country's foreign policy. At a public meeting, the General asked for six months to carry through his plan to transform the country.

The trials of about sixty persons arrested last week is being speeded up, and landlords who failed to obey the new reforms will be tried before a special military tribunal.

The first landlord to be arrested is Adel Lamlum. He has been charged with defying the authorities.

Britain rencently lifted the embargo on the export of equipment to the Egyptian and has declared her willingness to train Egyptian officers in Britain again. This move has been welcomed by the present Army Government.

MANCHURIA.

It was announced this week that Communist China and Russia had reached an agreement under which WHITFIELD'S

Russian troops will stay in the naval base of Port Arthur "until peace treaties" are concluded by China and Russia with Japan. In February, 1950, an agreement was reached between China and Russia under which Russia would have withdrawn her troops at the end of 1952.

The Chang Chung railway in Manchuria, now held by the Russians will be turned over to the Chinese government at the end of this year. These moves were the result of the top level talks between Russian and Chinese leaders held in Moscow last month.

ERITREA.

After more than seventy years of foreign rule, British and Italian, the small country of Eritrea officially federated with Ethiopia this week. On Monday, at a short ceremony held at the Government House, Chief Administrator Duncan C. Cumming, United Nations Representative, formally signed over his powers to Prince Andar Mesai, and Ato Tedla Bairu, the viceroy and premier

respectively of the new government. Prince Mesai is the son-in-law of Emperor Haile Selassie of Etiopia.

DENMARK.

Proposals to change the country's law of succession to allow the crown to pass to Queens as well as Kings is receiving much attention from the various political parties.

At the present time, the heir apparent is Prince Knud, brother of King Frederick, since the King himself has no sons. If the change is made, the King's daughter, Princess Margrete, age twelve, will become their apparent.

AUSTRALIA.

British atomic scientists, W. G. Penney and O. M. Solandt, arrived in Australia this week to take part in Britain's first atomic test scheduled for next month. Six hours before their arrival, D'arwin airport, where they landed was taken over by the Australian Air Forie,

LOCAL NEWS

BRITISH WEST INDIAN ASSOCIATION HOLDS OPEN MEETING.

A number of British West Indians met at the French Club last Thursday night, at the invitation of the Managing Board of the British West Indian Association, to consid-

er the possibilities of expanding the organization.

Spearheading this move and taking the chair at the meeting was Mr. Carl Worrell, Vice-President of the Association.

The British West Indian Association has been in existence for about four years, but has never had a wide membership, since it was the policy of the Board to assure a solid foundation before expansion. This policy has been misunderstood in the past, and the opinion expressed that the Association wanted to be "exclusive." In reality, this was far from the case.

This policy, however, has not proved successful, and an attempt

is now being made to rope in ALL. British West Indians in Aruba.

At the meeting on Thursday night, Mr. Worrell outlined the primary object of the Association, which in brief is to be an organization that is the center of British West Indian cultural, recreational and social activity in Aruba. To achieve this end, it would be necessary for the Association to have a building of its own, properly equipped for the purpose. The prospect was held out of a membership of 1.000, each person paying a subcription of 1.00 per month. This would mean f 1.000 per month towards such a building. It should not take very long to put a suitable building at this rate.

The idea is not beyond the realm of possibility, and it is hoped that all West Indians present in Aruba will consider the matter favourably and throw in their lot with the Association.

A number of persons present at the meeting spoke from the floor, asking questions for clarification or expressing views and suggestions. Many of those present submitted their names as willing to become members of the Association.

Another meeting is being scheduled for October 9th, when it is planned to present to West Indians the new Consul to Aruba, who is to arrive later this month.

The construction of the Great Pyramid, it is said, required a knowledge of all of the known sciences of the period. Its building entailed a mastery of mathematics, physics, and a considerable understanding of those fundamentals of astronomy recognized today.

Since the Rosicrusians, it is said, partrace their traditional origin back to Amenotep IV, Pharaoh of Egypt in 1350 B.C., and historically known as the first great personality in history, they commemorate their ancient origin by the ritualistic construction of a miniature pyramid. 
