The accutely dangerous condition of an open trench (approx. 3 feet deep), filled with water, adjacent to the new Princess Marijke school and the Lago Sport Park, in San Nicolas, Aruba's "Stepchild".

Undoubtedly this murderous trap was dug for a good and justified reason. However, an excuse can hardly be found for leaving this trap of doom and destruction, filled with water, left wide open without any kind of protection in an area that is cluttered with Kindergarten tots every day, especially sinie this gutter-of-death marks the dividing line between the Lago Sport Park playing ground and the road leading to (or from) the school.

At nights, the place is dark and there are no warning lights or sig-

nals at the corner or along the trench to warn motorists of the open arms of Mr. Death who is eagerly waiting for his victim at this spot.

The condition has existed for approximately 2 months now and it is time or rather it is high time that something be done... and in a hurry, before an innocent infant is drowned! or a serious car accident takes place.

This is urgent!

— The condition of the roads connecting the Prins Bernhardstraat with the partially completed (and apparently forgotten) new highway by the Lago Sport Park. The condition of these roads is a disgrace to the community, a safety hazard, and a menace to automobile springs.

While it may not be possible (for reasons which could be thought up by the authorities) to pave these roads at the present time, it is felt that the price of a truckload of caliche fill could certainly be spared from the tax-payers money to level off the booby traps in the roads.

Deputy Jose Geerman — has been charged with the care of technical matters. He is charged with matters pertaining to pu-

blic works, telephone system and the airport.

Deputy N.E. Henriquez Sr. — has been charged with the handling of matters pertaining to civil resignation. He is also in charge of matters regarding water supply, the harbor and pilotage service, agriculture, stock breeding and fishery.

Deputy F.B. Tromp — has been charged with matters pertaining to education and schools and other cultural matters such as national development and libraries.

In addition he will be in charge of social affairs, including national housing so far as falling under the services of social affairs.

Deputy Frans de P. Wever — ha been charged with all matters of a financial nature. He will be charged with the administration of domain land and other property, public health, matters of an economic nature and general administrative matters. He will guard the treasury of the Island.

NEW SILVER GULDERS

The National Government, some time ago, ordered the coinage of a quantity of new guilders in the amount of Fls. 1 million. Recently 500,000 arrived. The new guilders have undergone an important change compared with those now in circulation.

One side will show the effigy of H.M. Queen Juliana. In this effigy the Queen will be looking to the right, our former Queen Wilhelmina's effigy looked to the left. It is legally prescribed that at the succession of another head of state the effigy of the successor should face the opposite direction. On the other side of the new coin the inscription "Nederlandse Antillen" instead of "Munt van Curacao" is stamped. The coat-of-arms of the kingdom and the indication "1 G" remain unchanged. Two hundred thousand guilders have been sent to Aruba. It is the intention of the Government to take the paper notes of one guilder out of circulation gradually.

STADIUM LIGHTS GO INTO OPERATION.

ARUBA ALL STARS WHIPS LAGO ALL STARS 5-3 IN EXCITING GAME.

A full house was present at the Wilhelmina Stadium last Saturday night, January 17, to see the lighting facilities go into operation and to witness a thrilling and exciting football game between the Aruba All Stars and Lago All Stars, which ended in a 5-3 victory for the Aruba All Stars.

Among the many prominent guests witnessing this, for Aruba so important an event, were His Honor the Lt. Governor and Mrs. Kwartz, Members of the Aruba Island Council, Lago president Mr. J. J. Horigan and general manager O. Mingus.

Just outside the playing field, two tables and several chairs had been placed and shortly before 8 o'clock Mr. Fred Beaujon, president of the Aruba Football Association and chairman of the "Stichting", invited the Lt. Governor and Mrs. Kwartz, Messrs. J. J. Horigan and Engineer van de Berg to take place there.

Mr. van de Berg, the first speaker, said that the job had been completed and approved and it gave him pleasure to turn over the facilities to Mr. Horigan.

The chairman of the "Stichting", Mr. F. Beaujon, speaking both in Dutch and English, expressed the organization's appreciation and gratitude for the Lago's generous (f 90,000) gift. He also thanked Messrs. v.d. Berg (Public Works Department) and van Doorn, for their hard work which they had given without receiving any remuneration and concluded by asking Lago President Horigan to trip the switch which was placed on one of the tables.

As Mr. Horigan complied, spectators saw the stadium transformed into an "ocean of light", and a thunderous applause expressed the fans' sentiments.

Mr. Beaujon then requested Mrs. Kwartz to unveil the bronze plaque which was covered by the Red, White and Blue, and which will remain inside the stadium's main building as a permanent reminder of the event.

After Mrs. Kwartz had complied the Lt. Governor took the mike. In his own well-known calm and sincere manner our first citizen expressed his admiration for the enthusiasm displayed by Aruba's sporting public in general. On

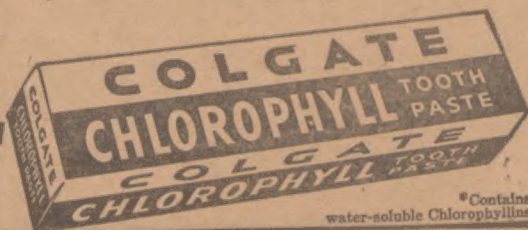

Again a thunderous applause greeted the speaker as the guests were escorted back to their seats in the reserved grandstand.

Lago side. Spectators were then thrilled to a game of football hardly ever seen in local club matches and seldom in international contests. While space does not permit a full account of the game, mention must be made of the near miraculous job done by goal-keeper Hernandez.

The game ended in a 5—3 victory for Aruba All Stars. At half time the winners were leading 2—0. Scoring for Aruba All Stars were Janni Brokke, Nel Harms (2×) and B. Hof-tijzer (2×) Scoring for Lago All Stars were Damian Tromp, Raymundo Kemp and Jansen.

During the rest period, Mr. Fred Beaujon presented a Parker 51 set to both Messrs. v/d Berg and van Doorn as a token of appreciation for their support.

FEATURES OF THE WILHELMINA STADIUM LIGHTING FACILITIES.

Masts:

There are 6 masts, each approxi-

mately 30 meters high and weighing 5½ tons. They are equipped with concrete platforms for the installation of armateurs.

They have been constructed to withstand a wind pressure of 70 kg. per square meter and a maximum tensile and compressive stress of 1000 kg. per centimeter.

The masts were imported from Holland and were built by the "Holland International Engineering Society Ltd". The firm A. J. van der Naaten Ltd., is its representative in Aruba and made the installation, assisted in the mounting and laying of the cement foundations by the firms Valen and Petrona & Croes.

Electrical Materials.

The electrical material was also supplied by the "Holland International" and installed by van der Naaten Ltd. On each mast there are 18 spotlights and 9 floodlights. The floodlights are equipped with normal light bulbs of 1,500 watts, while the spotlights carry projector-

type bulbs, also of 1500 watts. Depending on the need, all or only part of the lights can be lighted.
Installation :

The entire installation is underground. The main switches are located in the main building of the grand stand. The design has been kept simple so as to avoid future technical disturbances.

Electric lights are also installed in the main building of the stadium and along those parts of the field reserved for the public. These fixtures were installed by the firm K. Loonstra.

The entire project was carried out under the direction of the Public Works Department. This department also made all plans, drawings and estimates.

Capital :

The money needed to carry out this project was donated by the Lago Oil & Transport Co., Ltd., an affiliate of Standard Oil (New Jersey).

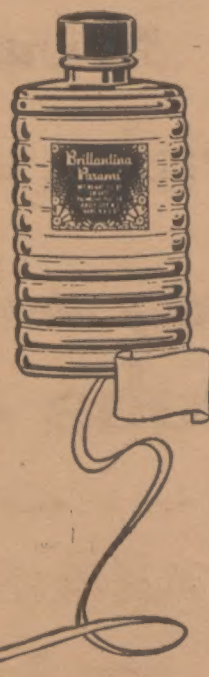

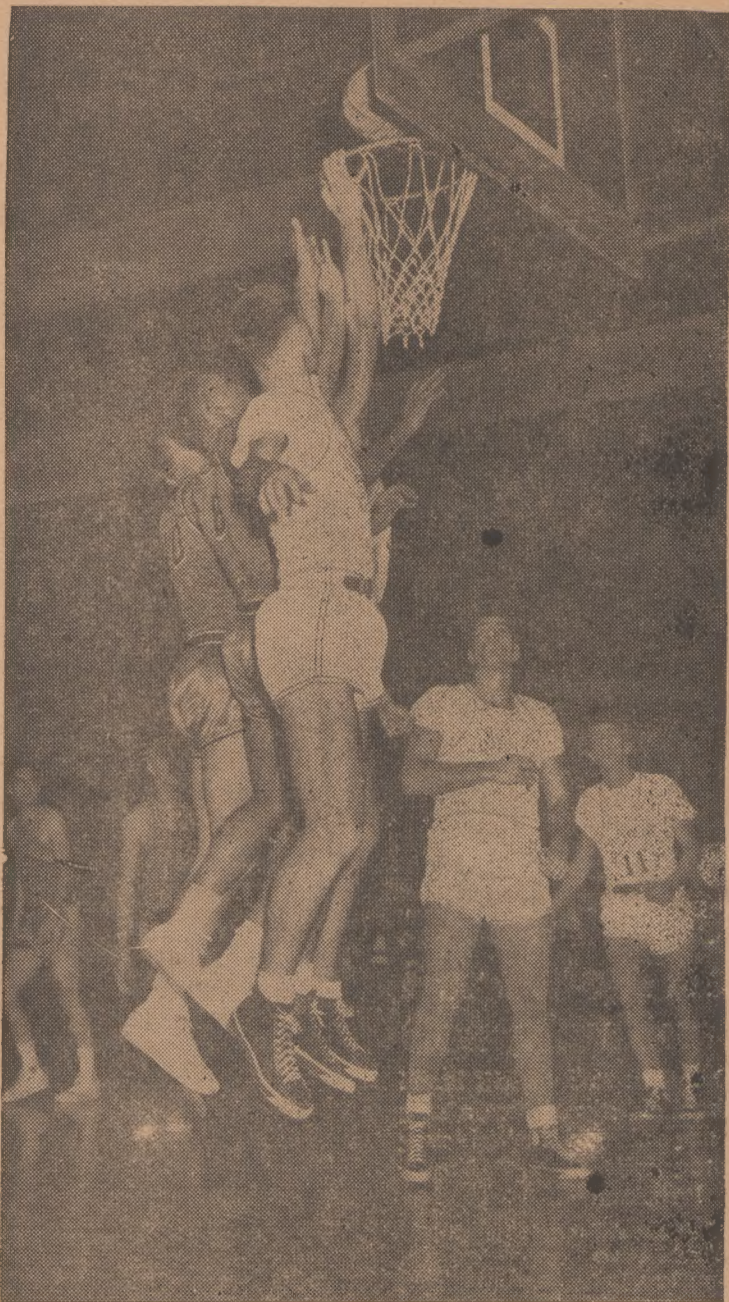
