



Eisenhouwer elected President of the U. S. A.

At 1.45 a.m., E. S. T. Adlai Stevenson, democratic candidate for the presidency admitted that he had suffered defeat at the hands of Dwight D. "Ike" Eisenhower, Republican candidate.

At that time Eisenhower had callected 18 million votes as compared to 15 million for Stevenson.

Dwight D. Eisenhower will be the 34th President of the United States; the 14th Republican President; the 12th general to occupy the White House; and the first native of Texas to hold the nation's highest office. At 62, he is the fourth oldest man to become Pre sident.

With this victory Eisenhower brought a stop to the uninterrapted stream of victories of the Demo crats who had ruled for the past 20 years.

America's thumping indorsement of Dwight D. Eisenhower as the next President of the United States neared the spectacular high tide of 31,000.000 votes Wednesday.

With more than 85 per cent of record-setting vote tabulated, these were the statistics:

30,695,323. Eisenhower — Stevenson — 24,629,151. Total -55,324,474. The popular outpouring spelled Everything you buy in Jewelry and

a victory margin for Ike in 38 and possibly 39 states with an electoral vote of 429 to 442, with only 266 needed for election.

The greatest number of votes previously cast in an American election was just under 50.000,000 in The greatest number ever before won by a candidate was 27,700,000 by Franklin D. Roosevelt in 1936, against Alf. M. Lan-

Political observers, still stunned by the Eisenhower sweep, were marveling at the way it bowled over traditional political barriers.

Eisenhower, first professional soldier to win the White House since U.S. Grant, cracked the "Solid South" by capturing Virginia, Texas, Florida and Tennessec. He won in such doubtful border states as Maryland and Oklahoma. He rolled up unprecedented totals in New York City, for a Republican, and easily swept California which the Republicans lost in 1948 Elastinas Samuella de la company de la compa

EISENHOWER'S LIFE.

1890 -Born Oct. 14 at Denison Tex.

1909-Finished high school in Abilene after attending public schools there.

1911-15-Attended United States Military Academy; commissioned second lieutenant of infantry.

1916-Married Mamie Geneva Doug, daughter of a prominent Denver family; promoted to first lieutenant.

1916-26—Assigned to various military posts in Texas, Georgia, Kansas, Maryland, Pennsylvania, and New Jersey.

1917--Promoted to captain.

1918—Promoted to temporary rank of major, then to temporary rank of luitenant colonel; received Distinguished Service Medal for "unusual zeal, foresight, and marked admistrative ability" in training of rank corps at Camp Colt, Pa. 1920-Promoted to permanent rank of major.

1926—Finished first in his class at Command and General Staff School, Fort Leavenworth, Kan. 1928 Graduated from Army War College, Washington, D.C.



BING CROSBY'S WIFE DIES AT 40 OF CANCER.

BEVERLY HILLS, Cal. — Dixie Lee Crosby, the attractive 40-year-old wife of World famous Crooner Bing Crosby, died of cancer Saturday after all efforts to cure her had failed.

The former actress and musical comedy star had been in a coma since Tuesday and did not regain consciousness before she succumbed.

Bing, her four sons and her father, E. E. Wyatt were present when death came in their Beverly Hills home. She became critically ill last week and doctors said there

was no chance for survival, but the family refused to give up hope.

Mrs. Crosby was received into the Roman Catholic Church last Monday, the day before she sank into a coma.

Mrs. Crosby rallied sufficiently after an operation for Bing to make a movie location trip to France. She had been ill several years.

When he returned from New York last Saturday, Dixie disregarded her doctor's orders, got out of bed, and met him at the depot in Los Angeles. As a result she had a relapse next day.

Dixie, a star of Broadway musical comedies and the screen in the late '20s, was born Wilma Wyatt in Harriman, Tenn., Nov 4, 1911.

A gifted singer and dancer petite and blonde, Dixie won a bluessinging contest at the College Inn in Chicago's Sherman House.

On Broadway, at 17, she had feature roles.

Bing was a little-known singer with a band when he and Dixie met. She liked to recall a movie producer's telling her: "If you marry that Crosby character you'll have to support him the rest of your life."

They were married Sept. 29, 1930. Bing was 27, Dixie 18.

Not all critics were exceptionally loud in their praise of the invention but the most critical and cautious still admitted that the new Steffens-bridge may greatly increase the value of even a low class violin or cello.

SINCLAIR OIL ASSETS TOP BILLION MARK.

Sinclair Oil Corp. made substantial gains in protits, sales and reduction in the first nine months of 1952 and its total assets exceeded \$1,000,000,000 for the first time in history, O. C. Spencer, Sinclair president, informed stockholders.

He pointed out that this substantial progress was made despite lower prices for residual fuel oils in the third quarter of 1952, the adverse effects of the oil strike which occurred in May and the subsequent protracted strike in the steel industry.

Consolidated income in the initial nine months of this year increased to \$ 64,085,436, equal to \$ 5.24 a share, from \$ 58,431,456, or \$ 4.83 a share, in the corresponding period of 1951.

Gross operating income rose to \$617,894,333, a new high for any

comparable period in the company's history, and compared with \$585,482,457 in the nine months ended Sept, 30, 1951.

Spencer noted that the 1952 income includes special credits of \$9,629,784, derived from gain on sales of Colorado Interstate Gas Co. stock. This also was reported in the six months report for 1952.

Sinclair now becomes the seventh major oil company in the United States whose assets have topped \$1,000,000,000. Among companies in this field, Standard Oil Company (N. J.) leads in total assets.

We understand that Neme Import & Export will represent Sinclair in Aruba.

LONDON.

For the month of October, 1952, the sterling area accumulated a

dollar surplus of 82 million dollars. It was the biggest monthly gold dollar surplus earned for the past two years.

Substantial help from the United States in the form of the 35 million defence aid during October was responsible for a good part of the surplus.

Further, the Sterling Area September trading surplus of 37 million was included.

British officials however pointed out that this showing could give grounds for nothing more than cautious optimism.

YUGOSLAVIA.

On Monday, Marshall Tito addressed the sixth Congress of the Yugoslav Communist party at Zagreb.

In a four and a half hour speech, he declared that imperialist Soviet Russia was mainly responsibe for the present world tension, but the West must also be blamed.

Stalin's Soviet system was up a blind alley and it was now the Yagoslav communists who were the true heirs of Marx and Lenin and the guardian of Communist orthodoxy.


The Yugoslav party had an historic role: To wage on an international as well as a national level the struggle against the Cominform and Soviet Revision of Marxist theory and practice, its purity and unity must be safeguarded at all costs to fit it to carry out this task.

The congress was attended by two thousand delegates representing a party membership of nearly one million. The Party was asked to change its name to the "League of Communists of Yugoslavia". It was also decided to make a bid to extend their influence to left wing movements abroad in an effort to cut out Cominform influence

This would be done through the "People's Front of Yugoslavia" agency.

Laboratories have succeded in growing a polio causing virus in chicken embryos which may provide the answer to the problem of producing an effective vaccine against polio on a large scale and at low cost. The vaccine has been successfully tested on monkeys against certain types of polio virus, but it has not yet been determined

Small quantities of anti-polio vaccine available thus far were developed in brain tissues of human beings, monkeys or rodents through a complicated process and, therefor, proved too expensive for other than laboratory research on the crippling disease.


