PRE-CHRISTMAS PAYDAY NOT SUCCESSFUL

The pre-Christmas payday inaugurated by the Lago Oil & Transport Co., at the request of the Lago Employee Council, for its staff (monthly paid) employees turned out to be less successful than expected. Out of the 1586 pay envelopes prepared, only 272 were called for by employees.

To the non-employees, this may appear to be an indication of a sound financial budget of Lago staff employees. The insider knows better. This publication made it a point to contact a number of the staff employees and investigate the cause for their not calling for their money.

The answer IN ALMOST EVERY CASE was "because I do not expect to get anything, and IF I do get something, it will not be worth the trouble". The other answer received was that employees were afraid to be overdrawn on their next (January 10th) payslip if they collected on the extra payday.

Peculiar was the fact that not one single employee advanced the reason that he (she) had no NEED for some extra cash at the time. Each and every one of the employees contacted said that he would be delighted to receive from f 50 to f 100 as a cash advance which could be repaid in easy installments over a 4 to 6 months period. Well, there's some food for thought!

SURINAM CLUB BARS SURINAMERS. ADMITS FOREIGNERS

Members of the Surinam Association/Club who were not up-to-date with their membership dues as of December 31, 1952, were barred from the dance sponsored by the organization on old year's night.

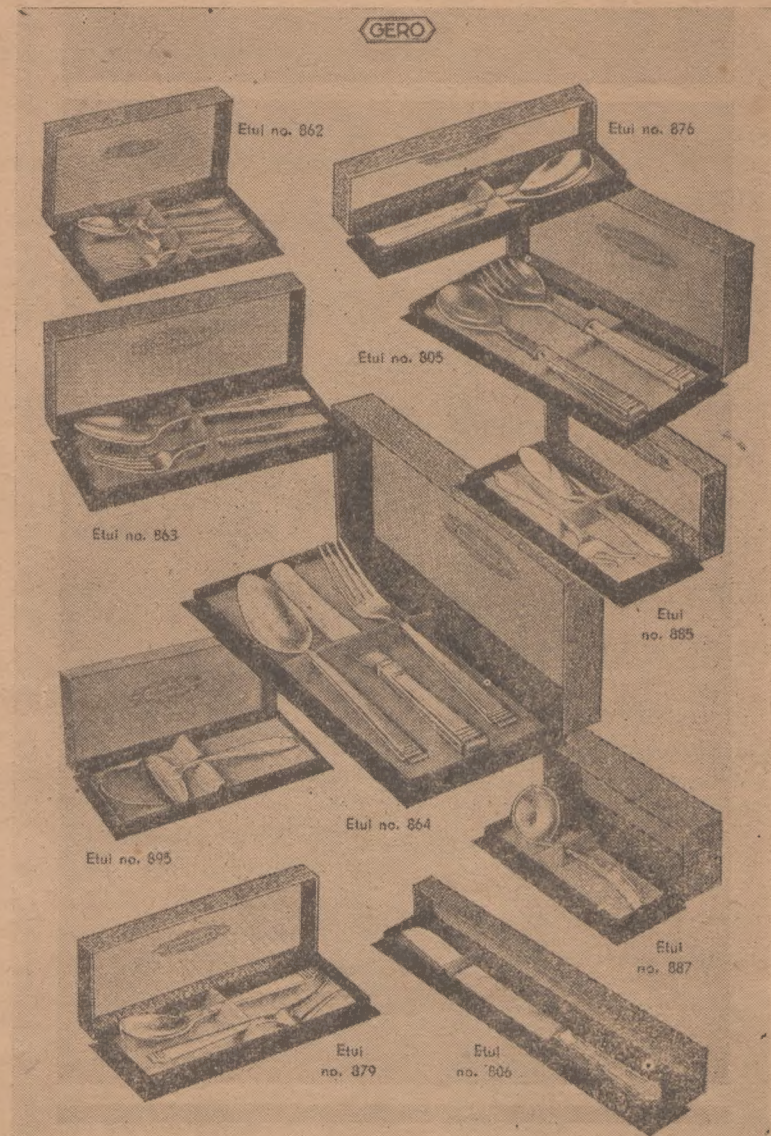
These Surinamers were not even afforded the opportunity to enter the Club-house as foreigners. Entrance to the dance — to which the vast majority of Surinamers look forward throughout the year — was free to solvent members.

Non-Surinamers, introduced as

guests, were permitted to pay f 5.00 and enter, but Surinamers who had fallen behind with their dues (irrespective of the cause or reason)

were not.

Inasmuch as one of the prime aims of the organization is to unite the Surinamers on "foreign" soil

and to encourage them to become members of the organization, the question was raised by a large group as to the motives of this action.

The feeling exists among this group that certain individuals, whose only interest seems to be the draining of Surinamers' pockets through all possible obscure means (such as jackpots), are completely ignoring these fine ideals and are, with ever increasing force, adopting the attitude of dictators in the organization.

The decision of the board of management to grant foreigners privileges which were denied Surinamers met with strong objection in various Surinam circles and several have resolved to tender their resignation.

While these members feel that it would be unfair to grant the same privileges to paying members as to those who do not live up to their obligations, they also feel that Surinamers should never be barred from the Club if and when Non-Surinamers are admitted.

MAN FOUND HANGING

Hanging by the neck from a tree, the body of a man, identified by relatives as Venancio Maduro, 58, a carpenter, was found near his home at the Road to Seroe Blanco on Monday of this week.

The body was discovered by his elder brother, Mr. N. Maduro, at around 7.30 p.m. According to the doctor who examined the body, the victim had been dead over one hour at the time.

There is reason to believe that the deceased took his own life. He

is survived by a wife, two sons and two daughters. Funeral exercises were held on Tuesday afternoon. Internment took place at the Government cemetery in San Nicolas.

racao, namely one week's imprisonment for libel, has been changed into a fine of Fls. 500.

This National Ordinance is based on Article 33 of the NWI Constitution, which reads: «The Governor, after having obtained information from the judge who pronounced the verdict, can grant pardon to all those who have been sentenced by verdict of the Civil Court.»

On December 30, the Court of Appeals at Curacao had passed verdict in the case of Henny Eman. The acting Attorney General had demanded a suspended sentence of two weeks with a probation period of three years. The Court confirmed the default verdict and sentenced Henny Eman to one week's imprisonment, unconditionally.

Mr. R.D. de S. Arends has been appointed National Receiver for Curacao effective January 1, 1953. He is charged with the collection of direct and indirect taxes.

U.S. FLEET VISIT

According to an article appearing in the «Amigoe» of January 5, the U.S. fleet will pay a grand-style visit to the NWI on January 14, 1953. Eight U.S. warships, including one aircraft-carrier, six destroyers and one submarine will call at the Curacao harbor and stay there for a short time. The total complement of these ships is approximately 3,000.

BOXING HIGHLIGHTS

As 1952 made its exit, the official announcement of his retirement by "Sugar" Ray Robinson and Archie Moore's capture of the light-heavyweigh title stood out as the most important fistic news in December. Next in line was Ezzard Charles' seventh round t.k.o. victory over Frankie Bufford in Boston, and La Motta's defeat at the hands of Nardico.

In spite of the fact that it was expected, Robinson's retirement came as a surprise after the announcement that he would meet Turpin in June.

Sugar Ray looks back on a brilliant career of 137 fights with 131 wins, 3 defeats, 2 draws and 1 no-decision contest in hanging up his gloves «because it's time». Ray said he was stepping down «because I don't feel I could give my followers the best I have. I don't want to let them down».

The 32-year old champion made his announcement with the NBA.

On the night that 1952 made room for '53, two-fisted Danny

Nardico made history by knocking the Bronx Bull, Jake La Motta, off his feet for the first time in 11 years.

La Motta suffered a t.k.o. in the 8th round of a scheduled 10 rounder on December 31 at the Coliseum, Miami, and for the first time in his fistic career heard the mathematics tolled over him. At the count of 8 he was back on his wobbly legs to serve as a punching bag for the hard-hitting Danny Nardico until Dr. Toth called a halt to the punishment. All three officials had Danny ahead on points with an identical 69-62 score.

By scoring this upset victory, Nardico has placed himself in line for a Moore title short. Nardico scaled 177 to 173 for La Motta.

MUSIAL SIGNS \$80,000 CONTRACT WITH CARDINALS

Stan (The Man) Musial of the St. Louis Cardinals, whose lifetime batting average of .346 is almost 30 points higher than any other active big league player, signed his 1953 contract for a reported \$80,000.

«I think you can assume Stanley is still the highest paid player in baseball,» Cardinal owner Fred Saigh told a news conference.

This week Mr. Winston Churchill, and President Elect Eisenhower met for informal talk in the strictest privacy at the home of the Bernard Baruch's town house in New York. They conferred for one and a half hours and no statements were given out by either Mr. Churchill or Mr. Eisenhower.

Upon his arrival in New York, the Premier, Mr. Churchill, in an interview with the press stated that Allied action in Korea has given the world a hopeful future for

peace but he opposed any extension of that war. He added that the danger of another world war has receded and credited resistance to Soviet aggression in Korea as the main reason for that.

At the press conference Mr. Churchill also asserted that United States tariffs are impeding trade with Britain and thus hampering British efforts to earn its living by

trade and not aid; that the U.S. has not kept to a promise made by the late President Roosevelt to share the fullest information about the atomic bomb with Great Britain; and that Britain did not intend to withdraw recognition of Red China, despite the Korean statement, but that Britain will try to preserve the united solid front with the United States.

ROME

On Monday the Pope will elevate 24 new cardinals, bringing the College of Cardinals to its full strength of seventy. One of the 24 nominees, Monsignor Carlo Agosini, patriarch of Venice, died last week, and the following day the Pope named as the new nominee, Valerian Gracias, Archbishop of Bombay.

Archbishop Gracias, whose ancestors were converted to Christianity by the Portuguese, is the first Indian ever so honored. The only other Asian now a member of the Sacred College is China's Cardinal Thomas Tien, refugee Archbishop of Peking.

The Pope has requested one of the nominees, Mgr. Louis Stepinac, the Archbishop of Zagreb to stay in Yugoslavia rather than come to Rome to receive the Red Hat from his hands. Mgr. Stepinac is under a police guard for alleged antistate activities, and it is understood that Marshall Tito has suggested to the Holy See that he would be prepared to allow Mgr. Stepinac to go to Rome on condition that he shall never return.

BRITAIN

Mr. Anthony Eden, foreign secretary, announced this week that Britain and her NATO partners will boost their defence spending in this year to counter the possibility of sudden Soviet Aggression.

The statement contained in a White Paper to Parliament summarising last month's North Atlantic Council meeting in Paris, caused much surprise especially since Mr. Churchill had announced last month that a cut in the nation's defence effort was necessary to avoid inflation.

U.S.A.

During the Christmas and New Year Holidays at least 1300 persons met violent death in various types of accidents. Of this amount 399 were killed in traffic accidents during the New Year week-end, creating a new record in the number of total accidents during any one weekend. The President of the National Safety Council has appealed to the public for ideas to stop what he described as «This senseless and needless slaughter on the highway.»

New York (Vaz Dias) — Millions of dollars in losses through spoilage of non-refrigerated ship cargoes will be saved thanks to electronic controls. Exposure to unfavor-

able temperatures and humidity in the ship holds will be reduced through electronic dehumidifying devices installed in commercial and naval ships, which will prevent the molding of cotton the rusting of metal products and the loss of labels from cans. TWO CSM SHIPS TRANSFERRED TO SHELL CARIBBEAN PETROLEUM COMPANY IN VENEZUELA

The tankers «Geomitra» and «Ganesella» belonging to the fleet of the Curacao Shipping Co. (Royal Shell Group) were transferred to the Shell Caribbean Petroleum Company (Royal Shell Group) in Venezuela. The transfer was symbolized by the lowering of the Dutch flag and the hoisting of the Venezuelan flag on board of these ships.

The «Geomitra» and the «Ganesella» will replace the lake tankers «Ojeda», «Alicia», «Acosta» and «Elena» which belong to the old type vessels and which are being taken out of service by the SCPC.

These so-called «G» ships will be used for the transport of crude oil from the Lake of Maracaibo to the refinery of the Royal Shell Group at Punta Cardon.

Since most of the «G» ships have been rebuilt in the meantime through which their loading capacity has been increased, this transfer could be effected without an appreciable decrease in the total transport capacity of the CSM fleet.
