LAGO EMPLOYEE DIES AS

DCAL NEWS

RESULT OF ACCIDENT.

Robert Koko, Lago instrument man, died at 3.30 a.m. October 1 at Lago Hospital.

He was fatally injured in an explosion following the rupture of a sample cilynder in the rear of Laboratory N^o 3 last Wednesday morning.

Joseph Joubert, who has been in the Hospital for treatment is expected to be released soon, and five others who received minor injuries were back at work the same day.

The reason for the cylinder rupturing is still being investigated.

Mr. Koko, who was from Sto. Domingo, had been with Lago for $11\frac{1}{2}$ years. He was 34, and single.

An impressive funeral procession was witnessed in San Nicolas last Wednesday evening when the body of the late Mr. Roberto Koko was taken to burial.

At 5 p.m. on Wednesday the funeral procession, headed by a brass band and a large turn-out of his fellow-members of the Odd Fellows

Lodge with their banners and regalia, left the Lodge rooms in San Nicolas and wended its way to the St. Theresa Church.

After Catholic ceremonies there, the cortege moved on to the cemetery at Zeewijk, San Nicolas, where the body was interred. The Catholic priests performed the last rites at the graveside.

The masters of the Lodge were not allowed any part in the burial ceremony.

B.W.I.A, TO STAGE CONCERT AND DANCE.



EGYPT.

Over the last week end, the po werful Wafd Party refused to submit to Government regulations un der which the party was supposed to purge from its ranks all grafters and present a reorganized listing to the Government.

In announcing the decision not to abide with Government regulations, Ibrahim Farag, a former cabinet minister, said the party would continue its activities.

Since the party cannot continue officially, it is felt that the party, after thirty three years of dominant activity might go underground.

The Wafdist party was organized in 1919 and has been in office six times. Following the Army coup in July, the party became the chief target of the charges made by the Army of graft, bribery and abuses of power. In a round up of leading politicians accused, the party's strong man, Fuad Serag Eddin and other leaders were arrested. The acknowledged leader of the party,

MOSCOW.


The United States Ambassador to Moscow, Mr. George F. Kennan, has been the subject of attacks from the Soviet Press. Mr. Kennan, while in Berlin on September 19, 1952, told reporters that contacts between Americans and the Russian people in Moscow had been reduced to the zero point.

The attacks have been so strong that experts on Russia feel that the Kremlin might force the United States to remove Mr. Kennan as envoy. This feeling is based on the fact that the Soviet reflects only views approved by the Government and several papers have hinted at the removal of the ambassador.

TURKEY.

Yugoslav General Pavle Yaktchitch, head of a military mission visiting Turkey, in a statement to Turkish reporters at Ankara airfield, said that his country will stand side by side with Turkey in the event of an attack.

The Yugoslav mission had just arrived from Athens, Greece where it had joined in talks with Greek Military chiefs for defense of that country. In speaking of their efforts in Greece, the Yugoslav General said it was very important for his country to reach an agreement with Turkey and Greece. Such an agreement would not be directed against anyone, but if we are ever attacked we will defend ourselves with all our strength. He firmly believed that if Turkey is at-

tacked she has the power of defending herself alone, however, he wanted to add that in the event of an attack, the Yugoslav nation will be a friend standing side by side when Turky fights for her defence.

EAST GERMANY.

The Communists are preparing for a series of war games as a prelude to gigantic army maneouvres. Soviet engineers have been setting up bridges, etc. over the Elbe River within artilry range of West Germany.

The engineer phase is being carried out with platoon and company units. However, regiments and division teams are moving up to areas in Saxony and Mecklenburg.

MEXICO.

On Wednesday Emilio Arellano Schetelige, 48, businessman, was arrested in connection with the bombing of a Mexican airline last Wednesday.

The police had been looking for Emilio to explain why he took out \$ 240,000 in insurance, policies on seven persons aboard the 'plane.

A time bomb on the 'plane exploded soon after it had taken off from Mexico city, blowing out one side of the 'plane and endangering the lives of 20 persons on board. The pilot made an emergency landing but two California tourists among the passengers were injured as a result of the explosion.

AUSTRIA.

Russia has refused to discuss the Western powers proposal for an abbreviated state treaty that would have provided for the withdrawal of all occupation troops.

This short treaty was proposed by the three western powers when Russia failed to meet for the 258th big four discussion of the full treaty in January this year.

Austrian Government officials believe that the Russians have no desire to leave Austria especially since by keeping troops in Austria the Russians have an important bridgehead in the West. At the present time they are approximately 44.000 Russian troops in the Russian Zone, and this refusal by Russia will force the British, French and Americans to keep their troops in their zones indefinitely.

In the meantime, the deputies of the Foreign ministers of the three western powers met in London to

figure out next steps in the search for an Austrian independence Pact A spokeman of the Western powers said that the conclusion is inescapable that the Soviet Government is not yet prepared to accept an Austrian treaty. The exploitation of Austria in the first seven years of the occupation has proved too pro fitable for the Soviet Government

WEST GERMANY.

Mr. Jacob Kaiser, Minister for all German affairs, in a statement, declared that there is no possibility of East West German discussions over the unification for this divid ed country

In an address beamed to East Germany, he said that the recent visit of a Communist East German delegation cannot be considered by our people as a positive element for the reunification of our country. No one among the German people can have anything to do with the men in Pankow, the Communist controlled East German Government.

His remarks about the Communist delegation made it clear that the Bonn Government will give no serious consideration to the proposals made by the East Germans.

CANADA.

\$ 600,000,000 U. S., which by linking the Great Lakes of North America with the Atlantic through a series of locks and canals will allow the world's largest freight carrying ship to sail into the heart of Canada.

Engineers and planners have dreamed of the St. Lawrence Seaway for many years.

British engineers are in Canada examining the plans, and German, Dutch, Italian and French companies have made enquires in order to made a bid. Great Britain is making a determined bid to get a good portion of this trade and to ensure that British machinery and technicians will be used on the project. Although officially the United States is not taking part in the project, Americans are also working on the project.

OPPORTUNITY FOR LATIN AMERICA

New York (Vaz Dias) — The raw material needs of the U.S.. already running ahead of domestic supplies promise to widen the gap by leaps and bounds during the next 25 years, thus offering Latin America a golden opportunity to expand her role as a key U.S. supplier. This is made clear in the September issue of lights, the quarterly review of the Chase National Bank of New

York. Referring to the conclusions of the Paley Commission --appointed by President Truman to study U.S. long-range raw material needs — the review points out that total production of the U.S. economy should double in he next 25 years, while U.S. Food consumption should rise by 42%; to support this growth U.S. imports of materials other than food and gold must increase threefold. Latin America can almost double her exports to the U.S. by 1971 — with a corresponding boost in dollars earnings - by expanding her output of raw materials in line with growing U.S. needs. Out of total shipments valued at \$3.30 billion in 1951, Latin America exports of food and industrial raw materials to the U.S. ran to \$3.25 billion. By



following a program of expanding output, the Chase National Bank's Review contends Latin America could raise this figure during the next 25 years to more . than \$5.5 billion at today's. prices. But if this expansion is to be realized, capital investment of such magnitude, will be required that sizable inflows of foreign funds will be needed to supplement investments from Latin-American sources. Thus. to provide for its own future needs, the U.S. should promote capital investments in the southern republics, according to the Chase. The Highlights also singles out for special mention the remarkable improvement in living standards achieved by Puerto Rico during the past decade. It calls the 70% rise in Puerto Rico living standards an outstanding

VENEZUELA — Five persons were killed and 10 other wounded in the second unsuccessful revolt in a year led by the outlawed Democratic Action party and Communist elements authorities said Tuesday.

In a communique the Venezuelan Junta, composed of a civilian and two military leaders, said also that an undisclosed number of persons were arrested.

Absolute quiet was reported in all army garrisons, the communique said.

The uprising began at the Boca Del Rio air force base at Maracay,

near the capital of Caracas, the communique said. The attack on the air base was put down immedialely.

'Armed civilians" also attacked armed forces posts on a collective farm in Turen, in central Venezuela, the communique said. In a short fight one soldier and four civilians were killed and 10 civilians wounded, before the rebels were driven off.

A "substantial number" of rebeing hunted, the government said.


The national information office said the rebels were mostly civilian members of the outlawed Democratic Action party and Communists.

The Yanks scored 1 in the 4th and 1 in the 5th.


In the 6th. the Yankees scored 5 big runs, 3 of them were scored on Billy Martins homer.


